

A message from the President

"Sheriff, I am sorry to wake you but I was wondering if you would mind doing a death notification for us."

The voice on the other end of the phone line is another small county Sheriff who was at the scene of a multiple-fatality vehicle crash. With that sobering news, I crawl out of bed at 1:30 a.m. on New Year's weekend and begin to get my thoughts together. I was about to tell some parents that their young son and his girlfriend had been killed in an auto accident.

As a four-term Sheriff, I've done this before and I can assure you, it doesn't get any easier. Every Sheriff and law-enforcement officer has aspects of their job that they would prefer not to do...but we do them anyway.

We are sworn to serve

It's a reality that the 28 newly elected Sheriffs will come to realize – if they haven't already: The job of Sheriff is not one to take lightly.

Having spent a week with this group at FSA's new Sheriffs' training institute this past December, I am confident they're up to the challenge. They are an incredibly talented group with varied backgrounds, including more than 300 years of combined law-enforcement experience. Most of the new Sheriffs are college graduates with numerous additional hours of advanced training.

And they are going to need every bit of it, as they face the demands that are unique to the Office of the Sheriff. A "reality show" you won't find on T.V.

A large central Florida police department made headlines recently when they started using a graphic video for screening new recruits. Like other agencies, they had found many new officers quitting within two years citing the same complaint: They weren't prepared for the amount of paperwork required, the intense criminal culture and the mistreatment they suffered from some citizens.

The PD's training officer defended the approach, saying, "This is down and dirty. It's not meant to be touchy-feely. We wanted it to be unsettling, not sterile and edited out like a T.V. version."

Like a new recruit, our newly elected Florida Sheriffs will head confidently into this "reality show" knowing full well that there are great challenges – and pitfalls – awaiting them. However, I am absolutely convinced they are well prepared and seasoned enough to stand up to the demands.

I encourage all Florida Sheriffs Association members to get to know their Sheriffs personally, and I believe you will reach the same conclusion.

Please feel free to contact the FSA office if we can help you in any way. And may you enjoy good health, safety and prosperity in 2005.

Enterprising criminals can gather enough information about you through the debris of everyday electronic transactions to pretend that they are you. Once this happens, they can gain access to all your financial information.


The most common way thieves go about getting this information is by stealing your wallet. However, other ways include looking over your shoulder at ATMs and phone booths to capture your PIN number; stealing mail from your mailbox; digging though your discarded trash; and fraudulently ordering a copy of your credit record.

Follow these tips to protect your identify and credit.

Protect Your Money and Credit

Having a credit card is a big responsibility - especially in today's electronic age. Here are a few tips to keep them safe.

- · Give your credit card account number out to make a purchase or reserva tion only when you have initiated the call.
- · Never give this information over a cellular phone.
- · Never give your credit card for someone to use on your behalf.
- ·Watch your card when giving it to store clerks to protect against extra imprints being made.
- · Destroy any carbon papers from receipts. Tear them up-don't toss them into the trash at the purchase counter. Keep the actual charge slips in a
- ·Save all receipts and compare them to your monthly statement. Report any differences immediately.
- · Keep a master list of all your card numbers in a secure place separate from your wallet. Include all account numbers and phone numbers for reporting stolen or lost cards.



Protect Your Identity

To prevent your identity from being stolen for fraudulent purposes, follow

- · Don't give out your social security number, unless it's for an official pur pose (and to a trusted agency)
- · Tear into small pieces all credit card offers, ATM receipts, bank state ments, credit card statements, and other printed materials that have your account numbers on them. Use a paper shredder if possible.
- Don't send personal information over the Internet, through e-mail, or over cellular phones.
- · Don't use passwords that are obvious— names (yours or those of your friends, relatives, or pets), birth date, even street addresses. The best passwords mix numbers with upper and lowercase letters.
- Avoid break-ins by changing your password regularly and memorizing it. If you have several, set up a system for remembering them. Don't write your password on your notebook or a sticky note.

Sexual Predator and Sexual Offender Database

We often read in the news of tragedies involving children who become victims of sexual predators or offenders who had a previous record. In order to safeguard our communities, the state of Florida passed a law that made it legal to learn if a person found guilty of previous offenses lives in your neigh-

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement developed one of the first public access systems for searching a database and determining if you should be taking greater precaution with a person living in your neighborhood,

or otherwise exposed to your children.

The database contains public record information on offenders classified as sexual predators and sexual offenders under Florida law because of a conviction for a sex-related crime and/or a specified crime against children.







Hurricane Relief for Sheriffs' Office Employees

In the aftermath of last fall's hurricanes - Frances, Charley, Ivan and Jeanne - the Florida Sheriffs Association learned that many of Sheriff's Office employees lost homes, vehicles and personal items that can never be replaced. Many will spend the next year or more piecing together their livesbeginning with home repairs (or replacement).

- · Beware if anyone claims to have found money and offers to share it with you
- MOST IMPORTANT: If you suspect fraud or any criminal activity, don't be embarrassed or ashamed to report it immediately.


Florida Sheriffs' 2005 Legislative Priorities

During the 2005 Mid-Winter conference, the Florida Sheriffs reviewed the priorities proposed by FSA's legislative committee. They discussed issues they plan to support or to oppose in the 2005 legislative session.

This year FSA has established the following priorities:

- Support an amendment to FSA legislation passed last year relative to law enforcement pursuits that will allow a person being pursued by an unmarked law enforcement vehicle to proceed in an orderly fashion to a lit and populated area before stopping.
- Support the Florida Police Chief's Association effort to provide enhanced penalties for criminals who use fake firearms to commit crimes in order to escape the 10-20-Life mandatory jail times.
- Initiate an effort to amend recently passed legislation dealing with maintaining firearms information that apparently causes problems in the utilization of Computer Aided Dispatch Systems.

- Request the Legislature to pass a resolution to the U.S. Congress to adopt a national strategy to combat Cargo Theft. Along the lines of the FSA-endorsed legislation that passed last year in Florida, this effort will seek similar support at the federal level.
- Continue to oppose the effort by the Miccosukee Indians to repeal all civil and criminal law on their reservation lands.
- Continue to oppose the effort to mandate that all interrogations be recorded. FSA President Bradford County Sheriff Bob Milner has appointed a Committee to propose a model policy for FSA to consider adopting regarding interrogations of suspects and prisoners.

Other issues were also discussed, and will be published in future editions of The Sheriff's Star as they develop.



GENERAL

What is the Florida Sheriffs Association?

The Florida Sheriffs Association is a not-for-profit 501(c)3 corporation made up of the 67 Sheriffs of Florida, plus approximately 130,000 citizens, business leaders and law enforcement officers throughout the state.

Founded in 1893, FSA has quietly served the citizens of Florida by supporting the needs of the state's law-enforcement community. It has grown to be the largest and most successful state law-enforcement association in the nation and is Florida's oldest law enforcement organization.

Through the Florida Sheriffs Association, the 67 Sheriffs of Florida are given a forum to address lawmakers and push for positive changes in the criminal justice system in our state. FSA also provides Sheriffs' Offices badly needed programs such as affordable training, special task forces and legislative and legal services. Because FSA unites the efforts of all Sheriffs Offices in the state, the result is a significant cost savings for better quality policing.

How is FSA organized?

FSA is a corporation made up of the 67 Sheriffs of Florida. To ensure statewide representation, the state is divided into four districts. The corporation is managed by a 17-member Board of Directors - all of whom are Sheriffs. The Board consists of 12 directors and five officers. Active member Sheriffs in each of the four districts of the state nominate three directors from each district to comprise the 12 members of the board. The five officers may be nominated from any of the four districts and elected by the active member Sheriffs. The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Board are elected by a simple majority vote of the 12 directors. The five officers included on the Board are: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Immediate Past President, who are elected each year at the Annual Summer Conference by all member Sheriffs present. A Sergeant-at-Arms and a Chaplain are also elected at the Annual

Summer Conference and are ex-officio (non-voting) members of the board.

The Florida Sheriffs Association employs an Executive Director and a support staff to carry out the Association's mission and organize conferences.

Who are the members of FSA?

The majority of members are not employed in law enforcement. Approximately 130,000 citizens throughout the U.S. (even abroad) including nearly 3,500 businesses make up the bulk of mem-

FSA is one of the rare state Sheriffs' associations nationally that has full, active participation by all Sheriffs in the state.

Where does the money from membership dues go?

Approximately 70% of FSA's annual expenses goes right into programs that enhance law enforcement in all counties throughout the state. These include training for Sheriffs' Office staff, financing of youth programs, providing professional and legal services to Sheriffs, organizing task forces and hosting Sheriffs' conferences.

The National Charities Information Bureau recommends that nonprofits "spend at least 60% of annual expenses for program activities" for which the money was raised. The Florida Sheriffs Association's track record has traditionally exceeded that minimum.

FSA does not employ telemarketers or professional fund raisers and welcomes the scrutiny of all Florida citizens on financial matters. A copy of the official registration and financial information may be obtained from the Division of Consumer Services by calling 1-800-435-7352, toll free within the state of Florida. Registration does not imply endorsement, approval, or recommendation by the state.

What are some of FSA's programs and events?

The Florida Sheriffs Association holds two statewide general conferences for Sheriffs and their command staff each year. One is traditionally in the summer, the other in late January.

In addition, FSA organizes and hosts (or co-hosts) annually: Florida Model Jail Standards Jail Inspector Certification Course, Florida Model Jail Standards Jail Medical Inspector Certification Course, FSA Jail Administrators' Workshop. Training Conference for the Sheriff's Assistant, Administrative Management Training Seminar and an Annual Car Evaluation and Fleet Management Training Seminar.

FSA also periodically hosts or co-hosts the following: Newly Elected Sheriffs' Basic Institute (every 4 years), Court Security

Seminar, Drug Enforcement Training, Extradition Workshop (biannually with the Governor's Office), Judicial Process Procedures Seminar, Regional Administrative Roundtable Discussion Groups, Vicarious Liability Reduction School

MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT, BENEFITS

What is the difference between Active Members and other Members of the Association?

Active Members — Only Sheriffs are qualified to be Active Members. Only Active Members hold office and vote.

Honorary Members - Private citizens may be Honorary Members, but they are not eligible to vote or hold office in the Association.

Business Members — Businesses have the option of joining at the Gold (\$500), Silver (\$250) or Bronze (\$50) levels. They receive a plaque which designates their level of membership, but they are not eligible to vote or hold office in the Association.

Law Enforcement Members — Sheriffs Offices and criminal justice agencies' sworn and non-sworn personnel, volunteers, retirees and auxiliary officers may be Law Enforcement Members, which makes them eligible for special insurance programs, including Line of Duty and accidental death benefits (included in their annual dues). But they are not eligible to vote or hold office in the Association.

Do Active Members pay dues?

Yes. The dues of Active Members are assessed by the Association and are paid as an expense of the county Sheriff's Office.

How are Honorary Members selected?

Each Sheriff gives the Florida Sheriffs Association permission to mail an invitation for membership to residents of his or her county and the Association makes arrangements for the use of public sector and commercial mailing lists. It is not a special or exclusive mailing list.

What are the qualifications for Honorary Membership?

Age: There is no age limit.

Sex: Both men and women are eligible for membership.

Character: Anyone who does not have a good reputation or who has been convicted of a felony is not eligible for membership.

Residence: There are no restrictions on residence. We have Honorary Members in many sections of the United States and in several foreign countries.

How is the membership campaign conducted in each county?

The Sheriff approves a letter for mailing to prospective Honorary Members in his or her county. The list of prospective members is checked against the names of members already on file with the Sheriffs Association and we attempt to remove any duplications. Letters are printed under the Sheriff's name and mailed to all persons on the list. Enclosed with the letter is an application and a business reply envelope which may be returned with annual dues of \$25 to Association headquarters in Tallahassee. When dues are received in Tallahassee, the Association mails to the new member:

- · A wallet identification card
- · An auto bumper emblem
- · A year's subscription to the bi-monthly Sheriff's Star magazine and quarterly Rancher.

The Sheriff's Star is the official publication of the Florida Sheriffs Association and includes this special directory edition which is widely used as a source of information on state government. The Rancher is a quarterly report on the progress and activities at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. Members also have the option of purchasing an auto tag to display on the front of their vehi-



Can a person's name be removed from the Association mailing list?

Yes. Individuals can either contact the Association and request the removal of their name or they may contact the Mail Preference Service, Direct Marketing Association, P.O. Box 3861, Grand Central Station, New York, NY 10163-3861.

Does the campaign create more work in the Sheriff's Office?

No. All the work is done by the Association, including securing a reputable list of prospective members. A few people may bring their membership dues to the Sheriff's Office instead of mailing them to Tallahassee, but this is handled at no cost to the Sheriff using an Association postage-paid application envelope.

MEMBERSHIP DUES

What if someone sends in more than \$25 for annual dues?

Many times people feel that they want to do more to support law enforcement in Florida and they send additional funds. Unless it is specified for a certain purpose within the FSA mission, it goes into the general fund to support programs and services that improve law enforcement in Florida counties.

Are Honorary Membership dues deductible for income tax purposes?

Yes. The Florida Sheriffs Association is classified by the IRS as a 501c(3) Charitable Organization which qualifies membership dues to be deductible for income tax purposes.

Where should Membership DUES be sent?

If a person joins the Association in the middle of the year. does he/she get a full 12 months of membership?

Yes. Memberships run for 12 consecutive months, starting with the month the person joins.



RELATIONSHIP TO YOUTH RANCHES

Please explain the relationship between the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc., and the Florida Sheriffs Association.

The Florida Sheriffs Association is the parent organization that formed the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc., to operate the Boys Ranch near Live Oak, the Youth Ranch in Bradenton/Sarasota, the Youth Villa at Bartow, the Youth Ranch near Safety Harbor, the Youth Camp in Barberville, and Caruth Camp near Inglis/Yankee Town. A portion of FSA membership dues is allotted to help the Youth Ranches. The Sheriffs Association office is in Tallahassee while the Youth Ranches' central office is at Boys Ranch. The Sheriffs Association continues to actively support and sponsor the Youth Ranches, but it is also involved in other law enforcement related programs. The Youth Ranches administers its own programs while working closely with the Association staff.

The Association and Youth Ranches are both run by a Board of Directors, but they are not the same board. The Association and the Youth Ranches are registered as Florida charities and are tax exempt.

I'm trying to encourage my grandson to be a law-abiding citizen and thought it would be good for him to become a "junior member" of your organization. Do you have a junior membership?

We welcome all ages as members of the Florida Sheriffs Association. Our affiliation with the Florida Youth Ranches has long assured us of having youthful members in our ranks. And many of our members today - who have been with us 25 years or longer - got started after receiving membership as a "gift" from a grandparent.


