## ALEXANDER SILTSNAIL

Floridobia alexander

Order: Littorinimorpha

Family: Hydrobiidae

FNAI Ranks: G1/S1

**Description:** This is a small, ca. 4mm, snail with an ovate-conical shell and straight-sided spire (Thompson 2000).

Similar Species: Many other snails might look similar to a layperson.

**Habitat:** This species lives on rooted and floating aquatic plants in a single spring run (Thompson 2000).

**Seasonal Occurrence:** This snail is likely present all year long.


**Florida Distribution:** This species occurs along Alexander River for a distance of about three miles below Alexander Springs in Lake County (Thompson, 2000).

**Range-wide Distribution:** This species occurs along Alexander River for a distance of about three miles below Alexander Springs in Lake County (Thompson, 2000).

**Conservation Status:** This species only occurs in a single spring run. Anything that degraded water quality, whether in the aquifer or only the spring run, could potentially cause this species to become extinct.

**Protection and Management:** Manage for water quality of the aquifer, spring, and spring run.
