Section 434.1 Purpose

The purpose of these rules is to define the scope of the audits/reviews and investigations ~~that the Department conducts and conducted by the Department.~~ These rules also explain the process the Department will use when conducting audits/reviews and investigations of internal units of the Department, providers who contract with the Department, and agencies which are licensed by the

Section 434.2 Definitions

"Audit/Review" means an examination of financial transactions, accounts, reports, an evaluation of internal controls ~~and or~~ an evaluation of compliance with applicable laws and regulations. An audit/review may also include an examination of efficiency and economy in the use of resources (such as personnel, property, space), ~~and or~~ an examination to determine whether desired results are effectively achieved.

~~"Audit Administrator" means the Chief Auditor of the Department of Children and Family Services, or other persons designated by the Chief Auditor to conduct a reconsideration of draft audit findings.~~

"Audit Standards" means the Standards for Audits of Governmental Organizations, Programs, Activities and Functions" (The Comptroller General of the United States, 1981) and the Guidelines for Financial and Compliance Audits of Federally Assisted Programs (United States General Accounting Office, 45 Federal Register 21,837, April 2, 1980) and the generally accepted auditing standards adopted by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA) as of the effective date of these amendments (December 30, 1983). Professional Practice of Internal Auditing (The Institute of Internal Auditors, 1978) or where required, in accordance with Government Auditing Standards (United States General Accounting Office, 1988).

"Certified Audits" means the entity's annual financial and compliance report which has been examined by an Independent Licensed Certified Public Accountant.

"Cost Report" means the State of Illinois Interagency Statistical and Financial report.

"Department" means the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services.

"Desk Review", as used in this part, means a review by the Department's internal auditors or certified public audits and costs reports submitted by the provider agency.

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"Follow-up Review" means a viewing of past occurrences, contemplation or consideration of past events, circumstances, or facts.

"Internal Auditor" is a Department employee whose responsibilities include conducting audits of Department activities and contracted purchase of service providers and in order to make recommendations to the Director regarding the results of such audits.

"Investigation" means an examination of employee conduct, security systems, and contractor conduct to assure compliance with state, Federal and Departmental rules and regulations. A Department investigation is not intended to focus on criminality or prepare cases for prosecution, but rather to obtain sufficient documentation to assure the Director of the appropriateness of Department and service provider employee conduct and the safeguarding of Department assets.

"Limited Review" means an examination of financial transactions, accounts, reports, an evaluation of internal controls, or an evaluation of compliance with applicable laws and regulations which is limited in scope to examine only certain areas. (Although this is not a full scope audit, it may include an examination of efficiency and economy in the use of resources (such as personnel, property, space), and an examination to determine whether desired results are effectively achieved.)

"Preliminary Review" means an entrance conference held at the beginning of each audit or limited review; a very limited review of financial transactions, accounts, reports, internal controls and compliance with contract provisions to assess the scope needed during an upcoming audit.

"Program Area" means a group of support or therapeutic activities that are coordinated into a service modality. Examples of "program areas" are counseling, foster care, group homes, child care institutions, day care centers, day care homes, comprehensive community based youth services. Subject to approval of the Department, private agencies are allowed flexibility in the designation of their program areas.

"Provider", as applied to this part, means purchase of service providers or any other entity with whom the Department has a contract.

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"Related Party Transaction" means a financial transaction in which one party has the ability to influence the management or operating policies of the other party. Disclosure of related party transactions should include the nature of the relationship, a description of the transactions, including dollar amounts, and amounts due to and from related parties.

"Scope of the Audit or Investigation" means the activities and testing procedures that the auditor or investigator deems necessary to conduct an examination or investigation.

Section 434.3 Audit Standards to be Applied and Audit Procedures to be Followed

The audits of provider agencies shall be performed in accordance with Standards for Audits of Governmental Organizations, Programs, Activities and Functions, Revised and Reissued February 27, 1981 as promulgated by the comptroller General of the United States. Auditors must also use generally accepted auditing standards adopted by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. The Standards for Professional Practice of Internal Auditing (The Institute of Internal Auditors, 1978) or where required, in accordance with Government Auditing Standards (United States General Accounting Office, 1987).

Section 434.4 Scope of the Internal Audit/Review or Investigation

a) The Department reserves the right to conduct audits/reviews, limited reviews, follow-up reviews or investigations of purchase of service providers and other entities which contract with or who are licensed by the Department. The Department may elect to designate qualified individuals to do this on its behalf when an independent (non-DCFS) audit is required by law or contract. Outside independent auditors will be used to conduct audits when a grant award from an outside funding source requires an independent certified audit as a condition of the grant. Audits/reviews and investigations shall encompass some or all of the following general objectives:

1) an examination of financial transactions, accounts, and reports, including an evaluation of compliance with applicable laws and regulations and Department rules.

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- 2) an evaluation of whether the entity is maintaining effective control over revenues, expenditures, assets and liabilities.
 - 3) an examination to verify that financial and cost reports contain accurate and reliable financial and client service data, and are presented fairly.
 - 4) an examination to verify that related party transactions are properly accounted for and disclosed appropriately.
 - 5) an examination to verify that funds are used for their stated purpose as prescribed in the contract with the Department.
 - 6) an examination to verify that costs and services were incurred, expended or provided as billed.
- b) A preliminary review of purchase of service providers ~~will~~ may be conducted prior to the full audit. The purpose of the preliminary review is to define and limit the general objectives of the audit so that the audit can be conducted in an efficient manner. The preliminary review ~~will~~ may encompass a selective review of financial transactions, accounts, reports, internal controls and compliance with contract provisions. At the conclusion of this review and based upon the results, the auditor(s) may:
- 1) conduct a full scope audit which encompasses all of the general objectives. A full scope audit will be conducted when major internal control weaknesses or significant deviations from generally accepted accounting principles are observed during the preliminary review.
 - 2) conduct a limited scope audit to include only the areas of observed weaknesses in the ~~provider agency's~~ entity's record keeping or compliance with contracts. A limited scope audit will be conducted when weaknesses in internal controls are observed or minor deviations from generally accepted accounting principles are observed during the preliminary review.
 - 3) cancel additional field work if no major areas of weaknesses are observed in the ~~provider agency's~~ entity's record keeping or compliance with contracts.
- c) In the event that a full or limited scope audit is not completed, a

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- written report of the results of the preliminary review shall be prepared and distributed as specified in Section 434.5 of this Part.
- d) Current employees of purchase of service providers or licensees and/or clients of the Department ~~shall~~ will be interviewed as necessary in conjunction with audits/reviews, limited reviews, and investigations.
 - e) The scope of the Internal Audit/Review or Investigation is not intended to identify fraud; but when fraud is suspected, the Department reserves the right to surrender all records pertaining to the audit/review or investigation to the appropriate law enforcement body without notice to the purchase of service provider or other entity with whom the Department has the contract(s).
 - f) Follow-up reviews ~~will~~ may be conducted when purchase of service providers have had major internal control weaknesses identified in the final audit report. Major internal control weaknesses include, but are not limited to the following:
 - 1) controls over cash accounts or petty cash controls,
 - 2) control over fixed assets,
 - 3) noncompliance with recordkeeping contractual requirements,
 - 4) major deviations from generally accepted accounting principles in the provider's financial reporting and recordkeeping practices.
 - 5) major deviations from State law or Department rules and procedures.

Section 434.5 Reports of Internal Auditors

- a) All entities that undergo a Department audit, review or investigation shall be provided a draft copy and a final copy of the report.
- b) The audited entity shall be provided with a draft copy of the audit or review within 30 business days after the fieldwork is completed. Fieldwork may include additional work after the "onsite" work has been completed. At that time, the ~~agency~~ entity will be requested to provide written comments on the findings and recommendations

of the request and shall be only a general discussion meeting performed between the agency representatives and the auditors who performed the fieldwork. Proposed responses to the draft report may be presented at the time of the discussion.

2) When an exit conference is held, the final report shall contain a brief narrative regarding the date that the conference was held; the names of the persons attending; the topics discussed, and any mutually agreed changes to the draft that were decided during the exit conference.

b) After the exit conference, if the entity disagrees with the audit findings, it may request an reconsideration administrative hearing regarding the findings and recommendations. A request for reconsideration administrative hearing must be received in writing within 15 business days after the date conclusion of the exit conference and shall be directed to the Department's audit administrator, administrator of the Administrative Hearings Unit. A request for reconsideration administrative hearing must be accompanied by supporting documents or factual matter which refute or modifies the Department's draft findings.

e) When a request for a reconsideration is received, the audit administrator shall review the additional supporting documents or factual matter submitted.

f) The Department shall contact the provider within 30 days after the receipt of the request to schedule the reconsideration.

1) During the reconsideration hearing, the provider may:

A) provide additional relevant documentation which was not originally available to the auditors or reviewers;

B) provide records or documents which refute or modify the Department's findings;

C) explain procedures or policies which were not clearly presented during the audit and which relate to the findings; and

D) have an attorney, accountant or auditor present who shall restrict his participation to his area of expertise.

corresponding to each issue. The draft copy will be distributed to the appropriate officials of the Department and the audited entity.

c) The Department may issue a preliminary report prior to issuing the draft report. A preliminary report would be issued to gather additional information prior to issuing the draft report. Issuing a preliminary report is considered a part of fieldwork.

d) The draft report shall present findings and detailed supporting information to the extent necessary to clarify the findings. Where possible, the report shall contain the auditor's recommendations to effect improvements in problem areas noted in the audit and to otherwise make improvements in operations.

e) Upon receipt of the draft report, the provider may submit a response to the findings and recommendations. The response must be submitted within 30 business days of the date of receipt of the draft report.

f) A final report shall be issued within 30 business days after the date of the draft report unless the provider entity requests an exit conference and/or an reconsideration administrative hearing of the audit findings per Sections 434.6 and 434.11 of this Part.

Section 434.6 Exit Conferences and/or Reconsideration of Draft Audit Findings and Recommendations

All entities that undergo a Department audit, review or investigation shall be given the opportunity for a reconsideration an exit conference and an administrative hearing of the Department's findings and recommendations. The requirements for requesting a review of the findings and recommendations are as follows:

a) After receipt of the draft report, the provider entity may request an exit conference. The request for an exit conference must be received within 15 business days after receipt of the draft report. The request must be sent to the Department's audit administrator. Chief Auditor and must explain which findings and recommendations the provider entity does not understand or does not agree with.

1) The exit conference shall be scheduled within 15 business days

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- ~~2) The Department's audit administrator will conduct the reconsideration and shall have the authority to subpoena witnesses and to compel the production of books, records and other documents which have a bearing on the reconsideration.~~
- ~~3) Prior to taking any testimony from any witness, the audit administrator shall require the witnesses to take an oath or affirmation of the validity of their statements.~~
- ~~4) Common law or statutory rules of evidence shall not apply, as the provider will be granted significant latitude in presenting his views in accordance with paragraph 1012 of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act, provided that the audit administrator retains the power to conduct the reconsideration in an orderly and timely manner.~~
- ~~5) Relevant exhibits shall be received into evidence and shall be numbered in order according to whether they are Department or provider exhibits.~~
- ~~6) Testimony shall be taken by the Department at the reconsideration and a record of the proceedings shall be preserved, either by stenographic or electronic means. All exhibits shall also be preserved and made a part of the proceedings. A record of the proceedings shall be made available to the provider at cost.~~
- ~~7) The decision of the audit administrator will be based on facts presented at the reconsideration in the form of oral testimony or documentary exhibits. Within 30 days after the reconsideration, the audit administrator, with concurrence of the Director of the Department, shall modify the draft report to reflect the resulting determination. A final report will then be issued to the agency which incorporates all reaudits or reconsidered findings, the agency's responses, and the auditor's final comments on each issue.~~
- ~~8) If the provider does not concur with the final report, the provider may pursue the matter in court.~~

Section 434.7 Certified Audits, Cost Reports and Desk Reviews

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- a) The Department's requirements for providers include the annual filing of a cost report (for all providers in accordance with 89 Ill. Adm. Code 357) and a certified audit of the agency for ~~providers entities~~ who receive annual payments in excess of ~~\$25,000~~ \$50,000 in any one contract year. The certified audit for all purchase of service providers must be completed and submitted within 180 calendar days after the completion of their fiscal year as required by Section 357.11(f) of Rule 357, Purchase of Service (89 Ill. Adm. Code 357). Day care providers must complete audits in accordance with the Department's Guide for Audits of Day Care Provider Organizations. Other not-for-profit organizations must complete audits in accordance with OMB Circulars A-128 or A-133, whichever is applicable.
- b) The certified audit and related cost report are to be reviewed by the Internal Auditors and, when appropriate, a report on the audit or cost report will be issued to Department officials who are responsible for the contract(s). The general objectives of the desk review and report shall determine whether:
 - 1) ~~whether~~ financial and service unit information is appropriately presented and is consistent with the generally accepted accounting principles;
 - 2) ~~that~~ costs incurred in operating the contracted program are not less than the revenues received directly for the program, subject to the provisions of item b) ~~c)~~ below;
 - 3) ~~that~~ related party transactions are appropriately recorded and disclosed, ~~and;~~
 - 4) ~~that~~ significant accounting practices and other information which require disclosure (as described by generally accepted accounting principles) are disclosed appropriately; and
 - 5) whether funds were used in accordance with Department policy and whether the agency has received monies in excess of actual reimbursable costs.
- ~~e) After reviewing the agency's certified audit report or the Department's internal audit report, the auditors must determine if the agency has received monies in excess of the actual reimbursable costs. If, in any fiscal year, payments from the Department exceed expenses attributable to the Department for a specified program, the agency may retain an amount equal to or less than 5% of the Department~~

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contract for that fiscal year. However, the total amount of excess payments retained from all past and current years may not exceed 5% of the current Department contract amount for the program in which payments were made. All retained amounts in excess of 5% of the current contract shall be returned to the Department either through rate reductions, services offered at no charge, or a check payable to the State Treasurer. At the termination or expiration of the contract(s) all accumulated excess of revenues over expenses directly attributable to the contract shall be returned by a check payable to the State Treasurer upon demand by the Department.

The Office of Internal Audits is responsible for answering all questions regarding the preparation of a certified audit. If the certified audit from a service provider has not been received by the deadline of 180 days after the completion of the entity's fiscal year, the Office of Internal Audits will notify the service provider of the delinquency and send a copy of the notice to Department regional administrative staff.

All audits are logged in upon receipt by the Office of Internal Audits and an audit digest (summary of findings) is prepared for each audit received. If the audit does not contain adequate information, the Office of Audits will send a letter to the provider to request additional information. If the audit is unacceptable, the provider will be given 30 days to submit a new audit.

The Office of Audits will prepare an audit digest which will highlight any deficiencies that are found in the audit and will contain specific recommendations for procedural changes in the preparation of audits. The completed audit digest will sent directly to the provider agency, with a copy to appropriate Department regional staff.

Department regional staff are responsible for reviewing the recommendations contained in the audit digest and providing assistance as necessary to the provider agency in follow-up on the recommendations made. The audit digest may contain recommendations for contract or budget revisions which must be acted upon by the Regional staff.

The audit digest may contain recommendations which require an additional response from the provider before the audit is accepted. The provider's response and concurrence with the recommendations of the audit digest will close the desk review process.

1) If, during State fiscal year 1994, payments from the Department

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exceed expenses attributable to the Department for a specified program area, any excess revenues which are identified will be turned over to the Office of Collections for recapture at an agreed upon schedule not to exceed nine months.

2) If, in any fiscal year beginning with the State's fiscal year 1995, payments from the Department exceed expenses attributable to the Department for a specified program area, the appropriate Regional contract administrator will be notified of the excess. The Regional contract administrator will be responsible for recapture of the excess at an agreed upon schedule not to exceed nine months. The Regional contract administrator may recapture the excess through voucher offsets, rate reductions, or through the Office of Collections.

e) e)

Waiver of the certified audit requirement must be requested in writing and directed to the Department's audit administrator. Chief Auditor. The request should state the reason for the waiver request. A request for an extension of the deadline for submittal of the audit beyond the time specified in the contract must also be submitted in writing to the audit administrator. Chief Auditor. The Department's audit administrator will respond to requests for waivers or extensions within thirty business days, specifying approval or rejection of the waiver. A request for a waiver of an audit will be granted if the provider has not received any administrative cost reimbursement under the contract and the contract does not require that the provider maintain accounting records. A request for an extension of the deadline for submittal of the audit will be granted if:

- 1) the provider has experienced a major disruption of recordkeeping, such as the death or illness of a key officer or employee, acts of vandalism, criminal conduct or natural disasters, or
- 2) the audit field work has started but it has been determined that the condition of the records are such that the records must be reconstructed prior to completion of the audit.

Section 434.8 Records Maintenance and Availability for Audit

All records specified in the Department's rules on service delivery (subchapter at (89 Ill. Adm. Code 300-313), and fiscal administration (subchapter at (89 Ill. Adm. Code 351-362), and licensing standards (89 Ill. Adm. Code 377 - 410, as

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appropriate for the facility type), and any documents which support financial transactions, billing statements, or which should be included in a case or personnel file must be maintained by the provider for a period of five years. Department requests for review of records shall be subject to the following guidelines:

- a) provider agencies shall be verbally requested to provide required records by properly authorized Department staff or designees after the commencement of desk review, limited review, preliminary review, limited scope audit, full scope audit or receipt of a questionable business paper;
- b) providers who fail to provide requested records shall be issued a written request for the documents. The request shall be from the Department Director, the ~~audit administrator~~ Chief Auditor or the contract administrator;
- c) if the records (requested in writing) are not provided within 15 business days of the date of the request, the Department's Director or authorized designee shall issue a subpoena for the requested records;
- d) continued failure to provide the requested records shall, with the Director's approval, result in termination of the Department's contract with the provider and forfeiture or withholding of payment.

Section 434.9 Responsibilities of the Office of Internal Audits

The Department of Children and Family Services is mandated by ~~An Act relating to~~ The Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act, (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991, ch. 15, pars. 1001 et. seq.) [30 ILCS 10/1001] in State government, paragraph 136.1, to monitor, report on, and enforce Department compliance with Federal and state statutes, Department rules, ~~and~~ policy, and management directives, as well as ensuring the integrity of Department assets through the review and monitoring of internal accounting controls. The Chief Auditor reports and is directly responsible to the Director of the Department. In order to fulfill their duties, the Department's internal audit office regularly undertakes audits/ reviews of Divisions or Units of the Department and activities of purchase of service providers in order to assess their compliance with established law, policy and directives. Accordingly, Department staff are responsible for full cooperation with the internal audit staff in their efforts to monitor, measure, and recommend improvements in performance.

Section 434.10 Administrative Hearings of Draft Audit Findings and Recommendations

- a) When a request for an administrative hearing is received, the administrator of the Administrative Hearings Unit may grant a request for a hearing only when:
 - 1) the written request for an administrative hearing was received by the Department within the 15 calendar days following the conclusion of the exit conference;
 - 2) the request was accompanied by supporting documents or factual matters which refute or modifies the Department's draft finding;and
 - 3) the issue is within the jurisdiction of the Administrative Hearing Unit.
- b) The administrator of the Administrative Hearings Unit shall dismiss a request for an administrative hearing only when:
 - 1) The appeal has been withdrawn in writing.
 - 2) The appeal has been abandoned. Abandonment shall be deemed to have occurred if the appellant, the appellant's authorized representative, or an individual legally authorized to act on behalf of the appellant fails to appear at the hearing and the appellant does not have an adequate cause for failing to appear. Adequate cause for failing to appear at an administrative hearing may include but is not limited to:
 - A) death in the family of the appellant or in the family of the the appellant's representative;
 - B) serious illness of the appellant or the appellant's representative or serious illness in either person's immediate family;
 - C) transportation difficulties that make it impossible for the appellant or representative to appear at the hearing; or

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D) failure of the Department to give notice of the hearing on the appellant or representative at the last known address available to the Department. However, it is the appellant's responsibility to keep the Department updated on any change of address.

3) the issue is not within the jurisdiction of the appeal system.

4) the request for an administrative hearing was not received within 15 calendar days following the conclusion of the exit conference.

5) the appellant failed to notify the administrator of the Administrative Hearings Unit of a change of address, and a notice of the administrative hearing cannot be delivered.

c) The Department shall provide written notice of the decision to grant or deny the request for an administrative hearing within 20 calendar days of receipt of the request for an administrative hearing. If the administrator of the administrative hearings unit finds that the issue is not appealable under this Part, but can be appropriately heard through another appeal process, in accordance with 89 Ill. Adm. Code 435 (Administrative Appeals and Hearings), the Department shall forward the appeal to the proper hearing authority and notify the appellant of this action.

d) The administrator of the Administrative Hearings Unit shall:

1) schedule the hearing at a date within 30 calendar days of the date of the appellant's written request for hearing.

2) ensure that the administrative hearing is scheduled at a time and place reasonably convenient for all parties. If the parties cannot agree to a reasonably convenient time and place, the administrator shall make this determination and proceed to schedule the hearing.

3) provide a written notice to the appellant at least 15 calendar days before the scheduled hearing, which shall contain the following information:

A) the date, time and location of the hearing;

B) a statement that the appellant or appellant's representative's failure to appear at the hearing without

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adequate cause may be deemed an abandonment of the request, thus constituting a waiver by the appellant of the right to a hearing; and

C) a statement of the parties' rights during the appeal process.

e) An appellant may bring a representative, including legal counsel, to the hearing. Expenses of a representative or of an appellant's witnesses shall be paid by the appellant.

f) An appellant may request the Department employee who had direct involvement in the audit, or other persons who may have information relevant to the issues in dispute to attend the hearing by asking the administrator of the administrative hearings unit to issue appropriate subpoenas. Witness fees and travel expenses for persons other than Department employees are the responsibility of the party requesting the subpoena.

g) Any motions from the appellant or the Department shall be filed with the administrative law judge at least 10 calendar days before the hearing. Copies shall be provided simultaneously to the Department's representative and the appellant.

h) At the appellant's request, the Department shall provide an interpreter at no cost to the appellant if English is not the appellant's primary language or a sign interpreter if the appellant is hearing impaired.

i) Both the appellant and the Department have the right to examine and copy documents and other information to be used by either party at the hearing by requesting them at least 10 calendar days before the hearing. If a party fails to disclose evidence and then seeks to introduce it at the hearing, the administrative law judge shall consider the surprise or prejudice to the other parties, including prior disclosure during the audit process. The administrative law judge's authority includes adjourning or continuing the hearing to a later time or date to permit the other parties to examine the evidence and prepare their cases accordingly.

j) During the administrative hearing, the appellant and the Department have the right to:

1) present and question witnesses;

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- 2) present any information relevant to the issues;
- 3) question or disprove any information, including an opportunity to question opposing witnesses; and
- 4) dispose of any disputed issue by mutually agreeing to a resolution any time prior to the conclusion of the administrative hearing.

k) In an administrative hearing concerning audit findings:

- 1) the Department carries the burden of proof by preponderance of the evidence; and
- 2) the administrative law judge has the authority to recommend changes in the audit findings record.

l) Appointment of the Administrative Law Judge

The administrator of the Administrative Hearings Unit shall select and the Director shall appoint a trained impartial administrative law judge from the available pool to conduct the appeal hearing. The administrative law judge shall:

- 1) be an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Illinois;
- 2) possess knowledge and information acquired through training and/or experience relevant to the field of child and family welfare law including familiarity with Department rules, procedures and functions;
- 3) not have been involved in the decision to take the action being appealed or have rendered legal advice to the decision maker on the issue; and
- 4) not have a personal or professional interest which interferes with exercising objectivity or have any bias against the parties or issues appealed. An adverse ruling, in and of itself, shall not constitute bias of conflict of interest.

m) Functions of the Administrative Law Judge

The administrative law judge shall have all authority allowed under the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991, ch. 127,

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par. 1000, et seq.) [5 ILCS 100/1-1]. This authority shall include, but is not limited to, the following:

- 1) conduct a fair, impartial and formal hearing in which the strict rules of evidence do not apply;
- 2) provide for the recording of the hearing;
- 3) inform participants of their individual rights and their responsibilities;
- 4) conduct preliminary and prehearing telephone conference if necessary between the parties and/or their attorneys to provide information about the procedural aspects of the hearing, narrow the issues and discuss possible stipulations and contested points of law in order to expedite the actual hearing.
- 5) take necessary steps to develop a full and fair record which contains all relevant facts;
- 6) administer an oath or an affirmation to all witnesses;
- 7) quash or modify subpoenas for good cause, including but not limited to, relevance, scope, materiality and emotional harm or trauma to the subpoenaed witness;
- 8) preserve all documents and evidence for the record;
- 9) rule upon evidentiary issues and contested issues of law at the hearing or take matters under advisement pending issuance of the written opinion and recommendation;
- 10) order the removal of any person from the hearing room who is creating a disturbance whether by physical action, profanity or otherwise engaging in conduct which disrupts the hearing.
- 11) identify the issues, consider all relevant facts and receive or request any additional information necessary to decide the matter in dispute, including but not limited to the submission of briefs, memoranda of law, affidavits or post hearing briefs; and
- 12) present a written opinion and recommendation to the Director within 30 calendar days after the record of the administrative hearing is completed or transcript is received. The opinion shall

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contain a summary of the evidence, findings of fact, conclusions of law and a recommendation.

n) Combined Hearings

When a common issue is raised, the Department may respond to requests for hearings from more than one appellant by conducting a single group hearing. The Department may also combine all issues raised by a single petitioner in one hearing. In all group hearings, the appeal system in this Part shall apply. Individuals shall be permitted to present their own cases separately. The Department, if required for the fair, efficient administration of the hearing or to prevent possible prejudice to the appellant, may sever any party or any issue from the combined hearing. The severed party or issue shall be heard separately.

o) Making the Final Administrative Decision

The Director of the Department shall receive the recommended decision from the administrative law judge and shall agree, disagree, or modify the recommended decision. The Director's decision is the final administrative decision of the Department. If the decision requires corrective action by the Department, the Director shall appoint a Department staff person who shall be responsible for assuring compliance with the decision and within the timeframes prescribed within the decision.

p) Notice of the Availability of Judicial Review

The Department shall include a notice to appellants as part of the final administrative decision. This notice shall include the name of the person responsible for compliance, it applicable, and shall advise the appellants that under the provisions of the Administrative Review Law (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991, ch. 110, par. 3-101 et seq.) 1735 ILCS 5/3-1101 that they may seek judicial review of the Department's decisions if it is unfavorable to them within the statutory time frame.

q) Who Received Copies of the Final Administrative Decision

The appellant or authorized representative, the Department's representative, the administrative law judge, and the administrator of the administrative hearing unit, shall receive a copy of the final administrative decision.

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n) Records of Administrative Hearings

The permanent record of the administrative hearing, and the final administrative decision shall be maintained by the administrator of the administrative hearings unit. All hearing decisions shall be available for public inspection during regular business hours. However, confidential information shall be deleted in conformance with 89 Ill. Adm. Code 431 (Confidentiality of Personal Information of Persons Served by the Department) and federal laws and regulations on confidentiality.

Section ~~434.10~~ 434.11 Referrals by Department Employees to the Investigations Unit

a) Department employees are responsible for referring specific types of problems identified as a result of their work to the unit of the Department responsible for investigations. Examples of the type of problems or inappropriate activities which should be referred are:

1) employee or provider fraud;

2) submittal of erroneous travel vouchers by Department staff;

3) threatening letters or telephone calls received by Department employees;

4) reports of alleged child abuse or neglect by Department employees in their roles as employees;

5) kickbacks between providers, or between a provider and a Department employee;

6) misuse of state funds by a Department employee;

7) misrepresentation of vital information (employment history, criminal background, identifying information) by a Department employee or provider agency;

8) knowledgeable submittal of inaccurate Department, state or Federal report; and

9) release of confidential information to unauthorized individuals.

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- b) Any other activities which are of a potentially criminal nature (i.e., violations of state or Federal law) should also be reported to the investigations unit.
- c) The investigation process will require the investigator(s) assigned to the case to conduct a formal verbal interview with the employee reporting the incident/activity, which will later be supplemented by a written, signed statement summarizing the content of the interview. Full, accurate disclosure of all pertinent information will be necessary to ensure the integrity of the investigation.

- a) Applicants must contact the Department of Conservation (Department or DOC) to obtain a permit reservation (except for Wayne Fitzgerald, Silver Springs State Park, Ramsey Lake State Park, Site M, Lee County Conservation Area (Green River) and Moraine View State Park where applicants must contact the concessionaire). Starting dates and methods for making reservations will be publicly announced. Only applications for reservations submitted by Illinois residents will be processed during the first two weeks of the application period. Applicants making reservations will be sent confirmation.
- b) Permits will be issued until the daily quota is filled. The daily quota is determined by the formula one hunter per 10 to 40 huntable acres. Huntable acres are determined by, but not limited to, the biological studies on the number of the species available, the condition,

topography, and configuration of the land at the site, the condition of the roads at the site, and the number of employees available to work at the site.

c) The permit authorizes the permit holder to bring one hunting partner. (The hunting partner cannot hunt without the permit holder being present to hunt.) The Springfield Permit Office cannot transfer or alter reservations to change hunting areas, dates or hunters' names. Permits cannot be transferred on the hunting areas. 54) The controlled hunting season on the Wayne Fitzgerald State Recreation Area (Rend Lake), Lee County Conservation Area (Green River), Wayne Fitzgerald State Park, Moraine View State Park, Silver Springs State Park and Ramsey Lake State Park will be ~~publicly~~ publicly announced.

b) Hunting hours are from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Hunters with reservations are required to check in at the check station between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. Reservations are void after 8:00 a.m.

c) When daily quotas are not filled, permits shall be issued on a first-come, first-served basis until 12:00 Noon.

d) Hunters are required to deposit their hunting license in the check station while hunting. Persons exempt by law from having a hunting license must deposit their firearm Owner's Identification Card. If they are under 21 years old and do not have a card they must be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or a person in loco parentis who has a valid card in possession. A \$15.00 Daily Usage Stamp must be purchased at each area (except at Wayne Fitzgerald (Rend Lake), Silver Springs State Park, Ramsey Lake State Park, Moraine View State Park, Site M and Lee County Conservation Area, a Daily Usage Stamp is not required. Fees and method(s) of payment at ~~Wayne Fitzgerald~~ these sites will be ~~publicly~~ publicly announced).

e) Hunters are required to wear a cap and upper outer garment of solid and vivid blaze orange of at least 400 square inches. Hunters must also wear a back patch

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issued by the check station.

- f) Anyone who has killed game previously and has it in his possession or in his vehicle must declare it with the person in charge of the area when he checks in. All such game found in a hunter's possession after he has started hunting on the area shall be considered illegally taken if the hunter has not declared it prior to going into the field.
- g) All hunting must be done with shotguns or bow and arrow. Only shot shells with a shot size of No. 5 lead or No. 3 steel or smaller may be used, except at the Wayne Fitzgerald State Recreation Area Park where only non-toxic shot may be possessed and only shot shells with a shot size of No. 3 steel or smaller may be used. Flu flu arrows only may be used by bow and arrow hunters.
- h) Non-hunters are not allowed in the field.
- i) Hunters under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult hunter.
- j) ~~Pheasants only may be taken. Daily limit.~~ Daily limits:
- 1) Two pheasants of either sex at Eldon Hazlet State Park, Chain O'Lakes State Park, Iroquois County State Wildlife Conservation Area, Richland County Controlled Pheasant Hunting Area, Wayne Fitzgerald State Recreation Area Park, Des Plaines State Fish and Wildlife Conservation Area and Green River State Wildlife Area (Lee County Conservation Area), Lee County Conservation Area (Green River) and Moraine View State Park.
 - 2) Two pheasants of either sex, 8 bobwhite quail and 4 rabbits at Silver Springs State Park and Ramsey Lake State Park.
 - 3) Two cock pheasants, 8 bobwhite quail and 4 rabbits at Site M.
- k) Tagging of birds.

All pheasants must be affixed with a Department tag before they are removed from the area during the controlled pheasant hunting season. The tag must remain on the leg of the pheasants until the pheasants are

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finally prepared for consumption.

- l) Hunters may not leave the confines of any permit area and return to hunt on the permit area during the same day.
- m) It shall be unlawful to hunt on a site listed in subsection (j) above for the remainder of the controlled hunting season after being issued a citation for violation of the Wildlife Code (Ill. Section 530.100 Illinois Youth Pheasant Hunting Regulations

- a) The Illinois Youth Pheasant Hunt will be November 1-8, 1992, except at Sangchris Lake State Park where the hunt will be December 1-11, 1992, and at Railsplitter State Park where the hunt will be November 28-27, 1992, and at Mackinaw River State Fish & Wildlife Area where the hunt will be the first Saturday of the statewide upland season.

Only one supervisory adult in a hunting party is required to have a valid FOID Card if the hunters in the hunting party stay under the immediate control (accompany youth hunter at all times) of the supervisory adult possessing the valid FOID Card.

- 5) Complete Description of the Subjects and Issues Involved: These proposed amendments are required to conform to Public Laws 102-237 and 101-610 regarding the exemption of income and assets under the Plan to Achieve Self-Support (PASS) and the exemption of payments under Title I of the National and Community Service Act of 1990. The purpose of the PASS program is to help individuals achieve self-support. The PASS provision is available to Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipients who are disabled or blind. With Social Security Administration's approval, a PASS allows these individuals the opportunity to set aside income and resources for education, vocational training, starting a business, or other activities that would help lead to self-sufficiency. The money thus set aside is not counted toward SSI eligibility. This rulemaking exempts PASS funds and income received under Title I of the National and Community Service Act of 1990 for Food Stamp purposes.

These proposed amendments also exempt as income student financial assistance funded under Title IV of the Higher Education Act and the Bureau of Indian Affairs Higher Education Act. In addition, this rulemaking increases the State Utility Standard from \$195.00 to \$198.00.

Section 140.24 Payment Procedures

- a) Payment of valid claims will be made by a State warrant (check) issued through the Office of the State Comptroller. Payments for services rendered by medical providers will only be mailed to:
 - 1) The provider's service address, or
 - 2) The provider's (individual practitioner/sole proprietorship) residence, or
 - 3) The provider's designated payee(s).
- ~~b) Payment will not be mailed to lock boxes or post office boxes where street address delivery is available.~~
- e)b) A long term care facility and its corporate or partnership owner may request the facility's warrant be sent directly to the business address of the corporate or partnership owner. The Department's approval of this type of request will be given only if the owner(s) has a minimum of four facilities which are located within Illinois and which are enrolled with the Department. After approval is given the warrant will be issued in the name of the facility but sent to the business address of the corporate or partnership owner rather than the facility.
- d)c) The Department shall permit individual practitioners to designate an alternate payee if one of the following conditions is met:
 - 1) The medical practitioner has a contractual/salary arrangement, as a condition of employment with a hospital or professional school.
 - 2) The medical practitioner is part of a practitioner owned group practice consisting of three or more full-time licensed practitioners or the equivalent thereof.
 - 3) The medical practitioner is employed by a practitioner who requires, as a condition of employment, that the fees be turned over to the employer.

5) A Complete Description of the Subjects and Issues Involved:

Through this emergency rulemaking, the Illinois Department of Public Health amends various sections of the Illinois Formulary for the Drug Product Selection Program. The Department proposes to promulgate administrative procedures for the Drug Product Selection Program, however, the actual list of products approved for drug product selection need not be promulgated. Hence, all sections containing drug listings are repealed with this rulemaking.

Revisions to and single copies of the drug formulary shall be provided to pharmacies at no charge. Upon request, licensed prescribers, student pharmacists and pharmacists practicing pharmacy in this state under a reciprocal license shall be provided a single copy at no charge.

The Department shall offer a subscription to the drug formulary and its revisions to other interested parties at a fee of \$50.00 per year. All subscription fees collected by the Department shall be deposited into the Food and Drug Safety Fund. Subject to appropriation by the General Assembly, moneys deposited in the fund shall be made available to the Department of Public Health to administer the Drug Product Selection Program or for other activities related to food and drug safety or drug product selection.

The Department has also revised the procedural requirements for data submission for those drug products to be considered for inclusion in the Illinois Formulary. This rulemaking requires drug manufacturers to make their initial data submission 28 days in advance of the regularly scheduled quarterly meeting. It extends the comment period for manufacturers to respond to each others data submissions by an additional 7 days. Revision of the data submission schedule should allow

adequate exchange prior to the actual meeting, and should allow the Technical Advisory Council adequate time to review the data prior to the meeting.

Section 280.10 Definitions

"Act". The "Fire Equipment Distributor and Employee Regulation Act" (111. Rev. Stat., 1991, ch. 111, par. 8001 et seq) [225 ILCS 215/1 et seq.].

Distributor License". An annual license issued to a distributor upon submittal of requisite forms designated by the Office, and the payment of fees outlined in the Act.

"Employee". A licensee or person who is currently employed by a distributor licensed under this Act, whose full or part-time duties include servicing, recharging, hydro-testing, installing, maintaining, or inspecting all types of fire extinguishing devices or systems other than water sprinkler systems.

"Employee License". A license issued to an employee after submitting an application to the Office, paying the fees outlined in the Act, and successfully passing the requisite examinations. This license is to be renewed annually upon payment of requisite fees.

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"Fire Equipment Distributor". Any person, company or corporation which services, recharges, hydro-tests, inspects, installs, maintains, alters, repairs, or replaces fire extinguishing devices or systems, other than water sprinklers.

"NFPA". The term, NFPA, means the National Fire Protection Association, Batterymarch Park, Quincy, Massachusetts 02269. The number following the NFPA is the standard number and is followed by the year designating the year of publication (or edition). Where the Office has adopted a standard, no later editions or amendments are included.

"Office". Office of the Illinois State Fire Marshal.

Section 280.20 Fire Equipment Distributor License

No person, fire association or corporation shall act as a Fire Equipment Distributor or as an agency licensed under this Act, or advertise or assume to act as such, or use any title that such person is engaged in such practice or occupation unless licensed by the Office.

a) Criteria for licensure as a Fire Equipment Distributor.

1) Any person, company, or corporation which services, recharges, installs, hydro-tests, inspects, maintains, alters, repairs, or replaces fire extinguishing devices or systems, other than water sprinkler systems, shall accomplish the following to become licensed as a Fire Equipment Distributor:

A) Submit a completed application to the Office (this form shall be provided by the Office).

B) Submit the annual license fee as follows:

i) Class A Fire Equipment Distributor License to service, recharge, hydro-test, install, maintain, or inspect all types of fire extinguishers shall be \$100.00.

ii) Class B Fire Equipment Distributor License to service, recharge, hydro-test, install, maintain, or inspect all types of pre-engineered fire extinguishing systems shall be \$200.00.

iii) Class C Fire Equipment Distributor license to service, repair, hydro-test, inspect or engineer all types of engineered fire suppression systems shall be \$300.00.

C) Provide evidence of registration as an Illinois corporation or evidence of compliance with the Assumed Business Name Act [805 ILCS 405/0.01 et seq.].

D) Provide evidence of financial responsibility in a minimum amount of \$300,000 through liability insurance, self-insurance, group insurance, group self-insurance, or risk retention group; and

2) Upon submission of the requisite information and fees, the applicant will be assigned a license number and issued a Certificate of licensure. The Certificate shall be prominently displayed in the office of the distributor, or in such a location that the inspection may readily verify the distributor's compliance with licensing requirements. This Certificate will bear the following information:

A) Name and location of distributor

B) License Number

C) Classifications(s)

D) Expiration date

E) Signature of the State Fire Marshal.

b) Renewal of Fire Equipment Distributor License

1) The expiration and renewal dates for each distributor licensed under this Part shall be at one year intervals. The Office will notify the distributor, by issuance of an annual invoice, 30 days prior to the expiration of said license.

2) Failure to renew by the end of the 60 day period following the expiration date shall lapse the license. The lapsed license may not be reinstated until a written application is filed and the renewal and reinstatement fees are paid (see Section 280.50).

2) Employees of a distributor newly created after December 31, 1991 in which no employees holds a license issued by the Office will be subject to the following:

- A) Employee shall complete application forms provided by the Office.
- B) Employee shall submit a payment for the requisite fees of \$20 per classification;
- C) Employee shall submit two (2) 1" X 1" photographs.
- D) The individual must register and be examined during the Office's next quarterly examination. Until such time as the individual takes the examination, the Office will issue a letter, which shall be carried by the individual. This letter will serve as an interim license and shall expire 30 days from the scheduled quarterly examination date.
- E) If the individual fails to successfully complete the examination, he must then work as a trainee and follow the provisions outlined in 41 Il. Adm. Code 250.

b) Renewal of Fire Equipment Distributor Employee License.

1) The Office will notify the distributor, by issuance of an annual invoice, 30 days prior to the expiration date of the employee license. The distributor shall return the appropriate copies of the annual invoice, along with the following:

- A) Requisite classification fees for the employee;
- B) Two (2) 1" X 1" photographs of the employee;
- C) Signed identification card for each employee (provided by the Office).

2) Failure to renew by the end of the 60 day period following the expiration date shall lapse the license. The lapsed license may not be reinstated until a written application is filed, the renewal and the reinstatement fees are paid, (see Section 280.50).

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3) Renewal and reinstatement fees shall be waived for persons who did not renew while on active duty with the military, and who file for renewal or restoration within 1 year after discharge from such service.

c) Amending of Employee License.

1) Any licensed fire equipment distributor employee who requests a change of name, address or distributorship shall inform the Office within 15 days, in writing, after such changes and make payment of any requisite processing fees (see Section 280.50).

2) Any licensed fire equipment distributor employee who currently holds a license from this Office, and applies for the additional classifications, shall, if the application is made during the term of the current license, prior to the current expiration date:

- A) Submit a completed application which specifies the classifications to be added
- B) Submit payment of additional fees computed in accordance with Section 280.50.
- C) Register for and successfully complete the requisite examination for the classification which is to be added.

The expiration date of the license the employee currently holds will remain the same for all classifications of the license, new and existing.

d) Termination of Employment

Any licensed employee who terminates employment is subject to the following procedures:

- 1) The terminated employee shall return the identification card, which was issued by the Office, to the distributor;
- 2) Within 10 days after termination, the distributor shall notify the Office, in writing, of the termination and return the employee identification card;

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- 2) A fee of \$20.00 shall be assessed for replacing a lost license, change of name or address, or the addition of classifications or employees to a distributorship.
- 3) A fee of \$100.00 per classification shall be assessed to distributors whose license have lapsed and \$20.00 for each employee license which has lapsed.

Section 280.60 Complaints, Investigation, and Formal Charges

- a) Complaints. All complaints concerning violations regarding licensees or unlicensed activity shall be submitted to the Office of the State Fire Marshal, Division of Fire Prevention, in writing, and signed by the complainant.
- b) Investigation.
- 1) Allegations of wrong doing on the part of the distributor or its employee, shall be investigated by the Office.
- 2) The Office may summarily suspend a license under the Act, without a hearing, simultaneously with the filing of a formal complaint and notice for a hearing provided under this Section if the State Fire Marshal finds that the continued operations of the individual would constitute an immediate danger to the public. In the event the Office suspends a license under this subsection, a hearing by the hearing officer designated by the Office shall begin within 30 days after such suspension begins, unless continued at the request of the licensee.
- 3) The Office, through the Attorney General, the State's Attorney of any county, any resident of the State, or any legal entity within the State may apply for injunctive relief in any court to enjoin from practicing a licensed activity:

- A) any person who has not been issued a license or whose license has been suspended, revoked, or not renewed; or

- 2) Each licensee whose conduct is the subject of a formal charge, if the Office seeks to impose disciplinary action against the licensee, shall be served notice of the formal charge and hearing date at least 30 days before the date of the hearing.

 - A) *The time, place and date of the hearing;*
 - B) *That the licensee shall have the right to appear personally at the hearing and may be represented by counsel;*

 - D) *That the hearing could result in disciplinary action being taken against his license;*

(Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991, ch. 111, par. 8021) [225 ILCS 215/21]*

Section 280.70 Grounds for Revocation, Suspension or Refusal to Issue a License.

Licensees subject to this Act shall conduct their practice in accordance with the Act and with 41 Ill. Adm. Code 250 and this Part. Licensees shall be subject to the exercise of the disciplinary sanctions enumerated in Section 280.75 if the State Fire Marshal finds that a licensee is guilty of any of the following or other grounds enumerated in Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991, ch. 111, par. 8017 [225 ILCS 215/17]:

- a) *Fraud or material deception in obtaining or renewing a license;*
- b) *professional incompetence as manifested by poor standards of service;*

A) Report regularly to the Office upon matters which are the basis of the probation;

B) Such other reasonable requirements or restrictions as are proper.

5) Refuse to issue, renew or restore the license;

6) Revoke probation which has been granted and impose any other discipline in this subsection (a) above when the requirements of probation have not been fulfilled or have been violated. (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991, ch. 111, par. 8020) [225 ILCS 215/20]

b) The Office shall reinstate any license to good standing under this Act, upon recommendation to the Office, after a hearing before the hearing officer authorized by the Office. The Office shall be satisfied that the applicant's renewed practice is not contrary to public interest.

c) The Office may conduct hearings and issue cease and desist orders to persons who engage in activities prohibited by the Act without having a valid license, certificate or registration. Any person in violation of a cease and desist order entered by the Office shall be subject to all of the remedies provided by law, and in addition, shall be subject to a civil penalty payable to the parties injured by the violation.

d) An order of revocation, suspension, placing the license on probationary status or other formal disciplinary action as the Office may deem proper, or a certified copy thereof, over the seal of the Office, and purporting to be signed by the Office, is prima facie proof that;

1) Such signature is that of the Office;

2) That Office is qualified to act; and

3) The hearing officer is qualified to act on behalf of the Office.

e) Upon the suspension or revocation of a license issued under this Act, a licensee shall surrender the license to the Office, upon failure to do so, the Office shall seize the license.

c) engaging in dishonorable, unethical or unprofessional conduct of a character likely to deceive, defraud, or harm the public in the course of professional services or activities;

d) conviction of any crime by a licensee which has a substantial relationship to his practices or an essential element of which is misstatement, fraud or dishonesty, or conviction in this or another state of any crime which is a felony under the laws of Illinois or conviction of a felony in court, unless such person demonstrates that he has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust;

e) performing any services in a grossly negligent manner or permitting any of his licensed employees to perform services in a grossly negligent manner, regardless of whether actual damage or damages to the public are established;

f) contracting or assisting unlicensed person to perform services for which a license is required under the Act;

g) permitting the use of his license to enable unlicensed persons or agency to operate as a licensee;

h) performing and charging for services without having authorization to do so from the members of the public being serviced;

i) failure to comply with any provision of the Act or this part;

j) conducting business regulated by this Act without a currently valid license.

Section 280.75 Sanctions to be Imposed for Violators

a) The Office shall impose any of the following sanctions, singly or in combination, when it finds that a licensee is guilty of any offense described in Section 17 of the Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991, ch. 111, 8017) [225 ILCS 215/17] or Section 280.65 of this Part:

1) Revocation of license;

2) Suspension of license for any period of time;

3) Reprimand or censure;

4) Place on probationary status for a period of time and require the submission of any of the following;

Section 280.80 Exemptions to Licensing

In accordance to Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991 ch. 111, par. 8004 [225 ILCS 215/4], licensing requirement embodied in this Part shall not apply to:

- a) *An officer or employee of this State, the fire department or fire protection district of any political subdivision of this State while such officer or employee is engaged in the performance of his official duties within the course and scope of his employment with the State or any political subdivision. However, any such person who offers his services as a private fire equipment distributor or employee, or any title where similar services are performed for compensation, fee or other valuable consideration, whether received directly or indirectly, shall be subject to this Act and its licensing requirements.*
- b) *Any entity regulated by the federal government in which employees of the company engage in such activities incidental to its own business, as long as properly trained.*

- a) Clients must cooperate with Department projects conducted for the purpose of obtaining or validating general program information or operations, where such projects are not related to client-specific eligibility.
- b) Clients are required to provide a mailing address, telephone number (if they have one), and sufficient information to enable local office staff to locate the client including directions to the client's home, if necessary. The client will also provide the name, address and phone number of an individual who will know the whereabouts of the client and/or through whom the client can be located.
- c) Clients are required to apply for all other financial or service benefits for which they may qualify insofar as these benefits may affect HSP eligibility, client cost share amount, or cost of service to DORS, with the exception of benefits in subsection (d) below. Clients are further to avail themselves of such benefits at the earliest possible date and may request local office staff to assist in the process of seeking such benefits.

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- d) Clients may choose to apply for Medicaid, pursuant to 89 Ill. Adm. Code 685.150.
- e) Clients are required to avail themselves of all potential resources, including claiming the maximum number of allowable exemptions from State and Federal income tax returns.
- f) In order to receive services, or continue to receive services, clients are required to sign all forms, and supply any information required by those forms, which are necessary to comply with applicable State or Federal laws or the provisions of the Medicaid Waiver or are necessary to process payments through the Comptroller's Office. Clients receiving Personal Assistant services must also sign the Client/Provider Agreement (see Ill. Adm. Code 714.310).

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SUBPART A: LITERACY PROVIDER PROGRAM

Section 3040.100 Purpose

The Literacy Provider Program is part of the Literacy Grant Program established by Section 7.2 of the State Library Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1989~~ 1991, ch. 128, par. 107.2)(15 ILCS 320/7.2), to develop, expand or support adult literacy programs in Illinois through local community programs administered by education agencies, libraries, volunteer or community-based organizations, or a coalition thereof. The local adult literacy programs will provide instruction in literacy to persons 16 years or older who read or compute below a ninth (9th) grade level.

Section 3040.110 Definitions

"Adult" means an individual in Illinois who has exceeded the maximum age for compulsory schooling (sixteen) and is not currently enrolled in school (Article 26 of the School Code, Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1989~~ 1991, ch. 122, pars. 26-1 et seq.)(105 ILCS 5/26-1 et seq.).

"Application" ~~shall~~ means the written request for a literacy grant submitted to the LAB pursuant to this Part. Applications shall be submitted by the legal entity responsible for the disbursement of public funds.

"Coalition" means a structured cooperative effort between a library system, library or libraries, education agency or agencies, and community-based organization or organizations, or any combination thereof at the local or regional level.

"Community" means a village or city, county, or any local municipality in Illinois.

"Community-based organization" means a private or public not-for-profit organization, including volunteer organizations, located in an Illinois community, which provides services to citizens within that community and the surrounding area.

"Fiscal year" ~~shall~~ means the fiscal year of the State of Illinois.

"Illiteracy" means the inability to read, write, compute, or comprehend above the 8.9 grade level.

"Illiterate adult" means an adult whose minimal skills in reading, writing, computation, or comprehension preclude the individual from functioning in society.

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"LAB" means the Literacy Advisory Board established by Section 7.2 of the State Library Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1989~~ 1991, ch. 128, par. 107.2)(15 ILCS 320/7.2).

"Library" means the main facility for a tax-supported public library within an Illinois library system.

"Literacy" means the ability of an individual to read, write, compute, and comprehend above the 8.9 grade level.

"Literacy Program" means a structured project or program which provides direct instructional services in literacy to adult students.

"Math Student" means an adult whose math skills are below the 9.0 grade level who is enrolled in the literacy program for math instruction.

"Participating Agency" means those agencies who will receive part of the grant funds or who will actively participate in the literacy project as an essential component of that project, without whose participation the project would fail or be radically changed.

"Secretary of State" means the Illinois Secretary of State.

"State Library" means the Illinois State Library, a department of the Illinois Secretary of State established pursuant to the State Library Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1989~~ 1991, ch. 128, pars. 101 et seq.)(15 ILCS 320/1).

Section 3040.120 Application for Grant

- a) A request for a grant shall be submitted to the LAB in writing postmarked no later than October 15, 1985, for Fiscal Year 1986, and April 15th for every fiscal year thereafter. Applicants shall use the forms prepared and made available by the Secretary of State for this purpose. Applications not submitted on time or on the required forms shall not be considered by the LAB.
- b) Applications shall be submitted to the Literacy Office, Illinois State Library, 431 South Fourth Street, Springfield, Illinois 62701.
- c) Applications shall be reviewed by the LAB. Awards shall be made on or after December 1, 1985, for Fiscal Year 1986 and on or after July 1st of every year thereafter for the fiscal year then commencing.
- d) Grants shall not exceed \$50,000 to any one grant applicant in Fiscal Year 1986. The maximum grant amount for each fiscal year thereafter

14) The budget for the literacy project, setting forth the personnel costs, fringe benefits, (e.g., retirement benefits and health insurance) travel costs, equipment purchases, supplies, contractual services, and instructional materials, and any other expense necessary to operate the literacy program proposed in the grant application.

15) A statement as to the time schedule for the completion of project objectives of the literacy program within the grant year.

Section 3040.130 Review of Grant Applications

a) The LAB shall review all grant applications which are designed to deliver direct instructional service in literacy to adult students, provide support services to literacy projects providing direct instruction in literacy to adult students, or to provide training, coordination and management of volunteers who will deliver or assist in delivering direct instruction in literacy to adult students, or any combination of one or more of these objectives.

b) The LAB will use the following selection criteria: 1) Whether the need for literacy services in the community is demonstrated and how the applicant has addressed the need.

2) Whether the extent of cooperation and coordination by the grant applicant of its program with similar programs provided by other organizations in the community is clearly stated.

3) Whether the plan of operation contains a specific statement of project goals and objectives, the methods used to achieve these goals and objectives, the number of students to be served, and the number of administrative and instructional personnel necessary to serve the targeted student population.

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shall be determined by the Secretary basing his or her decision upon the amount of money appropriated by the General Assembly and the likely number of grant applications.

e) Applications must be submitted in one (1) original and nineteen (19) copies.

f) The first grant period shall be for a period of six (6) months, January 1, 1986, until June 30, 1986. Thereafter, the grant period shall be the fiscal year.

g) Applications shall include the following information:

1) The name of the literacy program for the community.

2) The name and address of the grant applicant.

3) The name and telephone number of the grant project director or executive officer.

4) The name, address, telephone number, Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN), and signature of the grant applicant's fiscal officer, who will receive any approved grant and be responsible for the grant funds.

5) The term of the literacy program.

6) The total amount of grant money requested for the literacy program.

7) A brief and explicit description of the literacy program purpose and goals.

8) A statement supported by statistics (e.g., dropout rates, census figures on the education level of the local population, or the number of persons receiving public assistance) and other evidence, (statements from local officials, State Legislature requests, or community college reports) detailing the need for the literacy program in the particular community or geographic region of the grant applicant.

9) A statement of the instructional, promotional and training methods to be used by the grant applicant to meet its stated goals and objectives.

10) A statement of the grant applicant's plans to coordinate its effort with other community groups providing similar or related services and to cooperate with other community groups, including education groups, volunteer organizations, governmental bodies,

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- 4) Whether the proposed budget is reasonable in view of the proposed goals of the project, and the budget is adequate to support the project. *For example, administrative and instructional costs should not exceed 30%, instructional materials should not exceed 30%, and equipment purchases or rentals should not exceed 40% of the proposed budget.*
- 5) Whether the proposed project contains evaluation methods and procedures which will produce quantifiable data regarding pre- and post-testing of students to evaluate student progress, record-keeping procedures for students, and volunteer participation.
- 6) Whether the persons managing the project have experience, training or education to combat illiteracy, and how much time will be spent by these managers on the project, including at least a bachelor's degree and prior experience in the field of education or management.
- 7) What plans are presented in the grant application to continue the project after the grant funds have been expended.
- c) The criteria listed in subsection (b) of this Section will be evaluated and assigned point value by the LAB. *As follows: priority # 1 priority # 2 priority # 3 priority # 4 priority # 5 priority # 6 priority # 7. The highest priority and point value will be assigned to subsections (b)(2), (b)(3), and (b)(5) which will have point values of ten each. Subsections (b)(1), (b)(4), (b)(6), and (b)(7) above will have point values of five each.*
- d) The LAB shall not select any grant application or award any public funds to any grant applicant which:
 - 1) Does not certify or state that it will comply with the Illinois Human Rights Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1985~~ 1991, ch. 68, par. 1-101 et seq.)(775 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq.).
 - 2) Uses as its staff or management personnel persons who have been convicted of any felonies involving moral turpitude, embezzlement, theft, sexual offense, fraud, and misrepresentation under laws of the United States, Illinois, or any other state, or have been convicted of bribery in violation of Section 10.1 of the Illinois Purchasing Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1985~~ 1991, ch. 127, par. 132.10-1)(30 ILCS 505/10.1).
 - 3) Has as its managers employees of the Office of the Secretary of State.

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- 4) Has been disqualified and had its grant cancelled in previous years for false application statements, failure to adhere to the grant plan as approved by LAB, misappropriation of funds, or any violation of this Part as determined by the Secretary.
- e) The LAB shall not award more than one grant under Subpart A of this Part to any one applicant in the same fiscal year.

Section 3040.140 Award of Grants, Interim Reports and Final Report Recordkeeping

- a) The LAB will make a recommendation to the Secretary of State as to which grant applications shall be approved, and the amount of public funds to be awarded to fund each grant application based upon the criteria in Section 3040.130.
- b) The LAB shall make its recommendations on December 1 for Fiscal Year 1986 and July 1 for Fiscal Year 1987 and thereafter.
- c) The Secretary of State shall make his or her final decision upon each recommendation as soon as possible within 60 days after the recommendation is presented to the Secretary. The Secretary of State shall approve or disapprove the recommendations of the LAB based upon whether the Secretary determines the recommendations to be consistent with the Act and the rules of this Part.
- d) The final approved grant applications and the funding determination shall constitute the Literacy Provider Grant Program, which shall be a public record, as shall be the grant applications, whether approved or not, and shall be subject to disclosure pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1985~~ 1991, ch. 116, pars. 201 et seq.)(5 ILCS 140/1 et seq.) and the rules of the Secretary of State found at 2 Ill. Adm. Code 551.
- e) Approved grant applicants shall submit to the State Library, Office of the Secretary of State, at least quarterly each fiscal year: *an interim financial report*
 - 1) The interim A quarterly financial report which shall state the amount of money expended to date in each line item of the approved program budget.
 - 2) Failure to submit the required interim financial reports shall be cause for cancellation of the grant. Grant programs shall receive one thirty (30) day notice requesting compliance with this section before the grant shall be cancelled. A quarterly statistical report which shall state at least the numbers of students and volunteers in the program.

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g) A final audit ~~and final report~~ shall be submitted by each grant recipient to the State Library, Office of the Secretary of State, on or before September 1 of each calendar year for the previous fiscal Year's program.

h) The decision of the Secretary of State upon any grant application shall be a final decision for the purposes of the Administrative Review Law (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1987~~ 1991, ch. 110, par. 3-101 et seq.) (735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.).

Section 3040.150 Cancellation of Grant

a) A grant shall be cancelled if:

1) Financial, statistical, and ~~interim program~~ narrative reports are not submitted as required by Section 3040.140 (e) (2) and (f)(2). Grant programs shall receive one thirty (30) day notice requesting compliance with this Section before the grant shall be cancelled.

2) An audit or the interim financial reports show financial irregularities, such as misappropriation or embezzlements of funds by the grant program operator and/or its employees and staff.

3) The grant program fails to meet its stated goals.

4) The grant program managers are convicted of any felony or misdemeanor.

5) The grant program fails to operate properly and effectively.

6) The previous Fiscal Year's audit, as required by Section 3040.140 (f), is not received by September 1 and the program has a grant under which it is operating in the current Fiscal Year.

b) Upon cancellation, the Secretary shall send a notice by certified return receipt requested mail to the grant program, which shall return all unexpended public funds to the Secretary within thirty (30) days of the date of the cancellation notice.

c) Any public funds not returned shall be the subject of a collection action by the Attorney General of Illinois.

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f) Approved grant applicants shall submit to the State Library, Office of the Secretary of State, at least semi-annually each fiscal year, an interim program progress a semi-annual narrative report, on a schedule established by the State Library. If the interim program progress report semi-annual narrative reports shall state, at least:

A1) The number of students served to the date of the report (with a description of their ages, sex, educational level, and language proficiency). The number of students served shall be separated into two categories:

A) the number of students referred to other programs, and

B) the number actually taught by the applicant.

The names of the students shall be confidential and released only for audit purposes.

B2) Where the students are being taught.

B3) The total number of volunteers recruited, describing their sex, age, number of training sessions, and the amount of volunteer time expended to date.

B4) The name of the community coalition formed, if any.

B5) What public awareness efforts were undertaken by the program to the date of the report.

B7) What special educational materials were prepared by the program staff.

B6) What has been the most successful or positive activity of the project.

B7) What problems, if any, have occurred.

B8) What private or public funds have been generated in the community to help fund the program.

B8) To what extent the project goals and objectives have been met to date, and if not, why not.

B9) Failure to submit the required interim program progress reports shall be cause for cancellation of the grant. Grant programs shall receive one thirty (30) day notice requesting compliance with this Section before the grant shall be cancelled.

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Section 3040.160 Audit Procedures

- a) On or before September 1 of each year, the literacy grant recipient must conduct an audit of the program and its expenditure of the grant funds. Grant funds shall be accounted for using the modified accrual accounting method. The State Library will add funds to budgets of grant recipients to pay for audit costs. The literacy grant recipient shall select an independent certified public accountant to perform the audit in accordance with the United States General Accounting Office Government Auditing Standards - Standards for Audit of Governmental Organizations, Programs, Activities and Functions (Yellow Book), 1988 revision, no later editions. This document can be obtained through the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402. A copy of this document is also maintained for public inspection at the Illinois State Library, 300 South Second Street, Springfield, Illinois 62701. The results of this audit must be submitted to the State Library, Office of the Secretary of State. Failure to conduct the audit or failure to report the results to the State Library shall result in cancellation of any existing grants. The State Library shall withhold 10% of the grant funds until receipt and approval of the audit.
- b) A grantee who does not comply with audit requirements will be ineligible to ~~apply for~~ receive funds in ~~the next~~ any following fiscal year.
- c) The provisions of this Section will not be applicable to entities that fall under the authority of the Auditor General of Illinois.

Box 98, The Sea Ranch CA 95497; the Basic English Skills Test (BEST), which can be ordered from Center for Applied Linguistics, 1118 22nd Street, NW, Washington DC 20037; the Foreign Service Institute Oral Proficiency Interview (FSI) (also known as ILR), which can be ordered from ETS, Princeton NJ 08541; the New York State Placement Test (NYS-Place Test), which can be ordered from The University of the State of New York, The State Education Department, Division for Program Development, Albany New York 12234; and the Basic Inventory of Natural Language (BINL), which can be ordered from CHECpoint Systems, Inc., 1520 North Waterman Avenue, San Bernardino CA 92404. ~~and All test used must be described in the proposal. Results must accompany interim~~ semi-annual and final reports.

- 3) In the case of students who enroll for math assistance only, the TABE math test must be used in testing for semi-annual reports submitted to the State Library, Office of the Secretary of State.
- b) Grant funds shall be paid to the literacy program in an amount not to exceed 60% of the total grant for the first of three payments. The second shall be made half way through the grant period for the balance amount of the approved grant, minus the 10% holdback amount for the audit required by Section 3040.160.
- c) Equipment
 - 1) Any equipment purchased by a literacy program from grant funds shall be the property of the State Library.
 - 2) Any equipment purchased from grant funds, which equipment is no longer used by the grantee for literacy program purposes, shall be returned to the State Library. The equipment is "transferable property" as defined in Section 1.04 of the State Property Control Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1988~~ 1991, ch. 127, par. 133b4.1) (30 ILCS 605/1.04). The equipment shall be disposed of pursuant to the State Property Control Act/ (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1988~~ 1991, ch. 127, par. 133b1 et seq.)(30 ILCS 605/1 et seq.).
- d) No literacy grant program shall purchase with grant funds any equipment ~~which exceeds a value of \$500~~ without the prior written consent and approval of the State Library. Approval will be granted by the State Library if the grantee demonstrates that the purchase is essential to the program and cannot be funded in any other way.

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The purpose of the workplace literacy program is to promote working relationships between employers and Illinois adult literacy providers... one or more of the following:

- 1) Assess educational skill levels of employees to determine the extent of need for a workplace literacy program... 2) Develop plans for implementation of a workplace literacy program... 3) Implement a workplace literacy program for their adult employees...

4) Provide support services for a workplace literacy program including training in program management, training in teaching methodologies, diagnostic testing for learning disabilities, referral procedures, and other consulting services directly related to development and implementation of a workplace literacy program.

c) Public funds awarded under this grant program must be matched by the applicant with funds at least equal to the amount of public funds awarded. All combined funds must be used for the purpose set forth in the grant application and for which the public funds are awarded.

Section 3040.210 Definitions

"Adult Literacy Educational Provider" means an education agency, association, library, volunteer or community-based organization, or a coalition thereof which currently provides instruction in literacy to persons 16 years or older who read below a tenth (10th) grade level.

IN THE COMMUNITY OF ASSISTANCE IN WHICH IT IS OPERATED

"Adult Employee" means an individual in Illinois who has exceeded the maximum age for compulsory schooling (sixteen), is not currently enrolled in school (Article 26 of the School Code, 111. Rev. Stat. 1989 1991, ch. 122, pars. 26-1 et seq.) (105 ILCS 5/26-1 et seq.), and is employed by the business applicant.

NOTICE OF ADOPTED AMENDMENTS

No literacy program shall transfer funds within the approved grant budget in excess of 10% of the budget line item from which the funds are transferred, without the prior written approval of the State Library. Approval will be granted by the State Library when justification is shown for why the transfer is necessary and how it will affect the goals and objectives of the project. Unapproved expenditures in excess of 10% of a budget line will not be paid for by the grant.

f) Costs for purchase of consultant services will not be allowed in the proposal budget unless the specific expertise required is not available at the applicant's agency or the State Library, Office of the Secretary of State. Justification must be provided if consultant services are purchased and a complete description of the work to be performed must also be provided. The proposed consultant must be mutually acceptable to both the grantee and State Library, Office of the Secretary of State, based on the consultant's prior experience and expertise in literacy programs.

g) A literacy grant monitor shall make a minimum of one site visit to the literacy program during the fiscal year. Additional site visits may be made at the discretion of the Literacy Office (for such reasons as poor recordkeeping, fiscal irregularities, monitor's/staff's request after viewing narrative reports, request by literacy program). Literacy monitors shall evaluate program effectiveness as directed by the LAB. It shall be the responsibility of the grant monitor to:

- 1) Review the process of the budget. 2) Review the grant budget and expenditures in the project to date. 3) Verify that the project plan is being implemented according to the proposal approved by the LAB. 4) Submit a written report on the progress of the project to the State Library Literacy Office following each site visit.

Section 3040.200 Purpose

a) The Workplace Literacy Program is part of the Literacy Grant Program established by Section 7.2 of the State Library Act (111. Rev. Stat. 1989 1991, ch. 128, par. 107.2)(15 ILCS 320/7.2).

NOTICE OF ADOPTED AMENDMENTS

"Application" means the written request for a workplace literacy grant submitted to the Literacy Office, Illinois State Library, Office of the Secretary of State pursuant to this Part. Applications shall be submitted by the legal entity responsible for the disbursement of public funds.

"Association" means any organization incorporated under the General Not-for-Profit Corporation Act of 1986 comprised of members with a common purpose and having a structure in conformity with that Act.

"Business" means a private, legal entity which employs workers and is a corporation, a sole proprietorship, or a partnership.

"Coalition" means a structured cooperative effort between a library system, library or libraries, education agency or agencies, ~~and~~ community-based organization or organizations, and association or associations, or any combination thereof at the local or regional level.

"Community-based Organization" means a private or public not-for-profit organization, including volunteer organizations, located in an Illinois community, which provides services to citizens within that community and the surrounding area.

"Contractual Agency" means the ~~literacy~~ educational provider(s) with whom the business will contract to perform any or all of the services necessary for the development or implementation of a workplace literacy program.

"Diagnostic Testing" means testing methods which indicate whether an adult employee has visual, auditory, or basic learning disabilities.

"Educational Skills Assessment" means testing methods which measure the approximate grade level of education skills possessed by adult employees, including reading, writing, ~~and~~ comprehension, and computation abilities.

"Employer" means a private business, a government, or any entity employing for work purposes two or more persons not members of the employer's immediate family.

"Fiscal Year" means the fiscal year of the State of Illinois.

"Illiteracy" means the inability to read, write, ~~or~~ comprehend, and/or compute above the 9.9 grade level.

"Illiterate Employee" means an adult whose minimal skills in reading, writing, ~~or~~ comprehension, and/or computation preclude the individual from functioning in the workplace.

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"Instructional Materials" means written materials and computer software programs which are used in teaching adult employees basic reading, writing, ~~and~~ comprehension, and/or computation skills or which supplement the teaching of ~~BASIC READING AND COMPREHENSION~~ such skills.

"LAB" means the Literacy Advisory Board established by Section 7.2 of the State Library Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1989~~ 1991, ch. 128, par. 107.2)(15 ILCS 320/7.2).

"Library" means the main facility for a tax-supported public library within an Illinois library system.

"Literacy" means the ability of an individual to read, write, ~~and~~ comprehend, and/or compute above the 9.9 grade level.

"Secretary of State" means the Illinois Secretary of State.

"State Library" means the Illinois State Library, a department of the Illinois Secretary of State established pursuant to the State Library Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1989~~ 1991, ch. 128, pars. 101 et seq.)(15 ILCS 320/1).

"Workplace Literacy Program" means a structured program which provides direct instructional services in ~~literacy~~ reading, writing, comprehension, and/or computation to adult employees.

Section 3040.220 Application for Grant

- a) A request for a grant shall be submitted to the LAB Literacy Office in writing postmarked no later than April ~~1st~~ for ~~every~~ each fiscal year. Applicants shall use the forms prepared and made available by the Secretary of State for this purpose. Applications not submitted on time or on the required forms shall not be considered for funding by the LAB.
- b) Applications shall be submitted to the Literacy Office, Illinois State Library, 431 South Fourth Street, Springfield, Illinois 62701.
- c) Applications shall be reviewed by the LAB. Awards shall be made on or after July ~~1st~~ for the fiscal year then commencing.
- d) Grants shall not exceed \$10,000 to any one grant applicant.
- e) Applications must be submitted in one (1) original and fourteen (14) copies.
- f) The grant period shall be the fiscal year.

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NOTICE OF ADOPTED AMENDMENTS

- 3) Whether the business applicant has outlined evaluation methods which will produce quantifiable data regarding the results of the employee educational assessment, or the development of plans for a workplace literacy program, or the implementation of a literacy workplace program, or the support services for a workplace literacy program which have been proposed. Quantifiable data should include employees pre- and post-test scores, employee test hours, employee instructional hours, employee release hours, and employee progress as applicable.
 - 4) Whether the literacy adult educational provider with whom the business applicant will contract has experience and expertise in providing the services agreed upon, including qualified personnel and the administrative capacity to support that personnel.
 - 5) What plans are presented in the grant application to continue the program after the grant funds have been expended, if the business applicant determines there is a need.
- c) The criteria listed in subsection (b) of this Section will be evaluated and assigned point value as follows: POOR = 1 POINT, FAIR = 2 POINTS, GOOD = 3 POINTS, VERY GOOD = 4 POINTS, EXCELLENT = 5 POINTS. EQUAL PROBABLY WILL BE GIVEN TO ALL SUBSECTIONS (b)(1) = 10 points; (b)(2) = 15 points; (b)(3) = 10 points; (b)(4) = 10 points; (b)(5) = 5 points.
- d) The LAB shall not select any grant application or award any public funds to any grant applicant which:
- 1) Does not certify or state that it will comply with the Illinois Human Rights Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1989 1991, ch. 68, par. 1-101 et seq.)(775 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq.).
 - 2) Uses as its staff or management personnel persons who have been convicted of any felonies involving moral turpitude, embezzlement, theft, sexual offense, fraud, and misrepresentation under laws of the United States, Illinois, or any other state, or have been convicted of bribery in violation of Section 10.1 of the Illinois Purchasing Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1989 1991, ch. 127, par. 132.10-1)(30 ILCS 505/10.1).
 - 3) Has as its managers employees of the Office of the Secretary of State.
 - 4) Has been disqualified and had its grant cancelled in previous years for false application statements, failure to adhere to the grant plan as approved by LAB, misappropriation of funds, or any violation of this Part as determined by the Secretary.

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Section 3040.240 Award of Grant, ~~Literacy~~ Financial Reports, and ~~Final~~ Program Progress Reports

- a) The LAB will make a recommendation to the Secretary of State as to which grant applications shall be approved and the amount of public funds to be awarded to fund each grant application based upon the criteria in Section 3040.230.
- b) The LAB shall make its recommendations ~~on~~ by July 1 for each Fiscal Year.
- c) The Secretary of State shall make his or her final decision upon each recommendation as soon as possible within 60 days after the recommendation is presented to the Secretary. The Secretary of State shall approve or disapprove the recommendations of the Literacy Office based upon whether the Secretary determines the recommendations to be consistent with the State Library Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1989 1991, ch. 128, par. 105)(15 ILCS 320/5) and this Part.
- d) The final approved grant application and the funding determination shall constitute the Workplace Literacy Grant Determination, which shall be a public record, as shall be the grant applications, whether approved or not, and shall be subject to disclosure pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1989 1991, ch. 116, pars. 201 et seq.)(5 ILCS 140/1 et seq.) and the rules of the Secretary of State found at 2 Ill. Adm. Code 551.
- e) Approved grant applicants shall submit to the Literacy Office the following reports: quarterly financial reports; midterm and final program progress reports. ~~AN LITERACY FINANCIAL REPORT AND A PROGRAM PROGRESS REPORT~~
 - 1) The literacy quarterly financial reports shall state the amount of money expended to date in each line item of the approved program budget and the amount of money expended to date by the business applicant as matching funds.
 - 2) The literacy midterm and final program progress reports shall state, at least:
 - A) For an employee educational assessment, the number of employees tested, the method of testing used, the number of hours spent in testing, the results of that testing, the need for instructional services indicated as a result of that testing, if any, and the plans of the business applicant for addressing that need.
 - B) For development of plans for a workplace literacy program, the target number of employees to be served, how this number was determined, where employees will receive instruction,

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- 2) The literacy quarterly financial report shows financial irregularities, such as misappropriation or embezzlement of funds by the grant program operator and/or its employees and staff.
 - 3) The grant program fails to meet its stated goals.
 - 4) The grant program administrators are convicted of any felony or misdemeanor.
 - 5) The grant program fails to operate properly and effectively.
- Upon cancellation, the Secretary shall send a notice by certified return receipt requested mail to the grant program, which shall return all unexpended public funds to the Secretary within thirty (30) days of the date of the cancellation notice.
- c) Any public funds not returned shall be the subject of a collection action by the Attorney General of Illinois.

Section 3040.260 Other Requirements

- a) Adult literacy educational providers contracted with the business shall be subject to the terms, conditions, and requirements of Subparts A and B of this Part.

- b) Adult literacy assessment and/or instruction provided under Subpart B of this Part must be given on business applicant's premises unless exceptional circumstances prohibit this, such as lack of space for instruction or inappropriate facilities. In such instances, assessment and/or instruction in literacy must take place within a 10-mile radius of the business at a site approved by the literacy office.

- c) A literacy grant monitor shall make two a minimum of one site visits to the workplace literacy program during the fiscal year. With additional visits as requested by either the employer or the literacy office Additional site visits may be made at the request of the approved grant applicant or at the discretion of the Literacy Office (for such reasons as poor recordkeeping, fiscal irregularities, monitor's/staff's request after viewing narrative reports, request by business or literacy program). It shall be the responsibility of the grant monitor to:

- 1) Review the progress of the project.
- 2) Review the grant budget and expenditures in the project to date.
- 3) Verify that the project plan is being implemented according to the proposal approved by the LAB.

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- c) For implementation of a workplace literacy program, the number of employees served to the date of the report, the net gain in education level of each employee receiving instruction, pre- and post-test scores of each employee receiving instruction, the number of hours each employee has spent in instruction, and the amount of release time allowed employees who have received instruction.
- d) For support services provided to a workplace literacy program, the type and extent of services rendered, the number of employees served through the support services, and the impact of support services on the workplace literacy program.

- e) For all types of contractual services listed above, what has been the most positive outcome of the services, what problems, if any, have occurred in the delivery of these services, and to what extent the goals and objectives of these services have been met to the date of the report.

- 3) Failure to submit the required literacy reports shall be cause for cancellation of the grant. Grant recipients shall receive one thirty (30) day notice requesting compliance with this Section before the grant shall be cancelled.

- f) The final financial and program progress reports shall be submitted by each grant recipient to the Literacy Office on or before September 31 of each calendar year for the previous fiscal year's program.

- g) The decision of the Secretary of State upon any grant application shall be a final decision for the purpose of the Administrative Review Law (111. Rev. Stat. 1989 1991, ch. 110, par. 3-101 et seq.)(735 ILCS 5/3-101 et seq.).

15) Summary and purpose of rules: By this rulemaking, the Department implements the necessary procedures to comply with Public Act 87-1205, effective July 1, 1993. The Public Act changes the size requirements for signs in counties under 2,000,000 population and changes the spacing requirements for signs along primary highways. P.A. 87-1205 also changes the amount of the application fee. The changes in the Public Act were introduced and supported by the outdoor advertising industry without input from the Department.

This Part provides requirements for registration, application, and signs along the interstate and primary highways in Illinois. In addition, it contains requirements for the size, spacing, and other standards for outdoor advertising signs.

This rulemaking includes several new definitions, revisions to several existing definitions, changes in spacing requirements for signs on primary highways, and revisions to the application fees. Additionally, this rulemaking clarifies that outdoor advertising signs must comply with airport hazard zoning regulations promulgated by the Department. Finally, the Department is substantially changing the hearing procedures so that, instead of requiring the use of a hearing officer, a decision regarding a problem can be made by the Director of Highways or his designee.

A new illustration has been added entitled, "Public Airport Hazard Zoning in Illinois", and, statutory citations contained in this rulemaking have been updated to include cites to the Illinois Compiled Statutes in accordance with P.A. 87-1005, effective January 1, 1993.

SUBPART A: GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 522.20 Definitions

"Act" means the Highway Advertising Control Act of 1971 (Ill. Rev. Stat. ~~1987~~ 1991, ch. 121, par. 501 et seq.) [225 ILCS 440/1 et seq.].

"Air mile" means a distance of one mile as measured horizontally along a straight line between the sign and activity advertised.

"BUSINESS AREA" MEANS ANY PART OF AN AREA ADJACENT TO AND WITHIN SIX HUNDRED SIXTY FEET OF THE RIGHT-OF-WAY WHICH IS AT ANY TIME ZONED FOR BUSINESS, COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL ACTIVITIES UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF ANY LAW OF THIS STATE; OR NOT SO ZONED, BUT WHICH CONSTITUTES AN UNZONED COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL AREA. HOWEVER, AS TO SIGNS ALONG INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS, THE TERM "BUSINESS AREA" INCLUDES ONLY AREAS WHICH ARE WITHIN INCORPORATED LIMITS OF ANY CITY, VILLAGE, OR INCORPORATED TOWN, AS SUCH LIMITS EXISTED ON SEPTEMBER 21, 1959, AND WHICH ARE ZONED FOR BUSINESS, INDUSTRIAL OR COMMERCIAL USE, OR TO PORTIONS OF INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS WHICH TRAVERSE OTHER AREAS WHERE THE LAND USE, AS OF SEPTEMBER 21, 1959, WAS CLEARLY ESTABLISHED BY STATE LAW AS BUSINESS, INDUSTRIAL OR COMMERCIAL (Section 3.12 of the Act, Ill.Rev.Stat. 1979, ch. 121, par. 503.12) [225 ILCS 440/3.12]. Areas which were not specifically zoned for business, commercial or industrial use as of September 21, 1959 and were outside corporate limits on that date will not be considered business areas along Interstate highways.

"Code" means the Illinois Highway Code (Ill.Rev.Stat. 1979, ch. 121, par. 1-101 et seq.) [605 ILCS 5/101 et seq.].

"COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL ACTIVITIES," as used in the definition of "business area" and "unzoned commercial or industrial area," MEANS THOSE ACTIVITIES LOCATED WITHIN SIX HUNDRED SIXTY FEET OF THE NEAREST EDGE OF THE HIGHWAY RIGHT-OF-WAY GENERALLY RECOGNIZED AS COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL BY ZONING AUTHORITIES IN THIS STATE, such as land use devoted to commerce, industry, trade, manufacturing, highway service, highway business, warehouses, offices or similar uses, BUT for the purpose of determining unzoned commercial and industrial areas DOES NOT INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

AGRICULTURAL, FORESTRY, RANGING, GRAZING AND FARMING ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING WAYSIDE FRESH PRODUCE STANDS AND GRAIN STORAGE BINS;

RAILROAD TRACKS AND MINOR SIDINGS;

TRANSIENT OR TEMPORARY ACTIVITIES NOT INVOLVING PERMANENT BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES;

OUTDOOR ADVERTISING STRUCTURES;

ACTIVITIES NOT VISIBLE FROM A MAIN-TRAVELED WAY;

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED IN A BUILDING PRINCIPALLY USED AS A RESIDENCE (if the ground floor of the building is more than 50% residence)(Section 3.10 of the Act).

"Damaged signs" means signs which require more than fifty percent replacement of the uprights, in whole or in part.

"Department" means the Illinois Department of Transportation.

"District" means any one of the District offices of the Department's Division of Highways (see Illustration H).

"Directional signs" means signs containing directional information about public places owned or operated by Federal, State or local governments or their agencies; publicly or privately owned natural phenomena; historic, educational, cultural, scientific and religious sites; areas of natural or scenic beauty; or areas naturally suited for outdoor recreation which are deemed to be in the interest of the traveling public.

"ERECT" MEANS TO CONSTRUCT, BUILD, RAISE, ASSEMBLE, PLACE, AFFIX, ATTACH, CREATE, PAINT, DRAW OR IN ANY OTHER WAY BRING INTO BEING OR ESTABLISH; BUT DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY OF THE FOREGOING ACTIVITIES WHEN PERFORMED AS AN INCIDENT TO THE CHANGE OF ADVERTISING MESSAGE OR NORMAL MAINTENANCE OR REPAIR OF A SIGN OR SIGN STRUCTURE (Section 3.08 of the Act). Replacing more than fifty percent of the uprights, in whole or in part, or extending the height above ground, or similar activities which substantially change a sign such as anything which makes a sign more valuable; adding lighting, or making the sign bigger are examples, are not normal maintenance or repair.

"EXPRESSWAY" MEANS A PRIMARY HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTED EITHER AS A FREEWAY OR TOLLWAY WHICH HAS COMPLETE CONTROL OF ACCESS (see Illustration A) (Section 3.04 of the Act).

"Federal, State, or local law" means a Federal or State constitutional provision or statute, or an ordinance, rule or regulation enacted or adopted by a State or Federal agency or a political subdivision of a State pursuant to Federal or State constitution or statute.

"Illegal Signs" means signs not in compliance with this Part.

"Interchange" means a system of interconnecting roadways in conjunction with one or more grade separations, providing for the movement of traffic between two or more roadways on different levels.

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION
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"INTERSTATE HIGHWAY" MEANS ANY HIGHWAY, including a tollway, DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT AND APPROVED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AS A PART OF THE NATIONAL SYSTEM OF INTERSTATE AND DEFENSE HIGHWAYS. A HIGHWAY becomes A PART OF THE NATIONAL SYSTEM OF INTERSTATE AND DEFENSE HIGHWAYS UPON THE DATE OF APPROVAL OF THE ROUTE LOCATION DECISION AND THE APPROVAL OF THE ADDITION OF THE HIGHWAY TO THE NATIONAL SYSTEM OF INTERSTATE AND DEFENSE HIGHWAYS BY THE GOVERNOR AND THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (Section 3.02 of the Act).

"MAIN-TRAVELED WAY" MEANS THE TRAVELED WAY (i.e., pavement) OF A HIGHWAY ON WHICH THROUGH TRAFFIC IS CARRIED. IN THE CASE OF A DIVIDED HIGHWAY, THE TRAVELED WAY OF EACH OF THE SEPARATED ROADWAYS FOR TRAFFIC IN OPPOSITE DIRECTIONS IS A MAIN-TRAVELED WAY. IT DOES NOT INCLUDE SUCH FACILITIES AS FRONTAGE ROADS, TURNING ROADWAYS, OR PARKING AREAS (Section 3.05 of the Act).

"MAINTAIN" MEANS TO ALLOW TO EXIST (Section 3.06 of the Act) and includes the periodic changing of advertising messages, customary maintenance and repair of signs and sign structures.

"MUNICIPALITY" MEANS A CITY, VILLAGE, OR INCORPORATED TOWN IN THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, BUT, "MUNICIPAL" OR "MUNICIPALITY" DOES NOT INCLUDE A TOWNSHIP, TOWN WHEN USED AS THE EQUIVALENT OF A TOWNSHIP, INCORPORATED TOWN WHICH HAS SUPERSEDED A CIVIL TOWNSHIP, COUNTY, SCHOOL DISTRICT, PARK DISTRICT, SANITARY DISTRICT OR ANY OTHER SIMILAR GOVERNMENTAL DISTRICT (Section 3.09 of the Act).

Non-conforming sign and/or sign structure: A registered sign and/or sign structure lawfully in existence as of the effective date of the Highway Advertising Control Act (July 1, 1972), but which thereafter does not conform with the provisions of the Act. The term also includes a lawful sign and/or sign structure rendered non-conforming by its subsequently becoming subject to the terms of the Act, including but not limited to its being adjacent to a highway, and not in a business area, that subsequently comes under the control of the Act, or a sign and/or sign structure that is rendered non-conforming by subsequent amendment to the Act (except that sign and/or sign structures subject to the amendments of Section 6.01 (Size) and 6.03 (Spacing) of the Act by Public Act 87-1205 shall not be rendered non-conforming, the text of this paragraph notwithstanding). A non-conforming sign and/or sign structure may be repaired, but neither a lawfully erected conforming sign and/or sign structure nor a lawfully erected non-conforming sign and/or sign structure may be compelled to be altered or removed under this Act until just compensation is paid

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to the sign and/or sign structure owner and the owner or owners of the property on which the sign and/or sign structure is erected.

"Official notices" means service club and religious notices and public service signs.

"Official signs" means signs erected and maintained by public officers or public agencies within their territorial or zoning jurisdiction and pursuant to and in accordance with direction or authorization contained in Federal, State or local law for the purposes of carrying out an official duty or responsibility. Historical markers authorized by State law and erected by State or local government agencies or non-profit historical societies are considered official signs.

"On premise signs" means those signs which advertise activities conducted on the property on which they are located. Variety seed signs, fertilizer signs, and other agricultural product signs are not on premise signs unless at least fifty percent of the sign face is devoted to identification of the farm owner or operator. A sale or lease sign which also advertises any product or service not located upon and unrelated to the business of selling or leasing the land on which the sign is located is not an on premise sign.

"Parkland" means any publicly owned land which is designed or used as a public park, recreation area, conservation area, wildlife or waterfowl refuge or historic site.

"PRIMARY HIGHWAY" MEANS ANY HIGHWAY, OTHER THAN AN INTERSTATE HIGHWAY in existence on June 1, 1991, DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT AND APPROVED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AS A PART OF THE FEDERAL-AID PRIMARY SYSTEM. ~~A HIGHWAY becomes A PRIMARY HIGHWAY UPON THE DATE OF APPROVAL OF THE ROUTE LOCATION DECISION AND THE APPROVAL OF THE ADDITION OF THE HIGHWAY TO THE PRIMARY HIGHWAY SYSTEM BY THE GOVERNOR AND THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION~~ (Section 3.03 of the Act).

"Public utility signs" means warning signs, informational signs, notices or markers which are erected and maintained by publicly or privately owned public utilities as essential to their operations.

"Responsible Local Officials" means in urbanized areas, principal elected officials of general purpose local governments acting through the Metropolitan Planning Organization designated by the Governor; or in urban areas not within any urbanized area, principal elected officials of general purpose local governments.

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- d) Signs in business areas other than directional signs, official signs, official notices, public utility signs, or those non-business area signs described in subsections (a), (b), and (c) above. i
- e) Any nonconforming sign listed in subsections (a) - (d) which, after receiving a permit or registration, becomes a damaged sign and the owner intends to repair the sign. These signs shall require new permits but shall not require payment of a fee. i
- f) Any sign listed in subsections (a)-(d) which, after receiving a permit or a registration, is enlarged or extended by the sign owner. These signs shall require new permits and payment of the application fee.

Section 522.50 Permit Application Contents

- a) The permit application shall be a form prescribed by the Department. The application shall require the applicant to provide specific information necessary for the District to determine whether a permit should be issued.
- b) The following additional documentation shall be attached to the permit application:
 - 1) Verification as to the zoning classification for the proposed sign location. For proposed signs along Interstate highways, the documentation shall show whether the site lies within incorporated limits as they existed on September 21, 1959, and, if not, the land use as it was zoned on September 21, 1959. If the site was not zoned on September 21, 1959, or is not zoned now, this shall be stated.
 - A) Verification of zoning classification will consist of an ordinance, certification by the current zoning official or any other documentation which shows the zoning classification.
 - B) Zoning must be comprehensive. Signs will not be permitted on spot zoned land on which the only possible commercial or industrial use is outdoor advertising.
 - 2) A site drawing of the proposed location. The site drawing for business area signs other than on premise signs and signs that advertise the sale or lease of property on which

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they are located, shall contain at least the following information for signs to be erected outside of the counties of Cook, DuPage, Lake, McHenry, Kane, and Will:

- A) The exact location of the proposed sign.
- B) The distance as measured along the edge of the highway pavement between the proposed sign and the nearest existing sign(s) other than on premise signs and signs that advertise the sale or lease of property on which they are located, whether illegal or legal as long as the sign(s) is visible from any place on the main traveled way of the highway regardless of which highway the sign's message is primarily intended to face and, in urban areas, is within 660 feet of the nearest edge of the highway right-of-way. Measured distances between the proposed sign and the nearest existing sign shall be as prescribed in the table in subsection (b)(3).
- C) The distance between the proposed sign and the nearest edge of the highway right-of-way.
- D) For signs located along interstate highways or expressways outside incorporated municipalities, the distance between the proposed sign and the beginning or ending of pavement widening for any interchange within six hundred feet.
- 3) For signs with ~~facings~~ display area in excess of one hundred fifty square feet located in the counties of Cook, DuPage, Lake, McHenry, Kane and Will, the site drawing shall contain all of the information required in subsection (b)(2) above, and in addition shall be prepared or approved by a land surveyor ~~registered with~~ licensed by the State of Illinois and shall show measured distances between the proposed sign and the nearest existing sign according to the following table:

- 4) For signs with ~~facings~~ display area in excess of one hundred fifty square feet, a current title commitment or other evidence of title showing ownership of the proposed site.

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c) The applicant shall certify that all of the information provided is true and accurate.

Section 522.80 Denial of Application

a) If a review of the application or a site investigation reveals that the permit application is incomplete, contains incorrect information or is not in compliance with the requirements of the Act or this Part, then the District shall notify the applicant in writing by certified mail of its intent to deny the permit application and state the reasons for that action. The notification shall inform the applicant that he/she has thirty calendar days from the date of receipt of the notification to challenge the intent to deny or to correct the deficiencies noted. No time extensions will be permitted. The challenge shall be made in writing, state the position of the applicant, the facts in support of that position and shall contain any relevant documentation. ~~he cares to provide.~~ The challenge must be received in the District office within the thirty day period. The District will review the challenge and shall either approve or deny the application based on the requirements of this Part. No appeal may be taken from the District's decision on the challenged application. The applicant's priority will be retained pending the District's final decision.

b) If, after consideration of the challenge, the District approves the application, the procedures in Section 522.70 shall apply. If, after consideration of the challenge, the District denies the application, it shall be marked "denied" on its face and the reason for denial stated on the application. The District shall notify the permittee of the denial by sending ~~him~~ a copy of the denied application and refunding the ~~permit~~ application fee.

c) The permittee shall be deemed to have waived ~~the~~ the right to challenge if the challenge is not filed in the time specified ~~in~~ in subsection (a) above. In such case, the application will be denied and be processed in the same manner as an application denied with a challenge.

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5) Whenever the applicant does not own the proposed site, a fully executed site lease or other proof of consent to erect and maintain a sign on the site. Leases shall contain all riders. Rents need not be shown. All changes made to the lease or consent which are related to the requirements of this Part shall also be submitted to the District. Whenever the lease or consent is not signed by the property owner, proof of authority shall also be provided.

6) For on-premise signs, a plat or survey shall be provided showing the location of the sign, the location of the activity being advertised, and the distance to the nearest edge of the highway right-of-way.

7) For signs that advertise the sale or lease of property on which they are located, a site drawing shall be provided showing the location of the sign and the distance to the nearest edge of the highway right-of-way.

8) For signs described by Section 522.210, the distance in air miles between the proposed sign and the activity advertised. A copy of written notice by the applicant to the municipality where the sign is to be located, or to the county where the sign is to be located in an unincorporated area, of the fact that an application has been filed with the Department. A copy of the completed application form shall be forwarded to the municipality or county.

10) Remittance of the ~~permit~~ application fee by check or money order in the amount of ~~\$5.00~~ payable to the Treasurer of the State of Illinois. AS OF JULY 1, 1993, THE APPLICATION FEE SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:

A) FOR SIGNS OF LESS THAN 150 SQUARE FEET, \$50;

B) FOR SIGNS OF AT LEAST 150 BUT LESS THAN 300 SQUARE FEET, \$100;

C) FOR SIGNS OF 300 OR MORE SQUARE FEET, \$200 (Section 440/8 of the Highway Advertising Control Act of 1971)

(11). Rev. Stat. 1991, ch. 121, par. 508, as amended by P.A. 87-1205, effective July 1, 1993) [225 ILCS 440/8].

The square feet shall be measured by the smallest square, rectangle, triangle, circle, or combination thereof which will encompass the entire display area. If one side of the sign provides for more display area than another, the measurements will be made on the larger side.

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- a) The Reply shall be made to the appropriate District in writing and received at that office within the thirty day period. No time extensions will be permitted. The Reply shall specifically state one of the following:
- 1) That the sign has been removed. In such case, evidence of the removal (an affidavit or photograph) shall be submitted with the Reply.
 - 2) That the problem cited in the Notice of Intent to Revoke has been corrected or that measures to correct the problem will be undertaken in the manner and within the times set forth in the Reply. Evidence of the correction (an affidavit or photograph) shall be submitted with the Reply.
 - 3) That a dispute exists and a ~~hearing~~ review is requested.
- b) If the permittee fails to reply or to reply within the thirty day period, the Notice shall constitute the "30 day letter" as provided for in Section 522.140 and shall have the same force and effect as same.
- c) If the evidence submitted with the Reply shows that the sign has been removed, then the District will notify the permittee that the permit is revoked.
- d) If the evidence shows that the permittee has corrected the problem, the District will so notify the permittee and the Notice shall be considered null and void.
- e) If the District finds that the evidence submitted with the Reply fails to show that the sign has been removed or that no measures have been taken or proposed to correct the problem, and no ~~hearing~~ review is requested; then the District will issue a "30 day letter" in accordance with Section 522.140.

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- ~~compliance with the contested case procedures in Sections 10-16 of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1987, ch. 127, pars. 1010-1016).~~
- ~~2) The Hearing Officer shall set a hearing date not less than fifteen or more than sixty days after his appointment. The Hearing Officer shall notify the permittee in writing of the time, date and location of the hearing.~~
 - ~~3) All hearings shall be stenographically recorded and a transcript prepared by a certified court reporter at the permittee's expense.~~
 - ~~4) The permittee may appear personally or by representative at the hearing and present evidence in his behalf or he may waive his right to appear personally or by representative at the hearing and request that the Hearing Officer make his decision after considering written submittals.~~
 - ~~5) Failure of the permittee or his representative to personally appear at the hearing without giving notice shall result in a ruling by the Hearing Officer that the allegation or allegations as set forth in the Notice of Intent to Revoke Permit are true, correct and proven.~~

 - ~~2) The appeal shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Department. The appeal shall state the appealing party's position which shall be limited to ten pages. The appeal shall be based on the record of the proceedings before the Hearing Officer, and no new evidence may be submitted on appeal. No oral argument shall be available except at the request of the Secretary or his duly appointed designee.~~

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~~3) The Secretary or his duly appointed designee shall issue a decision based on the record before the hearing officer and shall notify the parties in writing of the decision. The decision of the Secretary shall be considered final and binding on the parties.~~

~~c) Departmental Action following Hearing~~

~~If a sign has been found to be unlawful by the hearing officer and no appeal has been taken or if the sign is declared to be unlawful by the Secretary after appeal, then the Department shall issue a "30 day letter" as provided in Section 522.140.~~

a) Proceedings

1) In response to the timely receipt of the Reply requesting a review, the District shall notify the Director of Highways within ten days that a Review Request has been received. A copy of the notification shall also be sent to the permittee. The District and the permittee shall submit, to the Director of Highways or designee, written arguments supporting their positions within thirty days of the Review Request being received by the Director of Highways.

A) Written arguments should contain proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law.

B) Written rebuttal arguments will not be considered unless they are submitted within 15 days of receipt of the opposing side's written arguments and a copy is sent to the opposing side.

C) The Director of Highways or designee may hold a conference if it is necessary to adjudicate conflicting facts or to simplify relevant issues. Conferences may be held in person or by telephone.

3) Within thirty days after receipt of arguments and exhibits and a conference, if one is held, the Director of Highways or designee shall render the decision and promptly notify the District and the permittee in writing by certified mail of the decision.

A) The decision will be based on the written arguments, the fact finding conference, and relevant exhibits.

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B) All ex parte communications with the Director of Highways or designee pertaining to the Review will be promptly summarized and communicated in writing to the uninformed party(ies).

4) If the permittee fails to submit written arguments or does not submit them within the thirty day period, the resultant decision will be that the allegation or allegations as set forth in the Notice of Intent to Revoke Permit are true, correct, and proven.

5) If the District fails to submit written arguments or does not submit them within the thirty day period, the resultant decision will be that the allegation or allegations as set forth in the Notice of Intent to Revoke Permit are unproven.

b) Departmental Action following Review

1) If a sign has been found to be unlawful, the Department shall issue a "30 day letter" as provided in Section 522.140.

2) If a sign has been found to be in compliance with this Part, the permit will be considered lawful.

3) If the Director of Highways or designee finds that insufficient information has been provided, he/she shall direct the parties to supply the needed information so that a decision can be rendered.

SUBPART D: STANDARDS FOR SIGNS

Section 522.150 Signs that may not be Erected or Maintained

The following signs shall not be erected or maintained:

a) Signs located within the right-of-way of an Interstate or primary highway or on any STRUCTURE, WIRE, CABLE, OR OTHER DEVICE OVER OR ABOVE an Interstate or primary highway right-of-way EXCEPT the following:

1) SIGNS DESIGNATING THE NAME OF THE RAILROAD which owns the bridge.

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- 2) SIGNS DESIGNATING THE CLEARANCE PROVIDED (Sections 9-112.1 and 9-112.2 of the Code) by the bridge.
 - 3) Public utility signs.
 - 4) Signs required by the Code.
 - 5) Signs required by the Illinois Vehicle Code (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1987-91, ch. 95 1/2, pars. 1-100 et seq.) [625 ILCS 5/1-100 et seq.].
 - 6) Signs, displays and devices giving specific information in the interest of the traveling public erected and maintained by the Department or by the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority.
- b) Signs which ATTEMPT OR APPEAR TO ATTEMPT TO DIRECT THE MOVEMENT OF TRAFFIC or which contain WORDING, COLOR OR SHAPE WHICH IS SIMILAR TO OFFICIAL TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNS OR OTHER TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES (Section 9-112.2 of the Code) as described in the Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (92 Ill. Adm. Code 546).
- c) Signs WHICH CONTAIN OSCILLATING, ROTATING, FLASHING, INTERMITTENT OR MOVING LIGHT OR LIGHTS (Section 9-112.2 of the Code), except the following:
- 1) Signs GIVING PUBLIC SERVICE INFORMATION including but not limited to TIME, WEATHER, DATE AND TEMPERATURE (Section 6.02(a) of the Act) and signs with displays that change not more frequently than once every ~~twenty four hours~~ 60 minutes.
 - 2) POLE SUPPORTED BUSINESS OR BRAND IDENTIFICATION SIGNS inside business areas WITH CONSTANT ILLUMINATION AND COLOR AND IN WHICH THE ONLY MOVEMENT IS A SLOW ROTATION OF THE ENTIRE BODY OF THE SIGN SO AS TO BE VISIBLE FROM ALL DIRECTIONS (Section 9-112.2 of the Code).
 - 3) On premise signs which comply with Section 522.190(j).
- d) Signs which are ERECTED, PAINTED OR DRAWN UPON TREES, ROCKS OR OTHER NATURAL FEATURES (Section 5 of the Act).
- e) Signs which are obsolete (i.e., advertises something that is no longer there) or STRUCTURALLY UNSAFE OR IN DISREPAIR (Section 5 of the Act), unless such structural conditions may be repaired in accordance with the provisions of the Act, and the sign owner agrees in writing to make the repairs within 30 days after receipt of the notice to remove.

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- f) Signs which project BEAMS OR RAYS OF LIGHT AT THE travelled WAY of a State highway or cause such beams or rays to create GLARE OR to IMPAIR THE VISION OF A DRIVER OF ANY MOTOR VEHICLE (Section 6.02(b) of the Act).
- g) SIGNS WHICH ARE LOCATED WITHIN 1,000 FEET OF OFFICIAL TRAFFIC SIGNS, SIGNALS, OR DEVICES AND OBSCURE OR INTERFERE WITH A DRIVER'S VIEW OF SUCH SIGN, SIGNAL OR DEVICE (Section 6.03(a) of the Act).
- h) SIGNS WHICH ARE LOCATED WITHIN 1,000 FEET OF APPROACHING, MERGING OR INTERSECTING TRAFFIC AND OBSCURE OR INTERFERE WITH A DRIVER'S VIEW OF SUCH TRAFFIC (Section 6.03(a) of the Act).
- i) Signs which require a permit for erection or registration under this Part and for which no permit or registration has been issued.
- j) Signs which advertise activities that are illegal under Federal, State or local law in effect at the location of those signs or activities. ~~(for example, gambling casinos, betting parlors, drugs).~~
- k) Signs which contain any ANIMATED OR MOVING PARTS (Section 4.02(g) of the Act).
- l) Signs which violate airport hazard zoning regulations adopted by the Department pursuant to the Airport Zoning Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991, ch. 15 1/2, par. 48.1 et seq.) [620 ILCS 25/1 et seq.] See Illustration J.

Section 522.200 Standards for Signs in Business Areas

In addition to the standards set forth in Section 522.150, the following standards are applicable to signs in business areas:

- a) NO such SIGN MAY BE ERECTED WHICH EXCEEDS THIRTY FEET IN HEIGHT, SIXTY FEET IN LENGTH, AND 1200 SQUARE FEET IN display AREA ON EACH SIDE INCLUDING BORDER AND TRIM BUT EXCLUDING ORNAMENTAL BASE OR APRON, SUPPORTS AND OTHER STRUCTURAL MEMBERS, MEASURED BY THE SMALLEST SQUARE, RECTANGLE, TRIANGLE, CIRCLE, OR COMBINATION THEREOF WHICH WILL ENCOMPASS THE ENTIRE ~~SIGN~~ display area (Section 6.01 of the Act). No temporary extensions, cut-outs or ornamentation is allowed which enlarges a sign beyond 1200 square feet as measured herein. EXCEPT WITH RESPECT TO REPAIR, REBUILDING, OR REPLACEMENT OF ANY SIGN LAWFULLY ERECTED BEFORE July 1, 1993, NO such SIGN MAY BE ERECTED IN ANY COUNTY WITH A

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POPULATION UNDER 2,000,000 THAT EXCEEDS 800 SQUARE FEET IN SURFACE AREA PER SIDE EXCLUDING EXTENSIONS AND CUT-OUTS. THE EXTENSIONS AND CUT-OUTS MAY ACCOUNT FOR NO MORE THAN AN ADDITIONAL 20% IN SIGN SURFACE AREA PER SIDE. (Section 6.01 of the Highway Advertising Control Act of 1971 (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1991, ch. 121, par. 506.01, as amended by P.A. 87-1205, effective July 1, 1993) 225 ILCS 440/6.01, as amended by P.A. 87-1205, effective July 1, 1993)

b) No more than two such signs may be erected in a facing with such facing not to exceed the size limitation stated in subsection (a) above.

c) SUCH SIGNS MAY BE DOUBLE FACED OR PLACED BACK TO BACK OR CONSTRUCTED IN A V-TYPE AS LONG AS THE ANGLE CREATED IS LESS THAN NINETY DEGREES (Section 6.01 of the Act).

d) No such sign may be erected along the same side of an interstate highway or expressway within five hundred feet of another such sign structure or location where another such sign has been permitted but not yet erected.

e) EXCEPT WITH RESPECT TO REPAIR, REBUILDING, OR REPLACEMENT OF ANY SIGN LAWFULLY ERRECTED BEFORE JULY 1, 1993 (Section 6.01 of the Act, as amended by P.A. 87-1205, effective July 1, 1993) ~~when~~ located outside of any incorporated municipality, no such sign may be erected along the same side of a primary highway within ~~three~~ five hundred feet of another such sign structure or a location where another such sign has been permitted but not yet erected.

f) EXCEPT WITH RESPECT TO REPAIR, REBUILDING, OR REPLACEMENT OF ANY SIGN LAWFULLY ERRECTED BEFORE JULY 1, 1993 (Section 6.01 of the Act, as amended by P.A. 87-1205, effective July 1, 1993), ~~when~~ located inside of any incorporated municipality, no such sign may be erected along the same side of a primary highway within ~~one~~ three hundred feet of another such sign structure or a location where another such sign has been permitted but not yet erected.

g) THE SPACING REQUIREMENTS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTIONS (d), (e) AND (f) ABOVE SHALL NOT APPLY TO SIGNS WHERE THE SIGN STRUCTURES ARE COMPLETELY SEPARATED OR SCREENED BY BUILDINGS, NATURAL SURROUNDINGS OR OTHER OBSTRUCTIONS IN SUCH MANNER THAT ONLY ONE SIGN FACING LOCATED WITHIN SUCH DISTANCE IS VISIBLE AT ANY ONE TIME (Section 6.03(b) of the Act). A sign structure cannot be construed as an obstruction of a sign.

h) The spacing requirements described in subsections (d), (e) and (f) above shall be measured along the edge of the pavement of the highway between the points of each sign structure which lie

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Closest to the highway pavement but in no event shall the distance between signs be less than the required spacing. (See Illustrations D-G) Signs visible from two or more highways must be considered in spacing measurements along all such highways. Any sign which has received a permit or a registration shall be included in spacing measurements whether or not the permit or registration has been revoked as long as the sign is visible from any place on the main traveled way of the highway.

i) Outside of an incorporated municipality, NO SIGN STRUCTURE MAY BE ERRECTED ALONG AN INTERSTATE HIGHWAY OR EXPRESSWAY ADJACENT TO OR WITHIN FIVE HUNDRED FEET OF AN INTERCHANGE, REST AREA OR WEIGH STATION, SUCH FIVE HUNDRED FEET TO BE MEASURED ALONG THE MAIN TRAVELED WAY FROM THE BEGINNING OR ENDING OF PAVEMENT WIDENING AT THE EXIT FROM OR ENTRANCE TO THE MAIN TRAVELED WAY (Section 6.03(c) of the Act) (see Illustration C).

j) The requirements of this Section SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO APPLY TO OR TO IMPOSE ADDITIONAL LIMITATIONS ON DIRECTIONAL SIGNS, OFFICIAL SIGNS, OFFICIAL NOTICES, PUBLIC UTILITY SIGNS, SIGNS ADVERTISING THE SALE OR LEASE OF PROPERTY ON WHICH THEY ARE LOCATED, OR ON PREMISE SIGNS NOR SHALL SUCH SIGNS BE COUNTED NOR SHALL MEASUREMENTS BE MADE FROM THEM FOR PURPOSES OF DETERMINING COMPLIANCE WITH (Section 6.04 of the Act) subsections (d), (e) and (f) above.

Section 522.210 Standards for Signs Providing Information Relative to Lodging, Food, Outdoor Recreational Facilities or Automotive Service Facilities

In addition to the standards set forth in Sections 522.150 and 522.200, the following standards apply to signs providing INFORMATION RELATIVE TO LODGING, FOOD, OUTDOOR RECREATIONAL FACILITIES OR AUTOMOTIVE SERVICE FACILITIES (Section 4.07 of the Act).

a) Such signs may be erected and maintained WITHIN SIX HUNDRED SIXTY FEET FROM THE EDGE OF THE HIGHWAY RIGHT-OF-WAY WITHIN TWELVE AIR MILES (Section 4.07 of the Act) from the advertised activity in the following areas:

1) In business areas.

2) ALONG INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS IN AREAS WHICH AT ANY TIME ARE ZONEO FOR COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL ACTIVITIES.

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3) ALONG INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS IN UNZONED COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL AREAS.

- b) NO SUCH SIGN SHALL BE ERECTED OR MAINTAINED WITHIN TWO MILES APPROACHING OR WITHIN 1000 FEET BEYOND AN INTERCHANGE. (Such distances shall be measured along the main traveled way from the beginning or ending of pavement widening at the exit from or entrance to the main traveled way.)
- c) ONLY SIX SUCH SIGNS MAY BE ERECTED OR MAINTAINED WITHIN TWO TO FIVE MILES APPROACHING AN INTERCHANGE. (Such distances shall be measured along the main traveled way from the beginning or ending of pavement widening at the exit from or entrance to the main traveled way.)
- d) AN AVERAGE OF ONLY ONE such SIGN PER MILE MAY BE ERECTED OR MAINTAINED MORE THAN FIVE MILES APPROACHING AN INTERCHANGE. (Such distances shall be measured along the main traveled way from the beginning or ending of pavement widening at the exit from or entrance to the main traveled way.)
- e) NOT MORE THAN TWO SUCH SIGNS WILL BE PERMITTED WITHIN ANY MILE DISTANCE MEASURED FROM ANY POINT, AND NO SUCH SIGNS WILL BE PERMITTED TO BE LESS THAN 1000 FEET APART (Section 4.07(a)-(f) of the Act).
- f) No such sign may EXCEED twenty feet in length, width or height or ONE HUNDRED FIFTY SQUARE FEET in area, including border and trim, but excluding supports (Section 4.03(c) of the Act).
- g) THERE MAY NOT BE MORE THAN ONE SUCH SIGN DESIGNED TO ATTRACT TRAFFIC ON an INTERSTATE HIGHWAY PROCEEDING IN ANY ONE DIRECTION (Section 4.03(a) of the Act).
- h) The limitations contained in subsections (b),(c),(d),(e) and (g) above shall be applied against signs based on the direction of travel they are intended to face.

The Illinois Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act (ch. 56 1/2, par. 503.14)[410 ILCS 620/3.13] and the Administrative Procedure Act (ch. 127, par. 1005.02)[5 ICLS 100/5-45], as amended by Public Act 87-1237, specifically authorize the Department to implement this rulemaking pursuant to emergency rulemaking.

Through this emergency rulemaking, the Illinois Department of Public Health amends various sections of the Illinois Formulary for the Drug Product Selection Program. The Department proposes to promulgate administrative procedures for the Drug Product Selection Program, however, the actual list of products approved for drug product selection need not be promulgated.

Revisions to and single copies of the the drug formulary shall be provided to pharmacies at no charge. Upon request, licensed prescribers, student pharmacists and pharmacists practicing pharmacy in this state under a reciprocal license shall be provided a single copy at no charge.

The Department shall offer a subscription to the drug formulary and its revisions to other interested parties at a fee of \$50.00 per year. All subscription fees collected by the Department shall be deposited into the Food and Drug Safety Fund. Subject to appropriation by the General Assembly, moneys deposited in the fund shall be made available to the Department of Public Health to administer the Drug Product Selection Program or for other activities related to food and drug safety or drug product selection.

The Department has also revised the procedural requirements for data submission for those drug products to be considered for inclusion in the Illinois Formulary. This rulemaking requires drug manufacturers to make their initial data submission 28 days (previously 21 days) in advance of the regularly scheduled quarterly meeting. It extends the comment period for manufacturers to respond to each other's data submissions by an additional 7 days (the innovator can respond to the generic petition within 7 days, both sides can comment for an additional seven days beyond that point in time. This is also the appropriate time interval for Council members to ask for additional data, enhancement of previously submitted data, or clarification of data presented.) Revision of the data submission schedule should allow

adequate information exchange prior to the actual meeting, and should allow the Technical Advisory Council adequate time to review the data prior to the meeting.

SUBPART A: GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 790.20 Introduction
EMERGENCY

a) The Illinois Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act (410 ILCS 620/3.13, formerly III. Rev. Stat. 1987, Ch. 56 1/2, par. 503.14) allows interchange of different brands or nonbrands of the same generic drug entity for a drug product prescribed by a specific trade name. Products selected for interchange must be pharmaceutically equivalent to the prescribed product and must be listed in a positive drug product formulary known as the Illinois Formulary which has been developed, maintained and issued by the Illinois Department of Public Health (hereinafter referred to as the "Department"). The practice of selecting an equivalent drug product from the Illinois Formulary to dispense instead of the trade name product prescribed is known as Drug Product Selection (DPS).

b) The initial issue of the Illinois Formulary for use in Drug Product Selection became effective on July 1, 1978. Periodic updates to the Illinois Formulary will be distributed by the Department of Public Health. Single copies of the Illinois Formulary shall be provided to all licensed pharmacies, physicians, and pharmacists with Illinois addresses. Upon request, single copies of the Illinois Formulary will be provided, at no charge, to licensed prescribers, pharmacists practicing their profession in Illinois, to pharmacists seeking reciprocation,

Section 790.40 Consideration of Drug Products for Inclusion in the Illinois Formulary
EMERGENCY

- a) Drug products for inclusion in the Illinois Formulary shall be approved and recommended to the Director, Illinois Department of Public Health, by a Technical Advisory Council composed of seven members, each of who has extensive experience in pharmaceutical affairs. Products for Council consideration shall be researched and presented by Departmental staff following consideration of recommendations by the Federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA), of recognized drug reference sources, of published research, and of qualified consultants.
- b) No product shall be considered for inclusion in the Illinois Formulary unless each individual dosage form, dosage strength and manufacturer has been recommended for drug product selection use by the FDA. Each product considered must be verified by the FDA as being marketed under currently approved drug applications, as meeting required manufacturing standards and chemical identity standards, and as being cleared of any issues involving the bioequivalence or bioavailability of the product. Prior to being sanctioned for DPS use, the product must pass FDA criteria specific for DPS approval which may be more stringent than that required for general marketing approval.
- c) Products in generic entities (as described in Section 790.100 of this Part) never previously reviewed in any manner shall be ineligible for consideration at Technical Advisory Council meetings if the products' FDA approval date is 30 or fewer days prior to the scheduled Technical Advisory Council meeting. Such entities initial review shall be deferred to the next scheduled Technical Advisory Council meeting.

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- d) Manufacturers of products in generic entities never previously reviewed in any manner, or items under further consideration by the Technical Advisory Council, for whatever reason, shall comply with the following criteria to be allowed to address the Council:

- 1) Eight copies of testimony and eight copies of any and all data upon which comment or reference to may be made, whether published or unpublished, shall be submitted, in writing, to the following address no later than ~~24~~ 28 calendar days prior to the regularly scheduled quarterly meeting of the Technical Advisory Council.

- 2) The Department shall notify all other manufacturers of products within a specific generic entity that a petition for review has been received within the time frame specified in this Section. Such manufacturers shall provide 8 copies of testimony and eight copies of any and all data upon which comment or reference to may be made, whether published or unpublished, in writing, to the Department within ~~14~~ 21 days of the regularly scheduled meeting should they wish to make presentation on the specific issue at the Council meeting. Eight copies of any and all rebuttal comments from any concerned manufacturer shall be submitted, in writing, to the Department within 14 days of the regularly scheduled meeting, should a company wish to respond to its competitor's submission.
- 3) Each manufacturer shall be limited to a 20 minute presentation, irrespective of their number of speakers. Additional time shall be available to answer specific questions of the Technical Advisory Council members, if necessary.
- e) Failure to comply with these criteria shall result in the exclusion of the speaker(s) from the agenda.
