Post-Visit Lesson

Summary

This lesson is a follow up to the Old Governor's pre-visit lesson and a field trip to the museum. It builds off of the Greek architecture topics already introduced by comparing the Parthenon, Old Governor's Mansion, and the US Capitol Building and it extends the learning opportunities of the field trip to the classroom..

Assessments	Students will complete a worksheet comparing the Parthenon, The Old Governor's Mansion, and the US Capitol Building. Students will identify the different Greek architectural features the Parthenon, The Old Governor's Mansion, and the US Capitol Building in a worksheet.
Procedure: Introduction	 Review what students learned about Greek architecture so far Class discussion over saw on the field trip to The Old Governor's Mansion What did you see? How did it remind you of Ancient Greece?
Procedure: Body	 We have learned about three styles of Greek architecture: Doric, Ionic, and Corinthian. A main feature of Greek architecture is columns. a. Review pictures of the three types b. What did the columns look like at The Old Governor's Mansion? Not only did the United States borrow the Greek's building style but we also borrowed some ideas for our own government. The Greeks had an early form of democracy where they elected leaders chosen by the people.
