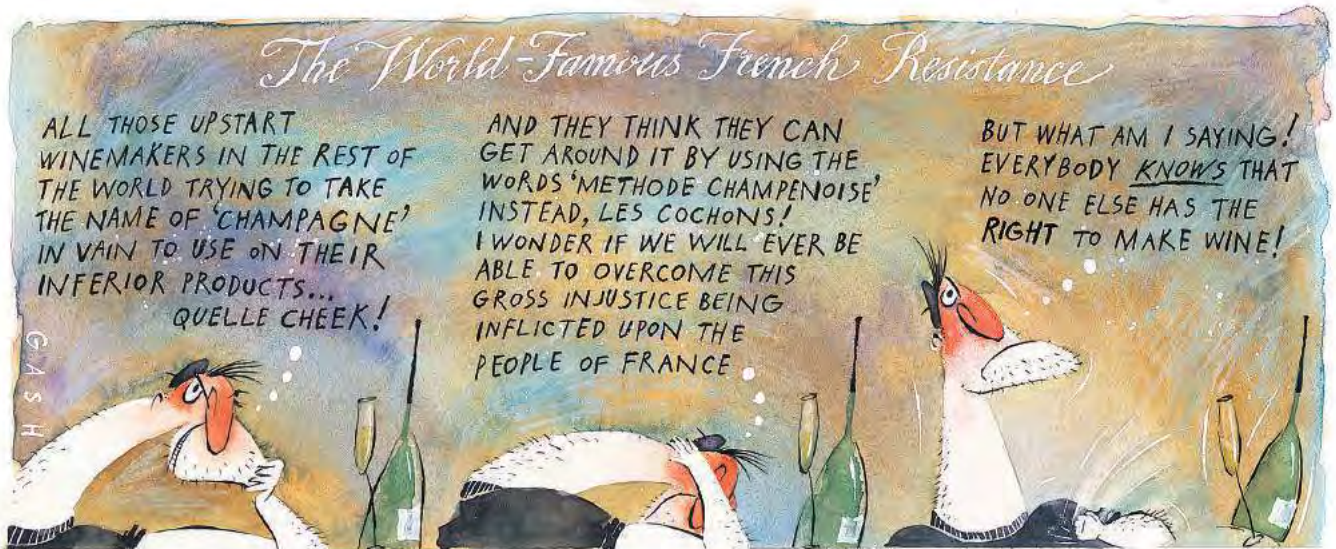

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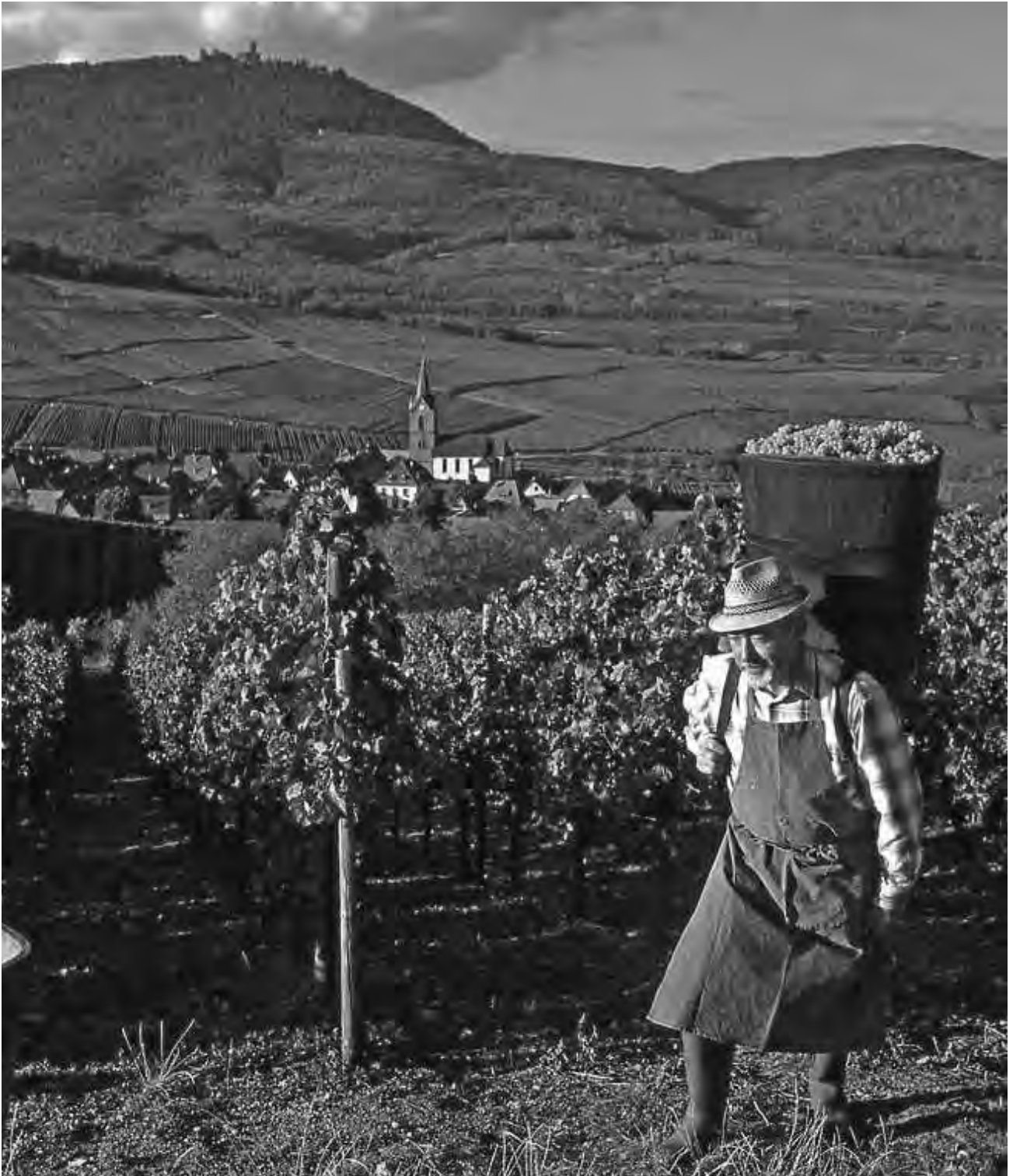

Gisselbrecht

Alsatian Pinot Gris is an entirely different breed to the New Zealand versions of this intriguing, pink-skinned variety. While some of our local offerings can perhaps hint at the delights on offer from Alsace, it is producers like Gisselbrecht who know how to deliver the complexity and astounding richness that the grape is capable of. They have a bit of an advantage, their family having made wine in Alsace since the 1600's. Indeed, they know their 17 hectares intimately. Great Alsatian aromatic wines like the ones produced by Gisselbrecht tend to be thickly textured expressions of their respective grape varieties, a thrilling collision of honeyed richness and flinty minerality, the result of a unique terroir and an attention to detail that only centuries of tradition can deliver.

Domaine Josmeyer

When it comes to aromatic wines, no one does it better than the inhabitants of Alsace. Founded in 1854 by Aloyse Meyer, Josmeyer is the jewel in our Alsatian range, biodynamic producers operating at the highest level, producing dazzling aromatic wines with a purity others can only aspire to. Five generations in, the Josmeyer Domaine covers an area of 25 hectares, of which five are on the slopes of the A.O.C. Grand Cru Brand and Hengst vineyards. Their superb, entry-level Pinot Gris sets the benchmark, its deliciously textured peach and honey characters travelling an endless and seamless arc across your tastebuds. And if you're feeling flush, the Grand Crus are simply off the planet.

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Domaine Louis Sipp

During World War I, while her husband Louis was away serving at the Russian front, the proactive Louise Sipp purchased the Domaine's first vineyard plots around the Alsatian commune of Ribeauvillé, and by 1920 this budding winery had won its first awards. No slouches themselves, Louis and his son Auguste expanded the business between Wars I and II, digging deep cellars and establishing a new processing plant. After the cessation of hostilities, the cellars were expanded and further vineyard parcels were acquired, making it the largest winegrowing Domain in Ribeauvillé. Today the Domaine is managed by Louis' great grandson Etienne, who has converted the operation to organic production. The company combines traditional methods with modern equipment, the grapes all hand harvested and the wines produced from local wild yeasts. The resulting expressions display great finesse and a true affinity for their Ribeauvillé terroir. One of Alsace's top producers, Louis Sipp are renowned for delivering some of the region's best value.

Château Potensac

Château Potensac is one of the three estates owned by the Delon family, with the other two being Château Leoville Las Cases in Saint Julien and Château Nenin in Pomerol. This estate has always been handed down by women in the family. Château Potensac is currently owned by Jean-Hubert Delon, who inherited the estate from his grandmother. Château Potensac is located on a high point in North Medoc. The vineyard is over 84 hectares, on mainly hilly mounds with a limestone subsoil covered with clay and gravel. Some of the Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc vines on the estate are over 80 years old.

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Château Poujeaux

Along with Château Chasse-Spleen this is the most highly regarded wine in the Moulis-en-Médoc area. Its history can be traced back to the 16th Century, when it was under the same ownership as Château Latour. The property suffered over time from a surfeit of sales and was broken up in the early 20th Century. Thanks to the ministrations of the Theil family, from 1921 on that situation was reversed, with the Theils doing much to endow the wine with an elevated reputation. Poujeaux was eventually purchased in 2008 by Clos Fourtet owners, the Cuvelier family. With consultant Stéphane Deroncourt on hand, Philippe Cuvelier and his son Matthieu are maintaining the wine's traditionally generous but delicate style while raising the property's potential for excellence through modernisation and sustainable viticultural practices. Organic farming is now used with lower yields, and they are also experimenting with biodynamics. The make-up is 50% Cabernet Sauvignon, 40% Merlot, 5 % Cabernet Franc and 5% Petit Verdot. One of the best value wines on the Left Bank.

It just seems a bit "lost" at the moment. Tasted twice with consistent notes."

Château Cantemerle

With a majestic courtyard, neoclassical architecture and cutting edge technology, Château Cantemerle is a Château of perfect harmony. Located in the Haut-Médoc appellation, the Cantemerle's vines produce complex, balanced and refined wines. The vineyard has 94 hectares planted and 91 hectares in production, with an average vine 30 years old. The winery is home to three thermo chests with a total capacity of 8000 hectolitres, a wooden vat with a 3400 hectolitre capacity for old vines, a stainless steel vat with a 2200 hectolitre capacity for young vines and a cement vat with a 2400 hectolitre capacity for blends.

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Château Sociando-Mallet

Château Sociando-Mallet is located in the Haut-Médoc, in the commune of Saint-Seurin-de-Cadourne. The 57 hectares of vineyards are planted in 60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 25% Merlot, 25% Cabernet Franc and 5% Petit Verdot. Owned for the last 20 years by Jean Gautreau, the quality here has been on the up ever since he took the helm.

Château Cos d'Estournel

Often referred to as a Super Second (Growth), with a long and distinguished history in the Saint-Estèphe appellation. This is largely due to M. Gaspard d'Estournel, the 'Maharajah of Saint-Estèphe' who founded the estate in 1811. It wasn't long before the château was well-known to wine lovers all over the world, not least because of its famous pagoda design, built to celebrate the wine's presence in India. Recently a complete renovation of Cos d'Estournel took place across the whole business. While Cos d'Estournel may not have been as consistent as it could have been in the past, it is now making one of the most exciting wines in modern-day Bordeaux. The wines are big, concentrated and full bodied with a finely-judged balance.

In the mouth, the wine is slightly more compact than one would find in a great vintage, such as 2009 and 2010, but it has impressive richness for the vintage as well as light to moderate tannin and admirable purity. It will benefit from 2-5 years of cellaring, and should keep for 15-20 years. Only 30% of the production was utilized for Cos D'Estournel, a blend of 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot and 5% Cabernet Franc." - April 2014		

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Chateau Meyney

Chateau Meyney is one of the oldest estates in the Medoc. In 1662, it was a Convent mentioned in records under the names Couvent des Feuillants or Prieure des Couleys. Today, the estate stretches over some of the best hilltops above the Gironde Estuary. The river lying alongside the first rows of vines makes for a majestic, serene landscape. The estate belonged to the Luetkens family for several generations, and was then acquired by Mr Desire Cordier in 1919. In 2004, CA Grands Crus, a subsidiary of the Groupe Credit Agricole, acquired Chateau Meyney, with a determination to strengthen the potential of this outstanding cru. An improvement plan was put together for the entire estate. It is supervised today by Anne Le Naour, the Technical Director, and the consultant oenologist, Hubert de Bouard. The company CA Grands Crus, a fully-owned subsidiary of the Groupe Credit Agricole, became, in 2004, the owner of prestigious Bordeaux estates: Chateau de Rayne Vigneau, 1er Grand Cru Classe Sauternes, Chateau Grand-Puy Ducasse, 5eme Grand Cru Classe Pauillac, Chateau Meyney,

The palate is medium-bodied with grippy tannin on the entry, good weight in the mouth and that Pauillac-like graphite tincture on the finish extant. There is a touch of chewiness here, some rough edges that will need to be abraded by bottle age, but there remains good potential."		

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Château Montrose

One of the few estates in Bordeaux not named after an original owner, according to local legend it was the reference by local sailors to the hills covered in pink heather that inspired this name. Montrose had been owned by the Charmoule family since 1896 until it was sold in 2006 to the Bouygues brothers. The new owners instigated an intensive renovation project that was completed in time for the 2013 harvest. One of the key components was sustainability, to ensure that Montrose was as green and environmentally conscious as possible. The 94-hectare vineyard has a terroir of gravel, typical of the Saint-Estèphe appellation, with sand and some clay. The vineyard is planted in 60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 32% Merlot, 6% Cabernet Franc and 2% Petit Verdot, with an average vine age of 40 years. On average, the vines reach between 40 and 60 years of age before they are replaced, and some of the oldest date back to 1933. Château Montrose is a powerful Bordeaux, massive dense and masculine, and can age and evolve for decades.

The palate is medium-bodied with supple tannin, very precise acidity and layers of crisp black fruit laced with vanilla from the new oak at the moment. That will be subsumed in time. What you have here is a very precise, multi-layered, almost sensual Montrose that is going to delight many for years to come. This is highly recommended—one of the finest Left Bank wines this vintage. Tasted September 2016." - Neal Martin

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Château Ormes-de-Pez

This estate is located in the hamlet of Pez, the old French word for 'peace'. At one time, the château also had very old elm trees ('ormes' in French) dating back to the 18th Century. Marie Cazes married the owner of Ormes-de-Pez in the late 19th Century, and when widowed, in fine French tradition she took on the task of managing the estate. The property was purchased just before WWII by Marie's brother, Jean-Charles, then owner of Château Lynch-Bages in Pauillac. The Cazes family's link with this exceptional cru thus goes back more than a century. Ormes-de Pez produce dependably fine wines year after year, and much investment has been made in the facilities since the early 1980's, as part of an ambitious renovation programme.

The palate is medium-bodied with grippy tannin. It felt a little pinched, but the finish shows vivacity and focus with graphite-infused black fruit. It just cuts away swiftly on the finish. This is one of the few 2014s that I felt did not match up to its showing in barrel, then again, it often does repay several years down in the cellar."

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Pauillac





Château Clerc-Milon

Located in the northern part of the Pauillac appellation, Clerc-Milon is one of eighteen Cinquièmes Crus (Fifth Growths) and faces Château Lafite Rothschild across the Route des Châteaux. Having become increasingly fragmented through sell-offs, it was acquired in 1970 by Baron Philippe de Rothschild, of Mouton Rothschild fame, as a do-up with great potential, and he immediately set about renovating the estate, constructing a new vat house and weaving his well documented magic on the château's imagery. The vat house is the first in Bordeaux to claim High Environmental Quality certification. The 45-hectare vineyard is planted in 50% Cabernet Sauvignon, 36% Merlot, 11% Cabernet Franc, 2% Petit Verdot and 1% of Carménère, the latter consisting of vines that were planted back in 1947. Clerc-Milon is now making the best wines in its history, beguiling, classically-styled expressions of currant, blackberry and spice, and can boast an outstanding run of recent vintages.

There is something almost Lafite-like about this Clerc-Milon and in my book, there is nothing wrong with that." - Neal Martin

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Château Lynch-Bages

Arguably the most popular of all the eighteen Fifth Growths, Lynch Bages dates back to the 15th Century. Thomas Lynch was a descendent of the Tribe of Galway and inherited the estate through his wife in 1749. The golden era started in 1934 when it arrives in the hands of Jean-Charles Cazes, who immediately began to lift the quality. His grandson, Jean-Michel Cazes, took over in 1973, modernizing the estate and becoming a tireless global promoter of Bordeaux. Located just outside the town of Pauillac, the large 100-hectare vineyard sits on a gravel ridge overlooking the Gironde estuary. Plantings are 75% Cabernet Sauvignon, 17% Merlot, 6% Cabernet Franc and 2% Petit Verdot, with an average vine age of around 30 years. The wines age very well, and sit nicely between the modern and the traditional styles, exuding power, concentration and charm.

Liz Wheadon: Echo de Lynch Bages 2014 is a blend of 73% Cabernet Sauvignon and 27% Merlot. One of the many Bordeaux properties who have, of late, outperformed their classified standing and historic quality, offering far more than anticipated. Their second wine is an outstanding find; with its blocky Pauillac tannins, the Echo is firm and boldly structured with a pure Cabernet precision. Fresh, vibrant, lively and ultra-fine.

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Château Mouton Rothschild

Mouton Rothschild was established in Pauillac in 1853, but their path to greatness started when a young Baron Philippe de Rothschild gained control of the property in the 1920's and began shaking things up in Bordeaux, changing the way wine was produced there. He was the first to bottle all his wine on the estate, allowing control over the selling process, and he introduced an unmatched level of sophistication to his branding. Artists have created labels for Mouton Rothschild include Miró, Chagall, Braque and Picasso. Awarded Second Growth status in the original 1855 Classification, the Baron made it his mission to achieve First Growth status, something he achieved, against all odds, in 1973. Since his death in 1988, the estate has been controlled by daughter Philippine. In the astute hands of director Philippe Dhalluin, production has been decreased and quality increased. Labour intensive vineyard practices are matched to dazzling new cellars estimated to have cost close to 20 million euros. The wine? Flamboyant, exotic, opulent, unforgettable.

Medium-bodied, lush and sexy, it can be consumed over the next 10-15+ years."

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Château Pichon-Longueville Baron

Commonly referred to as Pichon Baron, this property began life as part of the same estate as Château Pichon-Longueville Comtesse de Lalande, but was split apart in 1850 when the then owner, 90-year-old Baron Joseph de Pichon-Longueville died and bequeathed the property equally between his five children, the women receiving Pichon Lalande and the men what would become Pichon Baron. It remained in family hands right through to 1933, but following a difficult period through the 1960's and 70's, it was purchased by the AXA insurance group who, with the resources at their disposal, immediately began to turn things around, producing stunning 1989 and 1990 vintages. The wines have continued to improve to the point where they are now some of the most sought-after in Bordeaux. The hallmarks are a supremely rich spiciness and highly concentrated, tannic fruit that retains its elegance for decades. 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, 3% Cabernet Franc and 2% Petit Verdot are planted across the 40-hectare deep gravel vineyard, with some vines planted back in the 1930s.

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Château Pichon-Longueville Comtesse de Lalande

Commonly referred to as Pichon Lalande, this famous Second Growth wine is quintessential Pauillac for many consumers, voluptuously textured, with complex layers of fruit and a classic earthy perfume. Once part of the larger Pichon estate, it was split apart in 1850 when the then owner, 90-year-old Baron Joseph de Pichon-Longueville died and bequeathed the property equally between his five children, the women receiving Pichon Lalande and the men what would become Pichon-Longueville Baron. Pichon Lalande stayed in family hands for over 250 years until it was sold to Champagne giants Louis Roederer in 2007. A hugely expensive renovation then took place, both in the winery and in the vineyard. 67 hectares are planted in 61% Cabernet Sauvignon, 32% Merlot, 4% Cabernet Franc and 3% Petit Verdot. The estate is managed sustainably, with half of the vineyard farmed organically. They are also experimenting with biodynamics.

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Chateau Pontet Canet

Ranked as a Fifth Growth in the 1855 Classification, Pontet-Canet has seen a meteoric rise in quality in recent years, and is now arguably the most popular wine in Pauillac.

Over three centuries it has been owned by only three families, the latest being the Tesserons, who acquired it in 1975. Alfred Tesson took the reins in 1994, and under his guidance, the quality has risen to the point where they are producing wines at the level of the 'Super Seconds', and in some vintages, they are the equal of the First Growths, which is indeed an amazing achievement.

After taking over, Alfred moved to sustainable farming techniques on a parcel by parcel basis, and then in 2004 began to institute biodynamics. Everything is done by hand, and the entire vineyard will eventually be worked with horses in the traditional manner.

Château Ducru-Beaucaillou

The soils at Ducru-Beaucaillou are covered with large stones that lend themselves to the estate's name (Beaucaillou translating as 'beautiful stone'). The property can trace its roots back to the 13th Century. They are, in modern times, producing some of the finest wines they have ever made, thanks in part to the efforts of Bruno Borie, who inherited the estate from his father, Francis. The 75-hectare vineyard is planted with 70% Cabernet Sauvignon and 30% Merlot, with the average vine age 35 years, the oldest plot 'Les Sadons' planted all the way back in 1918. Ducru-Beaucaillou are operating at their highest level to date, thanks in part to the fact that, increasingly, only the very best fruit is used to make the Grand Vin. The wines are concentrated, supple, textural and harmonious, in a way that is only found in the best of the Bordeaux wines.

The knight, Joseph Stanislaw Gruaud, established the Saint-Julien property, and it was administered by two Gruauds, the priest and the magistrate. Upon the demise of the magistrate, part of the property went to Joseph Sebastian de La Rose, and there we have the origins of the name. Back in the day, they erected a tower over their vineyards so they could watch their workers. Supremely innovative, they would sell their wines to the highest bidder at auction, and if the wine didn't sell, they would keep lifting the price until it did. Over their history, Gruaud-Larose have been somewhat hit-or-miss; they have been more than capable of turning out stunning wines, just not with sufficient consistency to accompany their Second Growth status. Since 1997, the estate has been in the hands of the Merlaut family, and they, with much acumen, have introduced sustainable practices and organics into the vineyard, with their 2009 vintage a welcome return to form.

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Château Léoville Las Cases

Château Léoville Las Cases is a Second Growth under the 1855 Classification. Like most Bordeaux producers, it has a long history that dates back to the 16th Century. A large estate, it was at one time considerably larger, encompassing both of the other Léoville vineyards, Léoville Poyferré and Léoville Barton. Today, the Delon family, headed by Jean Hubert Delon and his sister Geneviève d'Alton, own and manage the property. It is planted in 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 19% Merlot, 13% Cabernet Franc and 3% Petit Verdot. Léoville Las Cases produces a very structured style, and in the top vintages it can take 20 years or more to develop and shed its tannic structure. However your patience will be rewarded with an expression that often resembles a First Growth Pauillac, yet is unique to the estate it comes from.

The estate's modern history begins in 1920 when it was purchased by the high-profile négociant family, the Cuveliers, with Didier Cuvelier taking the reins in 1979 and transforming Léoville Poyferré into one of the leading Great Growths. With its outstanding 80-hectare terroir, Cuvelier's huge investment in facilities and his consistent attention to detail, the estate is now firmly on the radar as a significant producer of elegant, lushly concentrated, long-lived wines, and it is one of the most exciting properties to be found in the Médoc.

The Cordiers, yet another négociant family, have run things there since the early 20th Century, with tradition and technical innovation both playing key roles in their approach. Respected wine consultant Stéphane Derenoncourt has also played a key role, as he has on so many other estates. The 104 hectares of vineyard consist of 68% Cabernet Sauvignon, 28% Merlot and 4% Petit Verdot. Talbot also produce a white wine, the only ones within the Saint-Julien appellation to do so.

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Château Giscours

We're in Margaux now. Obviously at some point Bordeaux was not a restful place as, yet again, there is a fortress in the tale, in the form of a fortified keep erected on the property in 1330. Putting war aside though, the estate's great era, vinously, began in 1847, after a procession of owners had come and gone and Pierre Skawinski began managing the property. One of the great agriculturists of the region, he was an important figure in the fight against mildew and invented a plough that still carries his name. He managed the estate for 50 years and was instrumental in Giscours earning its Third Growth classification in 1855. At almost 400ha, she's a big'un, boasting a neoclassic palace and landscaped grounds, although only 90 hectares is under vine, a mix of 60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 32% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Franc and 3% Petit Verdot. Dutchman Alexander van Beek took charge in 1995, and his devoted and meticulous renovations have put Giscours on the road to recognition, with their current offerings the best yet.

The Shÿler family took over in 1926, having arrived in Bordeaux in 1739 to immerse themselves in the business of wine. They are still present today, in the form of Sophie, Nathalie and Yann Shÿler, who oversee the 37-hectare property of 45% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Franc and 10% Petit Verdot vines, and employ experienced oenologist Philippe Delfaut as their managing director.

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Château Margaux

One of the world's greatest wine estates, Margaux has a history dating back almost eight hundred years. Ranked as only one of four wines to achieve Premier Cru (First Growth) status in the 1855 Classification, it is also the only Bordeaux property to share the name of the appellation itself. With its building the grandest in Bordeaux, the wines of Château Margaux have been sought after by wealthy oenophiles for centuries. The 1771 vintage was the first claret to ever appear in a Christie's catalogue, and it was purchased by Thomas Jefferson during his tour of Bordeaux in 1787, with Jefferson later opining that Margaux was one of Bordeaux' Top Four. The wine itself has incredible elegance, purity and finesse, and it is, without doubt, one of the most beautiful in all of Bordeaux. The modern era for this estate is perhaps its greatest ever, with even their second wine, Pavillon Rouge du Château Margaux, better than the Grand Vin itself was a few decades earlier.

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Château Prieuré-Lichine

Reflecting the Church's long love affair with things vinous, Prieuré-Lichine was founded back in the 12th century by monks who used it to produce the vinos for their meals and religious ceremonies. The church hung in there until the French Revolution, when, in a 'no-more wine-with-dinner' moment, the estate was seized, divided and disposed of. The portion that became Prieuré-Lichine received a Fourth Growth classification in 1855, and a much-neglected 11ha property was acquired in 1951 by Alexis Lichine (a.k.a. 'the Pope of Wine'), who with much patient dedication restored vineyards and cellars to their former status. Lichine, along with a consortium that included Count de Lur-Saluces of Chateau d'Yquem, invested heavily and seriously expanded the estate that now covers 78 hectares. It was sold to the Groupe Ballande in 1999, and they astutely employed the ubiquitous Stéphane Derenoncourt as their consulting oenologist. God knows how he fits it all in; with his name everywhere, there must, by now, almost be more pies in play than available fingers.

Château Haut Bailly has a unique terrior, which is expressed in their wines. The estate dates back to 1461. Located right next to the city of Bordeaux on the banks of the Garonne River, it is one of the most prestigious Cru Classé de Graves. Haut Bailly's vineyard is 30 hectares. Of that, there is 4 hectares of vines over a hundred years old, comprising of Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Carmenère, Merlot, Petit Verdot and Malbec. The rest of the estate is planted with 64% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot and 6% Cabernet Franc. Château Haut Bailly is committed to environmental winemaking, grapes are picked by hand and no chemical weed killers are used.

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Château Haut-Brion

Regarded as one of the world's greatest wines for around 600 years, Haut-Brion was the only First Growth outside of the Médoc in the 1855 Classification. Grapes are thought to have been grown here since Roman times, and it can boast the first-ever professional wine review, by Samuel Pepys in 1663. Lauded by Thomas Jefferson in 1787, it was the earliest recorded First Growth to be imported to the United States. The estate was eventually purchased by another American, New York Financier Clarence Dillon, in 1935, and it remains in Dillon family hands to this day. The elevated vineyard consists of deep gravels with a high clay and mineral content, planted in 45% Merlot, 44% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc and 1% Petit Verdot. They also produce one of the greatest and most expensive dry white wines in the world from 63% Semillion and 37% Sauvignon Blanc. The elegant and refined Haut-Brion is virtually in a class of its own, with a programme of deliberately lowered yields, stringent sorting and increased allocation to the second wine upping the ante significantly.

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Chateau Malartic Lagraviere

Domaine de Lagravière, recognized since time immemorial for its excellent terroir, was purchased at the end of the eighteenth century by the family of Count Hippolyte de Maurès de Malartic. Serving the armies of the Kings of France, this Admiral fought against the English on the many seas of the world, showing special bravery in 1756 during the battle of Quebec. The estate was then bought in 1850 by Madame Arnaud Ricard, who added the name Malartic to that of Lagravière as a tribute to the former owners. After land reorganisation and the acquisition of some small plots, the estate took on the form which it was to keep until the 1950s. The Marly family were the last of the Ricard ancestry to run the Château. Of particular note, Jacques Marly was estate manager from 1947 to 1990. Having enjoyed an excellent reputation from the beginning of the nineteenth century, Château Malartic-Lagravière was one of only six properties in Bordeaux to enter the 1953 Graves classification for both its red and white wines. At the end of 1996, the Château entered a new era with the arrival of the Bonnie family.

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Château Pape Clément

Few great wines can boast seven centuries of history and trace their origins back to a pope, but this one can. Elected Supreme Pontiff in 1305, during the reign of King Philip the Handsome (a moniker no doubt initiated by Philip himself), Clement V gave his name to the estate, having, it's said, a strong interest in wine, whatever that means. The Pope was very hands-on, and something of an innovator as well; his was the first estate in Bordeaux, for instance, to destem the entire crop by hand. When Clement moved the papal court to Avignon, he gave his Bordeaux vineyards to the Archbishop of Bordeaux, from which time every Archbishop followed the vinous techniques and teachings of Bishop Clement. The estate was eventually sold to the Montagne family in 1939, and they are still in charge today, with the present owner, Bernard Magrez, doing his utmost to keep standards at papal heights. Combining the traditional with state-of-the-art, Pape Clément is produced to the highest standards, with chemical weed killers abandoned in favour of ploughing.

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Chateau Smith Haut Lafitte

This Pessac-Léognan estate has a refined reputation as 'the quintessential Graves'. Its history stretches back over 800 years to the Crusades, with vines planted in 1365 on a gravelly plateau known as Lafitte. George Smith purchased the Graves estate in 1720, adding his name to the property. Current owners are the Cathiard family, who instigated manual harvesting and sorting regimes where only the best grapes are utilised, introducing, too, their own cooperage from where they produce 70% of their own barrels. A well-judged combination of new and old, the winery is ultra-modern, while the vineyard is ploughed using horses. The Cathiards have taken the estate from a degree of vinous mediocrity to its current position near the top of the pecking order. The farming is sustainable and organic, with a heavy slant towards biodynamics, producing fantastic smoky wines from 60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, 9% Cabernet Franc and 1% Petit Verdot. They also make a stunning dry white from 60-year-old vines of 90% Sauvignon Blanc, 5% Sauvignon Gris and 5% Sémillon.

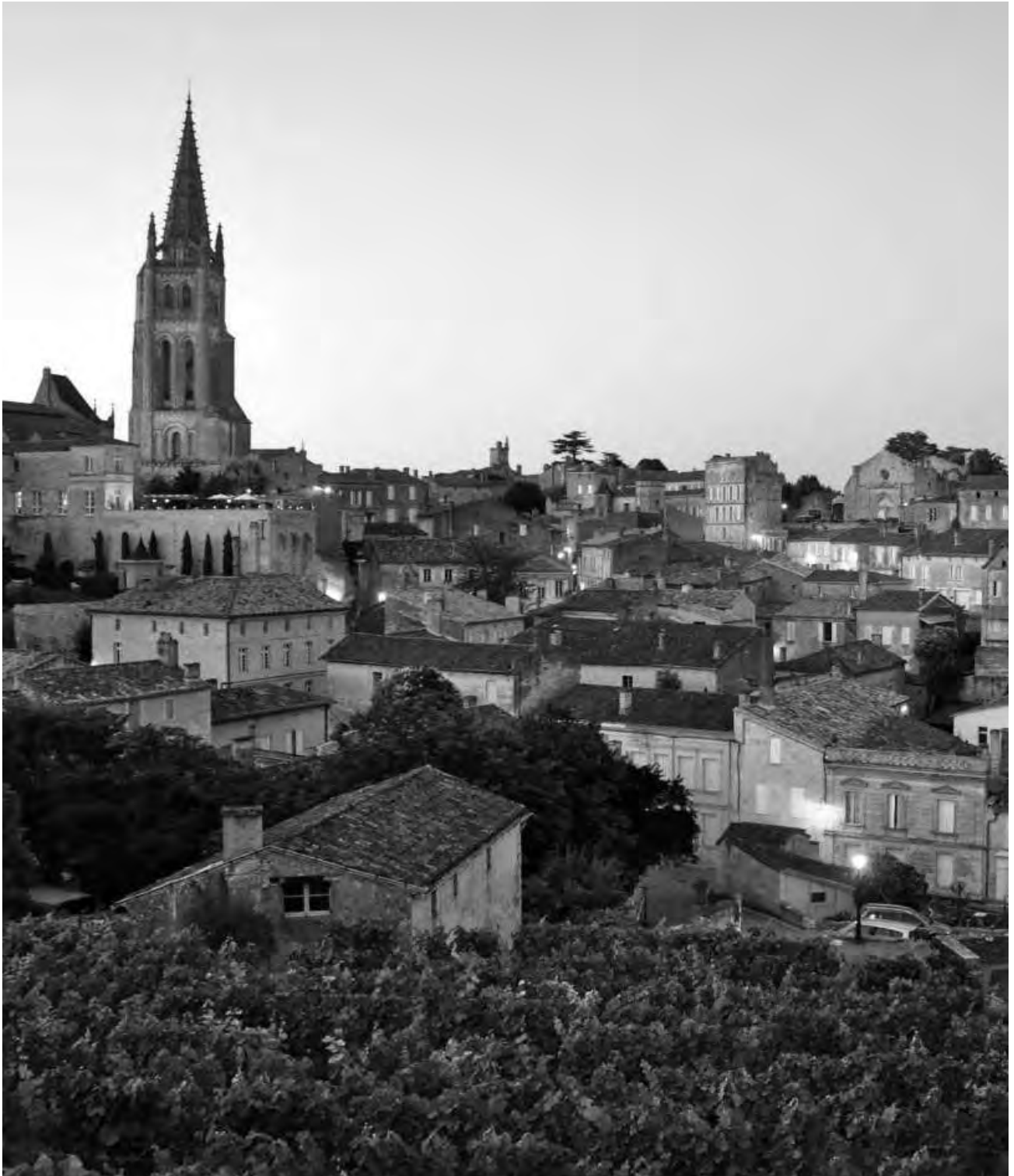

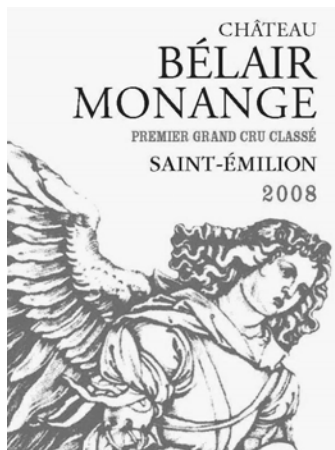

Château Bélair Monange

This is a very old estate. How old? Try the 1300's. Bélair was purchased by its rather famous neighbour Château Ausone in 1916; Ausone did the makeover and transformed it from vineyard to winery. It was sometimes opined, however, that it never quite lived up to its potential. In 2008, Christian Moueix - riding in on Château Pétrus glory - purchased the estate and renamed it Bélair-Monange in honour of his grandmother, Anne-Adèle Monange. In 2012, Moueix merged the neighbouring Château Magdelaine into Bélair-Monange. He believes this 12-hectare vineyard has the finest terroir in Saint-Émilion, and aspires to make it one of Bordeaux' greatest wines. With Moueix in charge, quality has, somewhat predictably, soared; the wine is already fleshier and more concentrated than previously, with an incredible elegance on the palate and the only direction in sight upwards.

Following the restructuring of the Chateau Belair-Monange, a new wine embodying the qualities of the vineyard emerged in 2014 - Annonce de Belair Monange, produced in very limited quantities.

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Château Bellevue Mondotte

Tiny! With a mere 2.5-hectare plot to play in, the annual production is miniscule. In 2001, Chateau Bellevue Mondotte was purchased by Gérard Perse, owner of the highly-rated Château Pavie, as well as Châteaux Pavie-Decesse and Monbousquet. Located on the Saint-Émilion limestone plateau within a stone's throw of Perse's other properties, the Bellevue Mondotte vines average around 45 years in age, with 90% planted in Merlot and the remainder evenly split between Cabernets Franc and Sauvignon. This is a trophy wine, produced with stunning levels of concentration, divinely opulent and velvety in the mouth. It doesn't come cheap, but rest assured, the quality is there and it is worth the outlay for its stellar interpretation of Saint-Émilion's magic.

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Château Cheval Blanc

The 'Castle of the White Horse' sits at the very peak of the Saint-Émilion classification, from where they create one of the world's finest wines. Founded in 1832, Cheval Blanc has been at the forefront of vineyard management for almost 200 years, installing a vast network of drains in 1860 and in 2011 building the most modern winemaking and cellaring facility in the appellation at a cost of around \$20M. They were purchased in 2009 by LVMH for a reputed 15 million euros per hectare, which would make them the most expensive estate in all of Bordeaux. Perched on the border with Pomerol, the Premier Grand Cru Classé A estate has a unique mix of 58% Cabernet Franc and 42% Merlot, with some of the vines close to 100 years old. The beauty of Cheval Blanc can be found in the complex and powerful perfume entwining textures that can feel as sensual as silk and as soft as velvet. The wine is incredibly opulent, yet light on its feet. Yes, you can drink it young, but really, it is one of the longest-lived Bordeaux wines being produced, so try to be patient. Truly a masterpiece.

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Château-Figeac

We're not just talking old here, the timelines are staggering: a Saint-Émilion Premier Grand Cru Classé, Figeac's history can be traced back to the Gallo-Roman period, during the 2nd Century AD, when the owner, Figeacus, named his villa here after himself. This is one of the few Saint-Émilion estates to have been continuously occupied for the past 2,000 years. By the 18th Century, Figeac had already been owned by the same family for around five centuries, and it has been in the possession of the current owners, the Manancourts, for over 120 years. It was, once, massive, at 200 hectares, but over time bits and pieces have been sold off by various owners, which is why, today, so many different châteaux have Figeac in their name. These days the vineyard stands at a relatively modest 40 hectares, plus 14 hectares of grounds. Under the innovative guidance of the late Thierry Manancourt, Figeac rose to become one of Bordeaux' greatest wines. As the Romans knew long ago, the terroir is superb, and the wines are consistently elegant, with fabulous aging potential.

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Château La Serre

The château was erected in the 17th Century and procured in the 1950's by the d'Arfeuille family, who are still in residence today. The soil is a combination of chalk, clay and sand and supports a vine mix of 80% Merlot and 20% Cabernet Franc. The wines are modestly priced, so they offer excellent value in a good vintage. Fresh and clean in style, their aging potential is around 6-10 years.

The Château's 23-hectare property is planted to 80% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Franc and 5% Cabernet Sauvignon, with the average vine age around 25 years.

Château Bourgneuf

This Right Bank estate is situated in the heart of the prestigious Pomerol appellation, spread over almost 9 hectares in one unique holding. It is, indeed, one of the oldest family-owned properties there, having been in the hands of the Vayron family since 1821 and managed by them now for eight generations. The vines are pretty well established too, the average age 40 years, with one parcel over 70. The varietal mix is 90% Merlot to 10% Cabernet Franc, and the main section - their best terroir - almost exclusively clay. Bourgneuf produces a fairly traditional, lighter, rustic style of Pomerol. Its stocks are on the rise, and the neighbours (Châteaux Trotanoy and L'Eglise Clinet) are high-profile.

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Château Certan-de-May

A Right Bank, Pomerol estate residing on clay and gravel soils, named after the Scottish founding family, the Demays, who had inhabited France since the Middle Ages and retained ownership from post-French Revolution times up to 1925. A two-owner vehicle, this is, with the then new purchasers the Badar family still in charge today, having morphed into the Barreau-Badar family. The vineyard is planted in 70% Merlot, 25% Cabernet Franc and 5% Cabernet Sauvignon. At around five hectares, Certan de May is a tiny jewel poised between Vieux Château Certan and Pétrus. It was very strong in the 1980's, then slipped a little through the 1990's. From 2005 onwards the estate has been back on track, producing elegant yet fleshy and flamboyant wines at a very reasonable price.

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Château Gazin

At 26 hectares one of Pomerol's larger properties, Gazin dates back to 1772 and is a single parcel on the upper part of the legendary Pomerol plateau. They share a border with Pétrus and have in the past sold part of their property to that venerable estate. Gazin was once the property of the Knights of the Templars, and current owners, the Bailliencourt family, have their own rich history tracing back to 1214 and an association with the then King of France, Philippe-Auguste. The Bailliencourts have been in residence at Gazin itself since 1946. Vine composition is 90% Merlot, 7% Cabernet Sauvignon and 3% Cabernet Franc and the winemaking facilities were upgraded in 1996.

The present day Chateau Gazin is located on the site of a hospital built in the 18th century by the Knights of St. John, hence the name of the estate's second wine, "l'Hospitalet de Gazin", which was created in 1986. 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Château Hosanna

Pomerol's Château Hosanna was originally part of the huge Certan estate that belonged to the de May family before the French Revolution. This was split up into Vieux Château Certan, Certan-de-May and Certan-Giraud. The Giraud family sold the latter estate to Christian Moueix in 1999; Moueix intended to use the name Château Certan, but decided on the name Hosanna after encountering objections from Certan-de-May. Only the best fruit from the oldest vines of 70% Merlot and 30% Cabernet Franc is used to produce Hosanna, with the remainder sold as Château Certan Marzelle. This is one of the most exciting properties in Pomerol, producing wines that manage to be rich and concentrated while retaining the appellation's classic charm and elegance.

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Château La Conseillante

This is one of the older properties in Pomerol, with a history going back to the mid-18th Century, when it was owned by the Conseillan family, who were producing wine there by the 1750's. Present owners, the Nicolas family, purchased the château back in 1871, so they have a bit of time on the clock now (five generations, to be exact). In 1971 the estate was completely renovated and modernized, with La Conseillante the first to introduce Pomerol to the concept of stainless steel. The vines average 35 years, but some date back as far as 1958. The winding, 11.8-hectare property, straddling both Pomerol and Saint-Émilion, is planted in 80% Merlot and 20% Cabernet Franc, with a future goal of 25-30% for the latter variety. In the vineyard, methods are stridently traditional, while the winery is overtly state-of-the-art. With new cellars and stainless temperature-controlled vats, they can now vinify parcel by parcel, gaining much control in the process. La Conseillante lives up to its hefty reputation for powerful, elegant expressions and consistent output.

The château was built in 1782 and has had a strong reputation since the late 1800's. It was sold to the Moueix family, owners of Chateau Pétrus, in 1953, just in time for the decimating Pomerol frost of 1956, after which it was completely replanted with 80% Merlot and 20% Cabernet Franc. Since then the quality has headed steadily upwards and there is no doubt that recent vintages are the finest ever produced here.

Despite the small production, in order to maintain the quality and tighten even further the selection of fruit for the Grand Vin, Château Lafleur, a second wine has been added, Les Pensées de Lafleur.

In 1983, the Suntory group, the leading Japanese wine and spirits firm, acquired Lagrange and invested heavily in a spectacular renovation. Priority was given to the vineyard, followed by refurbishing and modernising the vat room and cellars.

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Château L'Eglise Clinet

Even though the name has changed over the years, since its split in the 1800's from a larger estate, the vineyards used for production of L'Eglise Clinet have been constant for 100 years. Denis Durantou has been the owner and winemaker since 1983. His family had owned the estate since 1914 but, being predominantly farmers, had others manage the estate. Durantou did a huge amount of work to bring L'Eglise Clinet up to standard, renovating the dirt floor cellars, adding new vats, stainless steel, and increasing the amount of new French oak. The quality skyrocketed, and today it is one of the stars of Pomerol, rich and full bodied with beautiful harmony and balance. The vineyard has a century-old drainage network that removes excess water and the soil is deep clay and gravel. Plantings are 85% Merlot, 14% very old vine Cabernet Franc and 1% Malbec. In fact, 25% of the total vines are over 75 years old and 25% over 50 years old, giving L'Eglise Clinet the largest collection of old vines in all of Pomerol. This is one of the finest wines of Bordeaux' Right Bank.

Domaines Barons de Rothschild acquired the estate in 1990 and wasted no time in stamping their mark on it, instigating a more rigorous selection process for the grand vin, introducing a second wine, replanting vineyards and renovating the vat room and cellars. All of this activity has paid dividends, with Château l'Évangile lately producing a sustained stretch of very good vintages, elegant, powerful, long-lived wines that will age well.

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Château Petit-Village

Perched high on Pomerol's gravel plateau, Petit-Village dates back to the 1700's. In 1919 it was sold to the Ginestet family. Having owned Château Margaux, the Ginestets were certainly no slouches, but perhaps not fully discerning their left from their right, the formerly Left Bank-aligned Ginestets planted excessively with Cabernet Sauvignon on their Right Bank property (at over 50%, the highest on the entire Right Bank), with rather disastrous results for the wines. When Bruno Prats of Cos d'Estournel took over in 1971, he ripped out the excess Cabernet plantings and replaced them with Merlot, thus steering the estate back in the right direction. This was followed by an upgrade of the cellars in 1977, and a consequent return to form for the Petit-Village wines. The property became part of the AXA portfolio in 1989, coming under the control of AXA's main man, Christian Seely, who instigated new vats and a barrel cellar, and brought in the accomplished Stéphane Deroncourt to consult. Its recent vintages are, accordingly, the estate's best in modern times.

In 1949, Joseph's daughter and son-in-law brought Château Vray Croix de Gay. Since the turn of the millenium, the family has extensively renovated the estate. 50% of the vineyard was replanted according to recommendations by geological surveys. Siaurac are advocates of natural and sustainable winemaking, with their motto being "Believe in the earth, respect its future".

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Vieux Château Certan

Known to insiders as VCC, the origins are estimated to be around 1770, when it was the property of the Demay family. At this time, VCC was considered to be the leading estate of the region, and today it is once again back in the top echelon. The land was divided after the French Revolution into the various Certan estates, and in 1924 was sold to the Belgian Merchant, Georges Thienpont. It has remained with the Thienpont family ever since. Georges himself came up with the astute idea of placing the now famous pink capsules on the bottles, so he could see if collectors were buying his wine when he visited their cellars. VCC sits on the top of the Pomerol plateau across the street from Certan de May and down the road from Pétrus. The vineyard is planted with 65% Merlot, 30% Cabernet Franc and 5% Cabernet Sauvignon, with a very old average vine age of 50 years. This is one of the most elegant Pomerols, with great richness and silky textures, yet the style depends on the vintage, with some years having a majority percentage of Cabernet Franc, giving it a more structured feel.

Château Climens is located in the sweet wine appellation of Barsac, classified in 1855 as a Premier Cru Classé - a first growth Sauternes. It has long been called the 'Lord of Barsac' in tribute to the unassailable elegance of its wines. Yep, we're talking Top Dog status. Its history is jaw-droppingly long, dating back to 1547. Made from 100% Semillon off 35-year-old vines, Climens' distinctive character comes from the limestone terroir, its outstanding aromatic complexity neatly balanced by a heady dose of freshness and finesse. Climens was purchased by Lucien Lurton (Château Brane-Cantenac) in 1971, and is now managed by his daughter, Bérénice. With 30 hectares under vine, Château Climens has been cultivated biodynamically since 2010 and continues to set the bar for sweet white Bordeaux wine.

The de Fargues compares most favourably with d'Yquem, which says it all, really.

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Château de Rayne Vigneau

Over 200 years ago, Château de Rayne Vigneau was said to be the second-best producer of Sauternes (surely a galling position to be in for a French winemaker). Only Château d'Yquem was considered to be its superior. Located directly next door to that legendary estate, Château de Rayne Vigneau resides upon a large 83.7 hectare property and is classified as Premier Grand Cru Classé. The terroir is sand, clay and gravel, although legend has it that there are gemstones (or at least semi-precious stones) scattered through them thar hills that account for the wine's incredible golden hues. As long as they don't stick in the throat, we're fine with that. Using a blend of 80% Sémillon and 20% Sauvignon Blanc vines, the wines are quite moderately priced for Sauternes and, since 2005, increasingly popular as the current owners have injected renewed impetus and upped the ante.

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Château d'Yquem

First Growth, unassailably top of the class and the stuff of legend, this, though the building itself is more of a fortified farmhouse than a château, really. The golden, ambrosial expression they produce is famed the world over. Of course all of this is brought about by serious attention to detail. The botrytised grapes are carefully removed with small secateurs so as not to damage the remaining fruit that is still bringing itself to, well, fruition, with each plot picked over an average of six times in a season. The grapes are pressed immediately upon arrival at the cellar, the juice put straight into new oak barrels and aged for 30 months, with regular topping and racking. Yquem's philosophy has been the same for five centuries: to finesse nature and produce an average of just one glass of brilliance per vine. If the quality is not worthy of the estate's reputation in a given year, it is not sold under the château name. Nine vintages were thus not marketed by Yquem in the 20th Century. The estate is these days managed by Pierre Lurton on behalf of the L.V.M.H. group.

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Château Filhot

Located in Sauternes, Filhot dates back to the mid-1600's, with the château itself completed in 1709 by Romain de Filhot on one of the most attractive sites in Bordeaux. Since 1974, the Second Cru Classé Château Filhot has been managed by Count de Vaucelles and his son Gabriel, with the property undergoing a comprehensive restoration programme in 1995. The winemaking facilities were modernised, the old vinification replaced with temperature-controlled, stainless vats. The large, 62-hectare, gravel-based vineyard is planted in 60% Semillon, 36% Sauvignon Blanc and 4% Muscadelle. The wines are normally on the lighter side, refreshing in style, but they are, too, increasingly well made and reasonably priced.

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Château Guiraud

The Premier Grand Cru Classé Guiraud takes its name from the Bordeaux négociant Pierre Guiraud, who purchased the Sauternes property back in 1766. Owned these days by a consortium of interested parties, Guiraud is innovatively sustainable in its approach, and is the only First Growth from the 1855 Classification to be certified organic. There are 100 hectares under vine, the vineyards planted in 65% Semillon and 35% Sauvignon Blanc. Their wines are surprisingly rich, given they have one of the highest percentages of Sauvignon Blanc in the appellation. Considered one of the top six producers in Sauternes.

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Château La Tour Blanche

This Premier Grand Cru Classé Sauternes estate takes its name from its 18th Century founder, Jean Saint-Marc du Latourblanche, Treasurer General to Louis XIV. Its current tale begins, though, in the early 20th Century when then owner Daniel 'Osiris' Iffla bequeathed the château to the French Government, with the proviso that it be turned into a Wine School. After a period of Gallic humming and hawing, the Ministry of Agriculture agreed, and created the La Tour Blanche School of Viticulture and Oenology. Construction was completed in 1911. Despite its unusual status, Château La Tour Blanche is run by genuinely experienced Bordeaux personnel. The vineyard consists of 91 hectares planted in 83% Sémillon, 12% Sauvignon Blanc and 5% Muscadelle. The terroir is a mix of gravel, clay, sand and limestone. This estate has soared in quality since the late eighties and is now one of the most consistent in the region.

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Château Lafaurie-Peyraguey

This Sauternes château is stunning visually, constructed in the 18th Century in a Byzantine-Hispanic style, with the outer wall and main gate dating as far back as the 13th Century, reflecting its days serving as a fortress. The name is a combination of the first known owners, the Peyraguey family, and the Laufauries, who purchased it in 1796. A Premier Grand Cru Classé, the 41 hectares of Sémillon, Sauvignon Blanc and Muscadelle vines are tended with great care, with the soil ploughed and the use of chemical sprays increasingly reduced. In 2014 it was bought from the GDF Suez Company by Silvio Denz, the owner of numerous châteaux and a man known for his spare-no-expense approach.

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Château Rieussec

Like many Bordeaux properties, Rieussec was confiscated during the French Revolution and auctioned off. After numerous changes in ownership, the estate ended up in the hands of Domaines Barons de Rothschild. They bought the property in 1984 in partnership with Albert Frère (Louis Vuitton Moët Hennessy). The following year, Rothschild director Charles Chevallier was placed in charge of managing Château Rieussec. The estate has one of the largest wineries in the appellation and boasts excellent terroir. It sits next to Château d'Yquem on the east and extends all the way to the border of Fargues and Sauternes, covering 92 hectares of gravel, sand, clay and limestone soils. The plantings are 90% Semillon, 7% Sauvignon Blanc and 3% Muscadelle, with an average vine age of 25 years. The property is close to the top of the Sauternes pyramid. With their intensely concentrated flavours and voluptuous textures, these are stunning wines that can age quite easily for decades.

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Château Suduiraut

Château Suduiraut and Sauternes go back to 1580, and they produce one of the great Premier Cru Classé sweet wines. Indeed, meticulous and uncompromising is what they are, with tailored plot selection, grape-by-grape harvesting and fastidious control over the fermentation of each individual barrel. The wine's aging capacity is off the chart. The estate was significantly renovated in the 17th Century by the Count Blaise de Suduiraut, grandson of the founder, its stunning grounds and lakes courtesy of Le Nôtre, the designer of the gardens at Versailles. Like many Bordeaux estates, Suduiraut has passed through a number of hands. Losing its way somewhat in the 1940's-1960's, there has been a distinct return to form under the stewardship of insurance group AXA, who seem to have their fingers in a number of significant Bordeaux pies. With 92 hectares under vine, the wines are deeply opulent and highly collectible.

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Burgundy



UNDERSTANDING BURGUNDY

Burgundy is the narrowest and longest wine region in France, but one of the smallest, most fragmented and difficult to understand. With more than 1,000 names and over 100 appellations it's easy to see why. To understand the fragmentation, one must look at the past briefly. Once Burgundy was owned almost entirely by the church, until 1789 when the French Revolution took place. During this vineyards were seized and broken up and given to families to farm. French Inheritance laws have further fragmented these vineyards.

When it comes to the grapes grown in Burgundy, things get a little simpler. There are only three main grapes grown in Burgundy. Pinot Noir for red wine, Chardonnay for the white and Gamay for Beaujolais. There are various levels of quality in Burgundy. At the top is Grand Cru. Next is Premier Cru, followed by wine from a specific Village and then Burgundy generic appellations.

Burgundy can be divided into three distinct areas:

1. CHABLIS: The northern most and closest to Paris is Chablis. The only grape allowed to be planted here is Chardonnay because the soil is made up of chalk, decomposing oyster shells and the fact that it is very cold and could not reliably ripen Pinot Noir.

2. CÔTE D'OR: the heart of Burgundy – which is then further divided into;

a. Côte de Nuits: Quite literally home to the world's most expensive vineyards and wines. Virtually all Pinot Noir because of the soil being heavier and more clay based.

b. Côte de Beaune: The lower part of Burgundy central is dominated by Chardonnay and is the home to the most expensive Chardonnays in the world from the village of Puligny Montrachet.

3. BEAUJOLAIS: a huge region that produces vastly more wine than the 3 other areas combined. The only grape really planted here is Gamay.

CÔTE DE NUITS

The following are the main villages in the Côte de Nuits;

GEVREY CHAMBERTIN

In this village the vineyards are on gentle slopes with layers of pebbles on the top. The wines from Gevrey show red berry characters when young and game characters in the richer wines, as they develop they tend to have more licorice characters. Grand Cru's are Chambertin, Clos de Bèze, Charmes-Chambertin, Chapelle, Chambertin, Griotte-Chambertin, Latricières-Chambertin, Mazis-Chambertin and Ruchottes-Chambertin.

MOREY-ST-DENIS

Not as well known as the other villages in the Côte de Nuits, located between Gevrey and Chambolle, the vineyards in Morey-St-Denis have a good free draining gradient and a base of limestone. Morey-St-Denis is home to the Grand Cru vineyards of Clos de la Roche, Bonnes Mares, Clos de Tart, Clos St-Denis and Clos des Lambrays.

CHAMBOLLE MUSIGNY

Wines from Chambolle Musigny are one of the most delicate in Burgundy, they display fragrant fruit and finesse. The light soil and varying gradients of the village create this delicacy and the complexity of these wines. Grand Cru's are Bonnes Mares and Musigny.

VOUGEOT

This village is home to one Grand Cru – Clos de Vougeot which covers more than four-fifths of the area under vines here. Clos de Vougeot wines are rich and generous yet not overpowering.

VOSNE ROMANÉE

Home to the most expensive wines in Burgundy, the village of Vosne Romanée is home to the Grand Crus – Romanée-Conti, La Romanée, La Tâche, Romanée-St-Vivant, Richebourg and La Grande Rue and home to some of the best domains including Domaine de la Romanée Conti. The Grand Cru's of Grands Échézeaux and Échézeaux are located next door in Flagey Échézeaux.

UNDERSTANDING BURGUNDY

NUITS ST GEORGES

The town of Nuits added the name of its finest vineyard - Les Saint Georges - in the 19th century. There are no Grand Cru in the village of Nuits St Georges, but a host of very good Premier Cru.

A FEW MORE FACTS:

Generic wines are labelled as Burgundy or Bourgogne.

In total there are more than 400 Premier Crus vineyards in Burgundy.

There are 32 Grand Crus Vineyards in total – 8 white Grand Crus, 24 red Grand Crus. Of these 24 are from the Côte de Nuits and 8 from the Côte de Beaune.

The largest red Grand Cru in Burgundy is Corton, this Grand Cru represents about 25% of Grand Cru Red wines by volume.

It's very important to know your vintages when purchasing Burgundy. Recently – 2007, 2012 and 2014 were very good vintages, while 2009, 2010 and 2015 were excellent vintages.

Unlike Bordeaux, it is more likely that Domaines change hands, personnel change and the quality can improve in a short period of time, so it's often prudent to read as many reviews as possible to get a sense of the quality level they are producing in the current vintage.

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

The following are the main villages in the Côte de Beaune:

ALOXE-CORTON

Home to the Grand Cru, Corton, both red and white Corton can be produced. Red wine from Aloxé-Corton is one of the most powerful and tannic in the area and needs time to develop.

BEAUNE

This village is more known as the centre of Burgundy, where you'd likely stay when visiting the area, than for its wines. There are however some good Premier Crus in this area.

VOLNAY

As with Pommard, there are no Grand Cru, but a host of Premier Crus, the wines from Volnay are fragrant, elegant and age very well.

POMMARD

There are no Grand Cru in Pommard – although Grand Clos des Épenots would be a definite candidate if the Grand Cru classifications were ever reviewed; wines from this Premier Cru show finesse, character and the ability to age gracefully. Wines from Pommard definitely demand age, when young the tannins are very tight, as they age the power and richness in the wine develops.





Alex Gambal

American Alex Gambal visited Burgundy back in the 1990's, fell in love and never left. As much as the concept of an American making wine in Burgundy might come across as some sort of winemaking anathema, fear not, our Alex has his act well together, along with a deep and abiding respect for the terroir in which he operates. Not only are his wines extremely well made, they are exceptionally well-priced (not something that comes up that often when one is contemplating Burgundian expressions). He has established solid relationships with the local growers, and the philosophy of both Alex and his head winemaker Fabrice Laronze revolves around a regard for the individual character of each appellation and vintage, along with a passionate belief that the quality of the grapes means everything.

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Domaine Bonneau du Martray

Bonneau du Martray has been run since 1993 by Jean Charles de la Morinière, an architect who returned to the 11-hectare family property to manage it, fine-tuning the estate that his father originally brought back to life. The vineyard is on the side of the great Corton Hill, near Pernand, and while it is one continuous site, the parcels of grapes are treated separately in the winery to maintain their individual characteristics before combining as one great wine. Maturation is 33% in new oak for 12 months; the wine is blended and then assembled for a further six months of oak maturation.

The Parent family can trace their roots back to Etienne Parent. He established a professional and friendly relationship with Thomas Jefferson in 1787 as his Burgundy wine advisor. The Parent family have been a permanent fixture in Pommard since this time, with the sixth generation, sisters Anne and Catherine now in charge. Their brother Francois works with his wife at their Domaine A.F Gros. Since 1998 Anne has modified her approach to the wines, 100% destemming, hand picking and using three sorting tables. The story here is a little like that of Domaine Lamarche, where the quality has soared in recent years.

Seguin-Manuel is an old estate, originally founded in 1824. In 2004 it was acquired by 42-year-old Thibaut Marion, born into wine and with experience including the family winery Chanson Père & Fils. The vineyards are managed organically, with no use of chemicals and quality in mind - small yields, strict pruning and green harvest. Initially located in Savigny-lès-Beaune, new plots have been added to the domaine in the villages of Beaune and Puligny-Montrachet since 2007, and more recently in Pommard and Meursault. More than 6 hectares of vineyard are now grown by the domaine. The wines are impressive, the quality will only go from strength to strength and, unusually for Burgundy, they represent excellent value.

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Domaine Leflaive

It can be said that Leflaive is the heart and soul of Puligny; in fact, the 2017 vintage will mark their third century in the village, so their roots run pretty deep. Back in 1920, Joseph Leflaive undertook a significant programme of replanting, extension and enhancement of the vineyard. With vineyard manager, Francis Virost, he set in place the legacy that continues to this day. In a timely attack of common-sense, the four children from the next generation eschewed normal Burgundian tendencies and decided not to divide up the holdings, so as to maintain the integrity of the domaine. Brothers Vincent and Joseph Leflaive went on to shape a peerless reputation for their white Burgundy. Today, Leflaive remains under family control, helmed by Vincent's daughter Anne and Joseph's son Olivier.

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Domaine Vincent Girardin

Born in Santenay in the Côte de Beaune, Vincent Girardin is part of a winemaking dynasty whose origins date back 11 generations to the 17th Century. He began in 1982 with only 2 hectares of vines. When his father retired, Girardin took over several additional hectares and, thanks to an energetic and innovative approach, he has managed to expand that original holding to 20 hectares. While habitually focussing on lesser-known appellations of the Côte de Beaune, Girardin has nonetheless managed to accumulate an impressive collection of Premier Cru and Grand Cru wines from some very famous appellations. Working 42 parcels from 8 villages in the Côte de Beaune, his vibrant wines are ripe, textural, aromatic and elegant.

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Domaine Jean Chartron

Established 1859 in Puligny by the cooper-craftsman, Jean-Edouard Dupard, the Domaine has been governed by our generations, focused on both the prosperity and the expansion of the prestigious vineyards. The village owes its name to Jean-Edouard Dupard, when in 1873 as mayor of Puligny, he asked the local council to authorise that the name Montrachet - the most prestigious local vineyard - be added to that of Puligny, the original name of the village. Jean-Rene Chartron, the 4th generation, is without doubt the one who brought the most to the Domaine, making wines of the highest quality. Today, it is his son, Jean-Michel Chartron, who holds the reins and is now taking it to even greater levels. These are exceptional white Burgundies.

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Comtes Lafon

Domaine des Comtes Lafon has the deepest and coldest cellars in Burgundy and they nurture some of the greatest dry white wines of Burgundy. Dominique Lafon is the leading producer in Meursault, producing wines of astonishing depth and complexity, yet supremely balanced as well. The domaine dates back to the building of the house and cellar at Clos de la Barre by the Boch family in 1869, however the real creator of the estate was Comte Jules Lafon. Dominique Lafon has been in charge since 1985, taking over a domaine which already had a reputation for outstanding, if irregular whites, and potentially good reds. When Lafon took over the domaine, most of his vineyards were leased out on a share-cropping basis. It was only towards the end of the 1980s that he managed to reclaim all the vineyards and thus have full responsibility for them. The white wines are now consistently among the best in Burgundy while since 1989 the reds have reached the top division. Not only are the Lafons' holdings in the best vineyards of Meursault and Volnay, but they are mostly very well situated

The untimely death of his revered father Gerard, and difficult financial dealings under his own name, saw the young and dynamic artisan launch Domaine de Bellene. Nicolas has converted his growers to organic practices, and adhering religiously to his philosophy, Domaine de Bellene is 100% Organic, Carbon Neutral and uses donkeys and horses for all vineyard work. Nicolas Potel has gone from strength to strength, establishing himself as one of Burgundy's top 'new breed' winemakers.

The family history in the village of Vosne-Romanée dates back to around 1740, and from the end of the 19th Century the estate has grown considerably. Henri Lamarche, a cooper, married Marie Grivelet from Chambolle-Musigny and founded the estate. From early in the 1700's wines were produced by various members of the family off the prestigious terroirs of Vosne-Romanée and Vougeot, including from La Grande Rue, one of the rare Grand Crus of Vosne-Romanée. This vineyard has an incredible terroir, sitting in between La Tâche and Romanée-Conti itself. Today the estate is run by the sixth generation, Nicole and Nathalie, who have begun to transform the quality back to where it should be.

Today Anne and her cousins Michel (Michel Gros) and Bernard (Gros Frere et Souer) are neighbours in the village of Vosne-Romanée, but their wine styles are very different. Until 1994, Anne labelled her wines under Domaine Anne and Françoise Gros (her father's name). Her vineyard holdings are very small, but they include the jewel in her collection: 0.6 hectares of Richebourg, first planted in around 1930. She has quickly gained a reputation as one of the finest and most sought after producers in Burgundy.

His Clos Vougeot-Musigny for example, is at the premier top of the cru just beneath the slope of Musigny, hence the name. One of the more conscientious producers, Bernard strictly limits his yields for the depth and concentration of fruit he seeks, and the wines are only lightly fined, never filtered. Gros Frère wines are deep and dark and whilst known for their expressive aromatics, their bigger structure and back bone means they definitely demand time in the bottle.

The Gros family's winemaking dynasty began in 1830 when 26-year-old Alphonse Gros set up in the famous Burgundian commune of Vosne-Romanée. Six generations on, the properties have been divided up amongst family members, and there are now four separate Gros domaines. Today Michel Gros heads up his own, consisting of his Clos des Réas (Premier Cru) property, along with excellent parcels in Vosne-Romanée, Nuits-Saint-Georges, Morey-Saint-Denis, Chambolle-Musigny and the Bourgogne appellations. The vineyards are meticulously managed on a low-yield regime, with all fruit hand harvested and traditionally fermented using cultured yeasts, which Michel believes provide greater finesse. His attention to detail has been rewarded with numerous accolades, including Best Winemaker and Best Pinot Noir at London's famed International Wine Challenge, two years in a row.

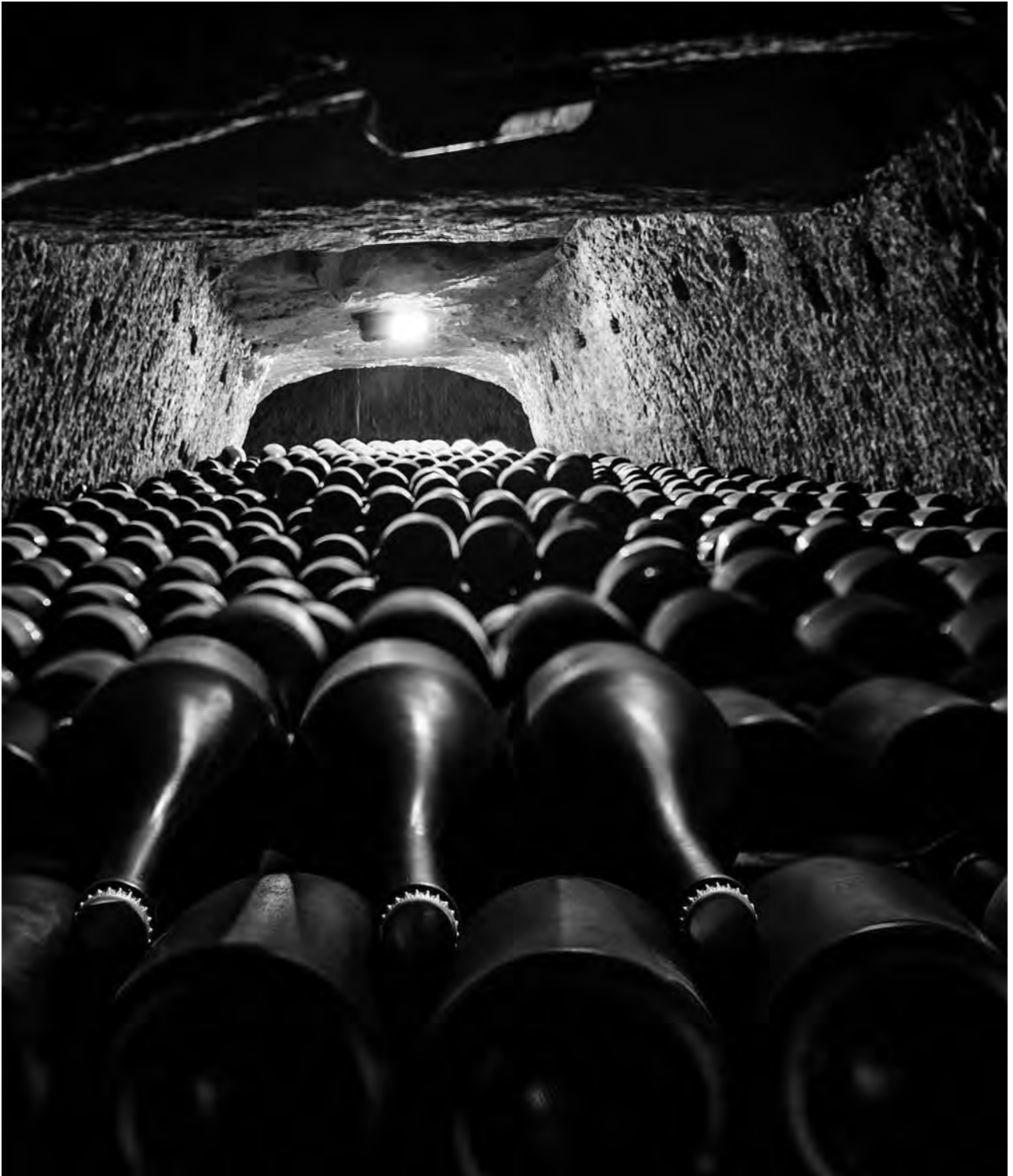
Currently working the 13th generation of the family business, Séguinot-Bordet have been producing wine in the commune of Maligny since the 18th Century, with records showing the family's roots in Chablis stretching back as far as 1590. The man in charge, the brilliant Jean-François Bordet, has forged a wonderful union between the old and the new and taken his family house to another level. Jean-François has installed a brand new winery in Maligny and established a strict viticultural regime in the vineyards, with cropping levels reduced and the Chardonnay harvested later. With the exception of the Grand Cru, all the wines are cool fermented and matured on lees in stainless steel to achieve fresh, clean fruit underscored by the minerality that characterises the classic Chablis style. Their signature Chablis comes off the Premier Cru vineyard Fourchaume, which they part own. With demand for their product at an all-time high, Séguinot-Bordet have had to start allocating their elegantly expressive, benchmark wines.

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Charles Heidsieck

Charles Heidsieck's provenance is immense, its origins lying as far back as 1785. That company gave rise to three different Heidsieck champagne houses, but it was the energetic, extroverted Charles-Camille Heidsieck (made famous in the song 'Champagne Charlie') who founded Charles Heidsieck in 1851. The House and its wines earned their first medals during the Universal Exhibition of 1859, and the Emperor Napoleon III is said to have been partial to its ambrosial qualities. Without any advertising other than word-of-mouth, its reputation in aristocratic circles flourished, establishing Charles Heidsieck as the champagne du jour in many of the royal houses of Europe. The wines are matured 25m underground in chalk cellars dating back to the 11th Century, under the watchful eye of current Chef de Cave Thierry Roset who, following in the footsteps of Daniel Thibault and Régis Camus, is stamping his own touch of genius on this distinguished brand. The giant Moët juggernaut accounts for nearly half of the champagne imported into the US, apparently, while also being responsible for the majority of soiled overalls on the Formula 1 circuit. Why don't those clowns just drink it? Anyway, it walks the perfect path between intensity and finesse in a swagger of inimitable balance and poise. Founded in 1743 by Claude Moët, it rapidly became the darling of the European courts. In 1792 Jean-Remy Moët took over the reins and established the world's first international luxury brand. The Moët & Chandon estate is the largest in the Champagne region, and they have access to 200 of its 323 Crus. The wines are a blend of Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and Pinot Meunier. 30 metres below the historic Maison in Epernay run 28 kilometres of cellars carved out of the great mass of marble chalk inherent to the region, with some galleries dating back to the original founding date in the 1740's.

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Champagne Moutard

The Moutard-Diligent family can trace a history of viticulture as far back as 1642, but it was not until the 1920s that they began producing champagne under their own name. Today, helmed by François Moutard, the family estate consists of 21 hectares of vines in the Côte des Bar region of southern Champagne, where the distinctive clay and limestone soils foster rich and fruity aromatics. Working from recipes written down by the gloriously named Hyacinthe Diligent back in the 19th century, Moutard produce a full range of champagnes, including the unique Cuvée des 6 Cépages, made from six varieties. The non-vintage wines are all aged for at least three years, the vintage and prestige champagnes for ten to fifteen. Moutard may lack the fame of some of the other marques, but their softly-textured wines are nonetheless very impressive, and flying, as they do, somewhat under the radar, they offer exceptional value.

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Laherte Frères

Laherte have 10ha across ten villages in the vicinity of Chavot. Since 2005 they have been biodynamic for most of the vineyards, with the balance organic, so healthy-looking vineyards, then, with the oldest parcel 45 years old. They are not 100% bio due to the distances between the villages; at critical times they can't be everywhere. The seventh generation is now at the helm, and there is a lot of attention to detail. With 100,000 bottles each year, this is not a big producer. Bottling is done by hand and gravity, while fermentation is in oak for most of the ++cuvée. These wines are very smart, very esoteric and a bucket-load of fun.

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Lilbert-Fils Champagne

Located in Cramant, the Lilbert family have been grape growers since 1746, and winemakers since 1907. Five generations on, it's Bertrand Lilbert at the helm today with his father close behind. The smallest of all our Growers, 3.5ha divided into 15 parcels, 100% Grand Cru produce a tiny 27,000 bottles. 80% of the production is NV, the balance is made up of Vintage champagne and a small amount of Perle. The NV and the Vintage are traditionally made Champagnes, from 100% Chardonnay. Perle is made in a Cramant style, not to be confused with the village of Cramant, a low pressure style that is richer and sweeter. Peter Liem, in his Champagne guide, sums this producer up well: "The only problem with these wines is finding them, as the tiny production is eagerly snapped up upon release by a near-cult following of clientele around the world". We have just landed these wines and are delighted to have them as part of our Grower Champagne range.

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Champagne Piper-Heidsieck

The oldest of the three Heidsieck champagne houses, Piper-Heidsieck was founded in 1785 by Florens-Louis Heidsieck. Ambitious to make his mark, F-L created a cuvée which he dedicated and presented in person to Queen Marie-Antoinette, a patronage one assumes was, at a certain point, abruptly severed. Upon his death, nephew Christian Heidsieck went into partnership with Henri-Guillaume Piper, an energetic entrepreneur who did much to champion champagne throughout the world. Christian died suddenly, his widow married Henri-Guillaume and the company became known as Piper-Heidsieck. Today, Piper-Heidsieck has established itself as one of champagne's most consistent and reliable expressions. In 2011, the prestigious FINE Champagne magazine awarded the Piper-Heidsieck Rare first place in its Best 100 Champagnes list. Ruinart's history dates back to the 17th Century, founded by Nicolas Ruinart. It is a tale of two Dom's, Dom Ruinart and Dom Perignon, close friends, Dom Thierry Ruinart Nicolas's uncle. Ruinart is now owned by LVMH and sits neatly in their portfolio of impressive Champagne houses, with a production of only 1.7 million bottles per annum, relatively speaking Ruinart is a small producer and has a surprisingly low profile. There's a dominance of Chardonnay in the house style, elegance outweighing power. Ruinart's prestige cuvee range is Dom Ruinart, which includes a Blanc de Blanc made from Grand Cru Chardonnay and a Rosé which has the same base as the Blanc de Blanc.

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Taittinger

The much-lauded Taittinger began life as Champagne Fournieux in 1734. The Fournieux family were themselves no slouches, acting for a time as advisors to Veuve Clicquot. During World War I, cavalry officer Pierre Taittinger spent time near Epernay. He subsequently returned to the region in 1932 to buy the Fournieux holdings and found the House of Taittinger, in the process buying up large swathes of valuable vineyard at a time when Depression-ravaged land prices were at rock-bottom. Relinquishing control to international corporate interests in the mid-2000's, the family have subsequently managed to claw their way back into contention. Today, once again in French hands and headed up by Pierre-Emmanuel Taittinger, the business is quartered in Reims, where they reside above their labyrinthine 4th-Century Roman cellars and remain one of the largest vineyard owners in the region.

Domaine Bourillon-Dorléans

The Bourillon family have been making wine at Rochecorbon, in the Vouvray appellation of the Loire Valley, for generations. The estate was founded as far back as 1875, but it was not until 1921 that it was organised as it is today by Gaston Dorléans. Still very much a family concern, the domaine is run by Gaston's great grandson, Frédéric Bourillon, who has consolidated the family's 26.5 hectares of vineyards and constructed a modern winery complex to service them. The Bourillon's continue to make their wines using fiercely traditional winemaking principles, with the immaculate Rochecorbon vineyards sustainably managed and the Chenin Blanc fruit for their highly characteristic Vouvray wines hand harvested and matured in the medieval caves alongside the winery. With an average vine age of 35 years, the wines are headily aromatic, deeply flavoured and lusciously textured, the sec (dry) style, in particular, showing a flintiness and minerality that is unique to the terroir of the Loire.

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Didier Dagueneau

It's not often that one feels they are in the presence of winemaking genius, one whose energy and spirit seems to seep out of the bottle and live on. This was the late Didier Dagueneau. Decanter named Didier as one of the world's top ten makers of white wine, opining that his expressions 'tower over the rest of Pouilly-Fume' and that 'he makes brilliantly three-dimensional wines, while too many of his fellow producers struggle to make it to two.' The Sauvignon Blanc wines of this risk-taking Loire perfectionist are legendary. Meeting an untimely end at the age of 52 in a plane crash, his brilliant legacy has been kept alive by his family via the dedicated and talented hands of his son, Benjamin, and to this day Dagueneau's Silex is hailed as the pinnacle of Sauvignon Blanc production.

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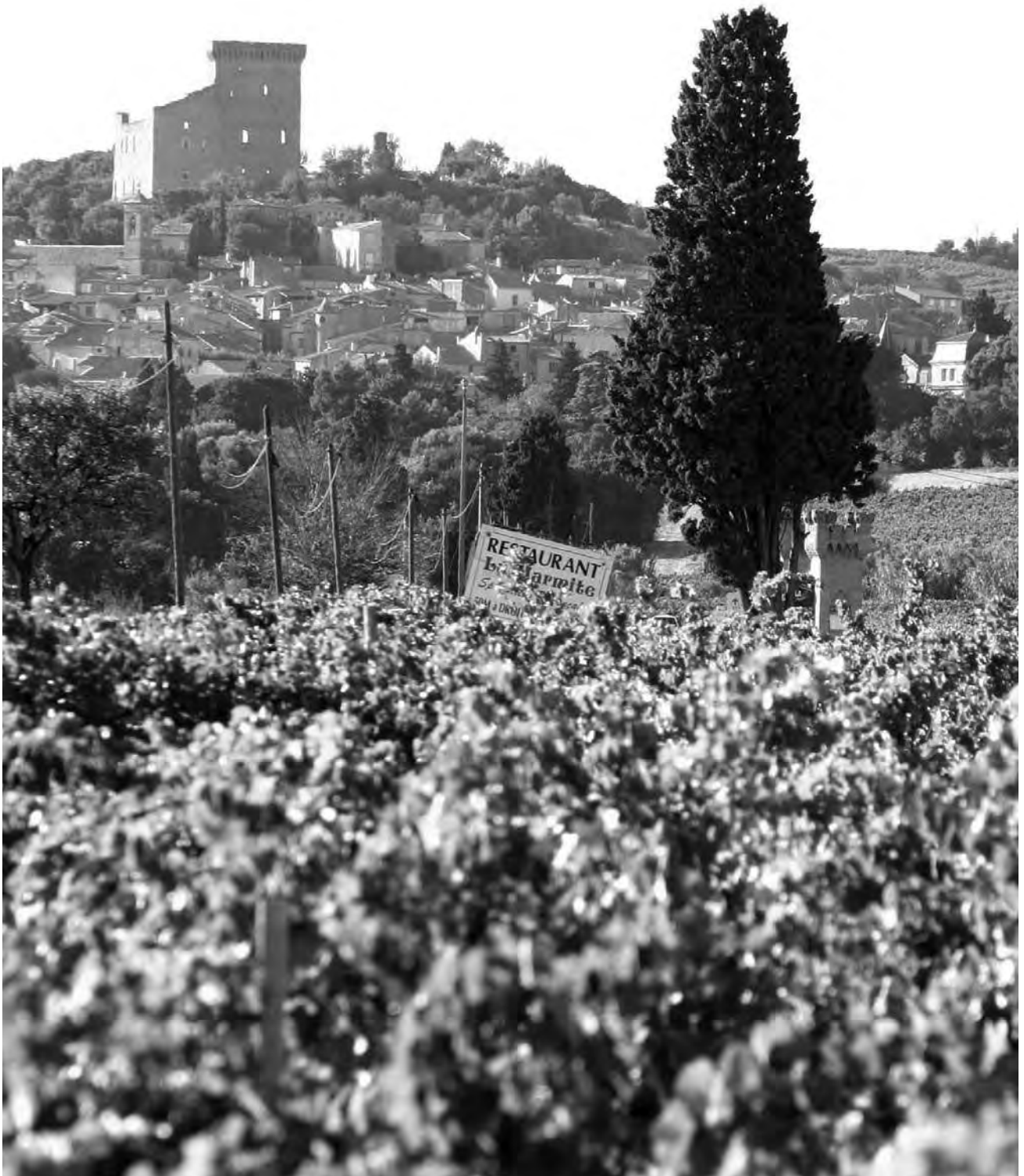
Pascal Jolivet

The energetic and enthusiastic Pascal Jolivet is one of a new breed of winemakers in the Loire Valley. While Pascal is a great respecter of tradition, and values the minerally-scented wines that the region has produced for decades, he is also acutely aware of the massive impact New World Sauvignon Blanc has had on the world stage. Aiming to make French Sauvignon - Pouilly-Fumé and Sancerre - sexy again, Pascal targeted the great restaurants of France, showing how brilliantly his wines paired with food, and gaining a reputation amongst the Michelin-starred dining rooms for his powerful yet elegantly styled expressions. While there is no question that these follow a long tradition of great Loire Valley wines (with the accompanying finesse, balance and 'gun-flint' hints all a hallmark) take note that this is a man who calls one of his wines 'Attitude'. He has made a huge impact, and he intends to keep it that way.

UNDERSTANDING THE RHÔNE VALLEY

The Rhône Valley is a historic wine region, grapes were grown in the northern part of the valley in the first century AD. In the 14th Century the papacy moved from Rome to Avignon, with their holiday residence in Châteauneuf-du-Pape; today the bottles of Châteauneuf-du-Pape still wear the papal signature in various ways. The Pope's were great lovers of wines and planted vineyards around the city. Situated in south eastern France, just south of Burgundy, the Rhône wine region is 250km long, with 250 communes, starting around Avignon in the south and finishing at Lyon – France's second largest city. Whilst often lumped together, the appellations of the Rhône are spread out over this vast wine growing region and produce a wide variety of styles from numerous grape varieties. Climatically it is a hot region, with abundant sunshine hours suiting grape varieties that like the warmth. There are four different types of rock that make up the unique soils of the Rhône Valley; granite, sandy silica, limestone and clay. The rocks significantly retain the intense summer heat during both day and night, perfect for ripening.

The Rhône wine growing region is broken into two distinct parts, the North and the South; the majority of wines produced across both are red, with small percentages of white and Rosé. In 1933 Châteauneuf-du-Pape was the first of the Rhône regions to be awarded the Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée status; today there are 19 AOC in the Rhône, including some relative new comers: in 2010 the still red wines from Rasteau were granted an AOC, and in 2006 Vinsobres was awarded the AOC status. The quality levels in the Rhône Valley are a little easier to understand than some of the neighbouring French regions; wine produced in one of the AOC villages areas is labelled under that village, outside that wines are either generic table wine, or Côtes du Rhône and then a step up to Côtes du Rhône Villages.

THE APPELLATIONS IN THE NORTHERN RHÔNE:

CONDRIEU: Home to the opulent variety Viognier (the only variety permitted here under the AOC), where the white wines produced are rich and luscious with aromas of apricot kernel and stoned fruit. The best examples are exceptional, one of the top producers in the region is Yves Cuilleron.

CORNAS: The only variety permitted here is Syrah; this is an appellation that offers some of the top fine wines in the world, for considerably less than their comparable counterparts elsewhere. The wines are densely structured powerful wines; black fruits, leather and an incredible will to just keep on giving.

CÔTE-RÔTIE: The fragrant beautiful reds of the northern Rhône; the varieties permitted here are Syrah and Viognier (which can make up to 20% of the blend), although in recent vintages the amount used is declining with many producers now making 100% Syrah. Fragrant, forward, fruit driven wines that are deceptively powerful.

CROZES-HERMITAGE: The majority of Crozes-Hermitage are red wines made from Syrah; there are small amounts of white produced from Marsanne and Roussanne. Geographically the Crozes-Hermitage AOC is diverse; when found, the best examples are excellent value and mature earlier than the other appellations of the northern Rhône.

HERMITAGE: Based around the Hermitage hill, there's Syrah, Marsanne and some Roussanne planted in this appellation. Characteristically the red wines are big, bold styles, full of ripe fruit characters, strong tannin structure, black pepper and spice.

SAINT-JOSEPH: The early drinking appellation in the northern Rhône; the whites are in the minority and are generally made from Marsanne and Roussanne, the reds from Syrah. Both red and white Saint-Joseph are fruit driven, fragrant, more gentle styles best to drink in the short term.

SAINT-PERAY: One of the smallest appellations in the northern Rhône, Saint-Peray is a white wine appellation producing both still and sparkling white wines.

CHÂTEAU-GRILLET: A tiny appellation consisting of 3.5ha on the right side of the Rhône river; there's only Viognier produced here and only by one producer. A very unique appellation, grapes have been grown here since Roman times and from 1936 it was an AOC.

THE APPELLATIONS IN THE SOUTHERN RHÔNE:

CHÂTEAUNEUF-DU-PAPE: The charming superstar of the southern Rhône; here there are 13 permitted varieties although only three producers, including Beaucastel and Mont-Redon, that grow all 13 varieties. Of all of the appellations, Châteauneuf-du-Pape is very hard to make generalisations about, the styles produced are wide ranging and there are 8100 hectares currently under vine. There are Châteauneuf-du-Papes that are excellent young and serious long lived wines produced here; in this appellation, perhaps more than the others, knowing the producers style and identifying the one that suits your taste is key.

GIGONDAS: This is a predominantly red appellation, with the main varieties being Grenache, Syrah, Mourvèdre and Cinsault. The wines produced here are strong, robust wines with chewy tannins and a rich fruity character; they are generous and rounded.

LIRAC: Often referred to as the Rosé producing appellation in the south; whilst Rosé is produced there, the majority of production is red wine made from a mix of grape varieties. In New Zealand we generally only see Rosé Lirac.

TAVEL: An appellation solely reserved for Rosé production; there are nine varieties that can be used to make Tavel including Grenache and Cinsault.

VACQUEYRAS: A sleeping superstar that is starting to wake, this appellation in recent years has started to produce some wines of exceptional quality and nicely enough without the massive jumps in price. The majority of this appellation is red wine, with Grenache, Syrah and Mourvèdre dominating the landscape. The wines are fruity, forward wines, plenty of dried herbs and spice; generally there's a strong acid backbone that adds lift to the wines.

BEAUMES DE VENISE: Whilst Côtes du Rhône Villages in Beaufort de Venise are produced in an appellation in their own right, the highlight of this appellation is the fortified wines made from Muscat Blanc à Petits Grains which is only permitted in this appellation in the southern Rhône and fall under the Muscat Beaufort de Venise AOC.

VINSOBRES: The newest addition to the appellations in the Rhône, producing red wines from Grenache and Syrah that are distinctly fresh and fleshy.

RASTEAU: This appellation has recently had its red wines recognised as an AOC, a classification that it already held for the fortified red wines produced here from Grenache. The still red wines, in the newest part of the appellation, are made predominantly from Grenache, Syrah and Mourvèdre.

GADAGNE: An appellation on the outskirts of Châteauneuf-du-Pape where red wines are produced predominantly from Grenache, Syrah and Mourvèdre.





Domaine Auguste Clape

Now in his eighties, Auguste Clape is one of the few remaining old-school proponents of French winemaking, a pioneering and unassuming genius who falls almost effortlessly into the category of 'great.' In reality, of course, there has been much effort involved, the Clapes inserting themselves into the northern Rhône landscape in the early 1900's to build their fortunes from next to nothing. Indeed, the Clape Syrahs from the Cornas appellation are among the most celebrated in France. Auguste paved the way there as the first to bottle his own wine. Today he works alongside son Pierre and grandson Olivier, farming a mere eight hectares of precipitous terraces by hand using traditional methods. Here, old vines are harvested as late as possible in a gamble with Nature to produce wines capable of tremendous longevity. The King, then, of Cornas, both because his wines are widely considered to be the best from this tiny appellation, and because he has at times fought single-handedly to maintain its integrity.

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Domaine Bosquet des Papes

Bosquet des Papes was founded by the Boiron family way back in 1860 and, six generations later, the Boirons are still in the driver's seat. One of the oldest names in Châteauneuf-du-Pape, over the decades they have procured many small parcels of land, eventually gathering to themselves forty-three different holdings scattered all over the appellation. Within the 27 hectares at their disposal, 3.5 ha is made up of 100-year-old vines (used to produce their Chante le Merle), while the average age of the total planted area is 50 years. The style of Bosquet des Papes is characterised as rustic, traditional and complex, and the winemaking is meticulous, producing rich, powerful, distinctive expressions with an affinity for cellar time.

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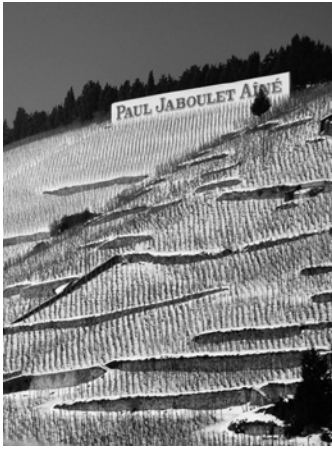
Domaine Jaume

The Jaume estate is located in Vinsobres and celebrated its centenary in 2005. The story started with Henri Chauvet, creator of an original recipe for croquettes, who was more interested in vines than cooking. He met Baron Leroy and fought to bring Vinsobres into the AOC system. It was Chauvet's son-in-law who established the estate and went on to allow his son Claude to raise some of its best wines during the 1960s. Grandsons Pascal and Richard succeeded Claude in the 1980s after completing wine studies in Beaune. Vinsobres currently carries the 'cru' appellation.

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Domaine Paul Jaboulet Aîné

Long one of the Rhône's most recognisable brands, replete with well tended vineyards, careful vinification and diligent aging practices (right down to employing their own cooper, who makes and maintains their stock of barrels). While there is an indelible Jaboulet character to all of the wines, the key to them - whether you're looking at the rustic Côtes du Ventoux, the lusciously rich Beauges de Venise dessert wines or the brooding, earthy flavours of the other reds - is that they are an accurate and authentic reflection of where they're grown. There has been much change at Paul Jaboulet Aîné in recent times, all of it for the better, with the Frey family, of Bordeaux' Château La Lagune and Champagne's Billecart-Salmon, taking over the reins. The change in ownership has introduced a welcome shot in the arm, one that has enabled a perhaps tiring Jaboulet to regain significant ground and capture once again the glories of their past. After all, when you manage some of the most significant pieces of wine real estate in the world, you'd want that to show in the bottle, wouldn't you?

Les Vins de Vienne is a highly successful négociant operation launched back in 1996 by a trio of Gallic winemaking superstars, Pierre Gaillard, François Villard and Yves Cuilleron. Originally devised as a project to rejuvenate the vineyards surrounding Vienne, the premise was expanded to encompass the key appellations of Côte-Rôtie, Condrieu, Saint-Joseph, Hermitage, Crozes-Hermitage, Cornas, Saint-Peray, Châteauneuf-du-Pape and Gigondas. The wines of Les Vins de Vienne harness the combined skills of these three talented winemakers, accessing the finest fruit available to produce an outstanding range that extols the best attributes of both northern and southern Rhône vineyards.

A relatively new addition to our range, Vignerons de Caractère are a cooperative based in the heart of the Vacqueyras appellation and specializing in the southern Rhône. We have, in the past, had a preference for working directly with domains; however, one mustn't become too inflexible, and when we tasted the quality here, our views on cooperatives were changed (or at least altered slightly). Vignerons de Caractère is a collective of 80 families who have been working together for 50 years, between them looking after around 1,000 hectares. In true Gallic fashion, the collective has flowed through the generations, with the livelihood of each of the families directly generated from grape growing and winemaking. In an operation of this size, the members (and their opinions) are as diverse as the wines they produce. One unifying component: recognition of the importance of eco-friendly methods and sustainable development. Traditional, pure, authentic.

Relentless work on often unforgiving slopes and a delicate touch in the cellar produce an end result that radiates precision and purity.

Following a back-to-basics philosophy, they believe in strengthening the land's biodiversity and natural defences by employing traditional growing methods and using only natural, non-toxic treatments. As such, the grapes are all harvested by hand, in tune with the seasonal and lunar cycles. Their belief is that if you respect the balance of the plant then you will get the most balanced fruit in return, and the flourishing of the vines (and olive trees) at Léoube stand as testimony to this approach.

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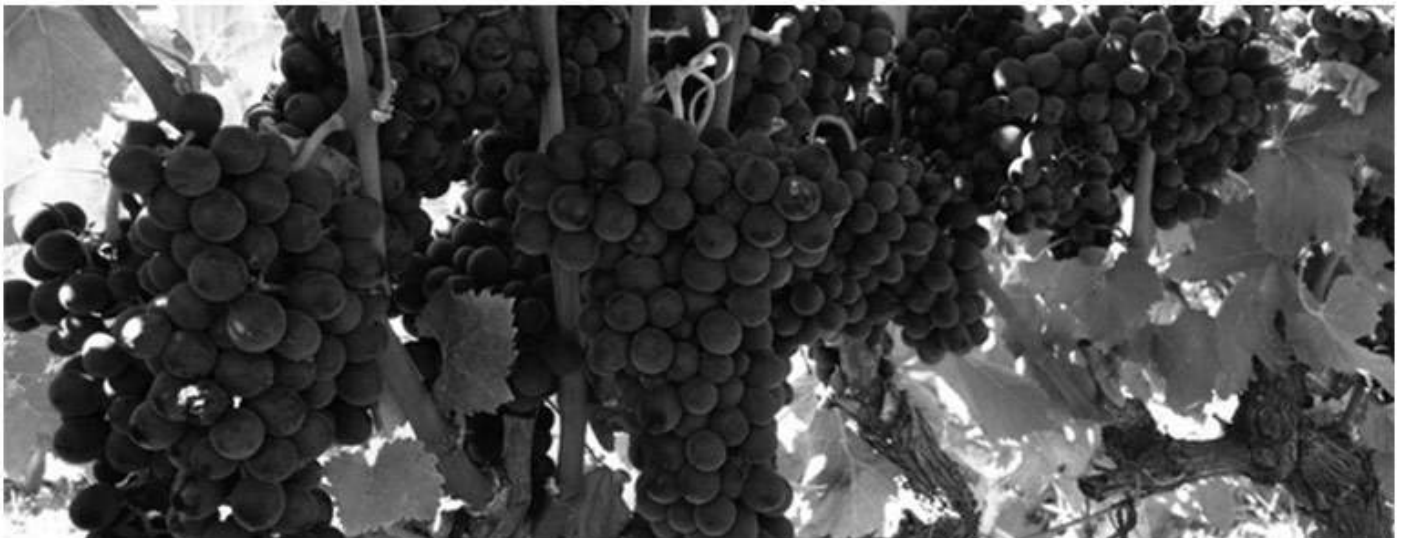

Descendientes de J. Palacios

One of a number of wines containing the fingers of the dynamic and pioneering winemaker, Alvaro Palacios, Descendientes de J. Palacios is named in tribute to Alvaro's father, the Riojan winemaker José Palacios Remondo. Arguably Spain's closest spiritual ally to the great domaines of Burgundy's Cote d'Or, the winery is a joint venture between Alvaro and his nephew, Ricardo Perez; both individuals had previously steeped themselves in the great wine regions of France and wanted to introduce some of the Gallic magic they had encountered into their mother country. The region of Bierzo had the ingredients they were looking for: steep hillside vineyards, distinctive terroirs containing poor but diverse, schist-infused soils and very old vines bearing the unique Mencía grape (supposedly introduced there by French pilgrims back in the Middle Ages), a variety they deemed capable of yielding its own grands crus. Fresh and spicy, with a mineral-infused vibrancy, the Descendientes de J. Palacios wines are some of Spain's most exciting.

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Valdespino

Located in the town of Jerez, in buildings with architectural character akin to the wondrous liquid that is concocted within, this is the oldest sherry bodega in Spain. That's some claim in a region that drips history out of every cornice. Its origins date back to 1264 and to Don Alfonso Valdespino, rewarded for his part in liberating the township from the Moors. At Valdespino, traditional practices meet modern technological understanding in a marriage made in heaven for sherry nuts. They are unique in their use of oak barrels in the blending process, ensuring distinctive wines with an additional dimension. Their sherries offer a diverse range of styles and flavours, with aperitifs to stimulate the palate and sweeter styles to savour either on their own, or with cheeses and desserts. They are a product of the Palomino grape and what happens to it when it sits in the sun and the blindingly white chalk soils of Jerez. Power and depth occur as if by magic, as does the remarkable finesse that, combined, make these wines fascinating, absorbing and wondrous to drink.

It was recently purchased in 2004 by the Fuertes family, who undertook a programme of modernization, unprecedented in the region. Such innovation can be seen in the production of an Organic Red, produced wholly under organic regulations with grapes grown from organic agriculture.

Leading the pack has been the charismatic and talented Alvaro Palacios, a perfectionist with a boundless energy for forging new vinous pathways and inserting fingers into a variety of pies. He replanted old vineyards and got working with Garnacha, a grape he considers 'the only variety that transforms heat and aridity into a beautiful, refreshing liquid.' His vision took off when in 1993 he brought the tiny L'Ermita vineyard and found himself producing a global smash. His Finca Dofi and L'Ermita vineyards are farmed biodynamically, and all of the wines are bottled without filtration. While the family winery in Rioja and his interests in Bierzo demand his attention, his weekly excursion to Priorat to address the range marketed under his own name is clearly a homecoming.

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Parés Baltà

Parés Baltà are a family-owned winery in Spain's Penedès region, with traditions stretching back to 1790. While Parés Baltà are renowned for their top-end cavas, they also produce some outstanding expressions in Priorat under the Gratavinum label. They are big on biodynamics, with their vineyards certified as ecological/organic, so you get to salute sustainability while sampling some of the most complex and complete expressions you're ever likely to experience, powerhouses of flavour, aroma and textural achievement.

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Cims de Porrera

'Cims' is Catalan for 'summits', a reflection of the estate's vines that are situated on the steep, rocky slopes high above Porrera village in Tarragona, the southern-most province of Spain's Catalonia. Cims de Porrera is a village co-operative, making only two premium wines that reflect the best of Priorat. Sitting at 400-600m above sea level, this difficult terrain, with its unique black slate soil, requires meticulous hand harvesting of the ancient, low-yielding vines that can be more than a hundred years old. Priorat is only one of two wine regions in Spain (the other being Rioja) to qualify as Denominación de Origen Calificada (DOCa, or DOQ in Catalan), the highest level of Spanish classification.

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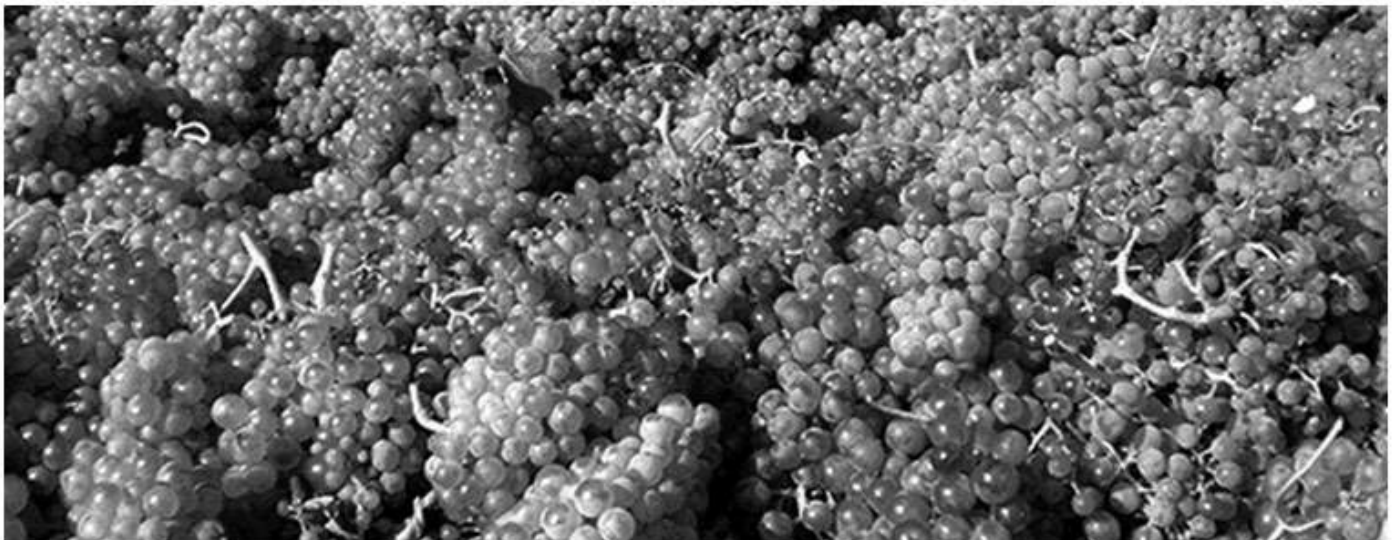
Pazo De Barrantes

We have to go back to the sixteenth century to find the origins of Pazo de Barrantes. The history of the Pazo, a Galician palace of 1229m², is bound to the history of the Creixell family, and have not been separated in the last four centuries. Vines of albarino have shared this prominence with History and Family. It was Don Vicente Cebrian-Sagarriga, Count of Creixell, who started to build the winery which adorns the view of the vineyard in perfect architectonic harmony with the original Pazo. Founded in 1991, Pazo de Barrantes is equipped with the latest technologies to produce high quality wine. Following the death of Vicente Cebrian in 1996, his children Vicente Dalmau (current Count of Creixell) and Cristina took over as managers of Pazo de Barrantes.

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Bodegas Pintia

In the latter half of the 1990's, Vega-Sicilia owners the Álvarez family purchased Bodegas Pintia, where the grape of choice is Tempranillo (here known as Tinto de Toro). Located in northern Spain's Toro region, Pintia sits on rich clay at a lofty altitude the Álvarez clan can relate to. The difference from their home patch in Ribera del Duero is in the temperature, which can really pump in Toro, especially at the height of summer. Harnessing a helping of refinement to the resulting intensity is the challenge here, one partially met by picking into very small crates that are immediately chilled for 12 hours, followed by four days of cold maceration. Big, ripe, concentrated wines, then, that age their way into elegance.

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Bodegas Emilio Moro

Emilio Moro is a third-generation, family-owned winery with over 120 years of winemaking history in Ribera del Duero. Emilio Moro, the hombre, grew up treading grapes and racking wine with his father in his native village of Pesquera de Duero. They have 200 hectares planted in a pure clone of the Tinto Fino (Tempranillo) variety taken off their earliest vines, and the vineyards look down from an elevated position 600 metres above the Duero River. A harsh continental climate and a hardy bed of clay, gravel and chalk add the finishing touches to the unique character of these Duero expressions. Nowadays, the winery is run by Emilio's sons, José and Javier, but we'll leave the final word to Don Emilio Moro himself: 'Wine is an art, if you know how to listen it speaks to you, telling you when it needs racking and when it needs to rest. It is like a living being that you have to understand, look after and care for.'

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Bodegas Vega Sicilia

Ribera del Duero's aristocratic Vega Sicilia winery has a long history dating back to 1864, and the exceptional Vega Sicilia Unico is Spain's most famous wine. Since 1982 the winery has been owned by the Álvarez family, members of the Primum Familiae Vini, a global (and very restricted) association of some of the world's top winemaking families. Around 40% of Vega Sicilia's vineyards are planted in traditional Bordeaux varieties introduced by the winery's founder, Elroy Lecanda y Chaves, back in the 1800's. Their favoured variety, though, is Tempranillo, which winemaker Javier Ausdas deems to be 'the best in the world.' With some of the vines over 100 years old, here it is all about patience, aging in barrel and bottle for as long as it takes to achieve the family's exalted goals. If the vintage doesn't stack up, the flagship Vega Sicilia Unico will simply not be made. There is a 5000-person waiting list to become eligible for an annual allotment, and really, you'd be leaving these wines for decades to realize their true potential, before popping the cork.

Protos now has about 100 hectares of its own vineyards. In addition, it is supplied by an additional 500 hectares belonging to associates, as well as approximately 300 more from winegrowers in the area who have become regular suppliers.

The host of innovative winemakers operating within Spain has been a significant factor in the country's success in recent years, hardy individuals unafraid to challenge centuries-old tradition, or preserve it where there is benefit in doing so. Leading the pack has been the charismatic and talented Alvaro Palacios, a perfectionist with a boundless energy for forging new vinous pathways and inserting fingers into a variety of pies. He replanted old vineyards and got working with Garnacha, a grape he considers 'the only variety that transforms heat and aridity into a beautiful, refreshing liquid.' His vision took off when in 1993 he brought the tiny L'Ermita vineyard and found himself producing a global smash. His Finca Dofi and L'Ermita vineyards are farmed biodynamically, and all of the wines are bottled without filtration. While the family winery in Rioja and his interests in Bierzo demand his attention, his weekly excursion to Priorat to address the range marketed under his own name is clearly a homecoming.

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Marqués de Cáceres

No wine-producing country has changed more dramatically than Spain in the last 30 years, and nowhere has this been more evident than in Rioja, where a new generation of winemakers and modern technology have transformed this tradition-bound region. One of the most influential new wineries of the region, Marqués de Cáceres is unanimously recognised as the leading producer of modern Rioja and considered largely responsible for the Riojan renaissance of recent decades. The company is owned and operated by the Forner family, long established in the wine business but forced to flee to France during the Spanish Civil War. When Enrique Forner returned to establish a winery in his homeland, he chose what he considered the finest viticultural region in Spain, Cenicero in Rioja Alta, constructing there the first new winery to appear in Rioja in fifty years. Today, Marqués de Cáceres continue to produce wines of the highest quality that pay homage to both Rioja's terroir and its indigenous varieties.

This claim is backed by their International Wine and Spirit Competition (IWSC) awards and accolades, including being named the 'Best Spanish Producer' in 2011. Lustau's oenologist, Manuel Lozano, has been named the 'Best Fortified Winemaker of the Year' by the IWSC multiple times. Bodegas Lustau was founded in 1896 by José Ruiz-Berdejo.

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Valdespino

Located in the town of Jerez, in buildings with architectural character akin to the wondrous liquid that is concocted within, this is the oldest sherry bodega in Spain. That's some claim in a region that drips history out of every cornice. Its origins date back to 1264 and to Don Alfonso Valdespino, rewarded for his part in liberating the township from the Moors. At Valdespino, traditional practices meet modern technological understanding in a marriage made in heaven for sherry nuts. They are unique in their use of oak barrels in the blending process, ensuring distinctive wines with an additional dimension. Their sherries offer a diverse range of styles and flavours, with aperitifs to stimulate the palate and sweeter styles to savour either on their own, or with cheeses and desserts. They are a product of the Palomino grape and what happens to it when it sits in the sun and the blindingly white chalk soils of Jerez. Power and depth occur as if by magic, as does the remarkable finesse that, combined, make these wines fascinating, absorbing and wondrous to drink.

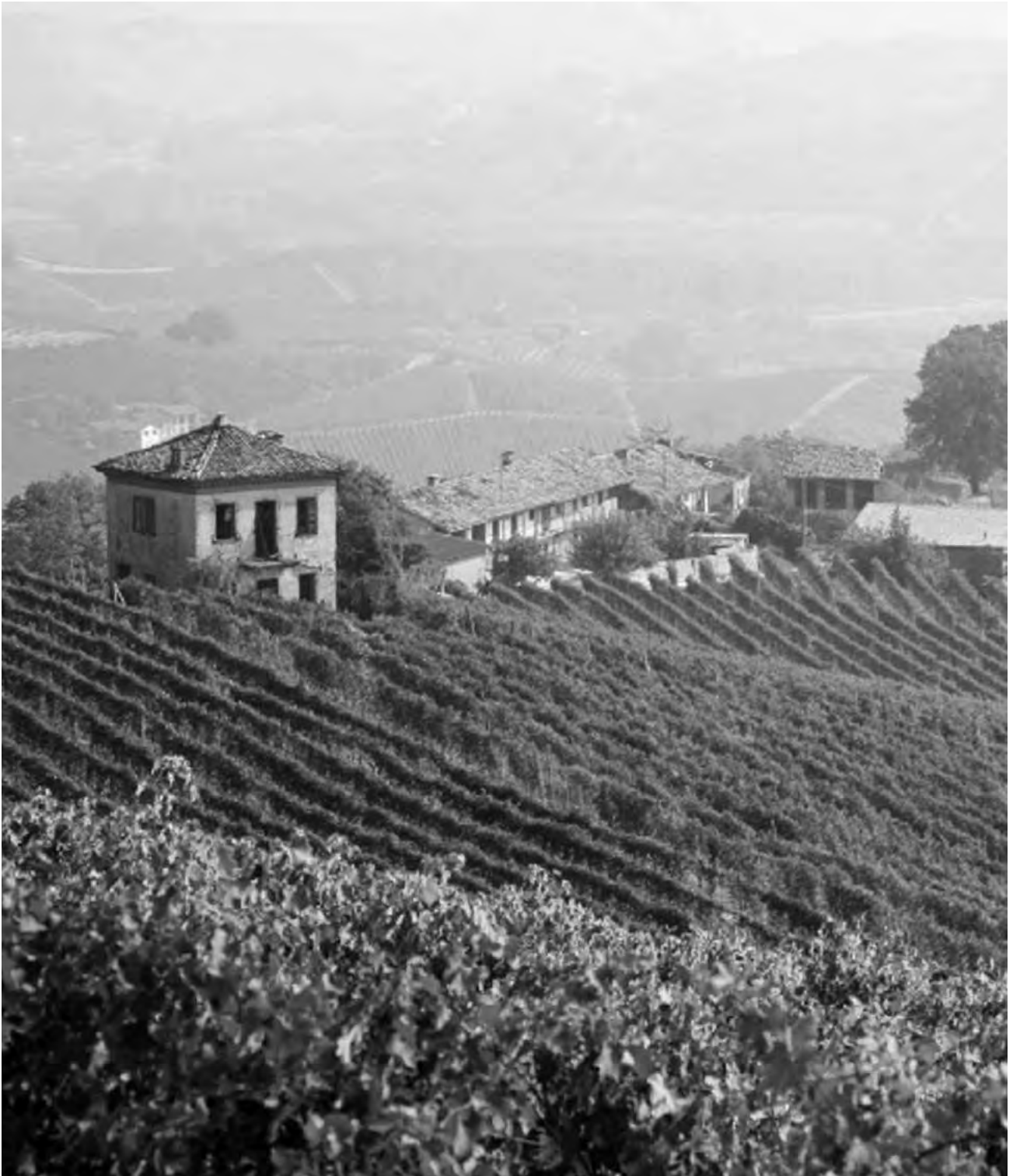

Bruno Giacosa

In the world of wine producers, Bruno Giacosa sits at the elite table. Born in 1929 in Neive, Piedmont, Bruno from an early age learnt on the job from his father and grandfather. Until recently, Giacosa did not own land, though this has now changed, with vineyards added to the company holdings. Quality is paramount, so much so that the Giacosa wines are not made every year, are often declassified or sold off, and only rarely do they bear the famous red label reserved for the very best expressions. One of Piedmont's finest traditional producers of Barolo and Barbaresco, with individual cru the focus and blending frowned upon.

Established in 1870, Ca del Baio remains today a family company lead by the fourth generation. Amidst their range of Barolo's is the prized cru of Asili, whilst the family had been growing grapes here for many years it was not until 1988 they started to vinify them separately and not long after the Pora. Ca del Baio manage their winery and vineyards sustainably, using very little intervention and as little sulphur in the winery as possible. The wines are vinified with natural yeasts and nurtured to ensure they reach your cellar ready for the long rest ahead.

Established in 1890 the Damilano winery is run today by the fifth generation of the family. Damilano are the largest land owners in the prized Barolo cru Cannubi with an impressive 10ha under their control. As well as Cannubi Damilano have 2 of the hectares of Liste as well as the Crus Brunate and Cerequio. The style here has changed over the last 10 years; the story is not uncommon in Barolo. as the area evolved and the producers looked outside they adopted many a technique used elsewhere, including the use of Barriques. Though 10 years ago Damilano had the good sense to understand that Nebbiolo can lose its charm with too much new oak and have gone back old large French oak.

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Marchesi di Grésy

Known officially as 'Tenute Cisa Asinari dei Marchesi di Grésy' and around here, a little more pragmatically, as just plain 'di Grésy' this estate has been in the di Grésy family since 1797. After a somewhat lengthy period as suppliers of top-quality fruit to other producers, Alberto di Grésy (raised apparently with 'no television and a lot of praying') stiffened his resolve, and in 1973 upped the ante, producing the first inhouse di Grésy wines and transforming the family business into a world-class enterprise. The aristocratic and affable Alberto and his team vinefy from the company's four estates, Martinenga, Monte Aribaldo, La Serra and Monte Colombo. Considered to be the greatest of all the estates in Barbaresco, Martinenga is home to the single vineyards, Camp Gros and Gaiun, nestled between them a 6.49ha block that is the source of an impressive traditional Barbaresco labelled Martinenga.

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Fontanafredda

Fontanafredda was purchased by the first King of Italy, Vittorio Emanuele II, as a hunting retreat. It was left to his first born, Count Emanuele Alberto di Mirafiori who, it seemed, was more interested in drinking wine than making it. Such profligacy could only have one outcome, and the party-loving Count's bankers became winemakers. Widely regarded as one of the region's great estates, the 250-acre property produced some good wines, but seldom lived up to its potential until 2008, when Oscar Farinetti and Luca Baffiso purchased a large part of the estate and introduced a renewed impetus. The vineyards, planted on Piedmont's gently undulating Langhe slopes, are responsible for Italy's version of Bordeaux reds, the muscular, brooding, long-lived wines of Barolo and Barbera that are forged from the Nebbiolo grape. With Robert Parker rating the majority of Fontanafredda's output in the 90-point range, it is no exaggeration to say that this is one of the great producers of one of the world's great wine styles.

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Gianni Gagliardo

While the name Gagliardo is somewhat new to Barolo's terrain, the estate itself has been around for many years, trading under the moniker of its founder, Paolo Colla. Gianni Gagliardo married into Paolo's family in the 1970's and by the mid-80's had altered the name to his own, signifying a change in guard and in style. The Gagliardo winery is located in the picturesque area of La Morra, at the foot of the mountain that the village of La Morra sits atop. The area itself produces 31% of the total Barolo made, the sub-region's style delicate, perfumed and quite subtle. Gianni's two oldest sons are involved in this family-run operation, with Stefano assisting Gianni with the winemaking, while brother Alberto manages the family's 30 hectares of vineyards. These vineyards are the major source of the Gagliardo Barolos. The company's reputation is based on these outstanding expressions, but it also makes an excellent range of classic Piedmont wines that are among the best in the region.

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Angelo Gaja

The Gaja winery was founded in the Piemonte region of northern Italy in 1859 by Giovanni Gaja, and it has been family owned and operated for four generations in a constantly evolving arc of inspired winemaking. Current patriarch, Angelo Gaja, started a revolution in the area following several trips to France, and is credited with taking both Barbaresco and Barolo into new stylistic areas, more often than not through controversial measures. Foremost is his use of oak barriques to soften the Nebbiolo tannins and produce a richer, more concentrated wine than the traditional model. Temperature-controlled fermentation, green harvest, reduction of crop size and the introduction of French varieties have all contributed to his modernist reputation and the soaring international praise for the Gaja wines. Wine Spectator proclaimed his 1985 Barbarescos 'the finest wines ever made in Italy.' With Angelo now past 70, his daughters Gaia and Rossana run the estate, although, it has to be said, the man himself has never officially retired.

La Raia produce three Gavi and two Barbera wins based on Nebbiolo. There's a link with Tenuta Cucco, the Rossi family purchasing Tenuta Cucco in 2015.

The extensive property that houses Fontanafredda is known as Mirafiore, the original name the company's wines were labelled under when it was first established right back in the 1870s. That historic name now graces a new range of wines sourced from those first vineyard plots and crafted in the original style. In its early days, Fontanafredda was a virtual village, accommodating, along with their schooling and healthcare, all the families that tended the grapes and made the wine. Sustainability, then, is key, with no chemicals or pesticides in the vineyard and a natural approach to winemaking that involves very low use of sulphur.

Biodynamic stalwarts the Rossi Cairos picked them up in 2015, and they are in the process of transitioning vineyard and winery to a similar eco-friendly regime to that of their La Raia property. The Tenuta Cucco portfolio includes three Barolo: one from the Serralunga area, the Cerrati and the Cerrati Riserva. They also produce Barbera and Chardonnay wines. A tiny 70,000 bottles are produced off 13ha of vines, with the Barolo the main event.

Tuscan to the core, the Antinori family have been making wine for over six hundred years, since Giovanni di Piero Antinori became a paid-up member of the Florentine Guild of Vintners back in 1385. This is a long time by anybody's yardstick, and means they were already well into their core business when Leonardo da Vinci was just down the road attempting to invent a helicopter (a truly sobering thought, Chianti in hand or not). They even own their own Renaissance-era palace. Throughout a history spanning twenty-six generations, the family have remained directly hands-on, making innovative and often courageous choices, tempered by an unwavering respect for their painstakingly earned traditions and the integrity of their Tuscan and Umbrian landscapes. Today, Marchese Piero Antinori directs the company, assisted by his three daughters, Albiera, Allegra and Alessia. They are the original champions of Brunello, the Sangiovese clone isolated in the 1800's by local farmer, Clemente Santi, that evolved into one of Italy's rarest and most expensive wines, Brunello di Montalcino (first released in 1888 by Clemente's grandson, the visionary Feruccio Biondi-Santi, who completely discarded the Tuscan winemaking manual to forge its magnificence). Not ones to rush into things, the Biondi-Santis had by the end of WWII released only four vintages (hence the rarity perhaps) in 1888, 1891, 1925 and 1945. These days the residing patriarch is Franco Biondi-Santi, described intriguingly by his grand-daughter Clio as being 'a hard man, but he has a good heart.'

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Angelo Gaja

Current patriarch, Angelo Gaja, started a revolution in the area following several trips to France, and is credited with taking both Barbaresco and Barolo into new stylistic areas, more often than not through controversial measures. Foremost is his use of oak barriques to soften the Nebbiolo tannins and produce a richer, more concentrated wine than the traditional model. Temperature-controlled fermentation, green harvest, reduction of crop size and the introduction of French varieties have all contributed to his modernist reputation and the soaring international praise for the Gaja wines. Wine Spectator proclaimed his 1985 Barbarescos 'the finest wines ever made in Italy.' With Angelo now past 70, his daughters Gaia and Rossana run the estate, although, it has to be said, the man himself has never officially retired.

This superb Tuscan estate was established by Marchese Mario Incisa della Rochetta in 1944, Mario nursing an overwhelming desire to create a 'thoroughbred' wine, his holy grail the great wines of Bordeaux. From deep within the home of Sangiovese and Nebbiolo, he put his money on the Cabernet Sauvignon grape (something it took the locals a while to come to terms with). No idle dream, this, though: Tenuta San Guido is the producer of Italy's most famous expression, Sassicaia, considered to be the seminal Super Tuscan and one of the most sought-after wines in the world. In a Decanter tasting, the 1972 Sassicaia was victorious over a field of 33 top wines from 11 countries, firmly underlining its international reputation. In 1994 it was given its own appellation - Bolgheri Sassicaia DOC - the only wine in Italy to have had

They had extensive business interests at home and in India, and were described by one historian as 'among the merchant princes of great Britain.' In 1820 they accepted twenty seven barrels of Port as payment for a debt, and then decided to devote their energies solely in that direction. Graham's is still entirely family-owned and fully independent, producing wines that are renowned for their rich concentration, velvet elegance and balanced power.

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Taylor's

For many, Taylor's is the archetypal Port house and its wines the quintessential Ports. Established over three centuries ago in 1692, Taylor's is one of the oldest of the founding Port houses. It is dedicated entirely to the production of Port wine and in particular to its finest styles.

Above all, Taylor's is regarded as the benchmark for Vintage Port. One of the oldest, and arguably the greatest, of all the port houses, Noval produce wines displaying an incredible delicacy and elegance, and they are unique in that their glorious Nacional, along with the Quinta do Noval vintage ports, Quinta do Noval Colheitas and Douro red wines all come from their single vineyard located in Pinhão, at the very heart of the Douro Valley. At the centre of that vineyard lies a tiny, treasured parcel planted with ungrafted vines that are 100% Portuguese rootstock untouched by phylloxera, from which Quinta do Noval make the legendary Nacional, the most famous and desired port in the world. The vineyard is, in its entirety, within the top classification, and planted with the noble grape varieties of the Douro, Touriga Nacional, Touriga Franca, Tinta Roriz, Tinto Cão, Tinta Barroca, Tinta Francisca and Sousão. As well as purchasing grapes from about 185 local independent growers, Peter Lehmann Wines has its own vineyards, which produce about 2% of its requirements. Chief winemaker Andrew Wigan heads the four person team of talented winemakers and it is the contribution of all members that goes into making Peter Lehmann Wines. Sadly Peter Lehmann passed away on June 28, 2013. His contribution to the industry as a whole was acknowledged in 2009 with an International Wine Challenge Lifetime

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Kilikanoon

These wines are micro-production with a common thread, using extremely old pre-phyloxera vines, and the grapes only picked at full ripeness. Only French oak is used and the wines are neither fined nor filtered.

Kumeu River

Kumeu River Wines was established in 1944 when Mick and Katé Brajkovich and their son Maté first came to the small country settlement of Kumeu, about 20 km northwest of Auckland City. The family had migrated from Yugoslavia in 1938 and had been working in the far Northern part of New Zealand digging kauri gum. After moving to Henderson, in West Auckland, in the early 1940's, they worked on vineyards and orchards in the area and saved enough money to buy a property with a small existing vineyard at Kumeu. Yields are kept low to improve the concentration of aromas and flavours in the grapes, and they harvest all of the grapes by hand. This allows them to remove faulty berries in the field so that quality grapes may arrive at the winery in pristine condition. The white grapes are all whole-bunch pressed, which is time-consuming but gives the best quality results. The reds are destemmed and crushed gently before being transferred to fermentation tanks. No yeasts are added, as they rely solely on the indigenous yeasts that are present in the vineyard.

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Pegasus Bay

Founded in the mid 1980's by Christchurch wine judge Ivan Donaldson and his wife Christine, Pegasus Bay is very much a family affair, with son Matthew and his wife Lynnette the Winemakers. The Waipara Valley is in the south island of New Zealand, 30 minutes drive north of Christchurch. Its latitude equates to that of the south of France in the northern hemisphere. To the east they are separated from Pegasus Bay by a range of hills which protect it from the cooling winds of the Pacific. To the west lie the Southern Alps, from whence the region's hot nor'west winds derive. Its sheltered position, but proximity to the sea, give it warm days, cool nights and a dry autumn, resulting in a very prolonged ripening period. This promotes intense flavour development and optimal ripeness, while retaining good natural acidity.

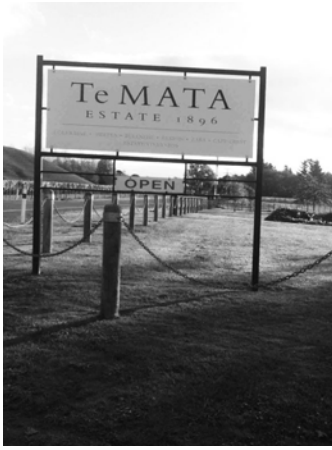

Marisco Vineyards combines a family history steeped in the very beginnings of grape growing in Marlborough with a bold entrepreneurial spirit.

Founder Brent Marris grew up on some of the very first vineyards in Marlborough, planted by his father. As a young winemaker he was responsible for the development of two major brands: Oyster Bay, and subsequently Wither Hills as owner and creator.

In 1995, and again in 1996 and 2001, Ata Rangi Pinot Noirs won the coveted Bouchard-Finlayson Trophy for Best Pinot Noir at the International Wine and Spirit Competition in London. 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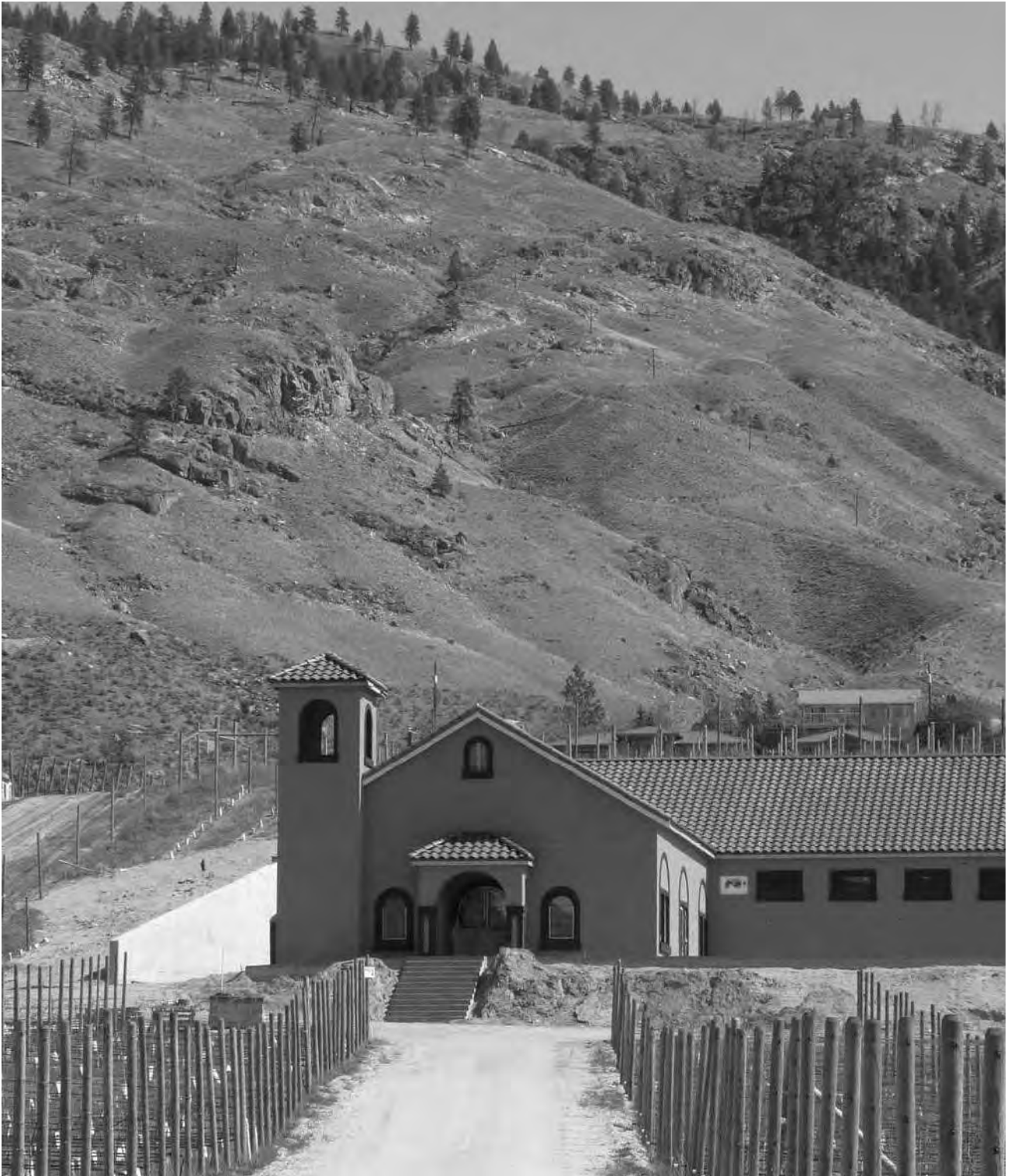

A Canadian producer, the wine's name, Osoyoos Larose, reflects the partners' roots in France and Canada. Osoyoos refers to the location of the vineyards in the Okanagan Valley, on the mountain slopes above Lake Osoyoos. The land is situated on the western bench, overlooking Lake Osoyoos, a slim lake that runs north and south on the valley floor. It boasts plentiful sunlight, minimal rainfall and excellent drainage, with proximity to the lake providing cooler temperatures in the evening. The sloping character of the site reduces the intensity of the sunlight, promoting excellent photosynthesis for the vines and enhancing the maturation of the fruit's tannins and colour. Pascal Madevon is both vineyard manager and winemaker for Osoyoos Larose.

The Chilean chapter of the family was founded by Alexandra Marnier Lapostolle and her husband Cyril de Bournet in 1994. Now managed by the 7th generation, Charles-Henri de Bournet. Their vineyards in Apalta are now certified organic and bio, though the wines are not labelled that way, the grapes are certified, not the winery. 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Vina Aquitania

All that time, understanding that this was the very best part of the region. The vines planted, of Bordeaux origin, the winery finished in 1993. Here you find French inspired winemaking with old vines in the heart of the Maipo valley. They are so much in the centre that the city of Santiago has come up to them and surrounded them.

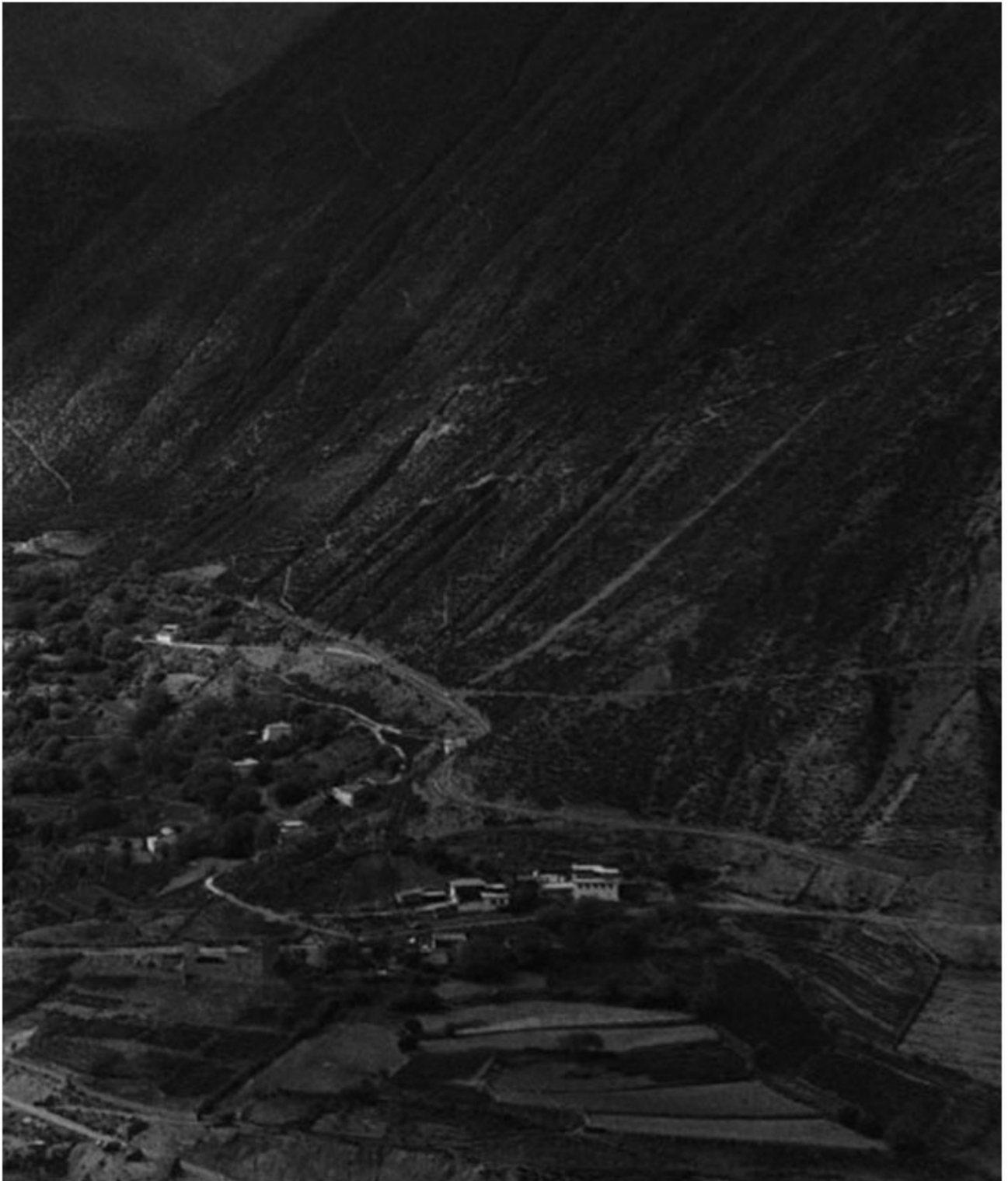
Chateau Musar

In 1930, at just 20 years old, Gaston Hochar founded Chateau Musar, inspired by Lebanon's 6,000-year winemaking tradition and his travels in Bordeaux. His 'wines with noblesse' greatly impressed senior officers in the army following on from the French mandate of the 1920s. Major Ronald Barton, of Château Langoa-Barton, stationed in Lebanon during World War II became a great friend, strengthening the links between Chateau Musar and Bordeaux that remain to this day. Serge Hochar, Gaston's eldest son trained as a civil engineer, then decided to study oenology and with the encouragement of his father became a student of Emile Peynaud at the University of Oenology in Bordeaux. Having declared to his father "I want to make the wine my way, I want it to be known world-wide - and I want you to quit!" he became Chateau Musar winemaker in 1959, Gaston senior having graciously given way. He then spent 18 years perfecting the formula for Chateau Musar's Red and was chosen as Decanter Magazine's first 'Man of the Year' in 1984 for his dedication to producing superb quality
