It takes a community.

Good News Project began as a humble effort in 1983 to assist a few people in St. Lucia who could use a gentle and encouraging hand. This was done by gathering a few friends and family members to help. A working vacation, really. And it was good.

As time passed, we expanded our communities of service to include St. Vincent and Dominica. In 1998, we organized ourselves to become a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization. Within seven years time we needed a new and ongoing source of funding to augment the generosity of our current list of supporters and cheerleaders. Electronic recycling was born at our organization as this new source of revenue. Through integrity, detail and excellent customer service we soon could depend on this income. We saw that this program was fiscally good.

Our programming quickly expanded and we took on an effort to assist people locally by providing gently used medical equipment (today's HELP closet). The concept of this program was "too good to be true" for people in our own county and state who didn't have the financial means to get the items they needed. But it was true and it was wonderfully good.

What we didn't consciously plan through all this "doing good" was one of the byproducts of our efforts; together we have built a culture of people who care for one another like family. We have built and continue to build a community. It has been a life-changing good.

Building community can take on many different forms. We are part of the spontaneous hugs in our HELP closet when someone's soul hurts after the passing of a loved one. We observe our eager e-cycle volunteer who knows his efforts are, in some way, contributing to a cleaner environment for the next generation. We are energized by the traveler abroad who returns year after year because her first encounter with a West Indian volunteer blossomed into a friendship. Whatever the reason, whatever the motivation, I am seeing more and more that the existence of our organization is creating a patchwork quilt of friendships and a more solid sense of community and belonging.

For years researchers have been discussing a direct correlation between a person's happiness as it relates to their sense of belonging to a group. Based on my own interaction with volunteers at Good News Project, I boldly go out on a limb and



suggest these volunteers return because they feel like they belong here. What else could keep them coming back week after week to clean medical equipment, unload wagons of electronics, help with bulk mailings or take a trip to build a home for a complete stranger?

Throughout this annual report I hope you get a glimpse of how we see communities being developed through our programming, through the volunteers who choose to serve their neighbors through us and through the donors who choose to donate to us.

This letter is an open invitation to YOU, dear reader, to consider giving the Good News Project community a try. You may be pleasantly surprised about what you find here.

Local (and very dedicated!) volunteers provide the support, maintenance and customer service needed to keep the HELP closet running smoothly.



Does a neighbor need to be an individual? Not at all! A variety of organizations enable us to support and improve the lives of those who have a need. Many of these community partners share information about our HELP closet with their patients, clients and customers. In return, we help connect people with their organizations.

What does it take to run our Health Equipment Lending Program (HELP)? It certainly takes a community!

It's a beautiful day for a neighbor!

THIS IS WHAT 2018 LOOKED LIKE IN OUR HELP CLOSET.

- 1,728 families/individuals were assisted in our HELP closet (at an average of 144 each month).
- 4,222 pieces of durable medical equipment went out our doors, either as loans or sales (when the need was long-term).
- Although we have no residential restrictions, 81% of the people who come in, live in Marathon County, 14% live in a county that borders Marathon with the remaining 5% living elsewhere in the state.
- We accepted 1,363 pieces of medical equipment as donations, 75% of which were absorbed into our program. The remaining pieces were shipped overseas.
- Last year 8 people volunteered on a regular basis, with a few more helping out when needed, giving a total of 1,324 hours!

COMMUNITY PARTNERS: Aspirus, Ascension/St Clare's, Marshfield Clinic, St Vincent de Paul, United Way of Marathon County, Faith in Action, Salvation Army, The Warming Center, Neighbor's Place, ADRC of Central Wisconsin, AIDS Resource Center, Women's Community, Inclusa, Ramp Up Marathon County, Open Door, Habitat for Humanity, Faith in Action, Bridge Community Clinic and The Wausau Area Hmong Mutual Association.

Many local churches and various fraternal organizations speak of our program. In addition, physical therapy departments, home health care, rehabilitation facilities, and doctor's offices refer individuals and family members to utilize our services.

The Shipment Arrived!

The Good News Project shipment arrived in St. Lucia via the US Air Force on January 13. Local and international Good News Project members accompanied me to offload the aircraft. The international Good News Project volunteers were thrilled to be part of offloading the plane, organizing and loading up the trucks for distribution.

I'm always excited when the shipment arrives because I know so many institutions benefit from the shipment (schools, hospitals, health centers, nursing homes and individuals).

To see the joy on a person's face when they receive a needed item, big or small, brings happiness in my heart.

On behalf of all the institutions and persons who benefit from the shipment I would like to say thank you Good News Project for all that you have done and all that you'll be doing in my country.

Our Friends, Our International Community



“Mom, you told me that already.” My son sighs in exasperation as he fidgets next to me on the couch. We snuggle deeper beneath the quilt; we are cozy in our comfortable home.

But the people in these families, in all families, are my son’s brothers and sisters. This global community is our shared home and we do need to “hear it” from time to time.

He is frustrated because I have told him once again about the families that I met during my most recent service trip in the West Indies. He doesn’t want to hear about those families. He doesn’t want to hear that they don’t have video games or bikes or Legos. He is seven. He is grumpy. He doesn’t want to hear it.

The beautiful thing is that sometimes when we hear, we actually listen. And sometimes when we listen, life makes room for action!

Fifty-four incredible individuals from the US and Canada listened in 2019. They packed their bags and rearranged their lives to make the lives of our neighbors in the West Indies better. Our traveling volunteers worked side by side with local West Indian volunteers who also chose to listen. Together we lifted walls and spirits as we built homes and community in areas of great need! Their impact is measurable; 13 adults and 27 children have been housed in 2019!



I am not trying to shame my son when I share my stories. I don't want him to feel selfish for having his own room or legos or a bike. In the grand scheme of things I just want him to see that we have so much.

"Those" children. "Those" families. "They". These words place a convenient and comfortable distance between us. But when we flip the narrative, when we use words like "we" and "our", that is when we remember that we are in this together. "Our neighbors." "Our friends." "We worked together." These are the words that make our friends across borders become our brothers and sisters.

My son may not always want to hear my stories, but I want to lay the groundwork for compassion now. I want my children to grow up hearing and knowing that we are brothers and sisters, neighbors and friends. I want them to grow up knowing our community extends far beyond the limits of our neighborhood streets, if we only choose to listen.

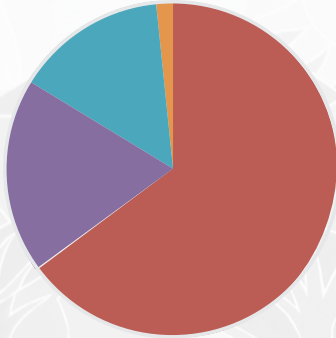

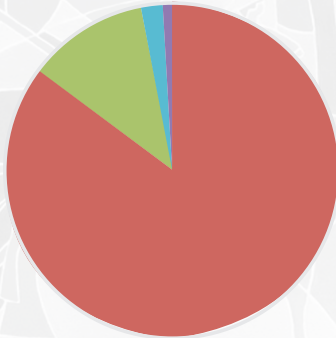

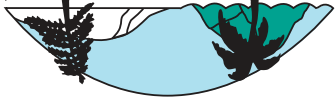
