

Tutoring for Tuition

Description

The Tutoring for Tuition Program provides high school students an opportunity to tutor other students in their school environment and/or through distance education while earning a tuition voucher towards post-secondary education. This program runs throughout the school year.

Eligible Applicants to be Tutors

Level I, II or III high school students can apply to become tutors in their own schools or feeder schools.

Eligible Participants to be Tutored

Students at any grade level needing tutoring services can access this program through their school guidance counsellor or principal. In addition, high school students can access this program online through the Centre for Distance Learning and Innovation (CDLI) at <http://www.cdli.ca/tutoring>.

Compensation

Students receive tuition vouchers based on the current minimum wage and the number of hours tutored to a maximum number of 120 hours annually.
