



David W. Dorman

David W. Dorman is a Managing Director and Senior Advisor with **Warburg Pincus**, a global private equity firm that has invested more than \$29 billion in approximately 585 companies in 30 countries around the world.

Previously, he was Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of **AT&T Corp.**, the largest telecommunications company in the world. During his time at AT&T he led the company through a profound reinvention and transformation prior to completing the merger of AT&T Corp. and **SBC Communications** in November 2005.

David joined AT&T as President in December 2000 and was named Chairman and Chief Executive Officer in November 2002. Prior to that he was CEO of **Concert**, the global venture created by AT&T and **British Telecommunications**. His career in telecommunications began in 1981, after he started working in software development, sales and marketing, and became the 55th employee of the then-fledgling long distance carrier now known as **Sprint**.

By 1990, he became president of Sprint Business, with 10,000 employees, and grew the company's revenues from \$5 million to \$4.5 billion. In 1994, at age 39, David became the youngest Chief Executive Officer of a Bell operating company when he was named Chief Executive Officer of **Pacific Bell**. As Chairman, President and Chief Executive Officer he led an \$11 billion business with 50,000 employees serving more than ten million households and one million business customers.

He became an Executive Vice President of SBC Communications when it acquired Pacific Bell. He was responsible for strategic planning, long distance and Internet business. He left SBC to serve as Chairman, President and CEO of **PointCast**, an Internet-based news and information service, before becoming Chief Executive Officer of Concert.

Mr. Dorman has been a board member of **Motorola, Inc.** since 2006 and was elected non-executive Chairman in 2008. He also serves on the boards of **CVS Caremark Corporation**, **YUM! Brands, Inc.**, **Phorm, Inc.**, and the **Georgia Tech Foundation** in Atlanta. He is also an industry consultant with **Firethorn Holdings, a Qualcomm company**. Mr. Dorman served on **AT&T's** Board of Directors from February, 2002 through completion of the company's merger in 2005. Mr. Dorman also was a board member of **Scientific Atlanta** until the company was acquired by Cisco Systems in 2006.

David graduated from Georgia Tech in 1975 with high honors, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in industrial management.
