NOTE.—Nearly all of the departments of the Government make a limited free distribution of their publications. When an entry shows a (\*) price, it is possible that upon application to the issuing office a copy may be obtained without charge.

# Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [ ] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The date, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

The word "processed" as used in this catalog indicates publications which are reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, e. g.,

mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith, etc.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

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Publications cannot be supplied free to individuals nor forwarded in advance

of payment.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which over five million are assorted, forming the sales stock. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold regardless of their age or scarcity. Many of the books have been in stock some time, and are apt to be shopworn. In filling orders the best copy available is sent.

#### PRICE LISTS

A general price list of public documents is not available, but numerous lists have been prepared on special subjects and any of these will be furnished free, on application, if the person interested will state the subject or subjects concerning which information is desired. It will also be noted that current publications which are for sale are listed in this catalog.

#### WEEKLY LIST

In addition to the price lists, the Documents Office issues a Weekly List of Selected United States Government Publications for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Each list is arranged alphabetically by subjects, with annotations and prices, and may be obtained free upon application to the Superintendent of Documents.

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Publications entered in this catalog that are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents are indicated by a star (\*) preceding the price. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the department, bureau, or division issuing the document. A double dagger (‡) indicates that the document is printed for official use. Whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary, it will be found under the name of the bureau by which it was published.

In ordering a publication from the Superintendent of Documents, give (if known) the name of the publishing department, bureau, or division, and the title, together with the classification number which is added to the entry at the extreme right; order the congressional documents and reports by the title, together with the document or report number and the Congress and session, e. g., H. doc. 458, 75–3.

Do not use the L. C. card number in ordering a publication.

#### HOW TO REMIT

Remittances for the documents marked with a star (\*) should be made to the Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington,

D. C., by coupons, postal money order, express order, or check. Currency may be sent at sender's risk. Foreign remittances should be made either by international money order or draft on an American bank.

Postage stamps, foreign money, defaced or smooth coins, will not be accepted. For the convenience of the general public, coupons that are good until used in exchange for Government publications sold by the Superintendent of Documents may be purchased from his office in sets of 20 for \$1. Address order to Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in United States, Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Puerto Rico, Samoa, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage. In computing foreign postage, add one-third of the price of the publication.

#### TO LIBRARIANS

The number given at the extreme right of each entry (except for congressional documents and reports) is the classification number by which the publication is arranged in the Library and in the sales stock of the Office of the Superintendent of Documents. It can be used as a classification number by such libraries as are using, for the departmental publications, the arrangement of public documents advocated in the Check List of United States Public Documents, 1789–1909. In using this number as a classification number in a library, it should be noted that the shilling mark (/) is used to separate what would ordinarily be a superior number or letter (the numbers or letters immediately following the line) from the main classification number, it not being practicable to print these numbers and letters as superiors in the Monthly Catalog, e. g., the number A 1.23/a: So 96/4 listed in the Monthly Catalog would be A 1.23\*: So 964 in a library.

#### LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the printed catalog cards of the Library of Congress are appended to entries for the more important publications. These are given at the left, with "L. C. card" prefixed. Do not confuse with the Documents Office classification number given at the right. Orders for these cards, remittances in payment for them, and requests for information about them should be addressed to the Librarian of Congress, not to the Superintendent of Documents.

## MONTHLY CATALOG DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly Catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.00 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$1.60 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

#### INDEX

An Index to the Monthly Catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from January to December, and can be bound with the numbers as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.

# Notes of General Interest

DOCUMENT CATALOG

The Catalog of Public Documents of the 73d Congress and of All Departments of the Government, July 1, 1933—December 31, 1934, no. 22 of the Comprehensive Index provided for by the act of January 12, 1895, has been issued by the Superintendent of Documents. It lists the publications of the executive departments, independent establishments, and emergency agencies of the United States Government issued during the period July 1, 1933 to December 31, 1934. The volume also includes all Senate and House documents and reports and congressional committee hearings, etc., of the special session of the Senate and the two regular sessions of both Houses of the 73d Congress, and all laws enacted by that Congress, whether printed before or after the period covered by this catalog. Some Government publications which are not printed at the Government Printing Office and are not received by the Office of the Superintendent of Documents are necessarily omitted from the Document Catalogs.

The Document Catalogs heretofore have covered a period of two fiscal years ending June 30 of each year; but in view of Section 2 of the twentieth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States changing the date of the assembling of Congress from March 4 to January 3 (unless Congress shall by law appoint a different day), the Office of the Superintendent of Documents, realizing the advantage of issuing the catalogs by calendar years rather than by fiscal years, obtained from the Joint Committee on Printing, by letter dated October 11, 1934, the authority to make the change. Therefore, this 73d Document Catalog lists the departmental publications issued during eighteen months from July 1933 to December 1934, and the congressional publications issued during the period of the 73d Congress (March 4, 1933–June 18, 1934). Beginning with the 74th Congress, convening January 3, 1935, the Document Catalogs will list both departmental and congressional publications issued during the period covered by two calendar years.

Although covering a period of only eighteen months this 73d Catalog, with the exception of the catalogs of the 65th and 71st Congresses, is the largest thus far published by the Superintendent of Documents. This is due largely to the listing of publications issued by the many newly created emergency or "alphabetical" agencies of the United States Government, a list of which, arranged alphabetically by their popular abbreviations, is included preceding the usual Table of abbreviations and Explanations. A notable example of the vast output of publications issued by the emergency agencies is found in the Codes of fair competition of the National Recovery Administration from submitted to final approved form with amendments, supplemental codes, etc., and related material. As inaugurated with the Document Catalog of the 72d Congress, Government publications reproduced by duplicating processes other than ordinary printing, such as mimeograph, multigraph, planograph, rotaprint, multilith, have been listed in this 73d Catalog, greatly increasing its size. The word "processed" is now being used by the Office of the Superintendent of Documents to indicate this material.

The Document Catalog has been issued in two editions, one bound in ruby buckram without the congressional document notation, and the other as part of the congressional set designated as House document 415, 73d Congress, 2d session.

#### STATUTES AT LARGE

As mentioned in previous Monthly Catalogs, the paper bound edition of the laws of the United States, popularly known as Session or Pamphlet laws, has been discontinued with the editions for the 74th Congress. Beginning with the 75th Congress, laws are issued first singly, as "slip laws," and at the end of each session of Congress will be combined in volumes designated as "United States Statutes at Large." The public laws passed by the 75th Congress, 1st session, have been printed as volume 50, part 1, of the Statutes at Large. The private laws, concurrent resolutions, treaties, international agreements other than treaties, and proclamations will be combined later as volume 50, part 2. This manner of issuance of the bound volumes of the laws of the United States was authorized by S. 3440, 74th Congress, Public 724, approved June 20, 1936 (49 Stat. 1551). The first print of each law, the "slip law," now carries in the heading the number of the law, the Congress which passed it, the chapter of the Statutes at Large in which it will appear later (designating which session was responsible for it), as well as the number of the bill which became law, and the title of the act.
