

Corymbia eximia (Yellow Bloodwood)

Description

A small to medium gnarled, spreading, evergreen tree, instantly recognisable by its scaly rough, soft, flaky, yellow-brown bark.

Flower and Foliage

Creamy white flowers occur during spring which is a beautiful site to see. Fruits are thick and urn shaped.

Maintenance

Protect from frost when young.

Occurs

Favours infertile soils along sandstone ridges & slopes, with some influences of clay.

Uses

A long-lived tree, with the flowers & seeds attracting a wide variety of native fauna. Ideal for medium-sized gardens. Can also be used in streetscapes and parks. Flowers heavily which gives an aesthetic appeal.

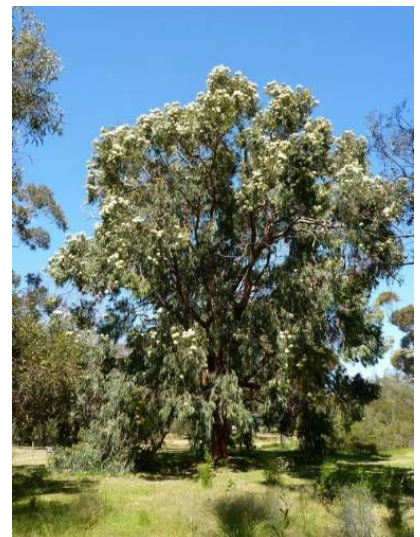
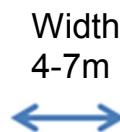
