## Lincolnshire's Natural Coast: *so many former lives*

After many years working, somewhat obsessively, on the restoration of Lincoln Castle, I'm almost rediscovering my love for the rest of this amazing county.

y new obsession for this past year has been Lincolnshire's Natural Coast. After a visit last Easter to see the North Sea Observatory at Chapel Point, which was nearing completion, I realised that I had forgotten how gloriously big these beaches are, how spectacular the nature reserves, the wealth of bird life and how very few visitors there are. Has everyone else forgotten too, I wondered? This is a precious and sensitive natural landscape of beaches, dunes, marsh and mudflats that must be protected. However there is a further fascinating, almost hidden heritage to discover, from the salt making industry of Roman and medieval times to the anti-invasion defence works of the Second World War.

Look out for mounds in the landscape; manmade, these are salterns, the waste

heaps from salt making, an industry that was widespread along the Lincolnshire coast for thousands of years. Salt was essential for flavouring and as a preservative and every society since the Bronze Age has tried its hand at making salt along this coast leaving evidence behind, some of which is buried by millennia of flood deposits. The salt was transported out of the marshes along the long straight droveways known as 'salt roads' or through Lincolnshire ports such as Saltfleet, Somercotes and Theddlethorpe, now long since silted up.

I have a soft spot for Freiston Shore as some years ago I played a very minor role in the managed coastal realignment there, a fascinating conservation and flood defence project which involved breaching the outer sea wall, and re-establishing large tracts of open lagoon and salt marsh leading to the RSPB reserve we see today. At the time it was the largest such scheme in the UK. Freiston Shore feels quiet and isolated now but in the first half of the 19th century it was a popular seaside resort with visitors arriving by charabancs, at least two hotels and horse racing on the beach.

As you walk around Freiston Shore there is more evidence of a former life to be spotted. The fortifications built to protect Britain against German invasion began in June 1940 as a consequence of the defeat of the British Expeditionary Force in France and the evacuation at Dunkirk.

On the south and east coast the 'Coastal Crust' was designed to be the first line of defence against invasion; it involved many types of structure, some of which can still be seen at Freiston Shore. Pillboxes, searchlight batteries, anti-tank structures and machine gun posts. Gun emplacements were camouflaged as bungalows, ice-cream parlours or chicken sheds and linear marks bisecting fields are probably anti-landing trenches dug to prevent aircraft landing. Winston Churchill's famous speech delivered on 4th June 1940 - "We shall fight on the beaches, we shall fight on the landing grounds, we shall fight in the fields and the streets, we shall fight in the hills; we shall never surrender" - defines the areas of English landscape today where the remains of the extensive defence systems built in 1940/41 can be found. Although no ground fighting took place on British soil, the relics of these defences represent battlefields that were prepared, but thankfully never needed.

Much survives along Lincolnshire's coast as an evocative reminder of the desperate days of 1940. These concrete remains, often hidden by vegetation, are recent history, within the lifetime of some or the immediate memory of their children. The landscape is given added meaning by the presence of these defences.

Visiting Lincolnshire's Natural Coast repays visits across the seasons. This is a migration superhighway so expect a constantly changing range of visiting birds; not necessarily a best time, just a whole series of brilliant opportunities. A thriving colony of grey seals arrive to give birth in the winter months making for a noisy and unforgettable wildlife spectacle as around 2,000 pups are born at Donna Nook.

The flowering and fruiting of the plant life adds another dimension and supports the vibrant bird and insect life. Those banks of sculptural sea holly and sea buckthorn with its vibrant orange berries are usually full of bird life and more, and it's worth standing and staring a while just to see who calls this home. So visit LincoInshire's Natural Coast and see what you discover.

If you missed the opportunity to explore the public air raid shelter in Barton upon Humber during Heritage Open Days last year, you'll have another chance this September.

he Heritage Open Days 2019 festival programme includes exclusive tours of the Humber Bridge anchorage, a behindthe-scenes glimpse of Barton Haven Shipyard and even Tai Chi sessions at The Ropewalk!

From Friday 13th to Sunday 22nd September 2019, 16 historic venues around Barton upon Humber will throw open their doors and offer a variety of unusual events and activities to celebrate their rich heritage. Last year's festival attracted tens of thousands of visitors to the town, shining a spotlight on the history of this special area of North Lincolnshire. This year's theme is "Lincolnshire Learning, Wisdom and Folklore", so prepare to roll up your sleeves and get stuck in!

## The *Historic Heart* of Lincolnshire

Wherever you wander in the Heart of Lincolnshire you'll find yourself walking in historic footsteps.

elebrating Heritage Open Days this year are our four NKDC visitor venues: Cogglesford Watermill in Sleaford is thought to be the only Sheriff's watermill still operating in England - millers have produced flour on this site for more than a thousand years. Milling takes place on the second Sunday of the month, and the flour produced is stocked in the charming gift shop. We will be producing a free family trail which links with nearby Navigation House, a short five-minute walk along the River.


Navigation House was built as the office for the Canal Company in 1838, and was at the heart of Sleaford's growing fortunes as goods came and went by canal. A refurbished Grade II listed gem, it has a heritage theme covering the early development of the new River Slea and portrays the story of the Navigation and its significant impact on Sleaford's history. The impressive gift shop is stocked with items made by local craftspeople.

Cranwell Aviation Heritage Museum has a rotating programme of fascinating exhibitions at its core, with a special mini exhibition in place for Heritage Open Days exploring 'learning at Cranwell'. Located in the shadow of the iconic RAF College, it principally portrays the fascinating story of this most historic and iconic establishment from its early days more than a century ago. The experience includes a Jet Provost flight simulator, Vampire Nose Pod, interactive displays and artefacts, making the ideal launchpad to discover the rest of Lincolnshire's airfields and aviation attractions.

This year there will be a fantastic opportunity to have a first look at the work done so far to Mrs Smith's Cottage in Navenby. Closed in 2012 due to structural issues and deterioration of the building, NKDC have been working to restore this unique 'time capsule' with support from HLF, and are planning to open to visitors in 2020. Mrs Smith lived in the cottage until her death aged 102 in 1995, and it offers a unique insight into life in Lincolnshire in the early 1900s. Through her carefully preserved diaries, we know what she enjoyed doing, how she decorated her home and how things were in Navenby at that time. Places are extremely limited and so booking is essential.

Founded in 1988, Heritage Lincolnshire is a local charitable trust which undertakes a range of activities in the promotion and conservation of the county's heritage and has been co-ordinating Heritage Open Days in Lincolnshire since 1994 with the help of a volunteering steering group.

## BUT WHAT ELSE DO THE CHARITY DO ACROSS THE COUNTY?

Heritage Lincolnshire is a local charity working to conserve the rich history of the county for the benefit of people who live and work in the area. Their charitable aims are lifelong education, building conservation, archaeological fieldwork and research across the county of Lincolnshire. They also have a national reputation for the conservation and re-use of historic buildings and for delivering innovative activities that engage and enthuse local people.

in April 2020. They have been fundraising for this restoration over the past five years, and capital works are now in progress to complete this £2.4 million project. These projects are enhancing the environment for the benefit of the local residents, businesses and visitors. This investment is bought into Lincolnshire from national funding sources and is targeted at priority buildings towns and villages in order to maximise its impact.

Community led groups also contribute to the heritage sector across Lincolnshire, with skilled volunteers running independent projects, museums and visitor attractions. Heritage Lincolnshire support these volunteers by providing advice, support and information on developments within the sector. In this way they are adding crucial capacity and resource into the sector by ensuring that these groups are well placed to secure investment and gain recognition for their work. Such was the case with Heckington Windmill. Jim Bailey, Mill Manager, told us: "Heritage Lincolnshire made an outstanding contribution to our team, and their involvement was crucial to our success."

## Valiant *volunteers* – what it takes to manage a restoration

 Heckington Windmill Having been involved in several restoration projects, I am full of admiration for those individuals who take on these challenges. here have been some great projects in Lincolnshire largely run by volunteers such as Heckington Mill, Alford Manor House and many of our churches. There are others such as St Wulfram's, Grantham and Spalding Gentlemen's Society, who I know are at the very early planning stage. Once a project completes, all the difficulties along the way are forgotten and like a fond parent you wave it off hoping that you've done everything possible to let it stand on its own two feet. But the journey to reach that moment can be painful.

Historic buildings can be remarkably demanding, almost diva-like in fact. They charm you until you are utterly in their thrall and then their demands start. You try and resist, but to avoid the tantrum you give way every time. One can pretend to be in charge of the situation, knowing full well that actually the building decides.

At some point you and the building will realise that "something must be done". Dilapidation can give a certain romantic air, but when bits of the building start randomly dropping off, you know you've got problems and of one thing you can be quite certain: it will all be terribly expensive.


I get very cross when people are snooty about the lottery, because I'm not sure where our heritage would be without the Heritage Lottery Fund. In the 25 years since its inception it has distributed a staggering £7 billion of grants to over 40,000 projects. Not that applying for such funds is easy; those of us who've been through the process belong to an exclusive club – we survived! We meet up to show off our battle scars and try and outdo each other with tales of horror, exhaustion and no doubt much exaggeration. This probably sounds a bit mad, but an element of obsession is a critical part of your armoury.

Finally after much sweat and tears you nail the money, all your problems are over or so you think. The worries are now all about time, "so much to do and so little time to do it in." The hard work of preparing your funding bids is forgotten and you now see it as a mythical time when you were lying on a couch, possibly peeling grapes, when you could have been getting on with the million tasks you now have!

Your team will undoubtedly grow as you acquire architects, engineers, archaeologists and more. They share your workload but questions come thick and fast and they all require decisions. I had a terrific team of experts helping me when we restored Lincoln Castle, they all knew their stuff and were incredibly sensitive towards the building. Team spirit is so important and you all need to get on, as you spend vast amounts of time in each other's company as you agonise over the plans. With historic buildings there are never simple black and white answers. Just to put it in perspective, it took ten years to complete the £22m Lincoln Castle project, six years to raise the money and decide how to do the works and just four years to do the works. Add stamina to your CV needs.



There are many inspiring moments to keep you going. An archaeological find, or the first time the build actually starts to resemble the plans. I could never resist a big crane moment whether it was on my project or not. I remember going to Heckington Mill to watch the exciting moment when their sails were lowered into place, all the volunteers were wreathed in smiles and there was no doubt a big dollop of relief too. For volunteers to take on these daunting historic buildings is extraordinarily brave and inspiring. So well done to them for all the amazing restorations that have been undertaken in Lincolnshire. If you are a lottery ticket buyer can I say a big thanks to you too. You make all these amazing projects happen. Whilst I stress how difficult they can be, that's all forgotten in the sense of achievement when it's all finished. We did it – together. ■

# Discover Lincolnshire's *hidden heritage* hotspot

South Kesteven, tucked in the south east corner of Lincolnshire, is the perfect place to discover world class heritage, while enjoying stunning countryside, fabulous food and family friendly attractions.

asily accessible by train and road, medieval churches and almshouses nestle between the Georgian façades of Stamford, England's finest stone town. Neighbouring Burghley House, with all its Elizabethan splendour, is a favourite for visitors and locals alike, whether they are attending an international event, or going for an afternoon stroll in the gardens.

The Stamford Georgian Festival will be bursting into the town from 26th–29th September, celebrating the 'Age of Wonder and Invention'. Visit www.stamfordgeorgianfestival.co.uk

Visible for miles around, the magnificent spire of St Wulfram's church dominates Grantham's skyline. The town's heritage is intertwined with Britain's industrial past, but it has its share of antiquity and natural heritage too. The medieval Trigge Library is a must-see, and the recently restored and award-winning Wyndham Park is the perfect place for a riverside picnic.

Grantham Museum holds a range of engaging exhibitions featuring the town's most famous faces – including Sir Isaac Newton and Baroness Thatcher; as well as the significant role that the area played in World War II.

Follow in the footsteps of Albert Einstein and Stephen Hawking and visit Woolsthope Manor: Sir Isaac Newton's birthplace and childhood home.

Bourne is a charming market town with a stunning park containing the earthworks of an ancient castle, and another which contains a traditional Lido. Visit Baldock's Mill Heritage Centre to see one of the country's finest collections of motor racing memorabilia, celebrating local racing legend Raymond Mays.

Nearby Grimsthorpe Castle is well worth a visit to see the remarkable Vanbrugh Hall and the beautiful gardens.

The picturesque ancient town and villages which make up the Deepings are wonderful to explore. Enjoy beautiful riverside walks, independent shops and some of the best fish and chips in the area. The stunning setting is complemented by ancient buildings, including the cavernous Priory Church in Deeping St James which echoes with pre-dissolution splendour.

In between the market towns are over 80 beautiful villages ripe for exploration, offering insights into Britain's heritage from the Romans to The Archers.

## Lincolnshire Wolds and Coast *Churches Festival* has arrived!

And what a celebration it is going to be, during two weekends in September, when over 120 churches fling open their doors to welcome everyone to enjoy their beautiful buildings and discover the secrets hidden within.

ver the two weekends of 31st August & 1st September and 7th & 8th September, churches and chapels from Louth to Woodhall Spa, Wragby to Sutton on Sea, will be celebrating their rich architecture and heritage, beautiful tranquillity and spirituality, vibrant exhibitions and music, as well as the welcoming oasis of peace.

The festival covers a wide area of rural Lincolnshire, encompassing the market towns of Louth, Spilsby, Alford, Horncastle, Tattershall, Wragby, Woodhall Spa and Skegness as well as a hundred rural hamlets and seaside villages in between.

Numerous activities will be staged to whet your appetite, from organ recitals to flower and art exhibitions, bell-ringing to afternoon teas. Exhibitions await at Holy Trinity, Hagworthingham; St Andrew's, Anderby; St Lawrence's, Revesby and St Margaret's, Thimbleby.

Our Wolds and Coast churches are widespread but all have a different story to tell. St James' Church, Louth has the tallest steeple of any medieval church in England and is widely recognised as one of the finest churches of that period. It played a crucial part in the reaction to Henry VIII's dissolution of the monastaries. In October 1536, under the leadership of the rector, people mustered to start the Lincolnshire Rising, the first serious rebellion against the crown. The Rising failed and as a consequence St James' was stripped of its riches including the dismantling of the rood screen.

St Mary's, Horncastle, another casualty of the Lincolnshire Rising, was also home to Edward Blackstone. Who was he and why is there a plaque in his honour on Boston



Common, USA? A visit to the church will provide the answers.

And a visit to St James' church in Spilsby would not be complete without viewing the stone memorial to our most famous sailor, Sir John Franklin.

The Lincolnshire Wolds churches are charming, nestling in hidden valleys or perched high on the rolling hills. Fulletby St Andrew's, set high in the Wolds, is constructed like many churches around, in local greenstone. Although undergoing many alterations, the church still retains a two-seater sedilia from a previous medieval church. A small exhibition on local Victorian poet, Henry Winn provides an entertaining look at life in rural Lincolnshire, and also explains why Winn is featured in the Guinness Book of Records.

Built in 1779 and opened by John Wesley, it will open to reveal the exquisite Georgian interior that has been lovingly preserved.

Lincolnshire's seaside churches hold a charm of their own. Many are large like Theddlethorpe All Saints, also known as the "Cathedral of the Marsh" due to its impressive length, spaciousness and the beautiful exterior carvings. Another striking church is the early medieval isolated church of St Botolph, Skidbrooke, which stands alone in the Lincolnshire marshes.

Many churches hold quirky facts. St Andrew's Church, Ashby Puerorum claims to house the oldest bell in England... and a gamekeeper who was murdered by poachers on the estate of Well, close to the Georgian chapel, is reputed to be the source of the Lincolnshire Poacher song!

Our Lincolnshire Wolds and Coast churches are not just for two weekends of the year. They are here to be visited and





enjoyed at any time. A comprehensive directory featuring all our churches is now available from Tourist Information Centres or from the Festival website https://www.lincswoldsandcoastchurches.org

Our churches are treasures to be protected and preserved. Many are the centre of the community, a mini-museum, recording the history of the parishes they continue to serve. All are different, offering a unique experience; all are free to enter; all offer a warm and friendly welcome and all have a different story to tell.







Since Great Grimsby pioneered the first successful steam trawlers in the 1880s, the port rose to the title of "World's Premier Fishing Port". Fresh fish was available nationwide and a national dish of Fish and Chips became possible.

he success was not without cost. Thousands of men have lost their lives in the endeavour to bring fish home to Grimsby. The 1950s alone saw the loss of 32 Grimsby trawlers.

Fascinating for visitors young and old, discover the story of our trawlermen as you sign on as a crew member for a journey back to the height of fishing. At Grimsby Fishing Heritage Centre you will experience the sights, sounds and smells of Great Grimsby's past.

Original trawler interiors and accurate replicas will show you a glimpse of a fascinating way of life that will never be seen in the same way again. You'll have a whole new appreciation for fish!


The Ross Tiger is today thought to be the earliest surviving large diesel side trawler in the UK. She entered service in early 1957, just after the port celebrated 100 years since the opening of the first industrial fish dock in 1856.

Built by leading trawler builders, Cochrane and Sons of Selby, the Ross Tiger was state-of-the-art for her time and featured new advancements in trawler design. Her powerful diesel engines were built nearby in the city of Lincoln.

The Centre's guided tour of this special ship, registered with National Historic Ships, gives an opportunity to see the conditions of life aboard one of Britain's few remaining traditional side-trawlers. Many of the guides are former fishermen and can give you a unique understanding of life in one of our most dangerous occupations.

Remember to collect your boarding pass from the reception to climb aboard the historic trawler Ross Tiger, moored behind the attraction in Alexandra Dock!





## Visit Stonebow and Guildhall

The Stonebow is situated on the site of the southern gateway to Roman Lincoln. It is a gateway that has stood for over 1800 years although the present building was not completed until 1520.

The Guildhall sits proudly above the Stonebow and is the official home of the Mayor. Tours are available of this interesting historic building and includes the main Council Chamber where Lincoln's Council still meet, and most importantly the old debtors prison which now holds an impressive range of civic insignia, including the King Richard II sword and many Mayoral and City artefacts.
