## **Transition Year Trip to Zipit**

On the 29<sup>th</sup> of September transition year students went on a trip to Zipit Forest Adventures.

They were then free to spend the day making their way through Zipits 2.8 kilometres of treetop challenges. These obstacles included plank bridges, rock climbing walls, cargo nets and travelling through the woods on the many ziplines throughout the different courses.

The five different courses ascend in difficulty. Courses such as the white and orange course for example were still challenging but were on the easier side compared to the blue course which ended with a terrifying winch drop to the forest floor. Half of the group hiked to the top of Tibradden mountain at the start of the day, followed by the other half later in the day. The trail shows off incredible scenery of the Dublin mountains and overlooks Dublin Bay and Howth. The summit is home to the Tibradden cairn, a prehistoric chambered cairn dating to the Bronze Age. A noteable feature is the beautiful spiral rock art carved into the ground of the chamber.
