Common name

Dwarf Yellow Bloodwood



DESCRIPTION

- Typical height:**
6-8 metres
- Typical width:**
4-8 metres
- Growth rate:**
Fast
- Typical form:**
Narrow-domed. Can be gnarled on exposed sites.

CHARACTERISTICS

- Dwarf version of *Corymbia eximia*.
- Attractive yellow-brown rough bark.
- Profuse white flowers for short period in early spring.
- Fruit are thick and urn shaped.

ORIGIN

Central New South Wales, from the Hunter River south to Nowra

TOLERANCES

- Drought once established.
- May suffer from frost damage when young.

FACTS AND TRIVIA

Flowers prolifically and attracts native birds, bees and bats.

Tree is relatively tidy in appearance, and sheds relatively little debris (bark, leaves or fruits).

The common names are derived from the yellowish colour of bark and the blood red sap that often exudes from the wood.

Specific name from the Latin *eximius*, uncommon, outstanding.
