A NOTE FROM THE DRAMATURG



SCAN CODE FOR MORE INFO ON THE BACKGROUND OF THE PLAY ON OUR WEBSITE The thing I most want to tell you about this play is that it is a story about real people's lives. The iconic words "Roe v. Wade" evoke so many feelings for most of us, but they don't very often conjur the names and faces of the real humans who lived this case, and whose lives were forever changed by the outcome. But I think it's important to see them. To try and understand them. Because between the protests and the politics and the dichotomy of right and wrong is the very grey and complex space of real life. We of course can't know the face of every person who has been affected by these issues, before Roe and after it, and in the very immediate future when we may live post-Roe. We can, however, know that those faces are the faces of our neighbors, our friends, our sisters, our mothers, our daughters. One in four of us. Maybe you. As you bear witness to this story tonight, I hope that you can see and feel the experiences of these real lives. This is who they were and what they did. Now it's our turn. —Lauren Morris
