
Deliveries

Propagation at Howard Nurseries

Our propagation department is responsible for producing more than 90% of our own stock for both field and container production. Propagation methods include, division, seed sowing, stem/tip cuttings, root cuttings as well as the pricking out of tissue culture. We utilise 6 different growing environments, 5 of which can be controlled for optimum growing conditions, before finally going outside to harden off before planting out or potting on. We clean and reuse our plug trays every year, some are now more than 15 years old and still going strong!







Field growing at Howard Nurseries

As with any planting project correct ground preparations are the key to getting a good result and this is also true for our field grown production. From cultivating the ground to more extreme measures such as the renewal of drainage, every effort is taken to ensure that we can produce the best quality plants.

We begin field planting as soon as weather and soil conditions allow and utilise both a module and disc planter to help plant the wide range of field grown varieties that we have available.

Irrigation is at times necessary during our dry Suffolk summers, often providing its own logistical puzzle. At times the borehole water used to irrigate our field crops can need to travel as far as 1.5 miles from extraction point to end destination!

Container production Howard Nurseries

Most of our container production is made up of 2L and 9cm pots which are now produced from post-consumer plastic waste and are 100% recyclable after use.

We are currently growing in a 50% reduced peat compost and hope to be peat free in two years' time.

We catch and recycle the water that falls onto the nursery and then re-use this for irrigation via our onsite reservoirs.

The energy generated by our solar panels will now be stored in a battery (from a well-known brand) and then re-used on site to power our buggies, potting machines and office computers.

- Please clearly state your full invoice address, delivery address (if different from invoice address), contact name, telephone number and e-mail address where possible.
- 2. Please check the order confirmation and if any changes or additions are needed, please make those before the order is scheduled for delivery. As soon as we have started lifting your order it cannot be amended again.
- 3. Prices are subject to the VAT rate at the time (currently 20%).
- 4. Payment becomes due, net at 30 days from invoice date. Accounts not settled within this period will be subject to a credit charge of 5% after 30 days. We are able to accept payment via credit and debit card or BACS payment.
- We offer either of the following discounts for payment within 15 days of the invoice date, however this does not apply if other discounts have been agreed.
 - 2.5% on goods delivered.
 - 5% on goods collected from the nursery.
- 6. All deliveries are subject to a carriage charge for which an estimate can be provided. The actual cost will be invoiced and might differ from the estimate.
