Alan, in his role as editor of the *Triangle*, asked each vice president to choose one person from his area of responsibility who demonstrated the excellent caliber of people who work at IWU.

That's almost like asking a parent to pick one of his or her children as examples of good kids. Employees at IWU are like family.

(For the record, Wilbur and Ardelia Williams, who are featured on the cover of this magazine, weren't involved in the selection process. They were consensus choices to represent the very best that IWU has to offer.)

The six choices made by the vice presidents are excellent, as we think you will agree when you read their stories in the pages that follow. It goes without saying that there are many similar stories throughout our campus. We will get to many of those stories in future issues of the *Triangle*, as time and space allow.

The common thread that runs through this particular issue is the remarkable story of how God has assembled this group of people for this particular time in IWU's history. Those who do not understand the heart of a Christian institution may consider some of the stories to involve pure coincidence, but we know better.

Susan Rose, a nurse who grew up down the street from IWU, wanted to work in the campus health center so badly that she pestered Dr. Todd Voss for three straight years. Just when she was about to give up hope, a job opened. Susan has been the director of the Health Center for the last five years.

Dr. Jim Lo, on the other hand, had been on the

mission field in Southern Africa and Cambodia for 14 years and had not considered the possibility of teaching at IWU. Three years ago, he brought his twin

sons to campus for a visit where he learned about an opening in the religion department. He was offered and accepted the job. Dr. Lo recently began his fourth year as head of IWU's intercultural studies program, which already has 70 students.

Two years ago, Dr. Harriet Rojas flew to Indianapolis to interview for a job at a state university – only to learn that the university no longer planned to fill the position. She drove to IWU to visit with friends and wound up being offered a job, which she accepted.

Well, you get the idea. The Lord has assembled a remarkable group of people, and he's done it in remarkable ways. And each person, regardless of rank or responsibility, is just as vital to fulfilling the mission of IWU as the next person.

That explains why our six vice presidents, without consulting each other, chose:

- Three people who are administrators at different levels of the university.
 - One faculty member.
- The nurse who directs the student health
- And the Director of the Physical Plant who is responsible for keeping the grass cut and the air conditioners running and the restrooms cleaned and sees it all as a ministry.





Wilbur and Ardelia Williams

A Lifelong Quest for Excellence

Wilbur and Ardelia Williams first came to Indiana Wesleyan University in the late 1940s as students and then returned to join the faculty in 1967. Wilbur is an Associate Professor of Biblical Literature and Archaeology, and Ardelia is an Associate Professor of Art and Coordinator of the Art Department. As they begin their 33rd year of teaching, the couple has given no thought to retirement. Wilbur and Ardelia Williams, as much as anyone on campus, exemplify the kind of excellence that makes IWU an excellent university. In the next few pages, we invite you to listen in on our conversation with the Williamses – and to meet some other people who are examples of excellence at IWU.

Wilbur & Ardelia

You both are graduates of Indiana Wesleyan University. What led you here as students?

WILBUR: I came from a Wesleyan background, but I went to Central Wesleyan the first year and nearly flunked out. When I came here, I lacked public speaking skills. Laura Emerson was the professor, and the first term I made a D. She asked me to come to her office where she said, 'I don't think this represents your capability.' I said, 'Well my brother flunked out of college, and my parents only went through fourth grade, and I probably won't make it.' That was in my mindset. She said to me, 'I wish you would prove to yourself, prove to the class, prove to me and, most of all, prove to the Lord that he put more in you than that.' I went out of there thinking, 'Well, what do I have to lose?' My favorite vice was to go by the Ping-Pong room and I couldn't leave it. I'd go to play one game and after game 50, I went to the next class. I didn't study. But I started to avoid that room and began to read my lessons, and I came up with an A- the next semester. I was shocked; I didn't know I could do it. Miss Emerson met me at the door and she said, 'Well you improved, didn't you?' I said, 'Yes mam, I made an A-.' And she said, 'Wilbur, it wasn't an A.' She wouldn't give up. It took me the rest of my time to pull up to a C+ average. And my first master's was a B+ average. And the 90 hours since then was all A's. I just credit her for doing it, so that was one reason I wanted to come back here to teach.

ARDELIA: I was born near Indianapolis. I went to a seminary in Westfield, Ind. for three years and graduated with a degree in Bible before I ever came to Indiana Wesleyan. I came from a Quaker background; my father founded the seminary in Westfield.

Is Indiana Wesleyan where you met each other and fell in love?

WILBUR: Yes, I cried on her shoulder a lot. I'd talk about the girls I'd dated and problems such as, 'Should I date this girl or should I date that girl?' and she'd give me advice.

ARDELIA: Well, he'd date one girl at a time. I'd tell him you need to date around, because that was what I was doing and having fun.

WILBUR: She didn't tell me when we started dating that she hadn't let go of the other five guys. When I found out, I called her up and said, 'I'm backing out. I've seen those five guys, and they're all more handsome than me, and I just don't want to have that kind of contest.'

ARDELIA: He didn't want competition.

WILBUR: But we finally started dating and got married a year later, in 1952, a year after we graduated. She got a job teaching in Carmel, Ind., and I enrolled at Butler University to work on my master's degree.

ARDELIA: I taught at Carmel for nine year, and then I had an opportunity to exchange teach with a teacher in England under the Fulbright program. That was really interesting. They had a girl in England who wanted to come here, and we wanted to go to Manchester University so Wilbur could study there. The girl in England had applied for the program for three or four years, but no one wanted to go to Manchester because that's the coal mining area. So when I applied, I requested Manchester, and the Lord just worked it all out.

WILBUR: They asked her, 'Why did you want Manchester?' We explained about my desires to go to Manchester University. So the Lord put us 15 miles from the university where I got a train every day. I only had a Tuesday-Thursday schedule. When the religion teacher at Ardelia's school resigned, I got a job teaching there three days a week because I had a religious education major on my master's.

What were your career goals when you were students?

ARDELIA: I was a double major, music and art. Both vocal and instrumental music. I planned to be a teacher.

WILBUR: She doesn't let people know that she has two majors, because she doesn't want anybody to ask her to teach music.

ARDELIA: I taught music in the public schools. That's a hard thing to do, because if you're art and music you have to do the programs, the plays, the backgrounds; you have to do it all. So I just focused on art.

WILBUR: I taught in a public school for a year before we went to England, because I had some bills to pay off, and I also was a full-time pastor in Sheridan, Ind. So our career goal as students was to teach and preach.

You both came to Indiana Wesleyan 32 vears ago? How did it happen that you both got jobs at the same time?

WILBUR: When I was hired to come to Indiana Wesleyan, I called Anderson College to see if they had a job for a friend of mine. They said, no, but they needed an art instructor, so Ardelia began teaching part-time at Anderson and taught a class at IWU for one year. The next year she came to IWU full-

ARDELIA: They asked Wilbur to come here, so we came and got the house on Harmon Street, right next to where we live now. We bought the whole four lots for \$13,000. Wilbur had to go to Israel, so he sent me out to look at it and I said, 'OK, let's take it.' When we moved, he was in the house one week and then he was gone, and I had to do remodeling. When I came, I was the only art teacher, and there was one art student. I said to Dr. (Byron) Tippey 'We've got to have an art major.' Now we have well over 100 art majors and had 73 new ones this fall. When I came, I taught everything in the Art Department. Then we got Craig Moore to come from Taylor University, although he later returned to teach at Taylor. Then Rod Crossman, who had

graduated here and had been freelancing and teaching in a public school near Chicago, agreed to come back to teach. Later, we got Rob Curfman, another IWU graduate. Then we hired Alan Kwok. And this year, Dallas Walters.

Was it a goal of yours to return to teach at IWU?

WILBUR: No, I was attending New York University and was the circulation manager of Christian Economics magazine, which had 300,000

circulation. The Vice President of Advancement at Marion College heard I was graduating, and he came to New York and appealed to me to return to Marion to teach. The timing was right. Christian Economics had decided to move its operations to Los Angeles, but I didn't want to go there. The magazine offered me an additional \$5,000 to

stay, but I chose to return to Marion and took a 50 percent pay cut.

Did you ever think when you came back that you would be here 32 years later?

WILBUR: We decided we weren't going to look back. We came with an open-ended commitment. We built our house a year later and really over-built for the area. It was the nicest house in the neighborhood. Really, We've never regretted our decision to stay here. We sacrificed in some areas, but we have so much more than we would have had if we had gone to LA.

ARDELIA: Several years into my teaching, I wanted to go ahead and get an M.F.A. degree if they would consider it a terminal degree in art. They wouldn't then, but they will now. I had my

master's degree in education, so I thought, 'Well, if that's going to be the situation, I will just switch gears and start studying in Italy.' Dr. Tippey suggested that I apply for another Fulbright fellowship, and I was awarded the fellowship. That allowed me to study in Italy for a summer, and I learned enough from that experience so that I could travel around by myself after that.

WILBUR: There can't be many people who have received two Fulbrights, as Ardelia has.

> Both of you have made travel a part of your teaching careers. How important has that been to your students?

ARDELIA: Every since I studied in Italy that first summer, I've been taking students on trips to England and Italy, which enriches my artistic teaching.

WILBUR: It's like

the man who authored a book in Israel, The Fifth Gospel, said. He decided you couldn't understand the other four gospels fully until you've studied geography, which is the fifth gospel. It just opens up a whole new dimension of biblical studies.

When I took my first trip in 1958, King Faisal of Iraq was killed while I was there. We were there for six weeks. We were to study for four weeks and tour for two weeks. The old city was to be part of our tour, but that was across the Mandelbaum gate in Jordan. Faisal's death forced President Eisenhower to send American troops to Lebanon, and the British sent troops to Jordan to stabilize the situation because it looked like the Near East was coming apart. We were told by the State Department that they were pulling our visas and they

wouldn't allow us to go to Jordan. The professor said the only option we have is to take you to the King David Hotel where you can stand on a hill and look into the old city. I was alone with my thoughts, and there was a great mixture of expectation but much more a feeling of disappointment. When I crested the hill and looked at the old city, I began to cry. I couldn't help it. I made God a promise on that hillside looking at the old city. I said, 'Lord, this is a spiritual experience like I've never had before. I will run tours for you, actually spiritual odysseys, to help people get closer to the Lord.' I just completed my 93rd trip to Israel. I have seven trips scheduled next year and two already are filled.

ARDELIA: I'd have to get some old calendars out to figure out how many trips I've taken to England and Italy with students. I took the first trip in 1972, so there probably have been 40 or 50 trips so far.

How would you like to be remembered by your students?

WILBUR: My favorite hymn is Charles Wesley's A Charge to Keep I Have. For me, I would like for my students to think, 'He was one who walked close to the lord.' The verse I don't like says, 'To serve the present age, my calling to fulfill.' Ardelia and I have both talked that we want to leave a legacy to the university, something that students will remember us by after we are gone. Twenty-five years ago, I went into covenant with God. I said, 'If you'll help me Lord, I will invest money for you so that I can help send students to Israel to study.' The Lord has just put things in our path, such as the two statues that we've donated for campus. We wanted to make a specific statement, instead of a dorm or some other building, that would speak to the presence of God on campus. We felt there was no campus vision, except the cross on the Christian Ministries Building, that spoke of the presence of God. One of Ardelia's former students told us about Rick Wienecke, the sculptor who did both of the statues.

Rick, who is from Canada, was an atheist until he went to Israel to work on a kibbutz and found the Lord. I wanted a Christian, not just a good artist, to do the sculpture of Christ.

ARDELIA: The prayer chapel being built near the center of campus is also a part of our legacy. Although it is gothic architecture, it is its own unique design and not a model of any other chapel. The architect is excited about the chapel because he's never built anything like it before. Even the man laying the cement blocks said. 'We've never built a building like this before.'

WILBUR: It's all brand new, from the concept itself on up to the actual construction. We scaled the building down purposefully because we specifically want it to be a prayer chapel. It will have just 20 seats. It is not a chapel that is intended as a place for students to have weddings. What we're trying to say with the two statues and the prayer chapel is that we'd rather be remembered for how we loved the Lord and not necessarily for our teaching.

You are both a few years beyond the traditional retirement age. Have you given any thought to retirement?

WILBUR: No, we still want to teach on

ARDELIA: As long as we can make contributions to our disciplines, we want to keep teaching.

WILBUR: I get more excitement teaching to build that prayer chapel, because all of the money we would make goes there. The Lord has enabled us to have enough money to live on. We signed irrevocable papers to see that the building is paid for, and God has enabled us to do that. The chapel is about one-third paid for.

ARDELIA: So we can't quit yet. Many people want to travel when they retire, but vou've already traveled all over the world. What will you do when vou retire?

WILBUR: We would like to travel together

ARDELIA: When we had January term, we would travel with our students but we'd always meet and have the last week together. That was really nice.

WILBUR: Yes, we'd send the groups home and we'd meet somewhere. We've often gone our separate ways, but it has brought a freshness to our relationship. I've never wanted to domineer Ardelia's time because I feel she needs her own career. When she was making windows for the Christian Ministries Building, I told people I was a stained-glass widower. I wouldn't let her cook, and it was about that time that I said, 'Let's send my shirts to the laundry.'



ARDELIA: That was a hard thing to for me do. With the girls and all our married life, anytime I ironed, I prayed for the person who wore the clothes I was ironing. So I said to Wilbur, 'That's my time to pray for you when I iron your shirts.' He still said, 'Send them to the cleaners; you'll find another time to pray for me.'

WILBUR: I do my best to try to honor her ability. When we were in school and I pastored, she would go one semester, and I would stay home and take care of the babies. And then I would go a semester, and she would lay out. And we traded back and forth. I felt as if she is a part of me and I am part of her, so if she gets her education, I am helped.

ARDELIA: We were among the first husband and wives who were allowed to teach at Indiana Wesleyan at the same time.

WILBUR: We were the first, I believe. I'm sure the college had some reason for that policy at one time, but they eventually realized that a husband and wife could both teach without creating problems.

Of all the changes you've witnessed in your 32-plus years at IWU, which ones come to mind first?

ARDELIA: The new art building. I never expected to get out of Teter Hall. My policy was to do the best you can with what you've got. We were trying to do our very best, and the Lord honored that faithfulness with the new building. And now, we're already filling the space. We're popping at the seams.

WILBUR: My office was in the basement of McConn came, so my surroundings have changed, too. When I first came, we occasionally had classes of 35 and thought they were crowded. I had 80 students in a class in the spring. Probably for 15 of the past 30 years, I had a goal to know every student by sight on campus. I could speak every student's name. With 60 to 80 students in one class, I can't do that anymore. The best thing I can do, when they're taking tests, is to study their names. But some wear caps and when they put the heads down to write, you can't tell who is who.



Freshmen Introduced to 'World-Changing' Class By Dr. By Baylis

The Indiana Wesleyan University faculty unanimously approved a change in the general education requirements to include a first-year course to introduce students to the concept of being world changers. The course, which began this fall, is an outgrowth of IWU's new mission statement.

The course, "Becoming World Changers: Christian Faith and Contemporary Issues," attempts to outline the fundamental components of the Christian faith from an evangelical perspective. Students are challenged to develop a Christian worldview throughout their entire undergraduate experience by examining how Christian ideas both challenge and enrich the prevailing thought patterns of contemporary society.

Students meet Monday and Wednesday in a lecture format and Fridays in a small group. Through the lectures, readings and discussions, students should begin to integrate faith, learning and living as a foundation of their university experience.

There are more than 30 faculty members involved in the presentation of the course: six of them do the main lectures and 25 lead discussion groups. One of the textbooks for the course is a collaboration of two IWU professors, Dr. Jerry Pattengale '79 and Dr. Clarence "Bud" Bence.

"For the first time in my teaching career, I understand why I am teaching at a Christian college, not just what I am teaching," one faculty member said of the course.

A peer group leader said: "A girl came up to me tonight from class and mentioned the class. I proceeded to ask her what she thought about it and she replied, 'It's the greatest thing that ever happened to me in my entire life.' When I asked why, she responded by saying that the class was making her ask questions she'd never considered before."

Other highlights of the 1998-99 academic year in Academic Affairs:

• The faculty approved the establishment of a General Education Committee. The committee will be responsible for oversight of the general education component of our curriculum, assessment of student attainment of World Changer outcomes of general education courses, and approval of courses to be included within general education. The committee has begun a review of the general education program.

• The faculty approved the establishment of a Faculty Development Council, whose primary task for the coming year will be to help define the



Profiles of Excellence

Jim Lo: The Man They Call Umfundisi

Each year at Honors Day, Indiana Wesleyan University's Student Government Organization honors a professor of the year. The award is chosen by a vote of students.

At the same convocation, IWU President Jim Barnes honors one professor with a Distinguished Service Award. The award is based on nominations submitted by faculty

At the 1999 Honors Day, students and faculty came to the same conclusion. Both awards were presented to Dr. Jim Lo, Assistant Professor of Intercultural Studies.

Jim Lo, the professor who is known to the university family as Umfundisi. It is a South African name for mentor or teacher or pastor. More than simply being a title, it means a person who wants to become a part of your life.

"I like the context," says Dr. Lo. "In the African culture it means one who wants to relate." Few would doubt Dr. Lo's ability to relate to others during the three years since he came to IWU to begin the intercultural studies program.

He's a high-energy professor who brings to the classroom what he describes as an interactive teaching style. He has a bachelor's degree from Bartlesville Wesleyan College, master's degrees from Indiana Wesleyan University and Wheaton College and a doctorate from the University of South Africa.

Dr. Lo came to IWU after serving three terms on the mission field, 13 years in South Africa and one year in Cambodia. He started the work of The Wesleyan Church in Cambodia, teaching in an interdenominational Bible school, starting churches and working with Campus Crusade.

"Teaching always was a long-time goal of mine," he says. "After 14 years of being a missionary, I started to realize I wanted to focus my role more in developing and training leaders of the

future — whether it was here in the United States or in Africa or Cambodia."

His job interview at IWU was something of a surprise, though. He enjoys telling the story of how a planned visit to IWU took a most unplanned turn:

"My wife Roxie and I were bringing our boys (twins Andre and Matthew, now IWU seniors) here to see IWU and to visit with Keith Springer, who was a friend of ours and who had been my teacher at Bartlesville Wesleyan College. When I walked into the Religion Department office, the secretary asked if I had received a letter from Dr. Joe Seaborn, who was the department chairman at the time.

"I didn't know what she was talking about. I had received no letter at all, but she assumed I had come to campus because of the letter. Instead of asking me in a letter if I would consider teaching at IWU, Joe got to ask me in person. It was quite a surprise since I had no idea they were thinking of hiring me."

At the time, there were about 10 students enrolled in a missions program in the Religion Department. Today, there are about 70 students enrolled in the intercultural studies program.

Dr. Lo tries to persuade most of those students to view intercultural studies as a minor, instead of a major. He believes students must relate to other cultures in a broad range of professions, both at home and abroad.

"We just don't believe you have to be a missionary overseas to be culturally sensitive," he says. "You have to be culturally sensitive here in the American context to be effective for Christ. Because of that, we're starting to see a lot of students right now who are interested in taking courses that will help them to become more sensitive to other ethnic groups.

"With IWU's newly defined mission



Dr. Jim Lo visits with a student after class. to produce world-changing students, I feel that the intercultural studies program really has enhanced the entire university."

Dr. Lo says he always will have a heart for missions and that mission trips always will be a part of his teaching.

"Each spring break, I've taken mission trips to urban areas in the States," he says. "During May term and the summer months, my goal always will be to take students to Asian and African settings because that's what I'm familiar with."

While he enjoys teaching, Dr. Lo admits he has struggled over the past three years with being homesick for South Africa. He found comfort recently when a friend told him that was natural and, indeed, even necessary.

"My friend told me, 'If you don't have a passion to be overseas, you shouldn't be teaching here in America. If you don't love missions, why would you want to be teaching students about missions?""

While he is honored by the two awards he received in April, he also is

"Teaching is not something I do comfortably," he says. "There is always a touch of fear. Every class I go into I have that sense of nervousness and anxiety because I want to do my best every day. I realize you can't always do that, but you can always try."

APS Continues Record Trend in Enrollment By Dr. David Wright

Indiana Wesleyan University's Adult & Professional Studies division continued its trend of enrollment growth during the 1998-99 academic year. The division has grown by 12 percent since last fall.

The new Bachelor of Science in Business Information Systems program was unveiled and has enrolled 140 students in its first year of operation. This program is designed to address the demand for business professionals who understand newly developing information technology and how to apply these tools within the business management setting.

IWU received accreditation for the Master of Business Administration Online program during the past year. The first class started in September 1998, and more than 70 students have enrolled. There is high interest in this innovative program, which has received regional and national publicity.

A new Bachelor of Science in Accounting degree completion program was developed during the past year. The program began this fall.

A new APS Student Service Advisor pilot program will be developed this fall and implemented at the first of the year. Assessment data have consistently shown that APS students lack a strong sense of connection to the university, lack of a personal relationship with university personnel and feel dissatisfied with the availability of advising services. The new Student Service Advisor program will be piloted in the southern third of the state. It is designed to give every core group a person who can become a link to the university, to solve problems, provide encouragement, prevent unnecessary attrition and provide increased academic advising.

A new faculty newsletter, the Compass: Directions for a World Changing Faculty, was launched. The newsletter is designed to enhance communication with and among the hundreds of adjunct faculty members who teach APS classes. It will be a key tool in helping APS adjunct faculty understand and share in the new vision and mission of the university to change the world by developing students in character, scholarship and leadership.

The APS academic departments have completed a yearlong process of writing program assessment plans. Each program now has written assessment measures that are tied to the university mission, APS goals and program

reading, college-level writing, critical thinking and using mathematical data). It provides both a measure of how well APS associate degree graduates grasp general education knowledge and how APS students compare with a national sample drawn from 23 comprehensive universities.

APS students exceed the national sample in two categories and are within two points of the national sample in all

APS students exceed the national sample in two categories and are within two points of the national sample in all other categories.

objectives. For the first time, these measures provide APS administrators with both quantitative and qualitative tools to assess the academic achievement of APS students. These assessment measures are key quality control measures that will help us understand the true impact of the education we provide.

As part of its assessment program, APS administered the ETS Academic Profile to a sample of students completing the APS Associate of Science in Business program. The ETS Academic Profile is a nationally standardized test that covers general education knowledge (humanities, social sciences, natural sciences, college-level

other categories. This provides a strong foundation for further assessment and a strong indication that APS students at the 'sophomore' level have achieved a level of learning comparable to that of sophomores in traditional comprehensive universities.

Employer surveys have been conducted for the Master of Arts in Education and the B.S. completion program for registered nurses, and both surveys shows an overall trend of strong satisfaction with IWU graduates.

Mark Smith's First Priority Always Was Higher Education

Dr. Mark Smith's educational background prepared him for what he's doing today: serving as Associate Dean for Adult & Professional Studies at Indiana Wesleyan University.

"Not many people prepare themselves academically to teach at the college level," Dr. Smith says. "Most educators are prepared to teach at the elementary or secondary level, and then they graduate to college. I specifically prepared myself to teach in college."

Dr. Smith, a native of Virginia, started to attend college at Virginia Tech with his sights set on being a veterinarian. He won a state Future Farmers of America award and took all the required preveterinarian classes his freshman year of college.

"That's when I felt like God began to deal with me about doing something more than serving cows," he says. "I prayed about it and fought the call for a year, but I couldn't get away from it. The Lord kept saying, 'I want to use you for ministry."

Dr. Smith answered the call and enrolled in Hobe Sound Bible College in Florida where he earned a degree in religious education. After graduating, he and his wife Debbie headed to Kansas City where they accepted teaching jobs in a private school.

"I taught science in grades 7-12, became an associate pastor for a church, served as the high school basketball coach and began working on my master's degree at the University of Kansas," Dr. Smith says. His wife taught elementary school.

"I still have a secret desire to return to coaching basketball at a Christian school," he says with a smile. "We had three great years of coaching."

From Kansas City, it was on to Oklahoma where Dr. Smith became the principal of a private school and earned a master's degree in college teaching from Northeastern Oklahoma State.

After two years in Oklahoma, now equipped with a master's degree plus experience as a teacher and principal, Dr. Smith felt it was time to move on.

"I had set a goal in college, actually I think it was set by the Lord, to have my doctorate by the time I was 30," he says. "I knew there were a dearth of people who were trained to understand college administration in the Christian realm, and I wanted to equip myself to be one of those people."

Dr. Smith's choice of a graduate school was simplified when The Wesleyan Church offered him an opportunity to pastor a church in West Virginia. "I said, 'Let's go for it." At the same time, he began working on a doctorate in higher education administration at the University of West

In addition to his doctoral studies and pastoral duties, Dr. Smith was elected assistant superintendent of the West Virginia District of The Wesleyan Church. At 27, he was the youngest person ever assigned that role in the district.

A chance encounter with Dr. Joe Seaborn, then the head of the Religion Department at IWU, opened the door for Dr. Smith to come to the university. "Joe said if I was willing to take whatever job was open, he would connect me with the right people at IWU," Dr. Smith says. "He introduced me to Dr. David Wright."

Dr. Wright, then the Associate Dean of the Adult & Professional Studies Division, is now the division vice president. He hired Dr. Smith as a faculty recruiter. Four years later, Dr. Smith is the Associate Dean. He is primarily responsible for academic programs and faculty development.

"It really has been a learning experience here, but I love it," Dr. Smith says. "I've always welcomed challenges, and this is the 21st century

happening right here in higher education. We were one of the first players to provide these kinds of innovative adult programs, and now everyone is trying to replicate what we're doing."

Dr. Smith has no plans to walk away from the program anytime soon. If he did, though, he would be proud of his legacy. "There have been several key initiatives that we have accomplished," he says.

Among them:

- "We've added full-time faculty; that was a key initiative, a quality initiative."
- "I take great pride in the way we've integrated faith into the curriculum."
- "We are just now starting to see the results of an assessment initiative which shows that our students can compete against any students in the nation."

The key question about the APS program, in Dr. Smith's mind, is whether students' lives are being changed. "I have documentation to show that we are doing that, so it doesn't matter what critics may say," he says. "As long as I know we're changing people's lives, that's all I need to know. Granted, what we're doing is a different way of educating people, but the results should not be any different."

Record Numbers of Students Still Streaming to IWU By Dr. John S. Gredy

The 1998-99 academic year was an exciting time for Indiana Wesleyan University's Enrollment Management division, which expanded to keep pace with the increasing number of students seeking an IWU education.

Prospective students and parents from Michigan, Illinois and Pennsylvania continue to tell us how the word about IWU is getting out in their home churches. Even though we promote the university in national evangelical magazines, through church visits and at schools and camps, people who have visited campus are our best ambassadors.

The wonderful thing is that parents often comment on how friendly everyone is and how there seems to be a presence of God at IWU.

The Enrollment Management Division, which consists of Admissions, Financial Aid and Marketing, strives to create a student-friendly environment. The division's purpose is to attract students who will benefit from an IWU education and who will graduate with skills to be a world changer.

Surveys taken by the Enrollment Management Division have shown that students choose IWU for the following reasons:

- Spiritual atmosphere.
- Quality academic programs.
- Excellent financial aid awards.
- · Outstanding facilities.

The growth in enrollment at Indiana Wesleyan University attracted the attention of two national publications during the year. IWU was the focus of a story on Christian higher education that appeared in the *Chronicle of Higher Education*, which is read by faculty and administrators at 3,500 colleges and universities nationwide. *U.S. News & World Report* later mentioned that IWU's enrollment had doubled in the past decade.

The national attention came as IWU was developing a strategic plan to market the university statewide and nationally. The Enrollment Management

Division has hired Stamats, a nationally recognized higher education marketing firm, to do marketing research and develop a long-term marketing plan.

As IWU has become more involved in strategic planning, there has been a growing awareness of the enrollment potential for traditional students at the Indianapolis campus. In an effort to facilitate that growth, Brad Kissell was hired as Director of Enrollment Management to coordinate marketing efforts for the traditional program at Indianapolis. He also will coordinate marketing and recruitment for traditional graduate programs in counseling, nursing and ministry as well as the MBA Online, Master of Education and B.S. completion program for registered nurses in the APS Division.

Other highlights of the 1998-99 academic year in the Enrollment Management Division:

- The Admissions Office moved into the former president's home on Nebraska Street, which is more visible and serves as a campus welcome center. The APS financial aid office moved to its new offices in the APS building.
- Almost 2,000 students applied for admission by the end of July, an increase of 97 over the previous year. Even more significant, deposits were 159 ahead of the previous year (890 this year compared to 731 the previous year) which is an 18 percent increase. There was a significant increase in the number of applications from Ohio, Michigan, Illinois and Indiana.
- Once again, we have the largest freshman class ever with 567 first-time freshmen and 79 transfers for a total new student enrollment of 646.
- Since fall 1996, the freshman class has increased 46 percent from 389 to 567.
- The academic quality of the freshman class continues to increase. There are 20 new freshmen who were ranked No. 1 in their high school class.

The number of honors students has increased by 72 percent in the last three years, with a 12 percent increase in the fall of 1999 over the previous year.

- More than 500 students and sponsors, the largest group ever, attended Fall Preview 1998. The awardwinning Jars of Clay, a contemporary Christian music group, was brought in to do a Friday night concert as part of an extensively redesigned fall preview weekend.
- More than 800 students attended Youth Conference '99 in April and took part in seminars and rallies aimed at affirming their commitment to follow God. Many made first-time spiritual commitments or rededicated their lives to Christ.
- Junior High Weekend in May attracted a record turnout of almost 400 students and sponsors. The two-day event featured games, rallies and spiritual development activities.
- Financial aid processing time was shortened for Adult & Professional Studies students by developing a new procedure to transmit federal financial aid information electronically rather than through the mail. This procedure reduced by about two weeks the time it takes for students to learn if they're eligible for financial aid.

IWU Keeps Drawing Harriet Rojas Back to Campus

After being drawn to the Indiana Wesleyan University campus four times in her life, once as a student and three times as an employee, Dr. Harriet Rojas has decided this is where God wants her to be.

Dr. Rojas, a native of Washington State, began college at Bartlesville Wesleyan College before transferring to IWU where she earned a degree in music education in 1976.

"My parents, Glen and Aloma Whittenberg, had an enormous influence on my life, both spiritually and educationally," Dr. Rojas says. "They sacrificed so much for me to be able to attend a Christian college. My dad was laid off my entire freshman year, and they lived on next to nothing. I really wouldn't be anywhere today without their dedication."

Dr. Rojas spent the summer after graduation from IWU working with a federally funded program for disadvantaged teens before accepting a job in the Financial Aid office at IWU.

"Don Corliss, who was the financial aid director, said he was looking for someone who would make a commitment of five to eight years," she says. Without thinking, I said, 'Oh, no problem.' As it turned out, I became the Financial Aid director when I was 25 and stayed here for eight years."

For the first six years, she also was the resident director for Teter Hall, a residence hall for 40 women. "I just walked across the Administration parking lot from one job to the other," she says. "I even had a reserved parking space, the only reserved space in the lot besides the one for the president."

While she was holding down those two jobs, Dr. Rojas completed a master's degree in counseling at Ball State University. "I thought the degree would make be better prepared to deal with students, both in the financial aid office and in the residence hall," she

Dr. Rojas' life took a sharp turn one Sunday morning in 1983 as she

worshipped at College Wesleyan Church and felt a strong call to the mission field.

"Ken Heer was pastoring the church at the time," she recalls. "I don't remember what he preached on or even what the scriptural reference was, but what my heart heard was that you have to be sold out to the Lord if you're really going to be committed and follow him. I'd probably heard that same thing many times, but that particular Sunday it hit home."

As a young child, Dr. Rojas had considered missionary service but never addressed the matter. "On that Sunday morning, though, I felt if I was going to get to the next level of spiritual growth, I was going to have to come to grips with the call that God had placed on my heart," she says.

After three months of praying and seeking the counsel of friends, Dr. Rojas accepted an appointment to teach in a private seminary in Peru. That's where she met another teacher, Ner Rojas, whom she would marry two years later.

After their marriage, the Rojases moved to Marion where Dr. Rojas took a job as Director of Business Affairs at IWU. Two years later, though, their daughter Glenda was born, and the Rojases decided to move to Washington State so Glenda would be close to one set of grandparents.

"We wanted to keep the family ties as strong as possible," Dr. Rojas says. "That's something that's real important to us."

Dr. Rojas worked for two colleges in Idaho, enrolled in a doctoral program at the University of Idaho and by 1997 was headed back to Indiana where she was one of two final candidates for a job as Director of Financial Aid at Indiana University-Purdue University (IUPUI) at Indianapolis.

At the last minute, IUPUI decided not to fill the position – but told Dr. Rojas to keep the airline ticket they had purchased for her to come for the interview. She took the opportunity to come to IWU to visit with friends, where

she wound up being offered a job as IWU's first purchasing agent.

"How's that for having a sense that God was opening doors for us to come back to IWU?" she says. "I was talking with Dr. (William) McDowell about the purchasing agent's job at the exact time I originally had planned to be interviewing for the job at IUPUI. You could call that a coincidence, but I prefer to call it God really working things out."

After serving nine months as purchasing agent, Dr. Rojas was promoted to Executive Director of Student Financial Services to help out with the growing workload in that area. During the 1999-2000 school year, she has moved on to teaching half-time in the Business Department and working half-time to finish some projects in Financial Aid.

"The more I teach, the more energized I get. I just thoroughly enjoy it," she says. "I still don't feel I'm doing what I'm supposed to do, but I'm having a lot of fun. I keep thinking of Jeremiah 29:11, and I know that God has a plan that he's still working out for my life."

There's just something special about being back at IWU, she says. "I have been on a lot of college campuses over the years, and there's a completely different feeling when I step on the IWU campus. It's really something tangible, even though I can't put my finger on it."

Campus Continues To Be a Major Construction Zone By Dr. Bill McDowell

Never in the history of Indiana Wesleyan University has there been more activity than this past year.

For several years, we built one building a year. A couple of years ago, time faculty members, staff support grew by six employees and administrative personnel increased by 15 people.

With added personnel and programs,

we moved to two buildings a year. This past year, we have been working with five construction projects.

Revenue for the 1998-99 fiscal year was \$49.6 million, up from \$44 million the previous year. There was an 8 percent increase in Adult & Professional Studies division revenue, and a 16 percent growth in traditional revenue.

The university's endowment grew from \$12.1 million at the close of 1997-98 to more than \$14 million at the end of 1998-99.

As enrollment grows and buildings are added, additional personnel are required. In addition to adding 14 full-

we not only need to build to accommodate students. We also need to expand office space, program space and other dimensions of the university's infrastructure.

As the fiscal year ended, three projects were nearing completion and since have been completed:

- A 120,000-square-foot Recreation and Wellness Center.
 - A 206-bed residence hall.
 - A 36-bed, six-unit townhouse. Ongoing projects include:
- The renovation and addition of a 43,000-square-foot wing to Burns Hall of Science. Construction started in May 1999 and is scheduled to be completed in August 2000.

- A second 36-bed, six-unit townhouse, which was started in July and is scheduled for completion in November.
- A prayer chapel, which was started in August and is scheduled for completion in August 2000.

Projects under consideration for the spring of 2000 include:

- An addition to the Student Center.
- More student housing.

Caring for IWU Campus is a Matter of Stewardship

Brendan Bowen sees his job as going well beyond the official title on his office door: Director of Physical Plant. He is as much a teacher and spiritual leader as anyone on the Indiana Wesleyan University campus.

"There is a spiritual dimension to our work," he says. "We're caring for God's campus. It's a matter of stewardship, which ups the ante here at IWU."

Mr. Bowen was seeking that added dimension when he set a goal for his professional life while working in a similar job at Western Kentucky University. "A few years ago, my supervisor at Western Kentucky asked what I'd like to be doing in five years, and I said I'd like to be the physical plant director at a small Christian college somewhere."

When the offer came from IWU in August 1998, Mr. Bowen knew it was where he was supposed to be. Until then, his adult life had been centered around Western Kentucky University.

Marriott, now Sodexho Marriott, is responsible for IWU's physical plant. Mr. Bowen is the only Sodexho Marriott employee for the physical plant, but he supervises 40 full-time workers and between 30 and 90 student workers.

In addition to his undergraduate degree, Mr. Bowen also has a master's degree in public administration. "I had a strong technical background," he says. "But I felt if I was going to stay in higher education, I needed to round out my education."

Mr. Bowen specifically chose to work at a small Christian college because he was not satisfied to have a job that did not impact people's lives. "I feel like God gives all of us gifts, gifts of ministry, gifts of administration, gifts to work with people around you," he says. "I felt I wanted to use the gifts He gave me in leadership to make a difference."

In just a year at IWU, Mr. Bowen already is making a difference. He has placed enormous faith and responsibility

lifelong learning skills is really our goal. We're going to do everything we can do to advance students' skills and sense of self worth and to develop good work ethics. In addition, we have the benefit of getting the work done."

Empowerment is the key, Mr. Bowen says, to building teamwork among fulltime employees.

"I have confidence that every person is capable of doing what he or she is responsible for doing, and I let them know that," he says. "I see myself as being an enabler. I'm not afraid to hire people that are more capable than me. If I can hire someone who knows more about air conditioning than me, you can be certain that's who I will hire."

By some standards, IWU should be an easy campus to maintain because a majority of the buildings are less than 10 years old. Mr. Bowen says that isn't true because IWU has a higher standard for maintenance.

"We don't maintain our campus at the same level as your usual run-of-the-mill college," he says. "We have a higher standard of excellence. We aspire to be greater than the sum of our parts. We aspire to achieve a level of excellence."

That's what Brendan Bowen means when he talks about the spiritual dimension to his work.

Mr. Bowen earned a degree there in industrial education and did his student teaching but never left the campus. He repaired air conditioners as a student, moved on to drafting and stayed on as a draftsman after graduating.

"I started moving up in physical plant administration and had become the Director of Administrative Services by 1995 when Western Kentucky outsourced its physical plant services to Marriott Corp.," Mr. Bowen says. "I stayed on with Marriott and was promoted to construction manager for the campus."

It was the Marriott connection that brought Mr. Bowen to IWU.

in student workers and has got the entire maintenance department working together.

"The number of student workers we use is unusual," he says. "A lot of university physical plants aren't willing to take risks with students, but we couldn't achieve our goals without them. We put so much confidence in students and their ability to do their tasks."

Mr. Bowen started an innovative program during the summer months when as many as 90 students were on the payroll. "We set up various student crews and hired a student leader for each of them," he says. "Teaching

Power of Prayer Has Impact on Chapel Programs By Dr. Todd Voss

An exciting new student-initiated chapel ministry began this year. Seven students used the power of prayer to support chapel by praying before and during each chapel. University Chaplain Gary Swyers believes it made a significant impact on the effectiveness of the chapel programs this year.

Due to the increase in the number of mission trips and outreach opportunities, we added a part-time student ministry coordinator to help organize and direct the various programs. In addition, almost 200 students responded prayerfully to our missions-emphasis chapel in the fall, making a public commitment to ask God to use them for missions.

In addition to a growing number of on-campus groups and departments, the Botany Glen Adventure Center had more than double the number of groups renting the center than the previous year. Botany Glen has a leadership high-ropes course for individual learning and several group initiatives for specific communication and relationshipbuilding experiences.

New townhouse apartments were built and opened just in time for the fall 1998 semester. These units house 96 upperclass students and have three bedrooms, three baths, a kitchen and living room. A new community center also was constructed to serve all the small units (Eastburn, Phillippe, Cox, University Court and the townhouses). This center has a reception desk, computer room, study room and large lounge with fireplace. It has proven to be a hub of activity and an important addition to the development of community in the small

We used 58 rooms during the fall semester to over-assign students to triples. Even so, we filled to capacity and had to turn away a small number of potential resident students for the first time in the history of Indiana Wesleyan University. Our fall occupancy was

1.278, which was 177 students greater than the fall of 1997. Plans were made immediately to prepare for the 1999-2000 academic year by building a new 206-bed residence hall.

A new university ID card was put in place this past year. Not only is the new card less expensive to produce than the old one, it allowed for the development of the pictorial segment of the Virtual Advising Link (VAL) on-line system. The new card uses digital technology to capture the picture, and the back of the card has magnetic stripes that will allow us to develop keyless entry systems and prepaid purchasing opportunities at vending and copy machines.

The Health Center continued to increase hours and services this year in response to a significantly growing patient response. A new brochure outlining services was sent to faculty/staff, and a major increase in University employees and their dependents was realized. This is a wonderful opportunity for saving the employee out-of-pocket expenses for health services, but it also saves the University as a result of low-cost lab and office visit fees.

We developed a survey to measure our students' "sense of community" on campus this year and to baseline their responses to help us develop additional programs and services to enhance their sense of community (belonging, loyalty, closeness) at IWU. The results were positive with about 80 percent of the respondents rating their current sense of community as excellent or good. The only major concerns expressed were: Continued growth's impact on food service lines, student center size, chapel overcrowding, offices keeping up with so many students, and loss of personal attention due to size.

After months of work, Herb Hughs and Dawn Greene mailed the Upward Bound reapplication grant in October. Upward Bound is a federally supported program that targets first-generation, low-income high school students to increase their chances of going to college. In May we received \$1 million to fund the program through 2003.

A new centralized scheduling system was piloted this year. Glin Winsor is now coordinating the booking and set up of most non-class-related University spaces throughout the year for both oncampus and off-campus requests. This new approach should help remove the growing confusion and frustration of how and where to call for reserving spaces on campus.

Student activities reached new heights again this year with record attendance and many new activities planned. The University now has more than 35 student organizations and collectively supports more than 400 students who hold a leadership position or office. In addition, we now have 60 active members in the SALT (Stepping Ahead with Leadership Training) leadership cocurricular transcript program.

As the university has grown, the relationship between the Admissions Office and Student Life has been much more deliberative and supportive. Collaboration on Fall Preview, Youth Conference and visit weekends has benefited both departments, saved money and increased attendance at events.

Susan Rose's Persistence Eventually Paid Off

Susan Rose grew up down the street from Indiana Wesleyan University, but her journey to the IWU Health Center took longer than she expected.

"For at least three years, I called Dr. (Todd) Voss to ask, 'Do you need a nurse? Do you need a nurse?" she says. "I really liked the Christian university and thought it could be a real neat place to work. I was excited to think I might have that opportunity."

Dr. Voss is Vice President for Student Development. His area of responsibility includes the IWU Health Center.

"I finally decided that Dr. Voss never was going to call; I never was going to get a job at IWU," Mrs. Rose says. "I took it off my list of things to do. I wasn't going to call him anymore."

Instead, Dr. Voss called her. "I got involved in leading a ladies Bible study and came home one day, during a high spiritual point in my life, and there was a message on my answering machine from Dr. Voss. 'I think I have a job for you,' he said."

Five years later, that original part-time job has turned into a full-time job as director of the Health Center. "If someone had told me five years ago that I would be working full-time, I wouldn't have believed them," Mrs. Rose says.

"My goal always was to work parttime, so I could stay home and be a mom to our four daughters. But, as it turned out, God's timing was perfect. When the opportunity came to work full-time, my kids were all in school. Everything about it was perfect."

Her husband, David '92, joined IWU four years ago. He is executive director of operations for Adult & Professional Studies.

When Mrs. Rose came to IWU, the Health Center was open half days and a doctor came twice a week for a couple of hours. Now, the Health Center is open full-time five days a week and a nurse practitioner is available four days a week.

"We are a full primary-care facility now," she says. "We pretty much can do anything that can be done in a doctor's office. We rarely have to refer patients to other health-care facilities."

In addition to 2.000-plus students, the Health Center increasingly has become a primary care facility for IWU employees and their families, and spouses and children of students.

"I'm especially pleased that we can provide care for married students and their families," Mrs. Rose says. "They often have no insurance and little money, so we try to provide health care as inexpensively as possible and work with them on payments."

The Health Center sees an average of 40 to 50 patients a day. "It's pretty nonstop," Mrs. Rose says.

"We never want to get so busy, though, that we miss something important. We have conscientious and caring nurses. They worry about people. They call and check on people the next day to see how they're doing. We bend

"All of the experiences I had through the years have really helped here," she says. "We deal with a lot of emotional disorders, such as depressions and eating

over backwards to please people. We always want to go the extra mile to make sure students have a good experience at the Health Center, and we look for staff who are willing to do

A common ailment, especially at the beginning of a new school year, is homesickness. "Deciding whether a student is really sick or just homesick is one of our jobs," Mrs. Rose says. "We get to be moms, which is really special."

Before coming to IWU, Mrs. Rose

Mrs. Rose doesn't regret for a minute her persistent phone calls to Dr. Voss five years ago. "I love it here," she says. "I have not had a single day that I've dreaded to come to work. I tend to get bored easily, and every hour brings something new at the Health Center that keeps it exciting. My job here is my mission, and I love it. My job at IWU was a beautiful gift from God."

Annual Fund Giving Tops \$1 Million for Second Year By Terry Munday

Giving to Indiana Wesleyan University's annual fund topped \$1 million for the second consecutive year. The actual amount raised was \$1,027,822, about \$20,000 more than the previous year. This is the 12th consecutive year that annual fund giving has exceeded the previous year.

The annual fund consists of all unrestricted gifts. It includes money raised through direct mail and events such as golf tourneys, scholarship days, alumni phonathons and an annual telesale.

Proceeds from the annual scholarship telesale showed the largest percentage increase of any annual fund event. The 1999 telesale raised \$91,740, compared to \$50,531 the previous year.

The telesale, which is held in January and broadcast live over WIWU TV, was extended from four to five days this year. Area merchants and friends of IWU donated more than 400 items valued in excess of \$125,000 for the 1999 telesale. The merchandise was sold for 60-70 percent of its total value.

Total giving for 1998-99 was \$11.7 million, which was a record amount for a year in which there was no capital campaign. The total was buoyed considerably by three grants, totaling \$8.25 million, from Lilly Endowment, Inc. of Indianapolis.

For the first time ever, giving by churches for Church Matching Scholarships exceeded \$400,000. A record \$426,167, \$33,000 more than the previous year, was received from 912 churches. Almost 940 students benefited from the scholarships.

Alumni giving for 1998-99 totaled \$657,789. The Class of 1943 led the way with total giving of \$78,785. The Class of 1958 ranked second with \$76,627. IWU had 23,689 alumni as of June 30.

Other highlights of the year in University Advancement:

· Six ministry teams and a drama

team served IWU during the academic year. In addition, several qualified students were used for freelance ministry. Unrestricted income from the various Christian service teams reached an all-time high of \$81,398.

- The IWU Chorale and Wind Ensemble had successful tours during spring break. The Chorale toured in Michigan, Ohio and California, while the Wind Ensemble was traveling in Virginia, North Carolina and Ohio. May tours to Christian schools reached into Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio and Wisconsin.
- WIWU TV, the university's lowpower TV station, produced more than 450 programs and projects during 1998-99. In addition, video services made more than 1,000 videos – including more than 160 that were sold at graduation ceremonies.
- Three golf tournaments sponsored by the Development Office generated nearly \$100,000. The Jack Colescott Scholarship Golf Tournament, held in September 1998 at Hart Golf Course in Marion, drew 252 players and raised a record \$55,393. Gale Sayers, the former all-pro running back for the Chicago Bears, was the celebrity golfer and spoke at a tourney banquet that drew more than 300 guests.

The Indy Golf Classic, held in May at Valle Vista Golf Course in Greenwood, Ind., drew 173 golfers and raised a record \$32,288.

A new golfing event this year, the Night-Light Scholarship Tourney, was held at night at Hart Golf Course in Marion. More than 70 players participated, and the event raised \$9,500.

- The annual Grant County and Wabash County Scholarship Days, which are coordinated by the Development Office, raised about \$70,000.
- Kay Alter, Director of Prospect Research and Management, coordinated a series of interviews with selected Trustees, PACE members and friends of the University to obtain names and contacts for potential relationships with IWU. Through interviews with 19 people, about 130 names were obtained.
- Circulation of the *Triangle* climbed to 31.500 for the summer issue of 1999. The paper quality for the magazine was upgraded, beginning with the spring 1999 issue, which improved the overall appearance of the publication.

IWU Was Always a Part of Kay Alter's Life

Kay Alter grew up in Texas, with Indiana Wesleyan University in her backyard.

"My mom and dad both graduated here, so I grew up knowing about Indiana Wesleyan," she says. "I always was going to come to IWU and become a nurse."

That thinking changed, however, during Mrs. Alter's teen years. "When I was 13, we moved to Marion when my dad became a professor at IWU and, all at once, I didn't want to attend college here anymore"

Mrs. Alter is the daughter of Dr. Marvin Hinds '51. Professor Emeritus of Biology, and Hazel Hinds '50.

By the time she was 18, Mrs. Alter had changed her mind about attending IWU. In 1978, she enrolled in the nursing program — but not for long. "It only took me a couple of weeks to discover I didn't want to be a nurse," she says. "I didn't like being in hospitals or around sick people."

She stuck with science classes

IWU in 1982, with a degree in journalism and science, she went to work as a salesperson in the Chronicle-Tribune advertising department but continued to cover sporting events on weekends.

After working briefly at Wesley Press, the publishing house of The Wesleyan Church, Mrs. Alter accepted a job as assistant director of records at IWU in 1986. She held that job for 10 years, earning an M.S. degree in management from IWU along the way.

"Returning to work at my alma mater wasn't something I'd ever thought much about," she says. "When Wesley Press moved to Indianapolis, I needed to look for a job, and IWU was an obvious place to look. After working in the secular world of a daily newspaper and then at Wesley Press, I decided that I preferred the Christian environment."

Two years ago, Mrs. Alter decided it was time for a job change. "I knew I wanted to change, but I really wasn't looking on campus. Then an opportunity

academic side," she says. "I knew the Advancement Department was over there in the Ad Building raising money, and I knew that the university needed to raise money. Still, it was almost like coming into a new employer. It gave me a much broader perspective of IWU."

In her present job, Mrs. Alter helps to identify individuals, corporations and foundations that might have an interest in providing financial support for IWU. She then develops and manages ways to build relationships with those people and organizations to get them involved in the life of the university.

"Basically, what we're doing is selling the university," she says. "It's more than just going out and raising money, although we need to do that too.

"Primarily, it's finding people who are interested in the same goals the university is interested in: Christian higher education, good leadership and developing students who will change the world. We are seeking people who want to help us develop the tools to prepare students in those skills."





Caleb Dimmich, Basketball Star, Dies in Accident


J. Caleb Dimmich, who led the Indiana Wesleyan University basketball team in scoring last season, was killed July 6 while working on his family's farm in Boswell, Ind. He was 22 and would have been a senior at IWU.

Dimmich was electrocuted while trying to repair a grain auger motor that apparently had a short in it. Dimmich's father, David, was working nearby when the accident occurred.

Dimmich, a 6-1 guard, scored more

than 1,000 career points at IWU. Some of his college records include 11 three-point field goals in one game, 27 consecutive free throws, a 43-point single-game high, and a 42-point freshman single-game scoring record.

At Benton Central High School in northern Indiana, Dimmich briefly was the career boys' basketball scoring leader with 1,216 points. His funeral was held July 8 in the gymnasium at his former high school.

Some Things are Worth Preserving

It has been said that we live in a throwaway society, and you don't have to look far for evidence of that. You have to look a little harder for evidence that some things are still worth preserving, but the latter search is well worth the time and effort.

Our summer vacation took us on such a journey of discovery. One stop was planned and the other wasn't.

The unplanned stop was at the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of American History in Washington, where 'The Star Spangled Banner' is being painstakingly restored.

Here's a brief refresher course on the history of the famous flag that inspired Francis Scott Key to write our national anthem.

In 1813, Lt. Col. George Armistead, the commander of Fort McHenry, Md., commissioned Mary Pickersgill to assemble a new flag for the fort. Mrs. Pickersgill was a flagmaker in Baltimore. The flag, which originally measured 30 x 42-feet (about half the size of a tennis court), cost the U.S. Army \$405.90.

The conservation project, which will take three years, is the most extensive ever undertaken by the museum. It is being done with surgery-like precision in a specially designed laboratory, at a cost of \$18 million. The good news is that most of the money is coming from private foundations.

The National Museum of American History clearly believes there are some things, indeed many things, worth preserving. Little wonder that the museum likes to think of itself as America's attic.

Moving on down the Atlantic coast from Washington, we came to the planned stop on our journey of discovery: the Cape Hatteras Lighthouse in North Carolina. At 225 feet, it is the tallest lighthouse in North America.

For many years, the Cape Hatteras light has been threatened by shoreline erosion and faced the very real possibility of eventually toppling over

into the ocean. After years of study and several temporary measures, the decision was made to move the lighthouse about one-half mile inland.

And so, for most of the month of July, the 3,850-ton lighthouse was rolled slowly along the beachfront on specially built tracks. We, along with an estimated 12,000 other tourists, were there the day the lighthouse passed the halfway mark on its journey.

Here are a few more statistics on the Cape Hatteras Lighthouse. It was built in 1870 at a cost of \$167,500. The cost to move the lighthouse, along with the keeper's quarters and an oil house, was \$12 million.

We're eager to return to Cape Hatteras next summer to climb the 268 steps in the lighthouse, just as we've done for the past few years. Unlike some people who opposed the lighthouse relocation, for both fiscal and philosophical reasons, we believe the \$12 million was well spent.

Strictly on a dollars-and-cents basis, it's hard to justify spending \$30 million to preserve two American artifacts that only cost \$167,905.90 to begin with.

Thankfully, there are still those among us who reject the throwaway mentality.

What kind of hope for the future can we possibly have without a deep appreciation of our past? It is important that we preserve those things which connect our past to our future.

T.S. Eliot, the distinguished poet and critic, put it simply but elegantly when he said, "Time the destroyer is time the preserver."




