#### MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING - MARCH 11, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Irvine Ranch Water District (IRWD) was called to order at 5:11 p.m. by President LaMar on March 11, 2019 in the District office, 15600 Sand Canyon Avenue, Irvine, California.

Directors Present: Reinhart, Matheis, Swan, Withers and LaMar.

Directors Absent: None.

Also Present: General Manager Cook, Executive Director of Engineering and Water Quality Burton, Executive Director of Water Policy Weghorst, Executive Director of Operations Chambers, Executive Director of Finance and Administration Clary, Director of Water Recycling Operations Zepeda, Director of Water Resources Sanchez, Director of Public Affairs Beeman, Director of Treasury and Risk Management Jacobson, Legal Counsel Collins, Legal Counsel DeMayo, Legal Counsel Roux, Secretary Bonkowski, Government Relations Officer Compton, Consultant Deborah Diep, staff, legal counsel, and members of the public.

<u>ORAL COMMUNICATIONS</u>: Ms. Robin Ganahl, a representative of the Orange County Clean Energy Advocates, invited the Board and staff to attend a public workshop on Community Choice Energy on March 17, 2019.

#### PUBLIC HEARING

#### EVALUATING A CHANGE IN THE ELECTIONS PROCESS FOR THE IRVINE RANCH WATER DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND ESTABLISHING DIVISION BOUNDARIES

Pursuant to Elections Code section 10010, an additional public hearing, the third public hearing since the drafting and publication of draft maps, is now being held on March 11, 2019 after the drawing of draft maps. The first hearing after the drawing of draft maps was held on December 10, 2018. The second hearing after the drawing of draft maps was held on January 14, 2019. The purpose of both of these hearings, and the current hearing, is to invite and solicit public comments on the draft division maps, which have been published by the District on its website, and the potential sequence of elections for the directors from each division at different times to provide for staggered terms of office.

President LaMar declared the Board meeting of March 11, 2019, to be the time and place for a hearing on evaluating a change in the elections process for the Irvine Ranch Water District Board of Directors and establishing division boundaries, and asked the Board Secretary to announce how the hearing was noticed.

District Secretary Bonkowski said that the hearing was noticed by publication in the *Orange County Register* on Sunday, February 24, 2019; by publication in Spanish in the *Excelsior Unidos* on Friday, February 22, 2019; by publication in Korean in the *Korea Times* on Saturday, February 23, 2019; by publication in English and Traditional Chinese in the *World Journal* on Saturday, February 23, 2019, and Sunday, February 24, 2019; by publication in Farsi in *Hafteh Bazaar* on Friday, February 22, 2019; by electronic posting in English, Farsi, Korean, Traditional Chinese, and Spanish on the IRWD website, through which the notice can be translated into approximately 20 languages; and by physical posting at IRWD's headquarters. She further said that five additional draft maps — Map A-1, Map B-1, Map C-1, Map D-1 and Map E — were published on IRWD's website on February 15, 2019. She presented affidavits of posting and proof of publication to the Board related to the hearing.

On <u>MOTION</u> by Swan, seconded by Matheis and carried (4-0) (Swan, LaMar, Reinhart and Matheis voting aye and Withers absent), the Board of Directors received and filed the affidavits of posting and proof of publication as presented by the Board Secretary.

President LaMar asked legal counsel to describe the nature of the proceedings, and to explain the purpose of the hearing.

Legal Counsel DeMayo said that the purpose of the hearing was an opportunity to invite and solicit public comment on the draft division maps which have been published by the District on its website at least seven days prior to the hearing, and the potential sequence of elections for the directors from each division at different times to provide for staggered terms of office.

Director Withers arrived at 5:17 p.m. President LaMar asked to open the hearing. On <u>MOTION</u> by Matheis, seconded by Swan and unanimously carried, THE PUBLIC HEARING WAS OPENED TO SOLICIT AND ACCEPT COMMENTS ON THE PROPOSED MOVE TO BY-DIVISION ELECTIONS, THE COMPOSITION OF DIVISIONS, THE DRAFT DIVISION MAPS, AND SEQUENCE OF ELECTIONS.

In response to Director Swan's inquiry, Legal Counsel DeMay0 said he will research and report back if the California Election Code would allow for a combination election within the statute with two at-large Directors and three with division boundaries.

President LaMar asked for a report to the Board regarding the draft division maps, and on any written comments received.

Using a PowerPoint presentation, Consultant Deborah Diep reviewed the maps. Following review, President LaMar asked for boundary revision on Map E along the Interstate 5 freeway with Director Reinhart asking to have prepared an overlay of the larger communities within the service areas. Following Director Reinhart's comments on Maps A and B, on <u>MOTION</u> by Reinhart, seconded by Matheis, and unanimously carried, MAPS A AND B WERE REMOVED FROM FURTHER CONSIDERATION. Following discussion, Ms. Deip said that she will move forward with the revisions as discussed and with the goal of trying to keep more communities of interest together.

President LaMar inquired whether there is any person present who wished to provide comments on the proposed move to by-division elections, the composition of divisions, the draft maps, and the sequence of elections. There was no one who wished to be heard.

President LaMar inquired whether there were any other comments or questions from members of the Board of Directors. There were none.

President LaMar asked for a motion to close the hearing. On <u>MOTION</u> by Reinhart, seconded by Swan, and unanimously carried, THE PUBLIC HEARING WAS CLOSED AND THE BOARD AUTHORIZED STAFF TO AGENDIZE AN ADDITIONAL PUBLIC HEARING FOR APRIL 8, 2019, FOR THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS TO CONSIDER FINAL ACTION ON A TRANSITION TO BY-DIVISION ELECTIONS, AND TO CONSIDER ADOPTION OF A FINAL MAP OF DIVISION BOUNDARIES BASED ON MAP C, C-1, D, D-1, E OR ADDITIONAL MAP(S) E, AND A SEQUENCE OF ELECTIONS WITH THE ELECTION FOR DIVISION NUMBERS.

# SAN JOAQUIN RESERVOIR FILTRATION BUDGET ADDITION AND CONSULTANT SELECTION

Executive Director of Engineering and Water Quality Burton reported that the San Joaquin Reservoir serves recycled water to the IRWD Zone B distribution system primarily from Interstate 405 to the Newport Coast and Crystal Cove areas of the District. Mr. Burton said that algal growth on the surface of the reservoir has become an issue during the summer months as the water temperature rises resulting in increased clogging of customers' onsite private irrigation components (e.g., high efficiency sprinkler heads and fine mesh filters).

Mr. Burton said that IRWD retained PACE Advanced Water Engineering to evaluate the reservoir's water quality and to recommend filter pore sizes for water treatment. Based on the PACE study, filtration system and disinfection improvements will be constructed at the San Joaquin Reservoir to mitigate algae and debris entering the Zone B system.

Mr. Burton said that staff issued a Request for Proposal for design services to five consultants: AECOM, Carollo Engineers, Gannett Fleming, Lee & Ro and Tetra Tech. Gannett Fleming and Lee & Ro declined to submit proposals citing staff availability. AECOM, Carollo Engineers and Tetra Tech submitted proposals on January 30, 2019. He said that staff recommends this contract be awarded to Carollo based on the design concepts and project approach presented within its proposal, the strength of the project team, and its design experience on similar District projects.

Director Reinhart said that this item was reviewed and approved by the Engineering and Operations Committee on February 19, 2019. On <u>MOTION</u> by Reinhart, seconded and unanimously carried, THE BOARD AUTHORIZED THE ADDITION OF SAN JOAQUIN RESERVOIR FILTRATION, PROJECT 10379, TO THE FY 2018-19 CAPITAL BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,654,000; AND AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH CAROLLO ENGINEERS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$634,888 FOR ENGINEERING DESIGN SERVICES FOR THE SAN JOAQUIN RESERVOIR FILTRATION, PROJECT 10379.

#### SUSTAINABLE GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT ACT COMPLIANCE FOR IRWD'S KERN COUNTY WATER BANKING FACILITIES

On September 16, 2014, Governor Brown signed the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA). The intent of the legislation was to require local and regional agencies to develop and implement plans to sustainably manage the groundwater resources of basins throughout the State. IRWD's Strand Ranch and Stockdale West water banking projects are located within the Kern County Sub-basin of the San Joaquin Valley Groundwater Basin.

The Kern Groundwater Authority was formed as a local Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA), which includes Rosedale-Rio Bravo Water Storage District. Rosedale has offered to provide SGMA coverage for IRWD's water banking lands, which are located outside of Rosedale's boundaries, by including these areas within its chapter of the Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP) being prepared by the Kern Groundwater Authority. Rosedale would provide SGMA coverage through the execution of two agreements.

On <u>MOTION</u> by Swan, seconded and unanimously carried, THE BOARD AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT -SUSTAINABLE GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT ACT AGREEMENT WITH ROSEDALE-RIO BRAVO WATER STORAGE DISTRICT AND TO EXECUTE THE GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY PLANNING AGREEMENT BETWEEN ROSEDALE-RIO BRAVO WATER STORAGE DISTRICT AND IRVINE RANCH WATER DISTRICT, SUBJECT TO NON-SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES APPROVED BY LEGAL COUNSEL.

## DRAFT TERMS FOR ONE-YEAR RECHARGE PROGRAM WITH BUENA VISTA WATER STORAGE DISTRICT

General Manager Cook reported that staff expects that current wet-year conditions will result in water supplies being made available for recharge at the Strand and Stockdale Integrated Banking Projects. Mr. Cook said that in 2017, the Board approved an agreement for a one-year recharge program that allowed Buena Vista Water Storage District (BVWSD) to augment recharge on the Strand Ranch by utilizing IRWD's Stockdale West basins to recharge high-flow Kern River water.

Mr. Cook said that IRWD was able to realize an increase of over 6,800 acre-feet of water in 2017 as a result of the execution of the agreement. He said that in the event high-flow Kern River water may be available this year, staff recommends that the Board authorize the General Manager to execute a letter agreement with BVWSD with similar terms as the 2017 agreement, subject to substantive changes approved by the Supply Reliability Programs Committee.

On <u>MOTION</u> by Swan, seconded and unanimously carried, THE BOARD AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE A LETTER AGREEMENT WITH BUENA VISTA WATER STORAGE DISTRICT BASED ON THE PROPOSED DRAFT TERMS FOR A ONE-YEAR RECHARGE PROGRAM FOR 2019 TO AUGMENT RECHARGE ON THE STRAND RANCH BY UTILIZING THE STOCKDALE WEST RECHARGE BASINS, SUBJECT TO SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES APPROVED BY THE SUPPLY RELIABILITY PROGRAMS COMMITTEE.

# TERMS FOR A 4-FOR-1 PILOT EXCHANGE PROGRAM WITH MOJAVE WATER AGENCY

Using a PowerPoint presentation, Executive Director of Water Policy Weghorst said that in January 2019, the Supply Reliability Programs Committee approved the terms for a short-term unbalanced exchange program with Mojave Water Agency. Mojave considered the terms and indicated its preference for a revenue component to be part of any established program. Based on this, staff has prepared terms for a 4-for-1 pilot exchange program with Mojave that would result in IRWD receiving three acre-feet for every four acre-feet of State Water Project (SWP) water that Mojave delivers into storage at the Strand and Stockdale Integrated Banking Projects (IRWD Water Bank). The terms provide for Mojave receiving compensation for the water through a separate agreement. The expedited execution of an agreement, based on the proposed pilot program terms, would allow IRWD to secure wet-year water supplies expected to be available this year to Mojave should recharge capacity be available after IRWD receives water from its existing exchange programs with Buena Vista Water Storage District.

Mr. Weghorst reviewed the terms for the pilot program under which IRWD proposes to compensate Mojave in the amount of \$177 per acre-foot for the SWP water it delivers into storage at the IRWD Water Bank. In addition, IRWD proposes to pay the costs associated with recharging the water and the costs of recovering Mojave's share of the water through the use of the IRWD Water Bank wells. Mojave would pay for all costs associated with the use of its capacities in the SWP to deliver water for recharge and to convey recovered return water to Mojave's service area. The effective cost of the water to IRWD would be consistent with the cost of water from IRWD's programs in Dudley Ridge Water District.

Director Swan reported that this item was reviewed and approved by the Supply Reliability Programs Committee on March 5, 2019. On <u>MOTION</u> by Swan, seconded and unanimously carried, THE BOARD AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE A FOUR-FOR-ONE PILOT EXCHANGE LETTER AGREEMENT AS WELL AS A SIDE AGREEMENT TO COMPENSATE MOJAVE WATER AGENCY FOR THE WATER DELIVERED INTO STORAGE THAT INCORPORATES THE PROPOSED EXCHANGE AND COMPENSATION TERMS, BOTH SUBJECT TO SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES APPROVED BY THE SUPPLY RELIABILITY PROGRAMS COMMITTEE.

#### NEWPORT COAST LIFT STATION REHABILITATION <u>FINAL ACCEPTANCE</u>

#### SUMMARY:

The Newport Coast Lift Station Rehabilitation project is complete. IRWD's contractor, Pacific Hydrotech Corporation, has completed the required work and all punch list items. The project has received final inspection and acceptance of construction is recommended.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Newport Coast Lift Station Rehabilitation Project was implemented to address aging infrastructure and to improve facility accessibility for staff. The work included installation of approximately 3,000 feet of cured in place pipe rehabilitation of the existing ductile iron force main, an enclosed stairwell to access the drywell, and an electrical and odor control building with new electrical and instrumentation, odor control, and ventilation equipment. Pacific Hydrotech Corporation was awarded the construct contract July 11, 2018, and construction of all improvements was completed March 12, 2019. To improve the aesthetics of the site and to maximize the screening of the newly-constructed facilities from public view, staff will be proceeding with a separate landscaping contract in the coming months.

#### FISCAL IMPACTS:

As of February 28, 2019, the book value of the investment portfolio was \$369,469,743, with a 1.90% rate of return and a market value of \$368,428,540. Based on the District's December 31, 2018 quarterly real estate investment rate of return of 9.02%, the weighted average return for the fixed income and real estate investments was 4.00%.

As of February 28, 2019, the outstanding principal amount of fixed and variable rate debt was \$672,220,000. The monthly weighted average all-in variable rate was 1.78%. Including the District's weighted average fixed rate bond issues of 3.70% and the previous month's negative cash accruals from fixed payer interest rate swaps, which hedge a portion of the District's variable rate debt, the total average debt rate was 3.57%.

Payroll ACH payments totaled \$2,107,829, and wire transfers, all other ACH payments, and checks issued for debt service, accounts payable, payroll, and water purchases for February totaled \$20,768,988.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE:**



# Irvine Ranch Water District Investment Portfolio Summary February 2019





## AMENDMENT NO. 8 TO THE SANTIAGO AQUEDUCT COMMISSION JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT

### SUMMARY:

IRWD and The Irvine Company executed an agreement in 2018 to transfer The Irvine Company's 2.5 cubic feet per second (cfs) capacity in Reach 1U of the Baker Pipeline to IRWD. Amendment No. 8 to the Santiago Aqueduct Commission (SAC) Joint Powers Agreement recognizes the transfer of capacity and the resulting allocation of costs of maintenance, capital repairs and capital improvements to the Baker Pipeline. Amendment No. 8 also updates the member and represented agencies of the Santiago Aqueduct Commission following IRWD's consolidation with former member agency Los Alisos Water District and IRWD's capacity transfer with The Irvine Company. Staff recommends that the Board approve Amendment No. 8 to the Santiago Aqueduct Commission Joint Powers Agreement, subject to non-substantive changes.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

IRWD and The Irvine Company executed an *Assignment and Assumption Agreement (Transfer Agreement)* in 2018 to transfer The Irvine Company's 2.5 cfs capacity in Reach 1U of the Baker Pipeline to IRWD. The Transfer Agreement is attached as Exhibit "A". The transfer of capacity rights and the resulting allocations of maintenance, capital repairs, and capital improvement costs became effective July 1, 2018.

The intent of Amendment No. 8 to the SAC Joint Powers Agreement is to memorialize the effect of the Transfer Agreement and acknowledge that each of the SAC member and represented agencies not participating in the Transfer Agreement will retain the same capacity rights identified in Amendment No. 7 to the SAC Joint Powers Agreement. Additionally, Amendment No. 8 updates the member and represented agencies of SAC following IRWD's consolidation with former member agency Los Alisos Water District and IRWD's capacity transfer with The Irvine Company. Amendment No. 8 is attached as Exhibit "B".

The capacity of each SAC member and represented agency in each reach of the Baker Pipeline is shown in Exhibit "A" of Amendment No. 8. The maintenance, capital repair and capital improvement cost shares for each member and represented agency in each reach, and for the Baker Pipeline as a whole, are shown in Exhibit "B" of Amendment No. 8. The capacities and allocation of costs of maintenance, capital repairs and capital improvements of the non-participating Transfer Agreement SAC member and the represented agencies remain unchanged from Amendment No. 7.

## FISCAL IMPACTS:

Effective July 1, 2018 the allocation of costs for maintenance, capital repairs and capital improvements will be allocated between the participating member agencies and represented agencies as shown in Exhibit "B". IRWD's capacity purchase will have an added annual maintenance cost of approximately \$600.

## ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE:

This activity is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as authorized under the California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15306 which provides exclusion for projects involving basic data collection, research, experimental management, and resource evaluation activities which do not result in a serious or major disturbance to an environmental resource. These may be strictly for information gathering purposes, or as part of a study leading to an action which a public agency has not yet approved, adopted, or funded.

## COMMITTEE STATUS:

This item was reviewed by the Engineering and Operations Committee on March 19, 2019 and the Santiago Aqueduct Commission on March 21, 2019.

## EXHIBIT "A"

## ASSIGNMENT AND ASSUMPTION AGREEMENT

This ASSIGNMENT AND ASSUMPTION AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is dated July 1, 2018 (the "Effective Date") and is between IRVINE RANCH WATER DISTRICT, a California water district, organized under Division 13 of the California Water Code ("IRWD"), and The Irvine Company LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, as successor-in-interest to The Irvine Company, a Delaware corporation ("TIC"). IRWD and TIC are each a "Party" and together are the "Parties."

On or about April 13, 1961, the Los Alisos Water District, the El Toro Water District, and the Orange County Municipal Water District entered into the Santiago Aqueduct Commission Joint Powers Agreement (the "JPA"). The JPA created the Santiago Aqueduct Commission ("Commission") to construct, maintain, repair and manage the Santiago Aqueduct ("Aqueduct"), which would transmit water to the parties to the JPA.

The JPA was amended seven times, by: Amendment to the JPA (on or about September 11, 1961); Amendment No. 2 to the JPA (on or about January 1, 1978)("Amendment 2"); Amendment No. 3 to the JPA (on or about January 13, 1978) ("Amendment 3"); Amendment No. 4 to the JPA (on or about September 1, 1981) ("Amendment 4"); Amendment No. 5 to the JPA (on or about October 22, 1986); Amendment No. 6 to the JPA (on or about July 8, 1999); and Amendment No. 7 to the JPA (on or about June 19, 2014). These Amendments, along with all exhibits and attachments thereto, are collectively identified in this Agreement as the "Amendments." TIC was not a signatory to the JPA nor any of the Amendments other than Amendment 3 and Amendment 4.

Amendment 2 added IRWD as a party and as a member of the Commission and TIC as a party to the JPA with respect to certain matters. That amendment, and various other leases and subleases issued pursuant to the Amendments, granted the Parties certain rights and obligations with respect to the construction, maintenance, operation of water lines to be constructed parallel to the Aqueduct to supply water to, among others, the Parties. Pursuant to the JPA Amendments, TIC possesses 2.5 cfs capacity in Reach 1U of the Aqueduct, also known as the Baker Pipeline.

The Parties intend by this Agreement to assign and transfer TIC's rights and obligations under the JPA, the Amendments, and any other leases or subleases related thereto, to IRWD for valuable consideration.

The Parties therefore agree as follows:

1. Assignment. In exchange for IRWD's payment to TIC of the sum of \$56,410.00 (the "**Transfer Fee**") concurrent with the delivery of this Agreement, TIC hereby assigns and transfers to IRWD all of TIC's right, title, interest and obligations under the JPA and the Amendments (collectively, the "**TIC Interest**") effective as of July 1, 2018. Upon assignment and transfer of the TIC Interest as set forth in this section, IRWD accepts from TIC all such TIC Interest, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

2. <u>Assumption</u>. IRWD assumes and agrees to perform and fulfill all the terms, covenants, conditions, and obligations required to be performed and fulfilled by TIC under the JPA and the Amendments.

3. <u>Assignor Representations</u>. TIC represents that, to TIC's knowledge, (a) TIC has not transferred or assigned any portion of the TIC Interest (including the 2.5 cfs capacity in Reach 1U as set forth in the Amendments), (b) TIC has not amended, modified or terminated the JPA or the Amendments except as set forth therein, and (c) TIC has not breached the JPA or the Amendments. As used herein, "to TIC's knowledge" shall mean and refer to the current knowledge of Peter Changala, who is the employee of TIC's affiliate (Irvine Management Company) who is most likely to know about the status of the TIC Interest.

4. <u>As-Is: Where-Is</u>. Except as otherwise set forth in Section 3 above, IRWD acknowledges and agrees that it is accepting the assignment and conveyance of the TIC Interest based solely upon IRWD's inspection and investigation of the same and all documents related thereto, or its opportunity to do so, and the TIC Interest is assigned in an "AS IS, WHERE IS" condition, without relying upon any representation or warranties, express, implied or statutory, of any kind. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, TIC's aggregate liability in connection with this Agreement shall not exceed the amount of the Transfer Fee.

5. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Agreement will be binding on and inure to the benefit of the Parties, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors in interest, and assigns.

6. <u>Choice of Law and Venue</u>. All matters relating to this Agreement are governed by the laws of the State of California, and venue for any action related to the Agreement shall be the Superior Court of Orange County.

7. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice will be deemed given by depositing it in the United States Mail, first class, return receipt requested, or by courier or overnight delivery service and addressed as follows:

8. <u>Amendment</u>. Any amendment or modification of this Agreement must be written and properly executed by both Parties.

9. <u>Interpretation</u>. Each Party has participated in negotiating and drafting this Agreement, so if an ambiguity or a question of intent or interpretation arises, this Agreement is to be construed as if the Parties had drafted it jointly, as opposed to being construed against a party because it was responsible for drafting one or more provisions of this Agreement.

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10. <u>Further Assurances.</u> The Parties shall take such actions, or execute, acknowledge and deliver, or obtain the execution, acknowledgment, and delivery of such instruments as are reasonably necessary, appropriate or desirable to give effect to the provisions of this Agreement.

11. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties regarding TIC's assignment and IRWD's assumption of all of the TIC Interest. This Agreement supersedes all prior or contemporaneous agreements, commitments, conditions, discussions, instruments, offers, promises and/or proposals between the Parties regarding TIC's assignment and IRWD's assumption of all of the TIC Interest, whether oral or written.

12. <u>Authority</u>. The Parties represent that the individuals executing this Agreement have the legal power, right and actual authority to bind that Party to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

IRWD and TIC are signing this Agreement to be effective as of the Effective Date.

## EXHIBIT "B"

## AMENDMENT NO. 8 TO THE SANTIAGO AQUEDUCT COMMISSION JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT

This Amendment No. 8 to the Santiago Aqueduct Commission Joint Powers Agreement ("Amendment No. 8") is effective March 21, 2019, and is between the following six member agencies of the SANTIAGO AQUEDUCT COMMISSION (the "Commission") created by a Joint Powers Agreement dated September 11, 1961 (as amended, the "Joint Powers Agreement"):

EL TORO WATER DISTRICT;
IRVINE RANCH WATER DISTRICT ("IRWD") on its own behalf and as assignee of The Irvine Company;
MOULTON NIGUEL WATER DISTRICT;
MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT OF ORANGE COUNTY (formerly known as Orange County Municipal Water District) ("MWDOC") on behalf of represented agencies EAST ORANGE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT ("EOCWD") and the County of Orange (the "County");
SANTA MARGARITA WATER DISTRICT; and
TRABUCO CANYON WATER DISTRICT (formerly known as Santa Ana Mountains County Water District).

The member agencies are also sometimes referred to as the "**Parties**." Together EOCWD and the County are the "**represented agencies**" but are not member agencies.

The Joint Powers Agreement has been previously amended by the following amendments: the first Amendment (December 20, 1974); Amendment No. 2 (January 13, 1978); Amendment No. 3 (November 1, 1978); Amendment No. 4 (September 1, 1981); Amendment No. 5 (October 22, 1986), Amendment No. 6 (July 8, 1999); and Amendment No. 7 (June 19, 2014).

The Joint Powers Agreement (as amended) establishes certain hydraulic grade lines and capacity rights for the member agencies and represented agencies in the various reaches of the Santiago Aqueduct, also known as the Baker Pipeline. The costs of maintenance, capital repairs and capital improvements to the Baker Pipeline are allocated to the member agencies and represented agencies in proportion to each party's capacity rights in each reach as compared with the total capacity for each reach and in proportion to the length of each reach as compared with the entire length of the Baker Pipeline.

Capacity rights in the Baker Pipeline have been transferred among various member agencies and represented agencies, as previously reflected in the tables set forth in Amendment No. 7.

In 2018, IRWD and The Irvine Company executed an Assignment and Assumption Agreement (the "Transfer Agreement") to transfer The Irvine Company's capacity in the Baker

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Pipeline to IRWD. The transfer of capacity rights and the resulting allocations of maintenance, capital repairs, and capital improvement costs became effective as of July 1, 2018. The Parties intend by this Amendment No. 8 to memorialize the effect of the Transfer Agreement and acknowledge that each of the Parties and represented agencies not participating in the Transfer Agreement will retain the same capacity rights identified in Amendment No. 7. The Parties also intend by this Amendment No. 8 to clarify the members of the Commission following IRWD's consolidation in 2010 with former member agency Los Alisos Water District.

Therefore, the Parties amend the Joint Powers Agreement as follows:

SECTION 1. <u>Exhibit A</u> to this Amendment No. 8 depicts the capacities and hydraulic grade lines in the Baker Pipeline resulting from the Transfer Agreement. <u>Exhibit B</u> to this Amendment No. 8 depicts the corresponding allocation of costs of maintenance, capital repairs, and capital improvements for each reach of the Baker Pipeline and the Baker Pipeline in its entirety. Both exhibits are incorporated by reference into the Joint Powers Agreement and shall amend and supersede in their entirety the capacities and hydraulic grade lines in the Baker Pipeline as well as the allocation of costs previously set forth in the Joint Powers Agreement.

SECTION 2. In order to reflect the consolidation of Los Alisos Water District with IRWD, and the transfer of The Irvine Company's capacity to IRWD, the first two paragraphs of Section 3 of the Joint Powers Agreement, as amended by Amendment No. 6, are amended to read as follows:

"The Commission shall consist of six (6) regular members, one (1) regular member to be selected by each of the following member agencies:

El Toro Water District; Irvine Ranch Water District; Moulton Niguel Water District; Municipal Water District of Orange County; Santa Margarita Water District; and Trabuco Canyon Water District.

The Commission shall maintain and operate the Baker Pipeline. Each member agency shall have one vote. MWDOC shall represent itself, EOCWD and the County of Orange. Each member agency may appoint two alternate members, designated a first alternate member and a second alternate member, to the Commission."

SECTION 3. Except as modified by this Amendment No. 8, the Parties reaffirm the Joint Powers Agreement as amended by the prior seven amendments described above. The Parties shall execute this Amendment No. 8 in duplicate, each identical duplicate of which will be considered an original.

#### ACTION CALENDAR

### 2019 LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY UPDATE

#### SUMMARY:

This report provides an update on the 2019-2020 legislative session and IRWD priorities. As legislation and regulations develop, staff will provide updates and recommendations to the Water Resources Policy and Communications Committee and the Board, as appropriate.

Staff recommends that the Board consider the following actions/positions:

- AB 510 (Cooley) Local Government Records: Destruction of Records "SUPPORT";
- AB 1204 (Rubio) Primary Drinking Water Standards: Implementation Date "SUPPORT";
- AB 1486 (Ting) Local Agencies: Surplus Land "OPPOSE UNLESS AMENDED";
- SB 307 (Roth) Water Conveyance: Use of Facility with Unused Capacity "WATCH";
- SB 332 (Hertzberg/Wiener) Wastewater Treatment: Recycled Water "OPPOSE/ OPPOSE UNLESS AMENDED"; and
- SB 414 (Caballero) Small System Water Authority Act of 2019 "SUPPORT".

### BACKGROUND:

The 2019 bill introduction deadline was February 22, 2019. Approximately 2,600 bills were introduced. On the Assembly side, 1,821 bills were introduced while the Senate introduced 784 bills. Many of the introduced bills contain spot or intent language; however, a number of bills include substantive proposals. With the introduction deadline having passed, the 2019 legislative year will come into full swing with policy committees ramping up and legislators working to amend their legislation so that it will be heard by the April 26 and May 3 policy committee deadlines.

A wide variety of bills have been introduced on issues of interest to IRWD including water conservation, groundwater, and recycled water. There are also a number of bills related to greenhouse gas emissions, energy, and public contracting. Many of these bills are expected to have significant amendments prior to their first policy committee hearings. As such, staff will monitor proposals and bring updates and recommendations to the Water Resources Policy and Communications Committee and the Board, as appropriate.

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A copy of the 2019 Legislative Matrix is attached as Exhibit "A". Exhibit "B" is the 2019 "Legislative Update Report Links to Bill Texts," which contains links to the bills discussed below, unless a separate exhibit is noted.

## State Budget Update:

## January Revenue Numbers:

On February 11, 2019, State Controller Betty Yee released her monthly report on the State's finances. She announced that the State took in \$18.79 billion during the month of January. This was \$1.81 billion, or 8.8 percent, less than estimates contained in the Governor's Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-2020 budget proposal, but \$1.21 billion, or 6.9 percent, higher than estimates contained in FY 2018-2019 enacted budget. According to the State Controller, "[t]otal revenues of \$74.42 billion for the first seven months of FY 2018-19 were lower than expected in the proposed and enacted budgets by \$2.87 billion and \$1.32 billion, respectively. In the fiscal year to date, state revenues are just 0.2 percent lower than the same time last year."

## 2019 State Legislative Update:

## Water Tax and Other Safe Drinking Water Proposals:

Since the end of the 2017-2018 legislative session, work on a solution for safe drinking water in California has continued to be a topic of considerable conversation at the State level. Governor Newsom included support for a funding solution in his inaugural address and State of the State, and included a funding proposal in his proposed budget.

On February 1, 2019, his administration released budget trailer bill language detailing his funding proposal in the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water and Exide Cleanup Budget Trailer Bill. The Safe and Affordable Drinking Water and Exide Cleanup Budget Trailer Bill follows the provisions of SB 623 (Dodd, D-Napa) from 2017-2018 closely and includes a statewide water tax and a tax on fertilizer, confined animals facilities and dairy operations. The budget trailer bill also includes the liability relief previously included in SB 623 for agricultural operations.

With regard to the water tax, the budget trailer bill proposes a monthly water tax on the following:

- \$0.95 per month for meters less than or equal to 1-inch;
- \$4.00 per month for meters less than or equal to 2-inch;
- \$6.00 per month for meters less than or equal to 4-inch;
- \$10.00 per month for meters greater than 4-inch; and
- Customers without a meter would be taxed at a rate of \$0.95.

IRWD currently has an "oppose" position on the budget trailer bill.

In addition to the budget trailer bill, there are currently five bills this legislative session that relate to safe drinking water:

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- <u>AB 134 (Bloom, D-Santa Monica) Safe, Clean, Affordable, and Accessible Drinking</u> <u>Water:</u> As introduced, the bill includes findings and declarations related to the intent of the Legislature to address safe, clean, affordable, and accessible drinking water. As introduced, the bill includes no funding mechanism. IRWD currently has a "watch" position on AB 134;
- <u>AB 217 (Garcia, D-Coachella) Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund:</u> The bill, as introduced, would establish the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund in the State Treasury and would provide that moneys in the fund are available, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to the State Board to provide a stable source of funding to secure access to safe drinking water for all Californians, while also ensuring the long-term sustainability of drinking water service and infrastructure. As introduced, the bill includes no funding mechanism; however, it is expected that the bill will be amended shortly to include a hybrid approach to funding safe drinking water. The approach is outlined in a chart put together by the Chairman Eduardo Garcia's office, which is attached as Exhibit "C". IRWD currently has a "watch" position on AB 217;
- <u>SB 200 (Monning, D-Santa Cruz) Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund:</u> The bill, as amended on March 11, 2019, would establish the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund in the State Treasury and would provide that moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the State Board to provide a stable source of funding to secure access to safe drinking water for all Californians, while also ensuring the long-term sustainability of drinking water service and infrastructure. As amended, the bill does not include a funding mechanism. IRWD currently has a "watch" position on SB 200;
- <u>SB 669 (Caballero, D-Salinas) Water Quality: Safe Drinking Water Fund:</u> SB 669 is the proposed sponsored by the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) and the California Municipal Utilities Association (CMUA). It proposed an alternative mechanism to fund safe drinking water. The proposal would create a Safe Drinking Water Trust to provide a perpetual funding source to address safe drinking water in disadvantaged communities. IRWD currently has a "support" position on SB 669; and
- <u>ACA 3 (Mathis (R-Visalia)/Garcia) Water: Minimum Funding Guarantee:</u> ACA 3, while not directly related to safe and affordable drinking water, relates to providing a durable funding source for water in the state which could be used to address safe and affordable drinking water in California. The proposed constitutional amendment proposes that commencing with the 2021–2022 fiscal year, not less than two percent of State revenues are to be set apart for the payment of principal and interest on bonds authorized pursuant to the Water Quality, Supply, and Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2014; water supply, delivery, and quality projects administered by the department; and water quality projects administered by the State Board. IRWD currently has a "watch" position on ACA 3.

Additionally, CMUA, in coordination with the Eastern Municipal Water District (EMWD), is sponsoring SB 414 (Caballero). SB 414, which is similar to AB 2050 (2018), proposes to enact the Small System Water Authority Act of 2019. The proposal seeks to address the governance issues causing unsafe drinking water in a number of communities in California. IRWD currently

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has a "support in concept" position on the proposal because the bill language had yet to be released. Given that the bill is now in print, staff recommends that the Board adopt a "support" position on SB 414.

Staff would propose adjusting the District's position on the other safe drinking water fundings bills should the bills be amended to propose a water tax is consistent with the Board-adopted position on a public good charge on water, or be amended in a way that presents other policy concerns for the District.

Staff continues to work with the water coalition on addressing safe drinking water in California without a water tax, and will provide an oral update on any new developments.

## "Making Water a California Way of Life" Related Legislation:

Last year, Senator Bob Hertzberg (D, Van Nuys) and Assemblymember Laura Friedman (D, Glendale) authored SB 606 and AB 1668, the "Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life" legislation. The legislation, among other things, requires urban retail water suppliers to calculate and comply with an urban water use objective. The urban water use objective is comprised of adding efficient indoor residential water use, efficient outdoor water use, and water loss to create a retail-level water budget for each urban retail agency.

When SB 606 and AB 1668 were enacted last year, one of the outstanding issues was the fact that the urban water use objective language did not clearly state that the State Board could only enforce the water loss performance standard within the urban water use objective. In fact, the State Board has made statements indicating that enforcement of the water loss performance standard, which is currently being set by the State Board, may been enforced under both the urban water use objective and as a separate objective.

Hearing the concerns raised by the water community, Senator Hertzberg has introduced SB 134 this year to clarify that the performance standard being set by the State Board on water loss shall only be enforced via the urban water use objective. The District currently has a "support" position on SB 134, which is scheduled to be heard by the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee on April 9.

In addition to SB 134, Assemblymember Friedman has introduced two bills related to the long-term conservation legislation while Assemblymember Brian Dahle (R-Redding) has introduced one. Those bills would:

• <u>AB 1414 (Friedman) – Urban Retail Water Suppliers: Reporting:</u> AB 1414 seeks to address issues raised by some urban retail water suppliers that the reporting deadlines contained in the "Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life" are challenging to meet given the large amount of data needed to complete the reports. As a result, AB 1414 proposes changing the reporting date for submitting a validated water loss audit to the Department of Water Resources (DWR) from October 1 to January 1 of each year. Additionally, AB 1414 proposes changing the reporting date for calculating and complying with the urban water use objective from November 1 of 2023, and each November 1 thereafter, to January 1, 2024, and each January 1

thereafter. Finally, the bill adjusts the compliance deadlines and reporting deadlines for updating Urban Water Management Plans;

- <u>AB 1415 (Friedman) DWR: Reporting Requirements/Civil Penalties:</u> AB 1415 would establish civil penalties that DWR would be required to impose of any person or entity failing to file certain statutorily required reports with the Department by the dates specified in the statute. Specially, the bill would authorize a \$1,000 civil penalty for failing to file a water loss audit report, urban water management plan, groundwater sustainability plan, and agricultural management plan, among others, by the deadlines prescribed in the statute. The civil penalty would increase to \$250 per day if the reports or plans are not submitted within 60 days of the statutory deadline; and
- <u>AB 1432 (Dahle) Urban Water Use Objective: Indoor Residential Water Use:</u> AB 1432 is currently a spot bill that would modify Water Code Section 10609.4, which outlines the indoor residential water use standards to be used when calculating an urban water use objective.

## AB 510 (Cooley, D-Rancho Cordova) – Local Records: Destruction of Records:

Since 1998, the Government Code has required that public agencies retain any routine video monitoring recordings for a period of one year, and keep radio and telephone recordings for 100 days. Over the past 20 years, video monitoring technology has changed drastically. When the original one year recording provision was enacted, the legislative history shows that the original intent was to store videotapes. However, since that time, technology has advanced while the law has remained unchanged. The vast majority of video monitoring today is now done using digital cameras that record onto DVRs, agency servers, and cloud-based servers.

With the ease of digital storage and decreased cost of digital cameras, public agencies are installing an ever-increasing number of cameras and the cameras are recording in significantly higher resolution. While this has made video monitoring records more useful and effective, the increased number of cameras and picture quality means that the amount of data that must be stored to comply with the current statutory retention requirements is exceptionally high. Additionally, public agencies are more frequently using more cameras for routine video monitoring that is of no value to the public because it is footage of no activity. For example, 24-hour footage from a camera facing the back entrance to an office building where zero incidents have occurred must still be maintained for one year.

In order to address the storage requirements of increased volumes of routine video recordings and in order to modernize the Government Code, Assemblymember Ken Cooley authored AB 510, which is sponsored by the California Special Districts Association (CSDA). The bill seeks to modernize the Government Code to allow local public agencies to adopt records retention policies designed for modern digital recording technologies, while ensuring the proper retention of any records in which an incident may have occurred. Specifically, the bill allows public agencies to set their own records retention policies for routine digital (video, radio and telephone) recordings, provided they maintain routine monitoring records where incidents may have occurred until the incident is fully resolved. Additionally, the bill specifies that in the absence of agencies adopting their own records retention policy, the current one-year (video recordings) and 100-day (radio and telephone recordings) retention policies would remain in effect.

CSDA has requested that its members consider supporting AB 510. Given the benefit AB 510 would provide the District, staff recommends that the Board adopt a "support" position on AB 510.

## AB 1204 (Rubio, D-West Covina) – Primary Drinking Water Standards: Implementation Date:

AB 1204 is a short, but important bill. The bill would provide that the adoption or amendment of a primary drinking water standard for a contaminant in drinking water that is more stringent that federal standards will take effect three years after the date on which the State Water Resources Controls Board adopts or amends the standard. Additionally, the bill would authorize the State Board to delay the effective date of the primary drinking water standard by up to two additional years when capital improvements are needed to comply with meeting the standard.

The bill is sponsored by ACWA and strives to provide water agencies the time needed to comply with new primary drinking water standards. Staff recommends that the Board adopt a "support" position on AB 1204.

## AB 1486 (Ting, D-San Francisco) – Local Agencies: Surplus Land:

Assemblymember Phil Ting has introduced AB 1486. AB 1486 would revise the rules related to a local agency's disposal of surplus land. Specifically, the bill would revise the definition of "surplus land" within the Government Code and would provide that land owned by a local agency is presumed to be surplus land when the local agency takes action to dispose of it regardless of whether the property is actually considered to be surplus property to the agency.

The bill would also define what actions are considered disposing of land. Of interest to IRWD, the bill would defined the term "dispose of" to include the sale, lease, transfer, or other conveyance of any interest in real property owned by a local agency.

Under AB 1486, prior to a local agency entering into formal or informal negotiations to dispose of real property it owns, the local agency must issue a written notice of availability to low- and moderate-income housing providers, parks and recreations providers and to school districts. This means that prior to leasing any property owned by a local agency, a local agency would need to offer the property for housing, parks, and education uses.

AB 1486 is a reintroduction of a bill Assemblymember Ting ran last year. A broad coalition of local agencies opposed the bill. Given the bill's potential impact to IRWD's real estate investments, staff recommends that the Board adopt an "oppose unless amended" position on the bill and authorize staff to seek amendments, independently or through the coalition, that would protect IRWD's investments.

#### SB 307 (Roth, D-Riverside) – Water Conveyance: Use of Facility with Unused Capacity:

Senator Richard Roth (D-Riverside) has introduced SB 307, which is a reintroduction of AB 1000 (2018), authored by Assemblymember Laura Friedman, and SB 210 (2018), authored by Senator Roth. The bill seeks to prohibit water from the Cadiz Valley Water Conservation, Recovery & Storage Project from being placed into an existing water conveyance facility unless the State Lands Commission found that there would be no adverse effect on the natural or cultural resources. IRWD adopted a "watch" position on AB 1000 and SB 120. Staff recommends that the Board adopt a "watch" position on SB 307 this year.

#### SB 332 (Hertzberg/Wiener, D-San Francisco) – Wastewater Treatment: Recycled Water:

Senator Bob Hertzberg and Senator Scott Wiener (D, San Francisco) introduced SB 332. SB 332 would declare that the discharge of treated wastewater from ocean outfalls is a waste and unreasonable use of water, and would mandate that agencies reduce their ocean discharges by 50 percent by 2030 and by 95 percent by 2040, as compared to average annual wastewater discharges between 2010 and 2020. As currently written, the bill fails to recognize the water use efficiency and high levels of water reuse by agencies like IRWD. IRWD will be working with a coalition of industry associations and reuse agencies to oppose the bill, as currently drafted.

Staff recommends that the Board adopt an "oppose/oppose unless amended" position on SB 332.

#### 2019 State Regulatory Update:

#### State Water Resources Control Board Proposed Recycled Water Policy Amendments:

In May, the State Board released proposed amendments to the "Policy for Water Quality Control for Recycled Water" (e.g. the Recycled Water Policy). The proposed amendments greatly change the policy from being focused on the use of recycled water for irrigation to a more overarching regulatory/policy document that will govern the terms of permits issued to recycled water producers and purveyors.

On June 19, 2018, the State Board held a public hearing to accept oral comments on the proposed amendments to the Recycled Water Policy. Staff participated in the hearing providing comments on the reporting, permitting and overarching policy goals of the proposed amendments. On June 26, 2018, IRWD submitted formal comments on the proposed amendments.

In late fall 2018, the State Board released a revised version of the proposed amendments. The State Board considered and adopted the final version on December 11, 2018. Many of the changes made in the adopted version addressed the District's comments and concerns. One of the outstanding issues that was not fully addressed, however, is how environmentally beneficial uses of recycled water support in-stream flows or natural habitat are classified in the annual reporting recycled water purveyors are now required to make to the State Board. Staff has been working with WateReuse California, the California Association of Sanitation Agencies, and Coastkeeper to seek a solution on the classification.

#### Other Pending State Regulations:

In addition to the regulations discussed above, the following is a list of some of the other state regulations and agency reports staff is monitoring, tracking or planning to engage in over the next three to 12 months. As the next drafts of the regulations or report are released for public review and comment, staff will engage, as appropriate.

The pending regulations and reports actively being tracked include the:

- Building Standards Commission's "2019 California Plumbing Code;"
- DWR and the State Board's implementation of the "Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life" legislation;
- DWR's "The Open and Transparent Water Data Act (AB 1755, Dodd) Implementation Plan;"
- State Board Electronic Annual Report;
- State Board's AB 401 Implementation/Low Income Rate Assistance Report and the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment's "A Framework and Tool for Evaluating California's Progress in Achieving the Human Right to Water;"
- State Board's development of a "Cross Connection Policy Handbook;"
- State Board's proposed "Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Program Regulations:"



## MICHELSON WATER RECYCLING PLANT BIOSOLIDS AND ENERGY RECOVERY FACILITIES CHANGE ORDER, VARIANCES, AND BUDGET INCREASE

## SUMMARY:

Filanc/Balfour-Beatty (FBB) is constructing the Michelson Water Recycling Plant (MWRP) Biosolids and Energy Recovery Facilities (Biosolids Project). The Biosolids Project is scheduled to be extended to June 30, 2020. The services of various consultants are needed to supplement the construction management team of the Biosolids project through this time extension. Additionally, staff has resolved several change requests and recommends approval for Change Order No. 99. Staff recommends that the Board:

- Approve Change Order No. 99 in the amount of \$330,609.60 for items including hardscaping, soil remediation, paving, mechanical and electrical changes, and SCADA programming modifications;
- Authorize the General Manager to execute Variance No. 8 with Black & Veatch in the amount of \$2,865,066 for supplemental construction contract administration, start-up, and commissioning services;
- Authorize the General Manager to execute Variance No. 3 with Arcadis, Inc. in the amount of \$664,138 for supplemental construction inspection, construction management, and document control system services;
- Authorize the General Manager to execute Variance No. 3 with EI&C Engineering, Inc. in the amount of \$835,860 for supplemental process control system (PCS) services, construction management services, start-up testing, and various engineering support tasks; and
- Authorize a budget increase in the amount of \$10,969,000, from \$227,573,100 to \$238,542,100, to the FY 2018-19 Capital Budget for the Michelson Water Recycling Plant Biosolids and Energy Recovery Facilities, Project 04286.

## BACKGROUND:

Construction of the Biosolids Project was awarded to FBB in March 2013 in the amount of \$163,465,940. The Biosolids Project will provide biosolids digestion, dewatering, energy production, and on-site sludge drying. The project includes excavation for subsurface structures; installation of 3,009 foundation piles; three egg-shaped digesters; a state-of-the-art odor control system; a biogas conditioning system and power generation using micro-turbines; a fats, oil and grease receiving station; and new utility services. These facilities are being constructed on the land north of IRWD's existing Operations Center, maintenance shops, water quality laboratory, and warehouse.

## Change Order No. 99

Staff negotiated with FBB and agrees to the labor and material costs contained in Change Order No. 99 in the amount of \$330,609.60. Change Order No. 99 includes the following items:

- Regenerative Thermal Oxidizer (RTO) Stack Bypass Re-route in the amount of \$42,305.48 So that the dryer off-gasses can be treated, the RTO stack bypass was rerouted to the odor control system of the Solids Handling Building. As originally designed the gasses would have been exhausted to atmosphere. This item is for the labor and material to re-route the bypass to the odor control system.
- Additional Soil Remediation on the South Road of Biosolids Site in the amount of \$43,444.97 Upon the recommendation of the design geotechnical engineer, a portion of the South Road of the Biosolids site was over-excavated and re-compacted to provide more stability in an area that has experienced settlement in the past. This item is for the labor and equipment to perform the remediation.
- Additional Base and Paving in the amount of \$21,619.30 An additional area on the south side of the Biosolids site of about 2,900 square feet required base and paving from the original design. This item is for the labor and materials to install additional base and paving.
- Odor Scrubber Recirculation Piping and Pipe Support Modifications in the amount of \$103,308.35 The recirculation piping and pipe support for the odor scrubber needed to be modified. The piping needed to be upgraded to larger sized diameter pipes. More valves, fittings, and appurtenances were also required. This item is for the labor and materials to make the necessary modifications.
- Electrical Modifications in the Control Room of the Solids Handling Building in the amount of \$9,371.28 To meet operational needs, electrical modifications in the Operations Control Room of the Solids Handling Building were necessary. These modifications included additional lighting, receptacles, and power conduits. This item is for the labor and material to make these modifications.
- Modifications to the Acoustical Panels in the Solids Handling Building in the amount of \$14,704.14 Modifications to various acoustical panels in the Solids Handling Building were necessary due to installation of large heating and ventilation ducts directly in front of the acoustical panels. This item is for the labor and material to relocate these acoustical panels to more effective locations.
- New 480 V Power Source for Vacuum System in the Dryer Room in the amount of \$9,995.96 To provide electrical power to the vacuum system in the dryer room, a 480V power source is necessary. The power source was not shown in the Contract Documents. This item is for the labor and material to install the new power source.

- Explosion Proof Duct Smoke Detector in the Digester Control Building Gas Room in the amount of \$25,719.23 An explosion proof duct smoke detector is required in the Digester Control Building Gas Room. This change request is for the labor and materials to install the explosion proof duct detector.
- SCADA Programming Update to the Centrate Treatment Area in the amount of \$38,467.14 This item modifies the control logic to synchronize the operation of the centrate basins so that one basin is accepting flow at all times. This modification makes the system easier to operate and prevents the operator from making an error when setting up the time durations for each phase of the process. This request is for the labor to make the necessary changes to the SCADA programming.
- SCADA Programming Update to Digester Gas System in the amount of \$21,673.75 This item is for programming changes to add backup control based on pressure for the digester gas system in the event of a loss of signal from the level transmitter at the Digester Gas Holder. This backup control enhances the reliability of the digester gas system. This item is for labor to make the necessary SCADA programming changes.

Staff recommends approval of Change Order No. 99 with FBB in the amount of \$330,609.60. Change Order No. 99 is attached as Exhibit "A" and the Change Order Log is attached as Exhibit "B".

## Variance No. 8 with Black & Veatch:

Black & Veatch (B&V) has provided contract administration, construction inspection, and construction management services since 2013. The scope of Variance No. 8 is summarized below:

- Additional Submittal Reviews It is anticipated that 3,600 submittals will be reviewed by the completion of the project. The original estimate was 2,400 submittals.
- Additional Review of Requests for Information (RFIs) It is anticipated that 3,300 RFIs will be reviewed and processed by the completion of the project. The original estimate was 2,500 RFIs.
- Additional Schedule Review
- Claims Review and Dispute Resolution
- Supplemental Onsite Design Team Representative, electrical and instrumentation/controls inspections, and civil/mechanical field engineering
- Electronic O&M Manual Development
- Pre-Start-Up Process Overview Training
- Start-Up Testing Coordination
- Post-Start-Up Services

Black & Veatch staff is being extended on a case-by-case basis based upon its need to be involved on the project on various tasks. Staff has reviewed this staff utilization plan to support project startup and closeout activities. Variance No. 8, shown as Exhibit "C", with Black &

Veatch in the amount of \$2,865,066 is for supplemental contract administration, construction phase, and start-up and commissioning services.

## Variance No. 3 with Arcadis, Inc.:

Arcadis has provided construction inspection, construction management, and document control system services since the start of the Biosolids project. Through Variance No. 3, Arcadis will negotiate and prepare change orders, provide as-needed construction management support, assist with resolving project claims and delays submitted by FBB, and assist in project close-out activities. These services will be provided through June 30, 2020. Arcadis will also provide document control services until June 30, 2020, including assistance with the archiving of vital project documents. Variance No. 3 with Arcadis, Inc., attached as Exhibit "D", is for construction management and document control support in the amount of \$664,138.

## Variance No. 3 with EI&C Engineering, Inc.:

EI&C Engineering has provided technical oversight of the process control system (PCS) development and will continue in this role through June 30, 2020. Additionally, EI&C will provide additional automation staff to support start-up testing when it is anticipated that multiple start-up tests are scheduled simultaneously. Also, EI&C will provide engineering support for air permitting, start-up testing, and other engineering tasks. Variance No. 3, shown as Exhibit "E", with EI&C Engineering, Inc. in the amount of \$835,860 is for supplemental PCS construction management services, start-up testing, development of PCS operations manuals, and associated PCS training presentations.

## Additional Budget:

With the extension of the project to June 30, 2020, an increase in the capital budget for the Biosolids Project is required. Additional budget is being requested to fund the future change orders, consultants, Construction Management staff, legal and claims staff to resolve more complex construction items, Operations and Maintenance staff during start-up and training, landscaping, and the MWRP Construction Trailer and supplies.

The estimated expenses are itemized below:

There is currently approximately \$1,689,000 left in the existing Biosolids budget. Staff is requesting a budget increase of \$10,969,000 to cover the estimated expenses.

## Schedule:

The estimated phasing schedule of the consultants is attached as Exhibit "F".

## FISCAL IMPACTS:

The MWRP Biosolids and Energy Recovery Facilities, Project 04286 is included in the FY 2018-19 Capital Budget. Staff requests a budget increase in the amount of \$10,969,000, for the reasons stated above, as shown in the table below:

## ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE:

The MWRP Biosolids and Energy Recovery Facilities is subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and in conformance with the California Code of Regulations Title 14, Chapter 3, Article 7, a Supplemental Environmental Impact Report, SCH # 2011031091, was certified by IRWD on October 22, 2012. The City of Irvine Planning Commission approved a conditional use permit for the IRWD Biosolids Project on December 6, 2012.

## COMMITTEE STATUS:

This item was reviewed by the Engineering and Operations Committee on March 19, 2019.

## **SCOPE OF WORK**

## BACKGROUND

The Irvine Ranch Water District (IRWD) owns and operates the Michelson Water Recycling Plant (MWRP). New biosolids and energy recovery facilities are currently under construction by Filanc-Balfour Beatty (FBB), the construction contractor. The current FBB Project Schedule Update shows a Final Construction Completion Date of March 1, 2019. However, FBB appears to be showing excessive time for completing their startup activities such that Black & Veatch recommends assuming a Final Completion Date of March 31, 2020 for this variance. This results in a time extension for the contract completion date, from April 2019 (assumed date for Variance #7) to June 2020 (a 14 month time extension). At the request of IRWD Black & Veatch will furnish additional project management; construction administration support; construction field support; electronic O&M manual; and training, commissioning, and start-up services to cover the additional time period and also cover out of scope work requested by IRWD.

## **BASIS FOR VARIANCE**

The MWRP Biosolids & Energy Recovery Facilities Project (Biosolids Project) is currently under construction. The following events have occurred that resulted in this proposed variance for Black & Veatch:

- Contract Time Extension It is anticipated that the project completion date will be extended from the current date of April 2019 to June 2020 (14 month time extension). This time extension directly affects the following scope of work tasks by extending the number of months that Black & Veatch services are required:
  - o Task 1 Project Management
  - Task 2.4 Schedule Review
  - Task 2.7 Claims Avoidance and Dispute Resolution Assistance
  - Task 3.1 thru 3.8 On-Site Design Team Representative
  - Task 3.9 Electrical Inspection
  - Task 3.10 Instrumentation and Control Inspections
  - o Task 3.14 Electrical/Automation Field Engineering
  - Task 3.15 Civil/Mechanical Field Engineering

- Scope Task 1 Construction Phase Project Management (B&V Phase 101) Due to delays by FBB, this task will experience a budget overrun. Assuming a completion date of June, 2020, a budget overrun of approximately \$161,000 is anticipated.
- Submittal Reviews (Scope Task 2.1 B&V Phase 201) The number of submittals (2,776) through October 16, 2017 has significantly exceeded the estimated number of submittals (2,400). A total of 3,600 submittals (including approximately 200 new and 100 record copy submittals) are now anticipated for the project. As of February 8, 2019, the actual expenditures were at approximately 101.4% of the budget allowance and a variance is necessary. Black & Veatch believes that the increase in the number of submittals is primarily due to the large number of re-submittals that have occurred. To date, 1,734 re-submittals have occurred compared with 1,676 initial submittals this represents a very high re-submittal rate of 97% for FBB. B&V assumed a resubmittal rate of about 20% during the scope/fee development for this project and a re-submittal rate of about 20-40% is typical on projects. At the estimated 3,600 submittals we anticipated an overrun of approximately \$225,000.
- **RFIs (Scope Task 2.2 B&V Phase 202)** The current number of RFIs (3,206) has exceeded the estimated number of RFIs (2,500). A total of 3,300 RFIs are now anticipated for the project. As of February 8, 2019, the actual expenditures were at 106.6% of budget allowance and a variance is necessary. Following are several reasons for the number of RFIs exceeding the estimated number.
  - IRWD has initiated a number of owner generated RFIs. This provides excellent documentation but is beyond what we normally experience on our projects.
  - There are a large number of programming/configuration RFIs required for this project due to the very detailed specifications and specific IRWD standards – much higher than a normal B&V project.
  - In some cases, RFIs were submitted by the contractor just to clarify what was in the contract documents or request additional design information and did not represent a design change.
  - The contractor has initiated changes to the work due to his lack of proper coordination of suppliers and subcontractors.
  - The contractor has initiated additional RFIs because he has proceeded at risk with fabrication of some electrical/I&C equipment without complete approved mechanical shop drawings, resulting in revisions.

We estimate a total of 3,300 submittals for the project and a cost overrun of approximately \$87,300.

• Scope Task 2.4 – Schedule Review (B&V Phase 204) – This task has exceeded the budget amount due to FBB delays. Schedule reviews were completed through the end of the anticipated completion of construction in March 2019, we estimate an overrun of approximately \$68,800.

- Claims Avoidance and Dispute Resolution (Scope Task 2.7 B&V Phase 207 The contractor (FBB) has made several claims for extra cost and delays on this project. B&V anticipates these contractor claims to continue throughout this project and we are recommending an increase in the budget for this task to accommodate responding to the anticipated increase in activity by FBB. Also, IRWD has been making requests from Black & Veatch to support the work of the District's third-party claims consultant, HKA. Assuming a completion date of June, 2020, a budget overrun of approximately \$123,000 is anticipated.
- Scope Tasks 3.1 thru 3.8 Onsite Design Team Representative (B&V Phase 301)
   Due to delays by FBB, this task will experience a budget overrun. Assuming onsite representation through the end of September, 2019, a budget overrun of approximately \$276,000 is anticipated.
- Scope Task 3.9 Electrical Inspections (B&V Phase 302) Due to delays by FBB, this task will experience a budget overrun. Assuming a staff on-site through the end of December 2019, and an additional 2 months at the completion of the project, a budget overrun of approximately \$458,000 is anticipated. This was included in draft Proposed Variance #8 submitted to IRWD.
- Scope Task 3.10 I&C Inspections (B&V Phase 303) Due to delays by FBB, this task will experience a budget overrun. Assuming a completion of this task at the end of May, 2020, a budget overrun of approximately \$328,000 is anticipated. This was included in draft Proposed Variance #8 submitted to IRWD.
- Scope Task 3.14 Electrical/Automation Field Engineering (B&V Phase 307) Due to delays by FBB, this task will experience a budget overrun. Assuming a completion date for this task in the end of May, 2020, a budget overrun of approximately \$616,000 is anticipated. This was included in Proposed Variance #8 submitted to IRWD.
- Scope Task 3.15 Civil/Mechanical Field Engineering (B&V Phase 308) –IRWD requested that Black & Veatch provide temporary field inspection services for the period April 26 thru May 18, 2018 while John Walker was on vacation. Ramiro Ojeda has completed this work for B&V at a total cost of \$22,165. This work was previously approved by IRWD and the additional fee will be included in future Variance #8. Due to delays by FBB, this task will experience a budget overrun. Assuming a completion date for this task of August, 2019, a total budget overrun of approximately \$306,000 is anticipated (including Ramiro Ojeda time). This was included in draft Proposed Variance #8 submitted to IRWD.
- Scope Task 4.1 thru 4.2 Electronic O&M Manual Development (B&V Phase 401) - At the request of IRWD, the preventive maintenance lists written for the major process equipment will be replaced with a list of the equipment and links to the vendor operations and maintenance manuals for the equipment within in each chapter. Also, additional appendices will be added to the electronic O&M manuals for items deemed by IRWD staff necessary to put into the electronic manual. These

items include spare parts list from the contractor, electrical shutdown plan, and training PowerPoint presentations. A budget overrun of approximately \$50,000 is anticipated due to out of scope work.

- Scope Task 5.2 Pre-Startup Process Overview Training Due to delays from the contractor, pre-startup process overview training activities have stretched from 2016 to 2019. Since the start of process training, there has been some turnover of IRWD staff and extensive time between training of existing operators. It will be necessary to have repeat sessions with operators over material that have been covered in previous sessions to train new IRWD staff and provide refresher training for the existing IRWD staff. IRWD requested additional services to repeat all process training sessions for all seven milestones due to the 11-month delay by FBB. A budget overrun of approximately \$104,000 is anticipated due to out of scope work.
- Start-Up Testing Coordination (Scope Task 5.3 B&V Phase 503) Due to contractor (FBB) delays, startup coordination is needed to engage the IRWD staff and contractor with startup and commissioning activities. This requires additional monthly meetings, technical transfer sessions, and additional assistance to FBB for startup activities such as combining Milestone 4A/4B and Milestone 5 and reviewing the Milestone 2 System Operational Test document.

Additional process evaluations have been performed that were not included in the original scope of the startup services. These include:

- a) additional process evaluation for digester startup without seed sludge, and
- additional process evaluation for return ammonia loads from centrate treatment.

The process evaluation for the digester startup without seeding was performed using Biowin model to provide information for IRWD staff to establish a plan on whether hauling seed from Orange County Sanitation District (OCSD) would be worth the any extra benefit in commissioning the digesters.

The other process evaluation includes Biowin modelling to predict return ammonia loads from the biosolids return from the centrate treatment to the liquid process. The IRWD staff wanted an estimate of ammonia concentration to determine return stream management strategies that may be necessary to treat the ammonia from the centrate treatment system.

A budget overrun of approximately \$205,000 is anticipated due to out of scope work.

• Scope Task 6.1 – Post Start-up Services (B&V Phase 601) – IRWD requested additional services for the development of ECPs, SOPs, eO&M set-up, additional operations training not identified in other tasks as well as completion of and asset

management tasks. A budget overrun of approximately \$48,000 is anticipated due to out of scope work.

• **Reallocation of Budget** – We are proposing a reallocation of engineering fee from Task 2.5 – Structural Observations (\$995) and from Task 3.11 – Edison Savings by Design Grant Application Support (\$20,198) to Task 4.5 – Asset Management Data Collection (\$21,193). Task 2.5 and Task 3.11 are complete and these tasks may be closed. Task 4.5 experienced a cost overrun and at that time Black & Veatch proposed waiting to see if other phases came in under budget such that an engineering fee reallocation could be implemented. Black & Veatch is proposing to implement this fee reallocation as part of Variance #8. All work is complete for Task 4.5 and after this fee reallocation, this task will be closed.

## SCHEDULE AND LEVEL OF EFFORT

The level of effort has been estimated by projecting expenditures through the end of the new contract completion date of June 30, 2020 (a 14 month time extension) for the tasks identified above – see Attachment A. The assumptions made for these projections are given in the attachment. The cumulative costs for each task on this project are shown for the thirty-three (33) total project tasks. Nineteen (19) tasks are not affected by the time extension since the work effort is the same regardless of the timing of the work. The Associate Automation Engineer will have the following duties:

• Witness the field testing for the Process Control System with live mechanical equipment, local control panels, and instrumentation.


