Matthew 5:33-37

I swear to God I'll be there!

"I swear by Almighty God to tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth."

'I take you....to be my wife/husband....for better, for worse...till death us do part. In the presence of God I make this vow.'

**Read Matthew 5:34a, 37:** "<sup>34a</sup>But I say to you, Do not take an oath at all..... <sup>37</sup>Let what you say be simply "Yes" or "No"; anything more than this comes from evil."

What does Jesus say here about taking oaths? - answer true / false for the following:

- (a) It's ok to swear by God, or the Bible, if the other person is more likely to believe you.
- (b) It's good to make our promises stronger by asking for bad things to happen to us if we don't do what we say.
- (c) It's okay to 'swear' to do something if you hear other people saying that?
- (d) Don't take an oath, or say "I swear". Just speak the truth and keep your commitments.

What reason does Jesus give in v37? Why do you think he says this?
