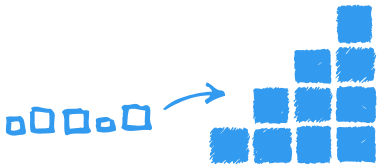

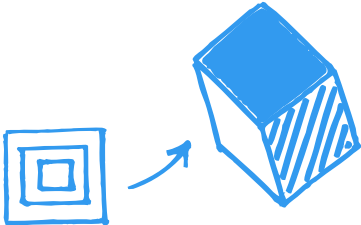

To realize this aspiration, we need to: engage governments and people, coordinate development partners, and mobilize the private sector to:

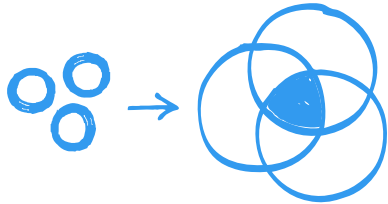
Build: Develop the foundational building blocks for sustainable, technology-led economies

WB background: strong and expanding regional project

- Participating African universities and research centers were rigorously selected with focus sectors aligned with regional priorities (e.g. agri, energy, health, materials, ICT...)
- Access to high quality faculty, researchers, students, and well-equipped laboratories
- Ownership and support by education and finance ministries in recipient countries
- Quality of research administration under M&E framework of the WB project
- Seen as a strong partnership platform by China (Min of Edu., Academy of Science, ...)

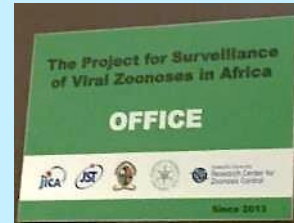
Collaboration with Japan to Date

- 6 centers (in Ghana, Malawi, Nigeria, Rwanda, Tanzania and Zambia) collaborate with Japanese universities.
- University of Zambia and Hokkaido University are joint recipients of SATREPS grant.
- October 2017 – Informed MEXT’s global university project’s target universities on collaboration opportunity with ACE and PASET. A few universities were matched with ACEs and discussing the details of MoUs.
- May 2018 – WB team met Hokkaido University on “study-in-Japan coordinator Project” commissioned by MEXT. Following up on synergies identified.
- Private sector on board and supporting, e.g. DMM

Next Steps

- Study Tour during the week of October 22 to invite interested ACE and PASET universities to deepen partnerships with Japanese universities through MoUs and explore broader collaboration with Japanese companies.
- MEXT can consider use of existing scholarship, research grant and student/faculty exchange schemes to facilitate, broaden and deepen university level partnerships.
