

# Ramstein stands up AGOW at ceremony

The stand up of U.S. Air Forces in Europe's first wing solely dedicated to supporting battlefield Airmen took place during a ceremony Thursday on Ramstein.

The stand up of the 435th Air Ground Operations Wing marks the second of its kind for the Air Force and adds another volume to Team Ramstein's growing legacy. Two groups from the 86th Airlift Wing - the Contingency Response Group and the Air and Space Communications Group - along with the 4th Air Support Operations Group out of Heidelberg, Germany, now form the 435th Air

Ground Operations Wing.

"This is a historic day for Ramstein and for USAFE," said Col. Tom Gould, who took command of the 435th AGOW during the ceremony. "This new wing's capability is certainly one of a kind. From calling in air strikes to opening bases, the capabilities this wing brings to the European and African theater is tremendous."

The wing consolidates the tactical air control-party and battlefield weather specialties of the 4th ASOG, the contingency communications support of the ACOMG, and the expeditionary support to assess, prepare and operate airfields

# Warriors compete for title of Soldier, NCO of the Year

**BAUMHOLDER, Germany** — There was blood and sweat, but no tears, as eight Soldiers from the 21st Theater Sustainment Command battled it out to claim the title of Soldier and Non-commissioned Officer of the Year during a competition held in Baumholder June 28 to July 1.

The competitors arrived at Panzer Kaserne for an equipment layout and transportation to Baumholder, and as soon as they arrived, the competition began. They were given map coordinates to the site where they would set up camp. Once they dropped their equipment, they were taken immediately to the start point for the first event of the competition – the 12-mile ruck march up and down the hilly terrain of the Baumholder Training Area. ## Joining the 'social norming' bandwagon

According to recent data, 75 percent of Soldiers do not drink and drive, 78 percent of Soldiers have not been a passenger in a vehicle belonging to a driver who is under the influence and 95 percent of Soldiers do not use illicit drugs.

Too good to be true some might say, but the data speaks for itself, and research from college campuses in the United States indicate that disseminating this information broadly will lower the risk of incidents related to alcohol and drugs for that population.

Why is this information important and why are our Soldiers so willing to be a part of pushing it out to others?

It is called social norming and utilizes a positive message, solid information and peer counseling to challenge misconceptions about drinking and drug use.

Research from college campuses illus-

trates that peers have the greatest influence on student norms. When peer norms appear to encourage immoderate drinking, consumption goes up.

Regardless of gender, ethnic group, residential circumstance and Greek affiliation, most students believe their peers hold more permissive attitudes about drinking than they actually do.

Likewise, they believe their peers drink more heavily than they do.

The U.S. Army Garrison Kaiserslautern Alcohol Substance Abuse Program and Community Health compared the demographics of our population to that of a college campus one year ago and, with the help of volunteer Lourdes Guidicelli, began working our own social norming campaign called "Stand Up and Be Counted."

Senior leadership from the 21st Theater Sustainment Command and the garrison have led the way with flyers promoting a positive campaign that will lead Soldiers to making the low-risk decision in regards to alcohol and drugs. The program has taken off with public service announcements with celebrity fighters and Soldiers from 5th Battalion, 7th Air Defense Artillery and Criminal Investigation Department promoting what those with highrisk jobs and personalities can and do make low-risk decisions regarding lifestyle.

With the support of the Army and Air Force Exchange Service, Defense Commissary Agency and our senior leadership, you now see social norming posters with familiar faces that are leaders of every rank, race and gender promoting the positive message of low-risk choices.

Help our Soldiers and families protect the things they value most. Send a positive message and "Stand Up and Be Counted."

for air expeditionary forces of the CRG. Both of the groups from the 86th will now perform their mission under the 435th AGOW.

"The 435th AGOW provides these specialized Airmen with a single command and control structure," Colonel Gould said. "By consolidating these units under one wing, we will be able to standardize our organizational processes and streamline how we train, equip and employ our battlefield Airmen."

As part of the redesignation ceremony for the 435th AGOW, the 435th Air Base Wing was redesignated as the AGOW. The 431st Air Base Group was also officially inactivated during an earlier ceremony Thursday. The remaining mission areas of the 435th ABW will merge with the 86th Airlift Wing.

"Realigning our mission under one wing meets the Air Force chief of staff's intent of structuring units by mission," said Brig. Gen. Bill Bender, 86th AW and KMC commander. "Our dual-wing team worked extremely well together – even garnering a dual 'Excellent' rating during our recent Unit Compliance Inspection. We look forward to continuing that great cohesion as we combine our efforts under one wing."

# Garrison welcomes new commander

Lt. Col. Kevin Hutchison took command of U.S. Army Garrison Kaiserslautern July 10 at the Armstrong Community Club on Vogelweh Housing.

He succeeds Lt. Col. Mechelle Hale, who is going to Washington, D.C., to serve with the Army chief of staff for the Installation Management Office as the chief of the Joint Plans Branch.

"I'm looking forward to working with the members of the command, our higher headquarters, the many units and agencies in the area, and our German neighbors to ensure Kaiserslautern stands the ensign for both an Army garrison and German-American community," said Colonel Hutchison, who followed with a similar greeting in German in his speech to the more than 200 German and American dignitaries and guests and garrison Soldiers, civilians and contractors.

Colonel Hutchison comes to the garrison from a joint assignment at NATO in Brussels, Belgium.

The garrison's mission is to provide administrative and logistical support to all U.S. Army military and civilian personnel, their families and organizations in the KMC.

The garrison also coordinates with the Air Force commands and units in Kaiserslautern to ensure operations support and unity effort for the KMC Army forces.

Within the garrison's footprint, there are 83 tenant activities in a 1,100-mile community con-

sisting of 10 Army kasernes.

Col. Robert Ulses, U.S. Army Garrison Baden-Württemberg commander, said during his remarks at the ceremony that Colonel Hale is a special leader.

"Colonel Hale has led this garrison from the front for the past three years, and her infectious optimism and positive attitude has affected all those who come in contact with her," he said.

Colonel Ulses said the garrison has achieved much during Colonel Hale's tenure, including supporting the relocation of 17 Department of Defense, Department of Army and civilian organizations. This translated to more than 770 Soldiers, 18,000 family members and 860 civilians from five other military locations throughout Europe.

Recently, the garrison became the first DOD site overseas to achieve Star Status in the DOD Voluntary Protection Programs Center of Excellence, which is comparable to the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration management systems. In fact, the VPP flag ceremony took place an hour before the change of command.

Another accomplishment Colonel Ulses mentioned was the past three Special Olympics Spring Games the garrison hosted in partnership with the German Polizei Academy in Enkenbach-Alsenborn. Last May's Special Olympics saw the greatest number of participants with more than 800 athletes, 1,500 volunteers and record numbers of spectators resulting in more than 4,000 people attended the event, Colonel Hale said during her goodbye address.

Colonel Hale also talked about the Month of the Military Family and Month of the Military Child events that were hosted for the first time by the garrison and the 435th Air Base Wing.

As garrison commander, Colonel Hutchison will oversee command and control, base operations support, force protection, reception, staging and onward movement in support of contingency operations.

Based on Pulaski Barracks, the garrison also acts as a power-projection platform, deploying and re-deploying Army units, which it has done steadily for the past seven years.

Customer service is the most visible part of the garrison's mission, which enhances the readiness and quality of life within the KMC.

This translates to the battalion's three – soon to be four – child development centers, three chapels and chaplain programs, three libraries, Army Community Service's classes and support programs, four Army clubs and sports and fitness programs including four gyms and fitness centers, and the award-winning live theater program – KMC Onstage.

The garrison provides many other community services also open to the entire community, such as Pulaski Park and Kid's Zone, both located on Pulaski Barracks, and Java Cafe on Rhine Ordnance Barracks.

About 500 civilian personnel and 26 Soldiers are assigned to the garrison in Kaiserslautern.

# Mortuary Affairs Office gets help from Puerto Rican Reserve unit

They perform a mission so sensitive it's hardly ever talked about. Their spotless, sanitized work environment at the 21st Theater Sustainment Command's Mortuary Affairs Office is permeated with sorrow and grief. They are mortuary affairs specialists who share a quiet pride in what they do.

Currently, there are five mortuary affairs specialists from the U.S. Army Reserve's 246th Quartermaster Company assisting the 21st TSC's Mortuary Affairs Office, which is located at Landstuhl Regional Medical Center.

The mortuary affairs Soldiers arrived in Kaiserslautern from Ramey Air Force Base in Aguadilla, Puerto Rico, and despite dreary days, meat-and-potato-based diets and other geographical or cultural peculiarities, they are extremely positive about their three-week stint with the 21st TSC.

"This is a great opportunity for us. We assist the mortuary affairs staff here, but they help us too. We are actually performing mortuary affairs duties, hands-on. This is the real world, no longer just theory or book-learning," said Pfc. Pedro Gonzales, a mortuary affairs specialist with the 246th QM Co.

"It is very sad to actually perform the duties we have trained for. You have to prepare yourself mentally and psychologically to do it," said Sgt. Moises Cordero, a mortuary affairs specialist with the 246th QM Co. "But it is also very rewarding because we do our work with respect and dignity to honor our fallen heroes."

Part of the 21st TSC Mortuary Affairs Office's responsibility is to take care of deceased Soldiers, retirees and Department of Defense civilians. The 21st TSC provides support to the U.S. European Command and some outlying units of U.S. Africa Command spread across more than 37 countries. With such a significant mission, the Reserve unit's augmentation is highly valued.

"The Overseas Development Training team and the 21st TSC truly appreciate the crucial support the 246th QM Co. provides to the command. We began our rotations in January and had units assist throughout the year. As we plan for fiscal

year 2010 and 2011, I can only see that relationship improve and grow," said Lt. Col. Philmore Williams, the operations, training and ODT officer with the 21st TSC's Army Reserve Affairs Office.

Mortuary affairs specialists' duties include the recovery, collection and

evacuation of the remains, establishment of tentative identification, escort and temporary interment. They also inventory, safeguard and evacuate personal effects of deceased personnel.

The other often-mentioned aspect of performing those duties concerns family – with the Army being the family of those who serve and their families.

"The (fallen) Soldiers have sacrificed all, and

we are proud to provide this last service for them. We are honored that we can treat them with the respect and dignity they deserve. They are part of our family," said Spc. Alex Perez, a mortuary affairs specialist with the 246th QM Co. "Their sacrifice was for us too."

Sgt. Omar Alvarez, a mortuary affairs specialist with the 246th QM Co., said it's difficult to know what to do for the families; they really can't help, but can only strive to do the best and most professional job possible.

Unfortunately, being professional does not facilitate the performance of their duties.

"You attempt to separate yourself and focus on the work, but even the most routine tasks never become



routine," Specialist Perez said. "This is our own way to serve our country. Not many people can do what we do. Not many people are prepared to do what we do. There is honor in being able to perform these important duties."

It also takes a great measure of grit right along with a lot of sensitivity and caring to perform the noble duties of what is often termed the hardest job in the Army.

# Late, but first ...

One of the many embarrassments for the United States when it entered World War I on April 6, 1917, was its lack of combat aircraft.

On that day, the U.S. military air arm – the "Army Signal Corps" – had only about 50 aircraft, and none of them were remotely suited for combat.

The result was that, when the American Expeditionary Force arrived in France, it was equipped entirely with French aircraft. But the United States did produce an excellent engine – the large 425 horse power Liberty L-12 water engine – and the U.S. Army Engineering Division began efforts to pair this engine with an indigenously designed fighter.

The most effective fighters at this point of the war were the two seat fighter reconnaissance aircraft - a relatively new type.

The most successful was the British F.2B Brisfit, which, after initial difficulties, had become one of the best fighters of the war. While the Brisfit was large and heavy, it had a powerful engine and formidable armament.

In addition to forward firing guns, it carried one or two .303 machine guns on a mounting firing to the rear. The F.2B was used like a regular fighter to dogfight, and if an enemy got behind the F. 2B, he received an unpleasant surprise from the rear gunner.

The large size of a two seat fighter made it a perfect match for the equally large Liberty engine.

To help with its design, the United States enlisted the aid of French aeronautical engineer Capt. Georges Le Pere, a member of the French aeronautical mission to the United States. Captain Le Pere developed a large (25-foot fuselage and a 41-foot wingspan) two seat biplane fighter powered by the Liberty.

The aircraft was given the awkward name "Engineering Division LUSAC – Packard 11." LUSAC stood for "Le Pere United States Army Combat" and Packard was the name of the company that built it. It is unknown why it was given the No. 11.

Despite its name, when it first flew in April 1918, the LUSAC-11 proved fast and agile with a performance equal or superior to any Allied or German fighter (though it almost crashed its first flight because the pilot forgot to open the main fuel tank valve).

About 3,525 aircraft were quickly ordered, but just as production hit full swing, the war ended in November 1918 and only 30 were delivered. It never went into squadron service. Nevertheless, the basic airframe was highly amenable to a variety of modifications and provided useful service for the fledgling American air arm.

One LUSAC-11, fitted with a modified turbo supercharged Liberty engine, set the world altitude record of 34,507 feet on Sept. 28, 1921, and then reset it again in 1923 and 1926. Another LUSAC-11 won the Liberty Engine Trophy at the October 1922 National Air Races at Selfridge Air Force Base.

Several other variants were developed but never produced. Three were built with a 420 horsepower different engine – the Bugatti 16 – and designated the LUSAC-21s, and three were built specifically for ground attack. Not surprisingly, these also had an awkward name – the LUSAGH (Le Pere United States Army Ground Harassment). Le Pere was not immune to the "triplane madness" that infected many designers in 1917 with the wide publicity given the Red Baron's



Fokker triplane, so he also designed a twin engine triplane reconnaissance/bomber for the United States – the LUSAO-10 triplane (Le Pere United States Army Observation), which used two Liberty L-12As. But with World War I over, the project languished and died and Le Pere returned to France where he continued to develop excellent aircraft.

There is a LUSAC-11 display at the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force at Wright Patterson Air Force Base – a fitting tribute to America's first effective fighter.

## 16th Sust. Bde. holds NCO induction ceremony

**BAMBERG, Germany** — Although the 16th Sustainment Brigade headquarters is currently deployed to Iraq, that didn't stop their noncommissioned officers from welcoming some of the Army's newest leaders into the NCO Corps.

During a formal presentation July 7 at Mohawk Theater in Warner Barracks, the 16th Sust. Bde. rear detachment command held an NCO induction ceremony for 13 newly appointed NCOs who accepted the duties and responsibilities that come with serving as an NCO in the Army.

Commonly known as "the backbone of the Army," the duties and responsibilities of the NCO corps were developed by Baron Friedrich Von Steuben in "Regulations for the Order and Discipline of the Troops of the United States" during the long hard winter at Valley Forge.

The ceremony featured Soldiers in various historical uniforms reciting "The Watch," which describes how NCOs used to be inducted into the corps, the poem "Boots of the NCO," and "A Soldier's Request."

"The Army has really shifted to a speedier pace. Sometimes you just get a plaque and a handshake," said Sgt. William Dubnansky, 223rd Ordnance Company ammunition specialist. "To go through 'A Soldier's Request' and all of that is something that is vital to the Army."

The guest speaker was retired Command Sgt. Maj. George Horvath, who in 1989 was selected as the command sergeant major for U.S. Army Europe and the 7th Army. He reminded the new NCOs of the important role they have in the Army.

"Nothing happens in the Army that a sergeant

isn't involved in, and if it is happening and a sergeant isn't involved then something is wrong," he said. "Our nation requires NCOs who are physically fit and mentally agile. We need NCOs who are tactically and technically proficient in what they do. We demand non-commissioned officers who lead from the front."

After Command Sergeant Major Horvath gave his speech, the inductees recited the "Charge of the NCO," reaffirming their commitment to their Soldiers. For some of the inductees, the fact that 2009 is the Year of the NCO made the induction ceremony more memorable.

"It's an incredible feeling to move up through the ranks like I did and to be able to say that I got my sergeant during the Year of the NCO. It really makes me feel good," said Sgt. Zachary Harding, an awards clerk with the 18th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion.

### Airmen provide presidential support in Moscow

Two H-model C-130s from Ramstein hauled a 17-member presidential support team, 10 portable light carts and a utility truck to Moscow's Vnukovo International Airport July 3 in preparation for President Barack Obama's scheduled visit to the region.

Planning the travel route for the 10-hour round trip flight would normally be a routine task for veteran flyers, however, C-130H Aircraft Commander Capt. Zac Johnson said military aircraft haven't made the trip into Russia's capital city for quite some time.

"When we looked at all our products to prepare for this mission, the last account we had of a crew coming out (to Moscow) was from a DC-10 mission 10 years ago. So nobody knew what to expect," he said.

But once the pair of Hercules touched down at the oldest of Moscow's three operating airports, the 37th Airlift Squadron crew commented that the support was awesome, the facilities were excellent and that help was given where it was needed.

While fuel trucks were being vectored in to top off the planes, Airmen on the presidential support team began pairing with aircrew to unload cargo. Within 30 minutes, the planes were empty and Capt. William Taylor, the presidential support team's detachment chief, began focusing on preliminary coordination for the commander in chief's arrival. It's a mission that Captain Taylor said was "very normal" for members of the 86th Contingency Response Group, but no less special.

"It is definitely awesome to be a part of something that is bigger than just yourself and to also be a part of making history," he said.

The presidential support team, comprised of Airmen representing eight different career field specialties,

brought communications capabilities, ground security for Air Force One, maintenance, air transportation and even an airfield manager who speaks Russian.

Tech. Sgt. Shawn Smith said he studied Russian in both high school and college and had previously traveled to Moscow to conduct a site survey for an air show in 2007.

"I'm excited. This is a high profile mission and a unique opportunity," he said.

The opportunity was also unique for Captain Johnson, a three-year veteran C-130 pilot with

only 17-hours of stick time as the aircraft commander. As the 37th Airlift Squadron transitions from the H to the J-model C-130, the pool of experienced H-model pilots is thinning out. Captain Johnson said that while this increases the workload on H-model aviators, it also creates unique opportunities.

"A year ago in our squadron, you would never see a brand new aircraft commander fly a mission into Moscow, let alone a presidential support mission. I'm lucky I have the chance to do this," he said.

# AIRMEN TEST THREAT RESPONSES

Airmen from six U.S. Air Forces in Europe bases competed in the 2009 USAFE Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear Challenge June 22 through 26 on Ramstein.

The full-spectrum threat response strike teams were tested in six scenarios based on real-world hazardous material events in a rodeo-style competition.

The response teams came from Aviano Air Base, Italy; Royal Air Force Lakenheath, England; Ramstein and Spangdahlem air bases in Germany, along with a combined team from Incirlik AB, Turkey, and Lajes Field, Azores.

"We challenged the participants' knowledge, skills and expertise in executing CBRN response," said Senior Master Sgt. Melinda Patrick, USAFE surgeon general bioenvironmental engineering manager.

The full-spectrum threat response strike teams are USAFE assets that support the entire U.S. European Command.

"The skills used here are vital to EUCOM's mission," said Lt. Col. Wendy Klein, EUCOM command surgeon CBRN planner. "These Airmen give commanders the information they need to make decisions on how to protect people and allow the mission to continue in hazardous material situations."

Airmen on the full-spectrum threat response strike teams used the latest Air Force provided equipment to detect and determine hazardous materials used in a terrorist bombing, dispersal of substances in living areas, a train accident, the bed down of a deployed unit and more that could affect the EUCOM mission.

"The Airmen here demonstrate their teamwork and ability to use the equipment in a time-pressure environment," said Maj. Darrin Ott, chief of the Risk Analysis Branch at the Air Force School of Aerospace Medicine from Brooks City Base in San Antonio.

"We observe the successes and additional requirements to take these lessons back to the school and improve the equipment and training," Major Ott said. "This was a great USAFE initiative that has been replicated across the Air Force."

USAFE began the annual CBRN

challenge in 2005, and the event has since been replicated in other major commands. The top ranked team from Ramstein will represent USAFE in an Air Force-level competition later this year.


"The scenarios are realistic and definitely challenging," said Staff Sgt. Vanessa Cifuentes, an Incirlik-Lajes combined team member. "I've fully implemented my 10 years of training during this event."

"These scenarios are complex and definitely take us outside of the comfort level we have at our home base," said Maj. Steven Lange, the Incirlik-Lajes team leader. "Every team member needs proficiency, but teamwork and communication are just as important on the scene."

The teams respond to an initial incident report for each scenario, but have no idea of exactly what they'll encounter when they begin to investigate, Sergeant Patrick said.

"We've been really challenged to observe and analyze under pressure," said Capt. Edward Walters, the Spangdahlem AB team leader. "We can't get stuck on preconceptions and have to connect each piece of evidence."

"I've really learned not to develop tunnel-vision," said Staff Sgt. Angelo Mejia, a Spangdahlem AB team member. "Using the skills of the whole team has been our

biggest factor in success."

# AFJROTC: Building citizens of character

The quiet atmosphere at Sembach Annex was interrupted this summer by a group of Department of Defense Dependents Shools Europe Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps cadets. They chose to come to the 2009 Summer Leadership School, a school where carefully selected cadets from all over Europe, including cadets as far away as Rota, Spain, and Lakenheath, England, come to enhance several important abilities.

Summer Leadership School is a school modeled after a modified military academy lifestyle. The academic curriculum includes leadership, health and nutrition, military etiquette, drill and ceremony and American and European history. The cadets are also trained in leadership, drill and

ceremony procedures and patriotism.

This year, 87 Air Force cadets, 60 Army cadets, 19 Navy cadets and three JROTC high schools came to SLS. To manage all the cadets, a staff of cadre was

mix of aerospace Army instructors, aerospace Air Force instructors and an Air Force activeduty non-commissioned officer from some of the DODDS Europe JROTC units, and five cadet training officers. CTOs are highly motivated cadets who have previously graduated from SLS and have exceptional leadership qualities. Additionally, a CTO must submit an application and be properly qualified because CTOs live and sleep among the cadet trainees and interact

directly with them.

Daily life for cadets is very busy. CTOs wake the cadets up at 5 a.m. to get ready for the raising of the flags and for physical training.

After physical training, cadets march back by flight to the dorms where they have about 15 to 20 minutes to get ready for breakfast. After breakfast, the cadets' day really kicks off. Flights alternate between doing drill and ceremonies training and academic instruction.

At noon, cadets form up into lunch formation and march to lunch. From 1 to 5 p.m., cadets continue training. Dinner is

served at 5 p.m. followed by sports – volleyball or softball – JROTC style. After returning from sports, cadets have a two hour period that consists of cleaning bathrooms and hallways, straightening rooms, studying and instructor guidance and evaluation. Then at 10 p.m., the CTOs call lights out, and everyone must be in bed, lights off, and no talking.

SLS sports have different rules than normal. Cadets must stand at the position of attention and ask permission to serve or hit the ball. Cadets are also responsible for keeping the correct score and making sure all their wingmen are included in the line-up. The rules and restrictions are in place to help keep the games safe and under control, as well as provide discipline and teamwork. If any rule or protocol is broken, the offending team looses the ball, and in some cases, the other team is awarded a point.

At first, the majority of the cadets struggle with the intensity of the two week school, as many of them at home are not required to keep a spotless room and maintain a strict dress code.

As time goes on, however, cadets start to adjust to the demanding atmosphere and begin to excel. By the end of the camp, many of the cadets love the lifestyle and wish to come back the next year as a CTO to pass on the knowledge and experience that they received.

small break came the next event: night land navigation.

"It wasn't easy. The points were far off, and with the terrain, plus doing it at night, it was pretty challenging. "If they're sick and have to stay at

LRMC or are premature or anything, then they get a Baby Love Quilt," she said.

Guild members said they appreciate having the chance to help out the community.

"Like so many things in the military community, you just want to help wherever you can, wherever there is a need," said Joan Albright, guild member and wife of Army Lt. Col. George Albright, LRMC. "There are so many opportunities and this happens to be one that our quilt guild can do."

The guild does more than just projects; they also build friendships.

"It's our hobby and we all love to do it," Ms. Eatmon said. "You can make a difference with quilts. We want to keep carrying on the tradition of quilting."

Aside from the "stitch and gab" sessions, the guild also offers quilting classes for the beginner quilter to the most experienced. Classes depend on who is teaching and what the student wants to learn.

"Usually, our members teach the classes according to what they know or what they're really good at," she said.

The guild also attends a retreat twice a year where they go to a resort, take their sewing machines and materials and just hang out and sew.

## Cadet finds Reserve unit in Germany

Living and learning in Paris, the City of Lights, a Vermont college U.S. Army ROTC cadet found a home away from home in Kaiserslautern with the U.S. Army Reserve 7th Civil Support Command.

Alexander Nishida says the biggest challenge facing his overseas college education isn't money, it's finding a place to conduct a weekend battle assembly with the Army Reserve.

With hundreds of Army Reserve units spread across the United States, it is usually easy to find one to train with while attending college. But overseas, it is a different story.

"You can't just go anywhere and pull drill," said Mr. Nishida, a Chicago native, who is studying in the Cultural Experiences Abroad program in Paris for a semester.

CEA provides college study abroad programs to U.S. and Canadian students in 15 countries and 28 cities around the world, immersing students in a different culture and building international relations.

Mr. Nishida enlisted in the Army Reserve in his senior year of high school and went through Military Police One Station Unit Training in 2007. He then enrolled at Champlain College in Burlington,

Vt., and joined the ROTC Simultaneous Membership Program offered at the University of Vermont.

Mr. Nishida is assigned to Bravo Company, 1st Battalion/391st Regiment, 4th Brigade, 98th Division (IT), 108th Training Command, from Colchester, Vt. He travels to Germany to conduct his battle assembly with the 7th CSC, the U.S. Army's only Reserve command on foreign soil.

Reserve Soldiers can conduct training with another unit by rescheduling training to meet the requirements of the Army Reserve and maintaining a satisfactory status with their assigned unit. Mr. Nishida said attending 7th CSC battle assemblies gives him academic and military experience while s

military experience while studying abroad.

"I wanted to further understand how the Army and the Army Reserve operate in Germany and Italy," he said. "I feel that experience on a military installation overseas will give me a larger range of experiences to draw from in my career, as a cadet and then in my first years as a junior officer."

Another Soldier can relate to Mr. Nishida's story.

Staff Sgt. Brett McMillan of the 200th Military Police Command at Fort Meade, Md., who studies in Holland, said he had just reenlisted two months before pursuing a master's degree while living in Amsterdam for 11 months.

"I was very glad when my command agreed to let me reschedule training with another Army unit. I used to drive 18 miles to my battle assembly, now it's 500 kilometers to Kaiserslautern," he said. "But it beats flying home every month for battle assembly weekends."



### FREINSHEIM CELEBRATES TOWN WALL FES

The historical wine village of Freinsheim celebrates its annual "Stadtmauerfest," or town wall fest, today through Monday.

A medieval curtain wall and Baroque buildings set the stage for this traditional wine fest. Nineteen food and wine booths will be set up along the historical town wall for a length of 1.3 kilometers. Local vintners, restaurant owners and associations will serve Palatinate culinary specialties and regional wines.

The town wall was built of red sandstone in the 15th century. Originally, it was seven to eight meters high. After the town came under the domination of the electoral palatinate in 1471, the new authorities enforced the current walls. With the iron gate, construction of the fortification came to an end in 1514. Until the beginning of the 19th century, only two gates were leading out of town. Besides the two town gates, the iron gate in the east and the Hain gate in the southwest, about 20 towers were put up within the wall. Today five towers are left. It is known as one of the nicest and most complete town fortification facilities in the Pfalz. For visitors it's worth it to explore Freinsheim with a tour around the town wall, which takes about one hour.

The Stadtmauerfest officially opens at 7 p.m. today on Marktplatz. It starts at noon Saturday and Monday and at 11 a.m. Sunday. Each day it continues until 1 a.m. the following morning. The old part of town is closed

for motorized traffic. Visitors are asked to park at the edge of town where they only have to walk a few steps to get to the center.

To get to Freinsheim, travel on A6 direction Mannheim, take the Grünstadt exit and follow the signs to Kirchheim, Dackenheim and Freinsheim.





A Sembach Annex security forces staff sergeant takes the Air Force's "fit-to-fight" mantra to another level when he climbs into a cage to compete in the fast-paced, grueling sport of mixed martial arts.

Anthony Durnell, assigned to the 786th Security Forces Squadron as an instructor at the Regional Training Center, ran his unbeaten record to 7-0 as a professional fighter after pummeling Cedric "Crazy Eyes" Jouvet of France to win the God's of War Lightweight Championship belt July 11.

Durnell entered the cage to chants of "U-S-A" from the roughly 500 in attendance at the event hall in Baumholder and proceeded to dismantle the Frenchman with his wrestling and punching power. The fight was stopped by the referee at two minutes and 49 seconds of the first round due to a technical knockout.

The beaten Jouvet didn't seem to have an answer for Durnell's non-stop pressure, but did attempt a leg-lock submission from his back after being taken down to start the fight.

"I studied him a lot before the fight, and knew he was a very accomplished grappler," Durnell said. "He had my leg locked good and I heard my ankle pop, but I wasn't going to stop for anything."

Jouvet also thought he had the submission locked in good, but gave his opponent a lot of respect for getting out of it and finishing the fight.

"I thought it was tight, but (Durnell) stayed in good position and didn't panic," Jouvet said. "Then he hit me with a good elbow to my head and dazed me. It was all over after that."

The end came quicker than most expected, including Durnell.

"I thought it would go longer. Maybe two or three rounds," he said. "We always train for five five-minute rounds with a big emphasis on cardio. You don't ever want to be the guy on the bottom with nothing left in the gas tank during a fight. To prepare for the fights, Durnell said he trains with the best in the KMC.

"There's nothing we'll see in the cage that we haven't seen in practice, so that allows us to go into the fight fully prepared, both physically and mentally," he said.

That preparation is something Durnell has been building on since he was 7 years old and studying Shotokan karate. He later added wrestling and a little judo to his arsenal while growing up. After entering the Air Force, he also learned to box, and carries the confidence he's gained from training and competing to his job as a security forces instructor.

"The training and competing really helps build confidence in your abilities," he said. "Not just your abilities in the ring, but in performing as a non-commissioned officer. I feel that if I can get in a cage and fight, I can be a confident NCO and leader."

Durnell uses that confidence to help teach and train others too.

"It's contagious," he said. "We have a lot of people come out and train with us just for fun and as another way to help their PT scores.

Durnell's Team Catacomb also had two other fighters compete on the card that night, both also assigned to the 786th Security Forces Squadron and making their professional debut.

Brandon Kilfoyle entered the cage to fight Benjamin Cigliutto, also from France, and after getting the better of a brief exchange on their feet, Kilfoyle took the Frenchman down. Kilfoyle looked for a couple of submissions and used his ground-and-pound to force Cigliutto to give up his back.

After taking more than a dozen unanswered punches, the referee stepped in to stop the fight at three minutes and 19 seconds of round one.

The other first-time fighter was Bryan Onderdonk, who, unlike

Durnell and Kilfoyle, had no idea he'd be fighting when he arrived with the other members of Team Catacomb. Another fighter didn't show up, so the promoter asked Onderdonk if he wanted the fight.

"I was nervous at first, but when you're offered an opportunity like that, you have to take it," he said. "Fortunately, I was prepared and have been training with a great team."

Onderdonk's opponent, Igor Montes of Germany, came out throwing some strong strikes, but Onderdonk quickly scooped him up, slammed him to canvas and unleashed a brutal ground-and-pound that left the German bloodied, but still determined.

Montes made it back to his feet only to be slammed once again and after a few more punches, the referee was forced to stop the fight via technical knockout.

In total, Team Catacomb walked away with three wins, zero defeats and a championship belt.
