Land Valuers Licensing Act 1978

Land Valuers Licensing (Remuneration) Notice 2013

Made by the Commissioner with the approval of the Minister under section 25 of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice is the *Land Valuers Licensing (Remuneration) Notice 2013.*

2. Commencement

This notice comes into operation as follows —

- (a) clauses 1 and 2 on the day on which this notice is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the notice on the 14th day after that day.

3. Terms used

In this notice —

assessment includes a reassessment;

valuation includes a revaluation.

4. GST and disbursements

(1) In this clause —

GST has the meaning given in the *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999* (Commonwealth).

- (2) The remuneration specified in this notice
 - (a) is inclusive of any GST that is applicable; and
 - (b) does not include disbursements.

5. Maximum remuneration

Except as otherwise provided in clauses 6, 7, 8 and 9, the amount specified opposite a service set out in Schedule 1 is fixed as the maximum amount of remuneration for that service.

6. Maximum remuneration - historic valuation

If a valuation of land by a licensed valuer is as at a date 3 years or more before the date on which the licensed valuer received instructions to perform the valuation, the maximum amount of remuneration fixed for that service is 1.25 times the maximum amount of remuneration specified opposite that service in Schedule 1 item 1.

7. Maximum remuneration - by agreement or appointment under *Commercial Tenancy (Retail Shops) Agreements Act* 1985 or as determinator

The maximum amount of remuneration a licensed valuer may charge when acting under an agreement or appointment under the *Commercial Tenancy (Retail Shops) Agreements Act 1985* section 11(3), or as a determinator, is fixed at \$406 per hour or part of an hour for time spent on the assessment or valuation if —

- (a) a licensed valuer does not consider that the assessment or valuation is adequately covered under Schedule 1 item 3(f) or (g); and
- (b) the client to be charged has given prior written approval to the remuneration being determined under this subclause.

8. Maximum remuneration - where service not adequately covered by this notice

Other than in the circumstances referred to in clause 7, the maximum amount of remuneration a licensed valuer may charge for time spent on the assessment or valuation is fixed at \$358 per hour or part of an hour if —

- (a) the licensed valuer does not consider that the assessment or valuation is adequately covered under Schedule 1; and
- (b) the client to be charged has given prior written approval to the remuneration being determined under this clause.

9. Maximum remuneration - experienced licensed valuer

(1) In this clause —

experienced licensed valuer means a licensed valuer who has:

- (a) at least 10 years demonstrable experience as a licensed land valuer; or
- (b) been admitted as an Associate, Fellow or Life Fellow member of the Australian Property Institute as a Certified Practising Valuer (or its equivalent status) for at least 10 years; or
- (c) been admitted as a member of the Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors for at least 10 years as
 - (i) a Chartered General Practice Surveyor; or

- (ii) a Chartered Valuation Surveyor; or
- (iii) a Chartered Commercial Property Surveyor.
- (2) The maximum amount of remuneration an experienced licensed valuer may charge for services specified in Schedule 1 items 3, 4, 5 and 7 is fixed at 1.35 times the amount specified in those items if the client to be charged has given prior written approval to the remuneration being determined under this clause.

10. Scope of maximum remuneration

- (1) The maximum amount of remuneration specified in Schedule 1 item 1 is, subject to this notice, chargeable in respect of each piece of land concerned.
- (2) For the purposes of charging remuneration, 2 or more lots in an existing or proposed subdivision are to be taken to be separate pieces of land if a plan of subdivision is furnished or available.
- (3) In subclause (2) —

lot includes any residue remaining after subdivision of the land concerned.

11. Joint valuations

If 2 or more licensed valuers jointly value, or assess the rental of, land, each of those licensed valuers may charge the maximum amount of remuneration fixed in respect of that valuation or assessment specified in Schedule 1 item 1 or 2.

12. Maximum remuneration for ascertainment of partial interests

A licensed valuer who —

- (a) values a partial interest in land; or
- (b) assesses a partial interest in the rental of land,

may charge the maximum amount of remuneration fixed in respect of the full valuation or of the full amount of the assessed rental of the land specified in Schedule 1 item 1 or 2.

13. Revocation

The Land Valuers Licensing (Remuneration) Notice 2010 is revoked.

Settlement Agents (Remuneration) Notice 2013

Made by the Commissioner with the approval of the Minister under section 44 of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice is the *Settlement Agents (Remuneration) Notice 2013*.

2. Commencement

This notice comes into operation as follows —

- (a) clauses 1 and 2 on the day on which this notice is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the notice on the 14th day after that day.

3. GST

(1) In this notice —

GST has the meaning given in the *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999* (Commonwealth).

(2) The amounts of remuneration specified in Schedules 1 and 2 are inclusive of any GST that is applicable.

4. Maximum remuneration - real estate settlement agents

The amount specified opposite a service set out in Schedule 1 is fixed as the maximum amount of remuneration that a real estate settlement agent is to receive for rendering that service.

5. Maximum remuneration - business settlement agents

The amount specified opposite a service set out in Schedule 2 is fixed as the maximum amount of remuneration that a business settlement agent is to receive for rendering that service.

6. Revocation

The Settlement Agents (Remuneration) Notice 2008 is revoked.

CO301*

Wildlife Conservation Act 1950

Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2013

Made by the Minister for the Environment under section 14(4) of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice may be cited as the *Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2013.*

2. Interpretation

In this notice —

"taxon" includes any taxon that is described by a family name or a genus name or any other name or description.

Note: The plural form of "taxon" is "taxa".

3. Declaration of specially protected fauna

For the purposes of the Act, all taxa of the fauna —

- (a) specified in Schedule 1, being fauna that is rare or likely to become extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
- (b) specified in Schedule 2, being fauna that is presumed to be extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
- (c) specified in Schedule 3, being birds that are subject to an agreement between the government of Australia and the governments of Japan, China and the Republic of Korea relating to the protection of migratory birds, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection; and
- (d) specified in Schedule 4, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection, otherwise than for the reasons mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).

4. Revocation

The Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2012(2) is revoked.

Wildlife Conservation Act 1950

Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2013

Made by the Minister for the Environment under section 23F(2) of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice may be cited as the *Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2013*.

2. Interpretation

In this notice—

"extant" means known to be living in a wild state;

"protected flora" means any flora belonging to the classes of flora declared by the Minister under section 6 of the Act to be protected flora by notice published in the *Gazette* 9 October 1987, at p. 3855;

"taxon" includes any taxon that is described by a genus name and any other name or description.

Note: The plural form of "taxon" is "taxa".

3. Rare flora

Subject to clause 4, protected flora—

(a) specified in Schedule 1, being taxa that are extant and considered likely to become extinct or rare and therefore in need of special protection; and

(b) specified in Schedule 2, being taxa that are presumed to be extinct in the wild and therefore in need of special protection,

are declared to be rare flora for the purposes of section 23F of the Act throughout the State.

4. Application

Clause 3 does not apply to those plants of a taxon of protected flora specified in Schedule 1 or 2 that have been planted for any purpose other than such plants that have been planted for the purpose of conservation of that taxon and in accordance with approval given by the Director General.

RACING AND WAGERING WESTERN AUSTRALIA (PLAYER FOB RULES) NOTICE (NO. 2) 2013

Made by Racing and Wagering Western Australia under section 61 of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice is the Racing and Wagering Western Australia (Player FOB Rules) Notice (No. 2) 2013.

2. Commencement

These rules came into operation on 12 June 2012.

3. Interpretation

In this notice—

"the Act" means the Racing and Wagering Western Australia Act 2003;

"the Rules" means the rules described in clause 4, adopted by Racing and Wagering Western Australia.

4. Rules adopted under section 61 of the Act

- (1) In a meeting held on 31 May 2012, Racing and Wagering Western Australia resolved—
 - (a) to adopt and operate under rules relating to a jointly operated fixed odds wagering system in accordance with section 61(2) and (4) of the Act.
- (2) A copy of the rules adopted was published for public information in the *Special Gazette* of 12 June 2012 at pp. 2413-2441.
- (3) Further amendments to the Rules were adopted by resolution of the Board dated 11 October 2012 and 25 March 2013 and published for public information in the Gazettes of 23 October 2012 at pp. 5058-5060 and 5 April 2013 at pp. 1490-1491.

5. Changes to Rules published for public information (section 61(6)(c) of the Act)

- (1) Further amendments to the Rules were adopted by resolution of the Board dated 30 August 2013.
- (2) Those further amendments to the Rules are published in the Schedule to this notice for public information, as required by section 61(6)(c) of the Act.

Schedule 1—Amendments to Adopted Rules

163. Delete the words "For leading Victorian or Interstate team finals are included. Wagers will be settled with the team advancing the furthest in the finals as deemed to be the winner. Should two teams be eliminated at the same stage, the winner will be the team that finished highest on the AFL ladder at the conclusion of the regular season."

Rule 277 (was 279)

277. Delete the words "If a game is postponed and rescheduled to occur again within 48 hours of the original start time, all wagers stand. If the rescheduled time is more than 48 hours after the original start time, all single wagers are void and wagers refunded, while affected multiples are recalculated excluding that leg."

Insert the following—

Postponed or Abandoned Matches

- (a) With the exception of situations in clauses 277(b), (c) and (d), an unplayed, postponed or abandoned match that is played on a different day to that originally scheduled will be made void for settling purposes. The only exception to this will be if the game is subsequently played within two days (local time) of the originally scheduled kick off time. For example, if the game was postponed at 20:00 on Tuesday bets will stand provided the match starts prior to midnight on Thursday (local time). If void matches reduce an accumulator, the bet will be settled on the remaining selections. Under no circumstances will the judgement of any 'Pools Panel' be accepted as a result.
- (b) Should a match be abandoned prior to the completion of 90 minutes of play, all markets will be void, unless a winning market has already been established prior to the abandonment eg. first goalscorer, time of first goal, half time result etc.
- (c) If a match is suspended or abandoned after the start and the remaining minutes are played at a later time on the same day or at a later time on either of the following two days (local time), settlement will be based on the score at full time, once the remaining minutes have been completed, otherwise bets will be void.
- (d) A match that is moved to accommodate TV schedules will not be treated as a postponed match for the purposes of this rule and all bets will stand.

278. Soccer Handicap Betting Rules

(a) General

- i. Predict the result when one of the competitors receives a 'start' and this is added to their final score. The 'start' is known as the 'handicap spread'.
- ii. All handicap betting is based on the result at full time. Extra time does not count. Where there is any doubt as to whether 'traditional' handicap betting or

- iii. Injury time counts.

(a) Goals x Cards

- Predict both the range containing the number of goals scored and the range containing the number of cards issued.
- ii. If either selection is unsuccessful the bet is a loser.

- ii. a deemed refusal or other time period as agreed under sub-paragraphs (b) or (c); and
- iii. a determination under sub-paragraph (d) being served on the applicant.
- (b) Subject to sub-clause(c), an application for planning approval is deemed to have been refused if a determination in respect of that application is not served on the applicant by the local government within 60 days of the receipt of the application by the local government, or within such further time as is agreed in writing between the applicant and the local government.
- (c) An application for planning approval which is the subject of a notice that requests comments or submissions as considered under 4A xiii and 4A xiv is deemed to be refused where a determination in respect of that application is not served on the applicant by the local government within 90 days of the receipt of the application by the local government, or within such further time as is agreed in writing between the applicant and the local government.
- (d) Despite an application for planning approval being deemed to have been refused, the local government may issue a determination in respect of the application at any time after the expiry of the period specified in sub-clause (b) or (c), as the case requires, and that determination is as valid and effective from the date of determination as if it had been made before the period expired.
