Liebfraumilch

Region

The grapes for our Liebfraumilch are grown in Rheinhessen, the largest of Germany's 13 wine regions. The vineyards are planted on rolling hillsides covering a wide area between the two rivers forming its east and west borders – the Rhein and the Nahe. It neighbors the three other wine regions making up the Rhein valley: the Rheingau, located on the opposite side of the Rhein river along its northern border, the Nahe, situated to the west across the Nahe river, and the Pfalz region, just to its south.

Liebfraumilch must originate from one of these aforementioned growing regions – Rheinhessen, Pfalz, Nahe or Rheingau.

Origin

Liebfraumilch literally means "milk of the blessed Mother", whose origin dates back to the start of the 19th century and the vineyards cultivated by the monks of the Liebfrauenstift Church in the town of Worms on the Rhine river.

Production of Liebfraumilch is carefully defined. The wine must be pleasantly fragrant and semi-sweet, with at least 70% of the final blend coming exclusively from Müller-Thurgau, Riesling, Silvaner and Kerner grape varieties. The balance may include other indigenous varieties grown in the region.

Liebfraumilch must have a Qualitätswein (QbA level) declaration, as approved by the regional Board of Agriculture, and, thus, carry the A.P. number on the label.

Tasting notes

Fresh and fruity with a soft fragrant aroma, medium-bodied, with a pleasant finish. Quite delicious and harmonious with abundant notes of pear and apricot followed by a hint of honey in the finish.

Food pairing

Delicious chilled anytime or served alongside a cheese platter with freshly sliced apple and pear. Pairs especially well with pungent cheese, such as Munster, Grayson or Limburger. Also try with smoked pork chops or honey-baked ham.
