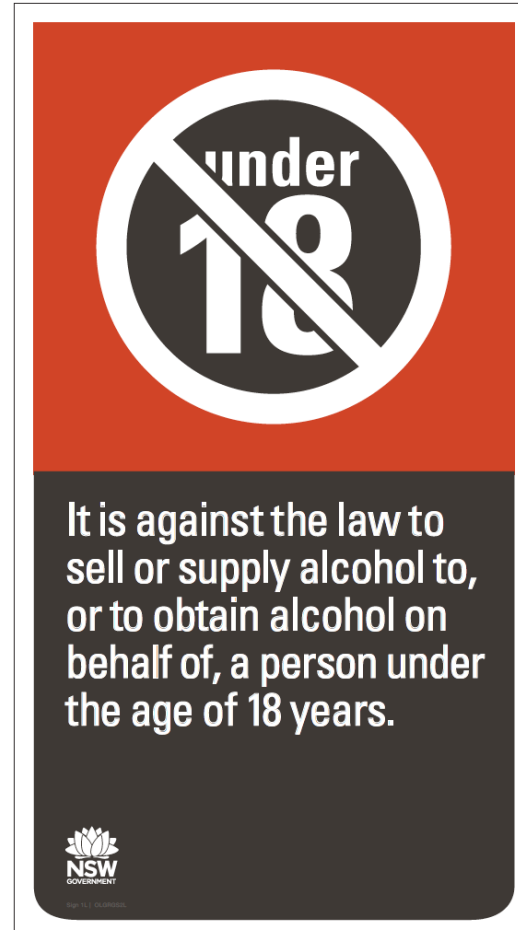

Under 18s not to be served alcohol – all premises

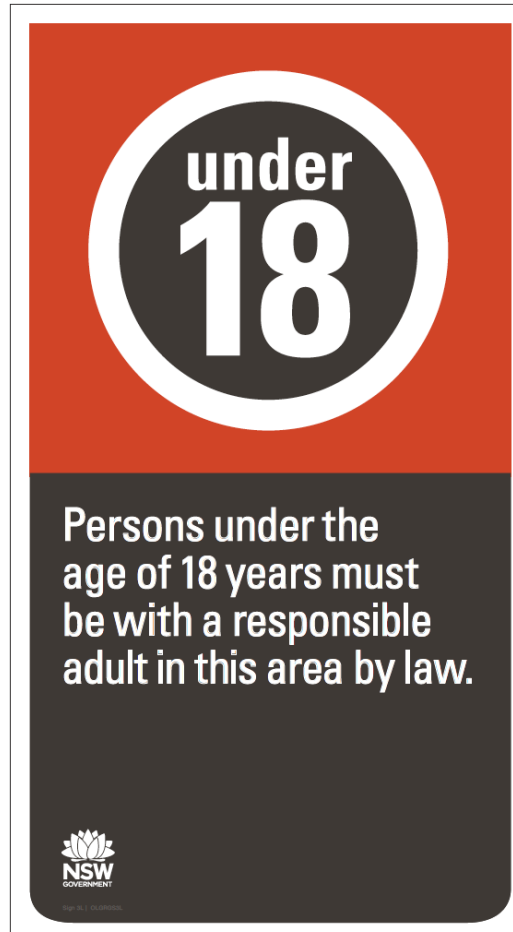

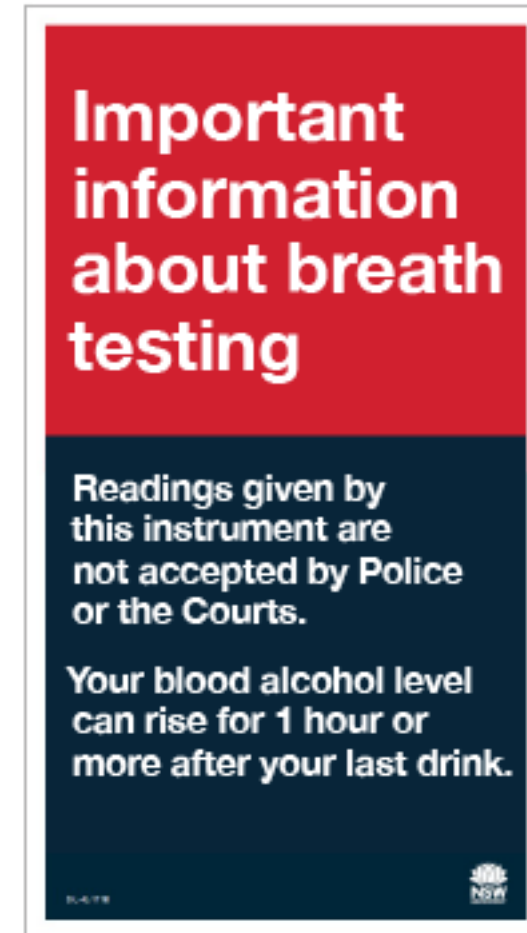

Mandated liquor law signs:

Sign 6L – small bars (unless authorised)

No one under 18 is allowed on these premises during liquor trading hours. It's against the law.

Mandated liquor law signs:

Sign 7L – small bars (if authorised)

Minors allowed on premises until ... as long as they are with a responsible adult.

Mandated liquor law signs:
Notice for online / web-based
liquor businesses

Old wording (acceptable
until 18 July 2021):

- ***Liquor Act 2007***
It is against the law to sell
or supply alcohol to, or to
obtain alcohol on behalf
of, a person under the
age of 18 years.

New wording (mandatory
from 19 July 2021):

- No Alcohol can be sold or
supplied to anyone under
18. It's against the law.

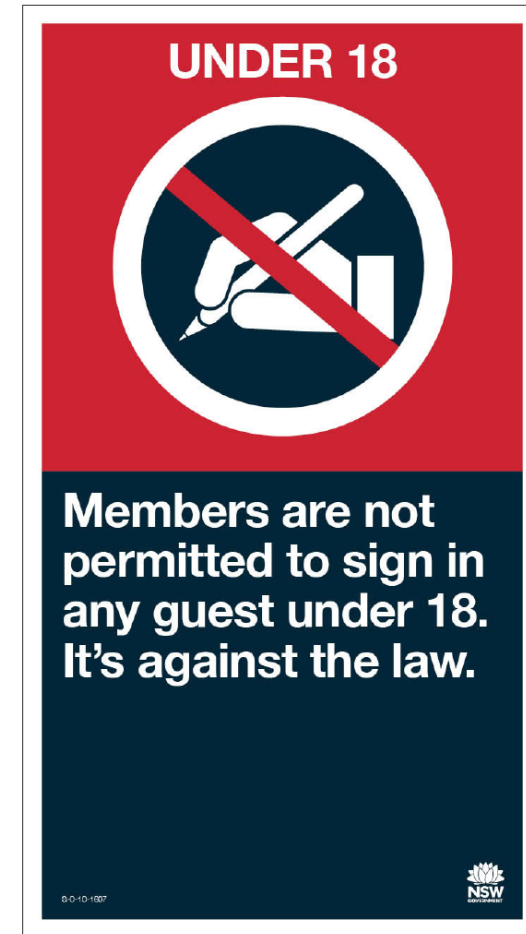

UNDER 25?

Be prepared to show ID

The **ONLY** acceptable forms of evidence of age in NSW are a current:

- Driver or rider licence or permit issued in Australia or another country
- NSW Digital Driver Licence
- Australian or other passport
- NSW photo card
- Proof of age card (issued by an Australian state or territory except NSW)
- Keypass (over 18) identity card issued by Australia Post

Note: Only the Keypass (over 18) identity card can be accepted as evidence of age.

If you're under 18, you can be fined up to \$2,200 if you enter a venue illegally or obtain/consume alcohol
