Mud Pond is located south of Jim Pond. Jim Pond Brook flows in at the northeast end from Jim Pond and exits the south end flowing south into the North Branch of the Dead River. The pond's shoreline is lightly developed.

Water quality in Mud Pond is marginal for coldwater gamefish. Most of the pond is warm and shallow with only a small area of cooler water over five feet deep. A few brook trout and salmon stay in the pond seasonally, but move into the brook or Jim Pond during warm weather. Spawning areas are inadequate to maintain any fisheries

and the pond is not stocked, so fishing opportunities are limited.

Mud Pond is accessible via logging roads off the King and Bartlett Road. The pond is open to fishing in the summer with the use of live fish as bait being prohibited. It is closed to icefishing.
