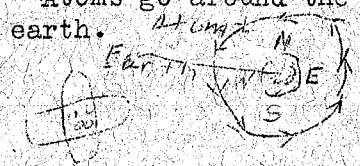

STRAWBERRY MAGIC PIE

Sprinkle one envelope plain gelatin on $\frac{1}{2}$ cup water in pan. Stir over low heat to dissolve. Add 1 cup strawberry preserves, 2 tbsps. lemon juice. Beat in 1 cup sour cream. Pour into baked pie shell. Chill. Serves 6.

DeLuxe Crust: To 1 package pie crust mix, add 2 teaspoons sugar. Mix in 1 beaten egg. Form into 2 balls; roll out; fit into 8" pie pans; prick with fork. Bake at 425° for 8 minutes; cool.

PATRICK HENRY

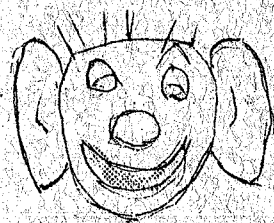
