

MASBO P-CARD PURCHASES REPORT

P-Card purchases for four months of the rebate year (April – July) totaled over \$7.8 million with 129 school districts and special education cooperatives participating in the program. OPI SCHOOL FINANCE DIVISION

- <u>Understanding Montana School Finance</u> provides a basic understanding of Montana school finance and school district budgets.
- Montana School Bus Standards and Resource Materials are effective July 1, 2018 and include standards for the new Type E bus.
- <u>FY2019 Student Count for ANB Reporting</u> contains important information about the fall (October 1, 2018) and spring (February 4, 2019) enrollment counts. <u>Read the entire memo.</u> Some important items to note:
 - ✓ Ensure that student enrollment, attendance on official count dates, aggregate hours, and student demographic information is accurate and up-to-date in the AIM system. You may need to coordinate with others in your district to make this happen.
 - ✓ In MAEFAIRS, you will import the minimum enrollment information from the AIM system necessary to determine your district's Average Number Belonging (ANB) for the 2019-20 budget year.
 - ✓ An explanation of the "10-day rule" is on page 4. If you need to request approval of a variance to the 10-day rule, you must submit your request to the OPI *prior to the count date*.
 - ✓ Run a report that shows the American Indian students submitted in the fall enrollment count and review it for accuracy. The deadline to correct information is December 31, 2018.

INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE

- <u>Withholding Calculator</u> The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act changed the way tax is calculated. The IRS encourages taxpayers to perform a quick "paycheck checkup" by using the Withholding Calculator to check if they have the right amount of withholding for their personal situation. You may want to notify your employees.
- Publication 15, Employers Tax Guide explains your tax responsibilities as an employer.

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WHAT IS VERTIGO?

VER - TI - GO (n.)

A sensation of whirling and loss of balance, associated particularly with looking down from a great height, or caused by disease affecting the inner ear or the vestibular nerve; giddiness.

synonyms: dizziness - giddiness light-headedness loss of balance loss of equilibrium - spinning/swimming of the head - fear of heights acrophobia mirligoes wooziness - sturdy

CAUSES

Vertigo is often caused by an inner ear problem. Some of the most common causes include:

BPPV. These initials stand for benign paroxysmal positional vertigo. BPPV occurs when tiny calcium particles (canaliths) clump up in canals of the inner ear. The inner ear sends signals to the brain about head and body movements relative to gravity. It helps you keep your balance.

Meniere's disease. This is an inner ear disorder thought to be caused by a buildup of fluid and changing pressure in the ear.

Vestibular neuritis or labyrinthitis. This is an inner ear problem usually related to infection (usually viral). The infection causes inflammation in the inner ear around nerves that are important for helping the body sense balance.

Less often vertigo may be associated with:

- · Head or neck injury
- · Brain problems such as stroke or tumor
- Certain medications that cause ear damage
- Migraine headaches

SYMPTOMS

Vertigo is often triggered by a change in the position of your head.

People with vertigo typically describe it as feeling like they are:

- Spinning
- Tilting
- Swaying
- Unbalanced
- Pulled to one direction
- Other symptoms that may accompany vertigo include:
- Feeling nauseated
- Vomiting
- Abnormal or jerking eye movements (nystagmus)
- Headache
- Sweating
- · Ringing in the ears or hearing loss

TREATMENTS

Treatment for vertigo depends on the cause and severity of symptoms. During a vertigo attack, lying still in a quiet, darkened room may help to ease any symptoms of nausea and reduce the sensation of spinning. Some may be advised to take medication.

Medications include corticosteroids, methylprednisolone, antibiotics, amoxicillin, vestibular suppressants, and Medizine

Self care can be done at home with exercises like Epley maneuver, Brandt-Daroff exercises Cawthome Cooksey exercise and exercises involving eye movement. It is also helpful to manage stress, as anxiety can make the symptoms of vertigo worse. Breathing exercises, head massage, using a slightly raised pillow, and getting enough sleep are some at home care options.
