Installation

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Please consult the Installation Guide located on the Ovation Installation Media (USB Memory card) for details on the hardware and software installation procedure and Authorization Key registration process.

RAVENNA users will have to install the NET-MSC-GBEX1 PCIe Ethernet card provided by Merging Technologies. TURN YOUR COMPUTER OFF (shut down then switch the power off). Next plug the NET-MSC-GBEX1 card into one of the PCI-Express bus slots on your computer and turn the power back on. The NET-MSC-GBEX1 card will only be operational once the MassCore runtime is installed. Refer to the Ovation Installation Guide for more details.

- To install the Ovation software insert the Ovation Installation Media the installation program should auto-start.
- To install MassCore launch the MT Security Settings, go to the MassCore page and install the MassCore RunTime (a MassCore base key is required along with MassCore 64bit and a RTX64 3.0 key). Refer to installation guide for more details.
- Warning: Make sure that the Windows 10 version you are installing onto is supported by Ovation, as often updates can break the compatibility. All details in the separate Ovation installation guide.

Ovation 9 installation notes

- Ovation 9 runs on the new Ovation 9 keys as of the Release Candidate
- Ovation 9 comes with the same MassCore RTX64 v3.7.0.4983 as Ovation 8.0.5 HotFix
- The Ovation 9 installer comes only as a 64bit version (64bit OS)
- Before you perform a Windows 10 update on a system already running a MassCore version it will be important for users to remove MassCore from the MT Security MassCore tab prior to performing a system update. Details below.
 Take note that when selecting uninstall MassCore you will need to reboot your system as the

Note #1: We highly recommend users to defer the Windows updates, so that it does not harm your system <u>here for details on how to defer updates</u> Windows 10 users should never update to Beta Windows version or major new updates before making sure they are supported by Merging.

Note #2:

Users wanting to update to Windows November 2019 update (1909) must follow the procedure here <u>https://confluence.merging.com/pages/viewpage.action?pageld=60031028</u> *Users that apply Windows updates must refer to the Merging Compatible Windows updates* <u>here</u> *Once you have updated your Windows 10, follow the Ovation 9 and MassCore installation.*

Note #3: Windows 10 Update 2004 not compatible with MassCore-RTX64 3.7. Do not update

- SSK-HUD-RTX owners can have Ovation 7, 8 and 9 MassCore key stored on their dongle and go from a system to the other using their SSK-HUD-RTX
- SSK-HUD-RTX owners should be aware that the Hasp driver 7.80 is not compatible with MassCore/RTX64. Refer to the procedure here:

- A new Cloud Security (dongle-less) is available as of the Ovation 9
- must perform a "Save Special as v12.0" in order to open such project in v12.0
- The VB Plugins (VS3) are no longer installed along Ovation as of the version 9 they come with a standalone installer. Download and run the VB Plugin – VS3 installer after having installed Ovation. https://confluence.merging.com/display/PUBLICDOC/VB+Plugins+%28VS3%29+standalone+installer

Native Installation Notes:

- Ovation 9 requires new keys as of the Release Candidate.
 Warning: Users with v8 keys will not be able to run Ovation 9.
- Ovation 9 can be installed on either Windows 7– 64bit or Windows 10 64 bit
- It is necessary to remove the previous Ovation and Pyramix version, if there is one, from the Windows Programs and Features, and then reboot your system before installing Ovation 9

- Follow the Ovation Installation Guide for all details Download and run the VB Plugins-VS3 installer after having installed Ovation.
- RAVENNA ASIO v12 > is mandatory to update to firmware 3.9.4 and higher and vice-versa.
- ANEMAN installer is not included in the Ovation Installer. Please download and install the latest ANEMAN in order to manage and monitor your AoIP devices from <u>http://www.merging.com/products/networked-audio/aneman</u>

MassCore Installation Notes:

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- Refer to the Ovation 9 Installation Guide for installation procedure and details on the specific BIOS settings and system configuration.
- Ovation 9 uses the same MassCore RTX64 v3.7.0.4983 as Ovation v8.0.5 HotFix
- Ovation MassCore users need a RTX64 3.0 key in order to Install and run MassCore. See with your Merging Sales Partners.
- It is necessary to remove the previous Ovation and Pyramix version, if there is one, from the Windows Programs and Features, and then reboot your system before installing Ovation. Take note that when selecting uninstall MassCore you will need to reboot your system as the uninstallation is completed during the system reboot Unless you are planning to update your Windows 10 it is recommended to first remove MassCore before performing the update. In such case follow the procedure document https://confluence.merging.com/pages/viewpage.action?pageId=60031028
- After installing Ovation 9 MassCore users might need to uninstall their previous MassCore from the MT Security setting, MassCore Tab, depending on the previous Ovation version you were running. If there is an older version present you will be warned and required to reboot before updating to the latest version.
- If your Ovation system never had a MassCore version before, users will have to install the new MassCore version from the MT Security Settings > MassCore tab. A valid MassCore RTX64 -3.0 key is mandatory.
- Users running MassCore 64bit will not be able to move their license to another system (or the same system after a Windows re-installation) unless first making this demand through Merging keys@merging.com Please justify the reason of your system migration or reinstallation as the RTX64 key is not meant to be frequently renewed. If Merging cannot follow up in a quickly enough (in case of emergency or during weekends) then please contact the Interval Zero (RTX) Sales team sales@intervalzero.com Note: MassCore/RTX 64bit keys are linked to the system/hardware. MassCore users can have their MassCore/RTX 64bit keys stored on a separate Dongle instead of having it linked to a unique system. Refer to the Merging option SSK-HUD-RTX.

Ovation V9 New Features

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New: Native Audio Engine multi-threading support.

Improved performance to the Ovation and Pyramix Native Engine now bases on a multi-threading architecture.

The native audio engine will now use multiple threads to process the plugins and the audio input/output. The number of threads that the audio engine runs on is configured by a mechanism that will decide the optimal number of threads. If, however you would like to change the Native Multi-Threading engine configuration a registry keys can be made available on demand for the duration of Ovation 9 and Pyramix 25th Anniversary beta cycle.

New QLM Cloud based security as of the beta2

A new security has been implemented for new users needing to run Pyramix, Ovation or VCube without a Merging SafeNet Dongle. This QLM Soraco based security implementation is currently at its early Beta stage. Only if you absolutely need such a solution should you contact keys@merging.com or qa@merging.com for a test key set. Note: SafeNet keys cannot be transferred to QLM security model for a chosen release. This process can only be done for now at the Upgrade stage.

Configuring OSC:

- To send OSC commands an UDP Streamer IP Port must be defined in the Settings > Application Settings > General > IP Connections and referred to in other settings like Player Units and Cue Properties
- To receive OSC commands an UDP Receiver IP Port must be defined in the Settings > Application Settings > General > IP Connections and referred to in other settings like Controller Units and Cue Properties

- In the Settings > Application Settings > Player Unit settings, a new OSC Options section has been added:
 - Check the Send Cue Status messages to this port button if you wish Cue Status related message to be sent to this Player Unit port, like Cue Fire, Cue Stop, Cue progress, etc... See the OSC Dictionary for details
 Note: OSC Dictionary the included in the Ovation Installer package.
 - Check the Send Mixer Status messages to this port button if you wish Mixing Console Status related message to be sent to this Player Unit port. The current position of most controls of the mixing console are sent in real-time to the port if enabled. See the OSC Dictionary for details
 - If the **Send Mixer Status messages to this port** button is checked, the **Remap to:** Combo box allows for choosing a remap scheme so a selection of Mixer Status messages are **remapped to another OSC Dictionary**.
 - If the selection is **None**, all Mixer Status messages are sent as described in the **Ovation OSC Dictionary**.
 - If the selection is Flux::SpatRevolution, the Fader, Solo, Mute and Panner messages are remapped to the Flux::Spat Revolution OSC Dictionary scheme. All other messages are sent following the Ovation OSC Dictionary.
 - Note: This allow working offline on 3D panning automation in Ovation and map the automation to some external spatializers later on when available.
- In the Settings > Application Settings > Controller Unit settings, a new OSC section has been added:
 - Check the **Dispatch received /Server messages from this port** button if you wish messages beginning with /Server to be executed. These messages allow for remote controlling the whole Ovation application like any other supported remote control protocols like MIDI, HTTP, GPI/O, etc... Please refer to the Ovation User Manual Appendixes for details on remote control commands. Please check Ovation **OSC Dictionary** for details on the /Server messages.
 - Check the **Dispatch received /Mixer messages from this port** button if you wish messages beginning with /Mixer to be executed. This allows remote controlling the Ovation Mixing Console from any OSC controllers. Please check Ovation **OSC Dictionary** for details on the /Mixer messages.
 - Check the Dispatch received /CueMapping messages from this port button if you wish messages beginning with /CueMapping to be executed. This allows mapping directly OSC messages to Cues. Please check the Cue Properties REMOTE CONTROL: IP / OSC Command section below. Please check Ovation OSC Dictionary for details on the /CueMapping messages.

Sending OSC Commands:

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- In **Cue Properties** the IP Command section has been renamed **IP / OSC Command**
- Select an IP Command Output Port that is configured as UDP Streamer (see Configuring OSC above)
- In the Command Format row select OSC
- In the Fire, Pause or Stop Command row simply type any OSC Command, like /rock/is/a/drug
- Other types of OSC Commands, like Cue Status or Mixer Status messages are automatically sent if enabled in the **Player Units settings** (see **Configuring OSC** above)
- **OSC Automation messages** are automatically sent when a OSC Automation Cue is triggered. See **OSC Automation** below.

- Markers can now send IP or OSC Commands
- A field named "Marker IP/OSC Command" has been added in the Cue Properties Markers section for the Selected Marker
- Simply type an IP or OSC command line in this field and it will be sent to the Command IP
 Output Port defined in the Cue Properties > IP/OSC Command section of the Cue containing
 the Marker

Receiving OSC Commands:

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- In Cue Properties the REMOTE CONTROL: IP Command section has been renamed REMOTE CONTROL: IP / OSC Command
- Select an IP Command Input Port that is configured as UDP Receiver (see Configuring OSC above)
- Make sure the IP Port above is configured to Dispatch /CueMapping messages in the Controller Units settings (see Configuring OSC above)
- In the Command Format row select OSC
- In the Fire, Pause or Stop Command row simply type any OSC Command, like /rock/is/a/drug. External devices sending a message to Ovation to trigger this cue will have to send the following OSC message: /CueMapping/rock/is/a/drug
- For receiving other types of OSC Commands like /Server or /Mixer messages please refer to the **Configuring OSC** section above

OSC Automation:

- In **Cue Properties** there is new **OSC Automation** section
- Select an OSC Automation Output Port that is configured as UDP Streamer (see Configuring OSC above). This port will be used to send any recorded OSC Automation
- Right-click on the Cue and select menu **Start Recording OSC Automation**. A blinking red dot with the OSC Automation logo will appear on the Cue.
- Now Fire or Audition that Cue. Any OSC messages entering on any port configured as UDP Receiver will be recorded in that Cue while the Cue is playing.
- Multiple OSC automation record passes can be performed on the same cue, one after each other. Just stop the Cue and Fire or Audition it again. The last recorded OSC Automation pass can be undone at any time using the Cue > Undo command.
- When done, right-click on the Cue and select menu Stop Recording OSC Automation.
- When the Cue is now Fired or Auditioned **any recorded OSC messages** are sent to the IP port selected in the **OSC Automation Output Port** row.
- The **Timing Mode** row gives to options: (Not implemented yet, currently set to Absolute)
 - \circ $\,$ Absolute: Any recorded OSC Automation is played back with the same timing it was recorded
 - Relative to Cue Length: Any recorded OSC Automation is played back relatively to the Cue Length. In other words the OSC automation can be stretched or squeezed in time by changing the cue length.

Cue Display:

- Cue containing OSC Commands display the IP Command logo
- Cue containing OSC Automation display the IP Command logo and a grey version of the Mixer Automation logo

Cue Menu:

• Added a new menu in the Cue menu and right-click menu:

• Add Cue > Record Automation as New Cue

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- This function adds a new cue ready for recording Mixer automation
- Added a new menu in the Cue menu and right-click menu:

 - Add Cue > Record OSC Automation as New Cue
 This function adds a new cue ready for recording OSC automation
 - First available IP port enabled for outputting IP is selected

New Atmos Connect Support

Atmos Connect:

11 May 1

- Support for Dolby Atmos Renderer has been implemented
- Currently only supporting Dolby Atmos Mastering Suite and Production Suite.
- Version 3.4.0 is the currently recommended version.
- Original Atmos RMU is not supported for now

Atmos Connect operation:

- Right-click on the Pyramix or Ovation mixing console and go to menu Settings > Atmos Connect...
- In the Atmos Connect dialog enter the IP address of the computer running the Atmos Mastering or Production Suite
- Click the Connect button
- The log window should display a line like: 192.168.3.99:53039->192.168.3.89:4001: connected

Audio Connection:

- It is then assumed that the 128 first outputs of the Mixing Console are routed to the Renderer through any audio transport available, like:
 - Using MassCore or RAVENNA ASIO to a Hapi/Horus then through MADI to another MADI interface connected to the computer running the Renderer
 - Using a Dante card installed in the PC running Pyramix/Ovation to a Dante interface in the computer running the Renderer
 - Using MassCore or RAVENNA ASIO directly to a RAVENNA/AES67 driver running on the computer running the Renderer
 - Currently Dolby only certifies the two first solutions with a MacOS version of the Renderer.
 - Merging has successfully tested the third solution with a Windows version of the Renderer running on the new Merging Audio Device driver. Please contact us if interested in this (beta only for now) solution.

Beds and Objects mapping:

- Once connected to an Atmos Renderer the Mixing Console will regularly receive the Input Configuration currently active in the Renderer and display all the channels naming and numbering in the console output patches, both in the main mixing console UI in the Masters Output section and drop-down menu and in the Route page Masters Output section.
- Patching from Pyramix/Ovation to the Renderer is then made very easy and verbose:
- Objects busses:
 - Pyramix/Ovation Masters Outputs of Objects Busses must be patched to any Renderer Objects. They will be displayed in Green in The Renderer Room Display when actual audio comes through or when they move.

- The Pyramix/Ovation Divergence parameter is mapping to the Atmos Objects Size parameter.
- If the Object Bus is disabled in the Pyramix/Ovation UI, then the objects in this bus are removed from the Atmos Renderer and the objects are rendered internally in the Pyramix/Ovation beds.
- Note: This support is equivalent as what can be seen in other workstations.

Beds busses (Pyramix/Ovation General Mixing Busses):

- Pyramix/Ovation Masters Outputs of any General Mixing Busses (except Objects Busses) can be patched to any Renderer Beds. In this case no indication is visible in the Renderer, only the actual audio signal will be displayed in the Renderer channel input display.
- Pyramix/Ovation Masters Outputs of any General Mixing Busses (except Objects Busses) can be patched to any Renderer Objects. In this case the Renderer Object is used as a Virtual Speaker, is made visible in blue in the Renderer Room Display and is positioned in the space at the static and predefined position for that speaker depending on its Channel Typing.
- Note: Wide Left and Wide Right speakers can be patched as Virtual Speakers Objects only. They have no equivalent in any Atmos Beds and must be mapped as objects.
- Note 2: Any Top Speakers must be patched as Virtual Speakers Objects too. Although the "official" 7.1.2 Atmos Bed contains two Top channels, these channels are Surround only Top Speakers, meaning that any Top/Front or Top/Rear signal can't be differentiated and will be rendered fully from Front to Rear. For this reason, the only way to properly differentiate Top/Front, Top/Side and Top/Rear speakers is to map them as Virtual Speakers Objects using Atmos Connect.
- Note 3: Other Speakers that have an "official" channel in the Renderer Beds (L, R, C, Ls, Rs, Sl, Sr) can be mapped either as Beds Channels or as Virtual Speakers Objects. The final result may differ from the actual rendering of the Atmos Mastering/Production Suite and the final render in Theatres or Home. This is subject to experimentation.
- Note 4: LFE must always be mapped to a Beds channel.

New Atmos Speaker Sets:

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In order to properly support recently released Dolby Atmos for Music speaker sets (9.1, 9.1.2, 9.1.4, 9.1.6) Merging had to reorganize the list of speakers channel types.

- Wide Left and Wide Right have been added to the list
- Surround Left Center and Surround Right Center have been suppressed from the list
- Dolby Atmos 9.1, 9.1.2, 9.1.4, 9.1.6 speaker sets are now properly supported
- Auro 7.1.4, Auro 13.1 and THM 12.2 speaker sets have been slightly modified, however are still supported



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REMOTE CONTROL: General MIDI Command

MIDI Command Input Port Click in the field to drop-down a list of available ports.

Fire Command Click in the field to reveal the down arrow.

Pause Command Click in the field to reveal the down arrow.

Stop Command Click in the field to reveal the down arrow.

For each of the commands clicking on the down arrow offers the choice of **<None>**, **<Clear last incoming messages>** or a list of the last 10 commands received on the specified port to select the required one. None removes the existing mapping and Clear last incoming messages clears the command list.

Note: Before attempting remote control of Cues in this way check the Controller Settings

in Settings > Application Settings > Controller Units > MIDI.

In order for direct MIDI Command mapping to work for the given physical or logical MIDI port the option **Enable**

direct Cue mapping of MIDI messages from the selected Virtual MIDI Port in the General Midi (GM) section

must be checked. Commands coming from the given physical or logical MIDI Port will be seen in the **MIDI** Command

dialog (down arrow) as coming from the selected **Virtual MIDI Port** at the top of the MIDI settings page. This enables the physical MIDI port to be changed easily without having to redo the entire mapping).

Note: A useful possibility is to be able to map Note On to the Fire Command and Note

Off to the Stop Command to emulate the Hot Keys Press Play/Release Stop mode.

The MIDI learn command below was removed.

REMOTE CONTROL : IP Command

IP Command Input Port Click in the field to drop-down a list of available ports.

Command Format Click in the field to drop-down the choice of **Hexa**decimal, **ASCII** or **OSC**.

Fire Command Click in the field to reveal the down arrow.

Pause Command Click in the field to reveal the down arrow.

Stop Command Click in the field to reveal the down arrow.

For each of the commands clicking on down arrow offers the choice of **< None>**, **<Clear last incoming messages>** or a list of the last 10 commands received on the specified port to select the required one. None removes the existing mapping and Clear last incoming messages clears the command list.

Note: Before attempting remote control of Cues in this way check the **Controller Settings** in **Settings > Application Settings > Controller Units > IP**.

New: Mixer Automation:

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- Mixing Console Automation can now be directly recorded into Ovation
- Right-click on a Cue and select the menu **Start Recording Automation**
- Now **Fire** or **Audition** that Cue. **Any Mixing Console movements/changes** will be recorded in that Cue while the Cue is playing.
- Multiple Automation record passes can be performed on the same cue, one after each other. Just stop the Cue and Fire or Audition it again. The last recorded Automation pass can be undone at any time using the Cue > Undo command.
- When done, right-click on the Cue and select menu **Stop Recording Automation**.
- Mixing Console Automation can still be recorded and edited in Pyramix and sent to Ovation using the File > Publish to Ovation command


- Mixing console General Aux/Group Busses Send Gain now allowed to go up to +12dB.
- When send value is above 0 dB both the dB text indicator and slider turns to light red.

Bus Trims

- Mixing console General All Busses Trim Gain now allowed to go up to +20dB.
- When trim value is above 0 dB the dB text indicator turns to light red.
- Double click on any trim value reset to Mute if clicked on left side, or 0dB if clicked on right side

Once one creates a custom bus, it is now possible to *Save Room* and *Load Room* into another bus from the same project without re-creating it all. You can also export/import it into/from another PMX or Ovation session.

Plugin Engine Notice:

The plugins engine Core distribution is done automatically for optimal performance. The total Core load of the Strips plugins will be processed first, followed by the total Core load of the Bus plugins. The engine is sequentially performing those two processing tasks. Meaning that a high Core load on the Strips plugins side is not summed with a high Core load on the Bus plugins side.

Changing a designated Core load to another one is not possible (unless modifying the Mixer configuration) and in no way would it change the total sum of processing passed to the engine for the chosen plugins.

About the Plugins Distribution Core Reading:

We measure the time duration of the plugin itself. Time to process Audio Frame / Duration of the plugin itself * 100 = Load for a single plugin. We then compute the multiple plugins (on a chosen Strip or Bus by example) and we calculate the summation of those.

Despite not yet having a complete recall of IO Connections it is possible on certain setups to recall the Presets store in the device (Horus, Hapi, Anubis) that holds one end of the RAVENNA connections and at the same time recall the ANEMAN save connections that holds the other connections end. *Warning: It is strongly advised that before recalling connection that users clear the existing connections.*

Windows Firewall:

The Windows Firewall can block communication between MassCore and Horus. We recommend users to disable the Public Network Firewall
