As many of you know, I've been counseling since 1997, and I must admit that it's my first love. I'm built for it. When my retirement officially begins on April 8, 2024, my plan is to shift my priorities into more of what I love. Some of you know, that I do some work for our Texas District church workers and their families. I'm actually the Director of Congregational & Worker Care for the District, and I'm delighted that President Newman is planning to use me more in that role.

So, as you can tell, I have a plan (I hope it's God's plan, too!).

There's still a ton of work to do before April, so let's not slip into a slower gear. It's a great day, as we serve together!

### A Word From Pastor Lee

#### What is "Church?"

On the first Sunday of October, during children's time, I asked students a question. I asked, "What is church?" Their answers in early service were, "One weekend, Jesus, Jesus is Lord, Messiah, where I learn about the Gospel, the Lord, Jesus died for us, and where we learn about Jesus. Their answers in late service were, "A place where Christians gather together to worship God, God, the house of God, and Jesus coming down from the ceiling." One student said, "I think of you." I said, "I think of you too!" Now when we think about the word, "church," we probably think about our beautiful Messiah Lutheran Church. Maybe we think of singing and praying as well. Maybe we think of something beautiful like our steeple, our stained-glass windows. Or maybe you think about people you worship with on

Sundays and/or Wednesdays. But the Apostle Paul in Ephesians describes church differently. He says in chapter four verses four and five, "There is one body and one Spirit – just as you were called to one hope when you were called – one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all." Now, that is not a description of a building or a place. God's Church is you. You are His Church. You are a part of the Body of Christ, united together as a family. This is a family that shares the same belief in Jesus, with one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. That is quite a different definition of the church than maybe you first thought.

Did you ever use hand gestures and repeat the phrase as a child, "Here's the church and there's the steeple. Open the door and see all the people?" The church is us, fellow believers, joined together as a Body, with Jesus as the Head or the Leader. When we gather together for worship, it is around Jesus and His Word, together with our family. This is why it is so important that we are gathered together in church and that we read and hear His Word. As we practice our faith, we are both receiving Jesus and His Word and then going out into the world. We are being equipped with God's Word and then carrying it out as we live as God's family.

The Apostle Paul also writes about what it looks like to be the church. He says in Ephesians 4 verse 16, "From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work." That is what we do. We grow together. We build each other up in love. That is why it is so important that we continue to worship Jesus together. A family wants to be together all the time.

In the near future, our church, Messiah Lutheran, will expand our campus through the construction of the new Life Center, where many more people will be able to be gathered together around Jesus and His Word together. God will continue to equip His Church, His family, as we grow together, all to His glory. I am so thankful for our Sunday mornings, for our Sunday School hour, and for every moment that we are gathered as God's church family. Let us continue to grow together and to build each other up in love. God bless you all, Messiah Lutheran Church Family! -Pastor Lee

Spotlight on Messiah's Tranquility Prayer Garden/Columbarium

<u>FEATURED PLANTLIFE-</u> DRUMMONDS SKULLCAP - The name "Skullcap" comes from the flower's resemblance to a head covering. Scutellaria is a flowering plant family in the mint family, and skullcap is its common name. The skullcap plants are easy to grow and prefer partial shade to full sun. Make sure the soil is well-drained, and water it moderately. Its evergreen mounding form only gets 6 to 10 inches tall, so it looks right at home as a filler tucked into small bare spots in well-drained garden beds.

This small perennial wildflower is found naturally in sandhills, pine flatwoods, and upland mixed forests, as well as along marsh and swamp edges, along sandhill slopes and Lutheran prayer gardens. Flowers bloom late in the spring and summer. Honey bees are attracted to a variety of flowers, but they seem to have a particular fondness for skullcap. This herbaceous plant is native to North America, and its small blue flowers are a favorite of bees. In fact, skullcap is often used as a bee pollen supplement, as it is rich in nutrients that are beneficial to bees. -Randy Konkel

#### COMFORT DOG MINISTRY



We say goodbye to one of our faithful team members. Lois McCulloch (shown here in October 2018) was one of our first Ministry partners on the Comfort Dog Ministry team. Lois entered her eternal rest on October 6. She became a member of Messiah Lutheran church in 1964. Since then. she has served in many different ministries and volunteered countless hours for various projects. It was our pleasure and privilege to work with her in the Comfort dog ministry, and she will be greatly missed!

#### What is the future of the Comfort Dog ministry at Messiah?



Did you know from the time we apply for a 'replacement" dog, the wait is approximately 3 years?

Triton is now 6 ½. We noticed at the annual conference this summer the dogs eternally deployed in the last several years the 'average' age of ministry dogs service was about 9 years. Messiah can't get in line for a replacement UNTIL we have a Top Dog and Caregiver in place. The Top Dog oversees the ministry team, communicates with LCC and other Top Dogs about the ministry, etc.. The dog lives with the caregiver and they are responsible for the care of the dog. (All expenses are reimbursed).

If we were to receive the replacement dog before Triton retires, the new dog would shadow Triton on all visits to establish itself with the current places he visits and then when it's time for Triton to retire the replacement then carries on the ministry work.

We are asking for Messiah members to think, pray and talk about this ministry. If the above positions mentioned are not for you perhaps you know someone within the church who might be a good fit for work in this ministry.
