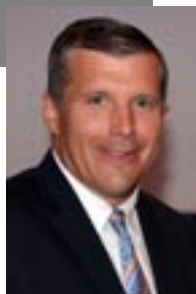

VIKINGS SAIL AGAIN IN D3

Nate Hall and Garrett Stevens knew what they were taking over when they were announced as co-coaches of the Dundee wrestling team before the 2023 season.

Longtime coach Tim Roberts did not leave the cupboard bare when he decided to retire. His Vikings program had won five straight MHSAA Division 3 team titles and was littered with talented, powerful wrestlers.

Hall and Stevens proved to be the right picks to take over the legendary program, as they helped coach the Vikings to their sixth-straight title, and 14th overall.

And Dundee did it in its usual impressive fashion, with a 60-18 win over Whitehall in the 2023 Final at Wings Event Center in Kalamazoo.

"The well was not dry, and don't wreck it," said Hall, whose team finished duals at 19-2. "We didn't change much. We have been around the program long enough, we had a great idea of what was taking place."

Which is?

"The commitment of the families, that is 100 percent why this program is so successful," Hall said. "I am not chasing kids down to have them wrestle. I'm chasing them trying to keep up with them."

And that is exactly what the Vikings' three opponents were doing all weekend in Kalamazoo – chasing down Dundee's talent.

In the Final, the Vikings were down 12-0 after two pins by Whitehall. After that, Dundee won 11 matches in a row, seven straight by pin.

Freshman Haydn Nutt began with a pin in 3:09. Nutt was one of six freshmen who took to the mat for the Vikings, and all six ranked among the top 10 in their respective weight classes by *Michigan Grappler*, including Nutt, the state's top-ranked 106-pounder in Division 3.

"We started the year with 13 freshmen, and I can't say enough the way our program has developed those kids," Hall said.

It helps when you have a senior class of defending state champions leading the way: Braeden Davis at 132 pounds, Kaden Chinavare at 138 and Aiden Davis at 157.

Braeden Davis went 3-0 for the weekend and helped Dundee defeat Hart in the Quarterfinals 64-15 and Constantine in the Semifinals 59-16.

He was most impressive in the Final, when he won by fall in 15 seconds.

DIVISION 4

Hudson 58, Bronson 12

The Hudson wrestling team is never afraid of the big stage. In fact, the Tigers thrive on it.

Hudson claimed its second-straight Division 4 team championship Saturday at Wings Event Center with an impressive 58-12 win over Bronson in the Final, 58-12.

The Tigers have won 10 team titles in head coach Scott Marry's 35 years leading the program. Marry said aside from a lot of hard work, it's a simple formula.

"We love each other – I love my kids, and they love me," Marry said. "I love my coaching staff, and when you wrestle out of the environment like that, it settles in and it's really powerful."

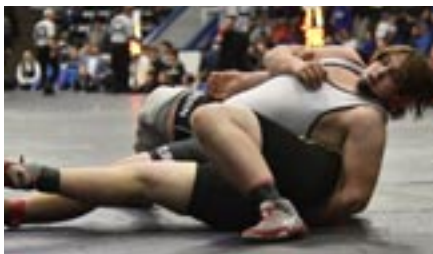
After falling behind 6-0, the Tigers ran off a string of nine straight wins. And among those nine straight wins, Hudson had seven pins.

Starting the streak was senior heavyweight **Aidan Rackowski** (above) with a pin in 2:44.

Pinning their opponents is a consistent theme for Hudson at the Finals. During the Tigers' 62-18 win over Iron Mountain in the Quarterfinal, 51-12 win over Martin/Climax-Scotts in the Semifinal and the championship victory over Bronson, Hudson had a total of 17 pins.

"We just work on a lot of subconscious brain work in the room," Marry said, "Visualization and creativity. And that manifests itself; it's powerful. Believe it or not, kids nowadays really do want to learn."

The 17th and final pin of the weekend for Hudson came from senior Logan Sallows at 190 pounds.

DIVISION 2

Lowell 42, Goodrich 18

It's been a decade of dominance for the Lowell wrestling team. The Red Arrows secured their 10th-consecutive Division 2 Finals championship in 2023 with a 42-18 win over Goodrich.

"It's amazing, and I can't really put it into words," Lowell coach R.J. Boudro said. "One is a feat in itself, and to win a state championship is special. For our guys to do it 10 years in a row ... these seniors were in 3rd grade the last time we didn't win a state championship. It's crazy."

The title also was the 13th overall for the Red Arrows.

Freshmen Cody Foss (113) and Logan Dawson (126), and sophomore Jackson Blum (132) all recorded pins at their respective weight classes in helping Lowell to a commanding 28-3 advantage.

The second-ranked Martians (32-1) came into the Finals unbeaten, but couldn't end the unprecedented run by the Red Arrows.

It was the sixth runner-up finish overall for Goodrich.

"We've been state runner-up to them four of the last five years, and it's frustrating," Martians coach Kenneth Sirignano said. "We knew what we were up against, and we knew it was going to be a big challenge."

Lowell advanced with wins over Bloomfield Hills Brother Rice in the Quarterfinal and Gaylord in the Semifinal. Goodrich reached Saturday afternoon by defeating Monroe Jefferson and Plainwell.

DIVISION 1

Detroit Catholic Central 41, Hartland 31

The Detroit Catholic Central wrestling team had grown tired of being second best.

After two straight runner-up finishes, the Shamrocks (28-2) returned to the top in Division 1 after a 41-31 victory over Hartland.

And what did Shamrocks coach Mitch Hancock do to motivate his team to finally get over the hump?

He reminded them of their past shortcomings.

"The first day of practice I put a picture up of the runner-up trophy from last year all over the locker room," Hancock said. "Over the water fountain, it was everywhere. They weren't too happy about it, so we left it up for a few months and then they got rid of it."

"I think these guys were pretty disappointed the last two years, and we thought we were close."

Senior Dylan Gilcher, a three-time individual champion wasn't fond of his coach's motivational tactic.

However, it provided all the inspiration they needed.

"It was horrible," said Gilcher, who earned an 18-6 major decision at 150 pounds. "Every time we walked into the locker room. It was bad."

The Division 1 Final featured the top-ranked teams in the state. Hartland (27-2), in search of its first Finals' title since 2016, finished runner-up for the sixth time in program history.

DCC had won four consecutive Division 1 team titles from 2017-2020. The Shamrocks also captured three straight from 2012-2014.

Hartland tied the match early at 12-12 with a pin from Dallas Korponic at 120 pounds, but the Shamrocks seized control by winning five of the next six weight classes.

School Spirit is Defining Difference in HS Sports

As Education-based sports in our nation's schools are different than any other level of competition.

Youth leagues and club sports often require significant entry fees, and in many cases, the focus is on competitive success with little concern for skill development, team building or sportsmanship.

High-profile college sports have been disrupted by issues concerning media contracts, NIL and the transfer portal, with the environment a bit like the "Wild West" on campuses throughout the country.

Professional sports, of course, are about the most elite performance, entertainment and winning championships.

Sports in our nation's 19,800-plus high schools instead are much more focused on education, relationships, team unity, having fun and school spirit.

School spirit is perhaps the defining difference between interscholastic and other levels of sports – having pride in one's school, maintaining a connection to the school and coaches for life, supporting all school teams and programs whether a participant or a fan, and contributing to the bond between school and community.

On an individual basis, pride is a key component of school spirit. Students who become involved in sports take pride in their teams and school and tend to carry that pride to their future careers after high school.

High school sports have the potential to boost the spirit of communities as well. There are countless examples every year but one such community was the small town of Fertile, Minnesota, located about 270 miles northwest of Minneapolis. In 2021, Jude Olson, a junior on the Fertile-Beltrami High School nine-player football team, was killed in an accident, which shook the approximately 1,000 residents of Fertile.

Last year, however, the Fertile-Beltrami football team provided a positive boost to the town with an undefeated regular season and a first-ever trip to the Minnesota State High School League Nine-player State Football Championship at U.S. Bank Stadium in Minneapolis.

According to an article in the Grand Forks (North Dakota) Herald, many of the town's residents did not have the means to make the five-hour trek to the game. As a result, local businesses and farmers donated \$25,000 for five charter buses to make sure every fan who wanted to make the trip had a free ride to the game.

"It means a lot to the whole town," said Jodie Strem, the co-owner of Fertile Oil Company. "We want (the players) to look in the stands and see us and know we are there for them. We are coming down full force."

While the Fertile-Beltrami Falcons lost to LeRoy-Ostrander in the MSHSL Nine-player Championship, the players and the 274 fans who made the journey will remember much more than the outcome of the game.

This is school spirit at its core and why high school sports are different.

High school activity programs boost the spirit of individuals, teams and communities. Research indicated that in 2020 when these programs were shut down because of the pandemic, the mental health of students was drastically compromised.

In the post-pandemic world, there are fewer face-to-face meetings. High school activities have played a major role in bringing people back together. We know that when schools have strong school spirit, communities respond with support and increased attendance.

School spirit and sportsmanship go hand in hand. If school spirit is channeled in a positive way, and expectations for good sportsmanship are communicated and enforced by school administrators, positive fan experiences will occur.

A survey several years ago by Varsity Brands concluded that high school students with school spirit performed better academically, were more engaged in social and civic matters, and were happier in general than their less-spirited peers.

The survey indicated that the benefits of school spirit are not just confined to the school years. The study suggested that school spirit can have lasting effects, including higher aspirations for continuing education and greater success in later life.

We are pleased to report that Varsity has commissioned a new research study, which will examine the post-pandemic educational landscape and attempt to understand how the return to in-person schooling has influenced school spirit and its profound impact on student learning, leadership and personal growth. We look forward to sharing the results of this survey down the road.

As the calendar turns to 2024, it is a great opportunity to renew commitments to these programs that involve more than 12 million participants in sports and performing arts – programs that foster and celebrate school spirit.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2024

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 35 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2023-24 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2024-25 school year. This year, a total of 1,607 applications from 445 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored during the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

Eight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2023-24 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2023-24 were: **Cale Bell**, Sault Ste. Marie; **Drew Cady**, Oxford; **Macy Jenkins**, Milford; **Isaiah Kabban**, Harbor Beach; **Ella Knudsen**, Leland; **Kaylee Kranz**, Clinton; **Joey Spada**, Kalamazoo Central; and **Anna Zoet**, Grandville Calvin Christian.

Those eight new members were selected from 105 applicants. That number of applicants was the fourth-most ever, with the last four years featuring the four highest totals.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class, members will have represented 137 schools from 50 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 16 MHSAA sports, and all eight will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council dis-

MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, non-public schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.

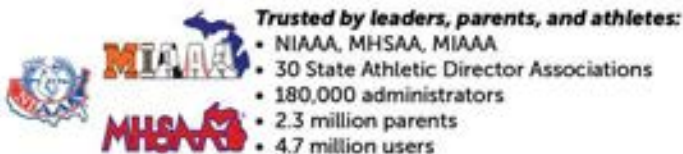

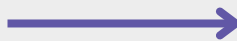
