Thirty recent films from Yugoslavia have been selected by Willard Van Dyke, Director of The Museum of Modern Art Department of Film, for public screenings at the Museum from October 5 through 22. Chosen by Mr. Van Dyke during several visits to that country in the past 18 months, none has been seen before in the United States. Examples of cinema verite as well as of more traditional forms are included.

"Outspoken, vigorously individualistic, the Yougoslav film reflects aspects of a nation composed of many different peoples," Mr. Van Dyke says. "Comparison with our own national characteristics is inevitable. The films reflect social concern for minorities, impatience with bureaucracy, love of beauty, and overall great good humor. They provide a wry glance at an imperfect world and express a desire to change it."

The films are being presented in cooperation with Dunav Films, Belgrade. The series will be launched at an invitational evening screening on October 3 of a new Yugoslav feature and a sampling of the short films to be shown later at the Museum. A reception will follow in the Museum Sculpture Garden honoring Vladimir Pogacic, director of the Yugoslav Archive and Cinematheque, who is coming to New York for the occasion. The Yugoslav National Dance and Folk Ensemble, which opens that night at City Center, will entertain at the reception.
