This learning experience was something brand new and challenging as we all responded to the COVID-19 pandemic. Yet our hope did not disappoint as our school community embraced this unprecedented experience with all the creativity and hard work that has defined excellence at NDA for generations.

The COVID-19 pandemic provided the backdrop for the volleyball season, as for the school year, but mostly we'll remember the Pandas' 2020 season for ending in a state title, the program's first since 1994.

SYDNEY SCHRODER, senior: Tryouts were very good. With the crazy year we were having I was more excited than ever to get back to volleyball.

MRS. WEBSTER, athletic director: As with all our sports and school in general. we worked very hard to follow protocols and put policies in place that would keep our students safe, healthy and able to continue. This includes things like temperature checks, masks, stringent sanitizing practices and social distancing.

ANNASHEA CARLISLE, senior: We could not use our locker rooms and we only got two tickets for games. The chairs were spaced 6 feet apart, and we had to wear masks whenever we weren't on the court. I was happy we got to play, but it felt very different from last year. We tried to make the best of it and still have fun.

MRS. LITMER, assistant coach/NDA alumna: I think this season was every bit of a process for everyone involved: players, coaches, families, and administration. There were so many "new normals" that we had to adjust to, and I know the players had to somehow get to a good mental place accepting that there were many unknowns because of COVID, resulting in different protocols that changed the way you play together.

The Pandas started 3-2 against a tough schedule, then won 14 of 15 matches to go into the postseason on a roll. But the district tournament began with most of the varsity team in guarantine, putting JV players in the spotlight: They would play as varsity. The Pandas beat Holmes and Holy Cross to move on as district champs.

CLANCY GAY, JV coach: My first feeling when I found out the JV would be playing in districts was excitement. That feeling soon turned to anxiousness once realizing what was at stake. Having the fate of the seniors' season in our hands was nerve-wracking.

ADELE FRANCE, sophomore: I felt bad for how hard they worked all season. At the same time. I saw it as a chance to prove ourselves by letting them play again.

LIZZIE CHUN, sophomore: We had never prepared for a varsity game before by watching film and basing it around that. I felt special — and professional, in a sense — to be a part of something this big.

JADA KRAMER, sophomore: I treated every drill in practice like we were playing Holy Cross. Every time I touched the ball, I imagined it was game point.

MRS. LITMER: We are fortunate enough to be in a program where our JV team can compete at the varsity level, so I also felt so much happiness for that team.

ABBY POWERS, senior: Our JV stepped up to the challenge

Then it was on to regionals for the Pandas with the varsity ready to return. NDA beat St. Henry, Cooper and Ryle, dropping only one set, in the regional to earn the trip to the state tournament.

EMMA GRACE, senior: We had no time to practice before the (regional) game. Because of that, I was worried we weren't going to play well and lose against St. Henry

From the Principal

What a school year it has been! We actually began planning for the safe return of our students to campus in May. By the time August rolled around, I was more anxious than ever to welcome our students back to NDA.

Although school looks drastically different this year with strict COVID-19 mitigation strategies in place. I am happy to report that the spirit of our

Pandas is the same. Students' smiles may be covered by masks this school year, but their energy and enthusiasm are undeniable in the way their eyes light up when they see each other.

As the COVID-19 situation is constantly evolving, our 2020-21 School Planning Team developed the "Pandas Return to Campus Plan" with three different plans for the upcoming school year including traditional learning, blended learning and remote learning. With the necessary technology in place, our school community can easily transition between these three plans.

Due to an executive order by Governor Beshear, we transitioned to Remote Learning @ NDA through the end of December. While 23 days of remote learning is not what we had all hoped for this school year, we have to remember that we have already completed 57 days of in-person learning. Those 57 days of in-person learning are a testament to the dedication of our students, faculty and staff to implement the Diocese of Covington "COVID-19 Return to School Requirements" as well as our "Pandas Return to Campus Plan" to help mitigate the spread of the virus in our school. We appreciate the diligence and ongoing efforts of our faculty, staff and students and we are happy to report that we have not had community spread of COVID-19 at NDA.

I am extremely grateful that our students continue to be engaged in meaningful learning despite COVID-19 and our temporary transition to Remote Learning @ NDA. Many schools will experience an achievement gap this school year due to the challenges of COVID-19. We are very blessed at Notre Dame Academy to have the framework in place to keep our students on track with their learning this school year. We have led the way in educational technology for nearly a decade giving NDA a clear advantage with remote learning. Several years ago our faculty began participating in Professional Learning Communities (PLC) increasing authentic pedagogy at NDA. We also have a phenomenal group of counselors keeping us mindful of our students' mental wellness and offering students the support they need to be successful.

As people of faith, we trust in the good God and we in turn, find grace and joy in lifting one another up in difficult times. We have encouraged our students to continue to lift each other up throughout this challenging school year.

Thank you for your continued support of our community. On behalf of the faculty and staff at NDA, I wish you and your family a very blessed Christmas and a joyous New Year.

SCIENCE STUDENTS DEBUNK COVID-19 MYTHS

Recently students in Mrs. Proudfit's honors biology class made posters to debunk myths about COVID-19 as a part of their study of viruses. Students chose a claim that they had heard or seen on social media and conducted research to investigate the claim. On each poster, students provided evidence to support or refute the claim. Additionally, students were asked to make the poster eve catching and easy to understand for a general audience. Mrs. Proudfit Published in National Journal



An article written by NDA Science teacher Mrs. Molly Proudfit was recently published in the October edition of The American Biology Teacher, the journal for the National Association of Biology Teachers. The article is titled "Sorting Fact From Fiction: Media Literacy in the Biology Classroom" and was published under the Inquiry and Investigations category in the journal.

In the article, Mrs. Proudfit proposes a lesson to help students develop media literacy skills, which are necessary across the curriculum and in students' everyday lives. In the first phase of the lesson, students are presented with a conspiracy theory (flat Earth theory, etc.) and construct media literacy questions to evaluate the claims. In the second phase of the lesson, students apply the questions they have constructed to a pseudoscience claim (climate change is not caused by human actions, fad diets, COVID myths, etc.). This year's donations may not have been the highest number of canned goods collected in a single year but the 2020 contributions are possibly the most impressive yet. Students generously dropped off their canned goods at school without any incentive of a friendly competition or out-of-uniform perk. Since students were learning remotely during the majority of the canned food drive, they had to go out of their way to drop off their donations outside of the school day. This year's collections of canned goods also pushed the total number of items donated to St. Vincent de Paul by NDA students since 2010 to over 90,000! That is quite a difference our Pandas have made in feeding the hungry over the past eleven years.

"We are very proud of our students ability to think of others during this challenging time," said NDA Principal, Mr. VonHandorf. He added, "Our students are true servant leaders focused on our 2020 theme, Uniting Humankind as Reflections of God's Love."



NDA Students Collect Canned Goods for Those in Need

As part of its mission to educate young women to make a difference in the world, Notre Dame Academy encourages its students to take part in community service regularly. Many of NDA's service events have become annual traditions including the very impactful November canned food drive.

This annual service event began in 2010 when NDA Student Council members wanted to do something to help fill the shelves of a local St. Vincent de Paul food pantry. The NDA community collected nearly 16,000 canned goods that first year and NDA's Student Council has continued to organized a successful canned food drive each year

Our Pandas did not let a global pandemic or a transition to remote learning stop them from collecting canned goods to feed the hungry this winter. They were creative in their efforts for this year's CANdemonium and were able to collect 1,949 canned goods along with \$275 to support their efforts.

Volleyball Takes State!

Volleyball had a wonderful season, winning the program's 9th State Title in a 5 set hard fought match against Louisville Mercy. Senior Anna Long was named the Region and State All Tournament MVP along with being a First Team All State selection and an Under Armour All American Honorable Mention. Senior Emma Grace was a Region All Tournament selection and a Second Team All State selection. Senior Emily Wichman was a Region and State All Tournament selection and Senior Abby Powers was a Region All Tournament selection. The State All Tournament team was rounded out by Sophomore Sydney Nolan. The Pandas were led by Coach Molly McDermott who is the first Volleyball Coach in the State of Kentucky to win a State Title both as a player (NDA 1990) and a coach! She was assisted by two other NDA alumnae Jenna (Schreiver) Leistner, 2010 and Leslie (Schellhaas) Litmer, 2011. Congrats to the entire volleyball team and program on your work and success!

Successful Golf Season

The members of the 2020 Panda golf team displayed resilience and perseverance in a season with many injuries and COVID related lineup changes. Despite all of these obstacles, the team had several successes and the future looks bright. The Pandas finished second in the conference led by Hannah Rice and Emma Meyer with an 84. In the 7th Region tournament the Pandas finished as runner-up with three players qualifying for the KHSAA Championship (Natalie Lovell 6th place with 87, Hannah Rice 7th place with 88 and Emma Meyer 10th place with 92). The three represented our region well but unfortunately did not gualify for day two. Our JV team had a limited schedule this season but many were able to play in varsity events due to players being out and performed extremely well and look forward to their improvement for next season.

Many Personal Bests For Cross Country

The cross country team had a unique year in which they were able to race 3ks 4ks and 5ks. The team had strong finishes at the Mason County Invitational and Villa Quad meets. Many athletes were able to run personal bests in the 3k, 4k and 5k events. The JV squad won the Diocese Championship. The varsity squad placed 4th at the regional meet and gualified for state.

Record Breaking Soccer Season

All three teams within the NDA soccer program enjoyed successes, learned life lessons and created memories to cherish. The hard work it took to get in shape and become a team in a short period of time did not go unnoticed. We are all really proud of each girl within the program for their effort and desire to make the season so successful. The freshman team posted an 8-1 record after going undefeated in the regular season. During regular season, the team only allowed 1 goal and that was on a penalty kick. The JV team finished undefeated with a 10-0-2 record and won the NDA JV Invitational Championship for the 4th year in a row. The JV team improved their style of play throughout the year and were playing some beautiful possession soccer as the season came to a close. The Varsity team finished the season with a record of 15-3, entered the Regional Tournament as the #1 team in the state, and set two new school records. Natalie Schuh set a new Career Assist record with 29 assists. The team set a new record for Fewest Goals Allowed in a season, only allowing 6 goals all year! The team lost in the regional tournament, but still had an incredible journey. We are so proud of our 11 seniors (10 players and a videographer) and thank them for all of their effort and dedication to the NDA Soccer Program!





The NDA Alumnae Mentoring Program is in its third year and enjoying many more student mentees and alumnae mentors for the 2020-21 year. This program is open to all Juniors and Seniors and at least 30% more students applied and were accepted for admission this year.

Students completed a form over the summer which asked their areas of interest for a future career. 
