

# Cal U. commencement speakers announced

**CALIFORNIA** - Two distinguished alumni with strong local ties will speak at California University of Pennsylvania's commencement ceremonies Friday and May 7.

Banking industry executive Daryl Zupan, Class of 1977, will address master's degree candidates at 7 p.m. Friday in Hamer Hall Auditorium on the main campus. Zupan, a native of Charleroi, is the president and chief executive officer for the AFCO and CAFO brands and Prime Rate Premium Finance Co. of BB&T Corp., one of the largest and oldest companies fi-

nancing property and casualty premiums in North America.

A leader in the energy industry, Raymond Milchovich, Class of 1971, will speak to undergraduates at 10 a.m. May 7 in Adamson Stadium at Roadman Park. Milchovich, originally from Roscoe, retired from Foster Wheeler AG in 2010. He currently is the nonexecutive chair-

man of the board for the global engineering and construction firm, which has offices in 25 nations around the world.

An honorary doctorate will be awarded during the undergraduate ceremony to Charles S. Pryor, Class of 1973, who has had a distinguished 37-year career in the construction and architectural/engineering busi-

ness. The vice president of business development for L.R. Kimball, he is responsible for business development and cross-divisional sales for the firm's architecture and engineering, civil and environmental, transportation and communications technology divisions.

Degrees will be awarded to 888 undergraduates and 294

graduate students in separate ceremonies.

Families are reminded to arrive early, especially for the undergraduate ceremony. Gates at Adamson Stadium will open at 8 a.m., and guests should be seated by 9:15. The outdoor ceremony will be held rain or shine. In case of inclement weather, ponchos will be provided. To avoid obstructing the view of others, guests are asked not to open umbrellas in the bleachers.

The campus television station, CUTV, will broadcast both ceremonies live on Armstrong Cable (Channel 61 Armstrong-Connellsville) and Atlantic Broadband Communications (Channel 17).
