Narrative:

At approximately 1730 hours on May 20,2000 I, Ranger Norman W. NELSON, Jr., received a request from Ranger Robert HARRIS for assistance. HARRIS was responding to a reported bear attack on the Little River Trail. Ranger Jerry GRUBB was also enroute.

I picked up Rescue 1 at the ranger station and proceeded to Elmont and the Little River Trail Head. I arrived at the trail turnaround at approximately 1800 hours. HARRIS was calling for a long gun as he said a bear was in the area, but since none were available GRUBB and I started up the trail. As we ran up the trail the information coming from the scene was minimal. HARRIS continued to request a long gun and my perception was that the bear was a great distance away from HARRIS' position.

At approximately 1830 hours GRUBB and I arrived at the scene. HARRIS was moving towards us. I called to him and ask where the bear was. He indicated in the woods. GRUBB and I began to work away from the trail paralleling a small embankment. As we moved away from the trail I asked HARRIS again where the bear was. He pointed towards a stump and rhododendron bush. At this time I observed a black bear sow on top of a body. Its head was down and it appeared to be in the act of feeding. A yearling cub was sitting near the sow.

GRUBB moved to his left and I flanked around his right to keep him out of my line of sight. As I moved to the right of GRUBB hem fired into the sow. She ran off and I started to follow. GRUBB then shot the yearling as it stayed near the body. It to then ran off in the direction of the mother. I then saw both bears down but still moving. I began firing rounds into the animals as I moved up on them. I believe that I expended 14 rounds into the two animals. At this time I ascertained that both animals were dead.

After destroying the two bears I stayed in the vicinity of the female body. A witness had reported three bears upon our arrival and I continued to watch for a third animal. I observed that the body had massive damage from her nose to her upper chest. A large portion of her inner left thigh and outer right calf was missing. No blood was visible.

The scene was secured and GRUBB and I tracked the attack back towards the river. Ranger Bobby HOLLAND upon his arrival verified the course of the attack. Upon the arrival of the litter team we removed the body and arrived at the trail turnaround at approximately 2100 hours.

Fatality by Bears, Victim, Glenda Bradley, Goshen Prong Bridge

I responded to the Little River trail with a four-wheel drive vehicle after Ranger Harris requested assistance with a bear attack on the Little River trail. Ranger Nelson responded with the park rescue vehicle. We arrived at the trail and drove to the old turn around where we loaded a litter and some supplies from the SAR vehicle. Ranger Harris requested we respond immediately with a long gun and come on up the trail without the litter. Ranger Nelson and myself ran up the trail for about 11/2 miles where we met the victims husband, and Ranger Harris. The bear was in the woods on the right side of the trail at the Goshen Prong bridge about 40 yards off the trail. I ran into the woods and saw the victim lying on a small incline with a bear, approximately 250 pounds at her head. The bear appeared to be feeding on the victim's head. There was a small bear, about 50 pounds at the victims right upper side and appeared to be feeding on the victim's arms. I ran up to within about 10-12 feet of the bears and immediately shot three rounds with my .40 caliber semi-pistol, hitting the larger bear which ran up the hill about 50 feet and collapsed. I then shot two rounds into the smaller bear that also ran up the hill to where the larger bear was and collapsed. Ranger Nelson and myself then fired several rounds into the bears where they had collapsed.

The victim was lying on her back, and her face and throat had been eaten by the bears. The victim had no airway and there were no vitals present. Her left leg in the calf area had also been consumed and there were signs of mauling and mutilation by the bears. The victim had also been partially covered with leaf litter and dirt by the bears.

The victim's companion was at the scene and I talked with him. He identified himself as (6) (6) (7) (7) (C) was visibly upset but was able to give me an account of what had happened. He said he had been fishing and had gone about 1/2 mile downstream from the Goshen prong bridge. When he returned he said he could not find the victim and began looking for her. He met two persons on the trail who told him there was a black pack lying in the river. He found the pack and said it was lying in the river to the left of the Goshen prong bridge. He said he retrieved the pack and found it to belong to the victim. He said he then became very worried and began looking for the victim. He said he then found the victim and two bears were with her and she was being dragged by the bears. He said he tried to run the bears off but they aggressively approached him. He then left the area and went to the Elkmont campground where he made the report to Ranger Harris. He could not give me any information as to the condition of the victims before he left for help.

Fatality by bear, Glenda Bradley, cont.

There was three or four person at the scene on my arrival and Ranger Harris obtained the identification of the subjects and escorted (b) (a) (b) (7)(c) from the scene. Ranger Nelson and myself secured the area and began looking for clues to determine the sequence of events. Based on the information given by (b) (a) (b) (7)(c) there were clues indicating the initial contact by the victim and the bears at the river by the Goshen prong bridge. Footprints and disturbed vegetation leading from the river indicated the victim had encountered the bears at the river and had attempted to run back to the trail but was unable to get back to the trail. It appeared the victim ran to the downstream side of the bridge and crossed over a large deadfall and began running through the woods adjacent the trail about 40 yards. It appeared the victim ran about 75 yards and caught by the bear at the location the victim was lying. There was very little disturbance at the scene and there was very little evidence of any struggle. The ground consisting of leaf litter and dirt was disturbed and there appeared to be drag marks where the victim was dragged up a small incline for about 10 feet where the bears began feeding.

Ranger Holland responded to the scene and was able to verify the path taken by the victim and bears by tracking. There appeared to be no foul play involved in the incident and there were no witnesses to the event. Prior to being able to photograph the scene, it began to rain heavily. The scene and victim was photographed and removed from the area.

On May 21, 2000, around 1727 hours at Elkmont campground office, (b) (c), (b) (7)(c) reported a missing person. According to he and a companion where hiking down the Little River trail when he ran into another hiker, (b) (6, (b) (7)(c) had seen had seen (b) (6, (b) (7)(c) hours had seen had

wictim, about 100 yards up the Goshen Prong trail between the Little River trail junction and before the steel bridge. When we arrived on scene around 1748 hours, I saw the lifeless, mauled body of Glenda A. Bradley lying in a rhododendron thicket with two bears lying about 15 feet away. Each time that I approached Bradley's body, the larger of the two bears stood up and stood over the victim's body in a defensive manner. The smaller of the two bears remained behind a tree. I kept """ and other hikers away from the scene until backup arrived. About 25 minutes later, rangers Grubb and Nelson arrived and shot both bears.

According to (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) he and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) Glenda Ann Bradley, on May 21, 2000 left the Little River trailhead on a day hike around 1100 hours. About 2 miles up the trail, (NOTE) and Bradley decided to split up. (NOTE) would go fishing while Bradley went for a hike. However, they agreed to meet back up at around 1430 hours on the Little River trail near an island in the creek.

When Bradley did not return to the meeting location at 1430 hours, began to look for her. He saw two boys from his school out on the trail and asked if they had seen Bradley. When they said that they had not, he sent them to get help.

had seen Bradley. They said that they had not but they did see a black backpack on the other side of the creek near the steel bridge. According to he located her backpack near the steel bridge on the Goshen Prong trail. Continued to search along the creek for Bradley. He located Bradley's mauled body in a rhododendron thicket not far from the steel bridge on the Goshen Prong trail with two bears guarding it.

Glenda was right handed. Glenda had no known medical history. Glenda did not use any alcohol or drugs Glenda would not consider suicide.

Randall reported that after (60.00.00) and Glenda married, Glenda moved into (60.00.00) house. According to (60.00.00) Glenda and manage were good Christians and would go to church together, manage and Glenda's divorce was not a messy one. (Characterized Glenda as a type "A" personality; however, Glenda was having considerable personal problems with (6) (6) (7)(C). According to (6) (7)(C) Glenda had very little contact with (6) (6) (7)(C). (b) (6) (b) (7)(C) and another grandchild had died in March of 2000. Throughout much of her life Glenda always had a lot on her but was always able to pull through. MOSONON last spoke with Glenda on Mother's day. Things at that time were improving with her children and she seemed happy. Most across believed that Glenda would never consider suicide. Most had no personal knowledge of Glenda and Most planning on (b) (c) (c)

The interview began at 0800hrs and lasted until 1100hrs. """ was visibly upset and crying for most of the interview. I began the interview by asking """ a series of questions aimed at obtaining information that the Pathologist had requested. """ advised that Bradley was right handed. According to """ Bradley's daily medication consisted of hormone pills and herb medicines. """ assumed that Bradley had taken her medications on Sunday May 21", but did not actually observe her taking any. """ could not report any significant past medical history. Bradley was not feeling sick nor had she taken any drugs or alcohol on Sunday May 21". "" advised that Bradley did not wear any perfume on Sunday, and probably didn't even shower since the two planned on hiking. """ and Bradley stopped at DJ's Market Sunday morning. Bradley ate a sausage / egg/ cheese sandwich. According to """ Bradley was not experiencing her period and had not contemplated suicide.

I then had """ describe the incident: """ stated that he and Bradley had spent Saturday night together at his house. After waking up Bradley decided that she would like to walk, and easied that he would like to fish. The two decided to go the Little River Trail an area that they had been three times previous this spring. " and Bradley arrived at the trailhead at approximately 1130hrs and began hiking up the trail. At approximately 1300hrs 650 began fishing the Little River at the beginning of the island above just above the Huskey Gap Trail junction. Bradley continued north on the Little River Trail towards the Goshen Prong Trail junction. "" and Bradley were to meet back on the Little River Trail between 1430 and 1500hrs. *** stated that he lished the backside of the island then returned to the trail at approximately 1445hrs and waited there for Bradley until approximately 1500hrs. ****** then hiked north on the Little River Trall to the Goshen Prong junction where he waited until 1545hrs. "" then continued north on the Little River Trail towards backcountry campsite # 24. *** talked to a couple who had not seen Bradley and decided to return to the Goshen Prong junction. After returning to the Goshen Prong junction Not walked over to the metal bridge where he met (b) (6), (b) (f)(C) ***** told **** that he had not seen Bradley, but there was a backpack lying on the other side of the river near the bridge. Not ran over to the pack and recognized it as Bradley's, 5m2 went through the pack and saw that nothing was missing. At this time 5m2 stated that all kind of thoughts were going through his head. According to *** he knew that something bad had happened *** had left his fishing gear back at the Goshen Prong junction and laid Bradley's pack up on the trail. Hill then searched the river upstream of the bridge but did not locate Bradley. As "" was searching downstream of the bridge he located Bradley with two bears standing over her. *** stated that he was pretty sure that Bradley was dead when he first located her. "" attempted to run the bears off, but the big bear would not let him get close. "" got some sticks and began yelling loudly, but the big bear continued to run him off. *** stated that the bear ran at him quickly with its ears back. "" felt like the bear was saying this was mine and your not going to get it.



Scene Field Observation

Trackers: Chuck Hester Bobby Holland

The night of the incident Bobby Holland and I observed the following tracks in the area of the body.

Beginning at the sycamore stump in the middle of Little River, we were able to track a person with small feet running across an open area. We surmised the person was running due to the long length of stride. We followed the same track from the river to where the body was laying.

While tracking the first subject, we found where a bear moved onto the tracks from the right (from the south). The bear's tracks were then moving in the same direction of travel and along the same course as the human tracks. This course of travel ended at the body.

05/22/00 Trackers: Paul Williams Larry Hartman Chuck Hester

The day after the incident Paul Williams, Larry Hartman, and I observed the following.

At least one bear had moved down the south side of Little River to a gravel bed to the area the victim's pack was reported to have been found. The distance from the pack area to the stump where Bobby Holland and I found the first running tracks was 47ft.

The distance from the stump to the termination of tracks at the body was, including a small amount of movement upstream, 198.6ft.

Wildlife Biologist Kim Delozier and Chuck Hester attended the post mortem examinations. Photographs were taken of both bears. The brain of each bear was removed and transferred to the State Rabies Lab for testing. Stomach contents were removed from each bear and transferred to NPS Criminal Investigator Bill Acree. Acree will submit the stomach content to the TBI lab for DNA comparison with samples taken from Glenda Bradley's body. The skulls of each bear were transferred to Ranger Kloster. Kloster delivered the skulls the Forensic Pathologist Dr. Ellen Wallen for comparison with Glenda Bradley's body. See final necropsy report for results of each bear.

The adult female bear was discovered to have an ear tag. The tag number was 1514. This bear had not been contacted by NPS staff as a nuisance bear. The tag belonged to the University of Tennessee as part of a denning study. Records indicate that an orphaned cub from The Appalachian Bear Center in Townsend TN was placed in the den with this adult female #1514. See data sheets from the University of Tennessee and the Appalachian Bear Center for detailed information on bears.

Park Ranger Steve Kloster attended the post mortem examination. Photographs of Glenda Bradley were taken. Body samples for DNA comparison (Skin-neck, Skin-abdomen, Skin-right thigh, Skin-left thigh, Left thigh muscle, Liver, Buccal swab, and Blood Samples-heart) were received from the Forensic pathologist by Ranger Kloster, sealed as evidence and delivered to NPS Criminal Investigator Bill Acree. Acree then transferred the samples to the TBI Lab in Knoxville for comparison with human contents taken from the bear's stomach. Ranger Kloster received clothing from the deceased. The pathologist report is to follow. The following was related to Ranger Kloster by the pathologist or observed by Kloster.

Glenda Bradley was found lying on the ground in the supine position with her feet facing the Little River. Bradley jacket was pulled off of her shoulders and back. The tee shirt and bra had been pulled up towards Bradley's neck. Shorts, underwear, socks and boots were intact and blood soaked. Major trauma was observed to the neck, left femur and buttox. Over fifty bite marks, puncture wounds and claw marks were observed over Bradley's body. Defensive type wounds were observed on the hands.

SPECIFIC OBSERVATIONS:

Small wounds on hands / fingers might suggest defensive wounds. Puncture / bite wounds on right hip. Right leg - Tib. / Fib. area eaten away. Left leg - femur eaten away - left femoral artery severed. Larynx, upper portion of trachea and beginning of esophagus gone. Right carotid artery severed (absent), left carotid artery intact. Right jugular vein absent. Neck does not appear to be broken.

Narrative:

Eyes, nose, stomach and chest wounds all appear to be post mortem. No apparent heart attack. Possible fractured right rib. Collapsed right lung. No fluid in lungs (did not aspirate any blood). Most wounds on the legs show considerable reaction / bruising.

At this time the Pathologist believes that there was only two possible lethal wounds that could have caused death, a severed right carotid artery and a severed left femoral artery. Preliminary cause of death is exsanguinating injuries due to bear attack. The death is believed to be accidental and that the injuries seen are consistent with having been caused by bears.

SUMMARY

On May 21, 2000 at approximately 1727hrs at the Elkmont Campground (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) reported to Ranger Robert Harris the he was asked by park visitor (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to report a missing hiker on the Little River / Goshen Prong Trail. While enroute Ranger Harris received a second report from (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) that a bear had attacked a woman. After arriving on scene Ranger Harris observed a 112-pound female bear and a 40-pound yearling bear guarding the lifeless body of Glenda Ann Bradley. Ranger Harris attempted to run the bears off but was unable to. NPS Rangers Grubb and Nelson shot the bears and autopsies on Glenda Bradley and the bears confirmed the suspicions of a bear attack.

National Park Service Rangers and Biologist attempted to reconstruct the events of the attack.

pridge on the other side of the river. """ immediately crossed the river and located the pack. """ recognized the pack as Bradley's and opened it. """ discovered that the camera and food were still in the pack untouched. """ brought the pack up to the trail and began looking around the bridge for Bradley. When """ did not locate Bradley anywhere around the bridge he began searching the riverbanks. """ first searched the southwest riverbank upstream from the bridge. """ then returned to the trail and searched the northeast riverbank upstream from the bridge. With no success began searching the northeast riverbank downstream from the bridge. As """ was working his way back up towards the bridge he looked over to his left and observed the bears. """ then looked closer and saw Bradley's body lying next to the bears. INVESTIGATION

Immediately after shooting the bears Ranger Grubb assumed control of the investigation. Ranger Grubb secured the scene and began searching for clues / evidence. Grubb conducted a field interview with (b) (6) (b) (f)(c) Physical evidence found at the scene included Bradley's body, the two bears, and footprints left by Bradley and the bears. Ranger Grubb discovered footprints belonging to Bradley beginning at the riverbank near a sycamore stump. The tracks indicate that Bradley attempted to run upstream along the riverbank towards the trail. When Bradley wasn't able to get back to the trail she turned and ran downstream, crossed a dead fall, climbed a two foot bank and began running through the woods parell to the Goshen Prong Trail. Bradley ran approximately 198 feet and was caught by the bear. The bear tracks were observed falling in closely behind Bradley's tracks (See scene diagram). Ranger Bobby Holland arrived on scene and back tracked both Bradley and the bear verifying Ranger Grubb's findings. Prior to being able to photograph the scene it began to rain very heavily. After the rain let up the scene was photographed. On scene Park Medic Steve Spayner evaulated Bradley's injuries and constulted with NPS Medical Control (UT Lifestar). It was decide by medical control that due to the time laspe / lack of airway and other injuries life saving procedures would not be started. Bradley's body was placed into a body bag, carried by litter to the trailhead and transported to Sevier County Medical Center by Gatlinburg Ambulance. The two bears were carried by litter to the trailhead and transported to the University of Tennessee Veterinary Hospital by NPS Wildlife Biologist Kim Delozier and Chuck Hester

FOLLOW UP INVESTIGATION:

On 05/22/00 Rangers Paul Williams, Larry Hartman and Wildlife Biologist Chuck Hester returned to the scene. The group backtracked Bradley and the bears, developed a scene diagram and photographed and videoed the scene.

Ranger Kloster conducted the follow-up investigation. There are no witnesses to the death of Glenda Bradley. It is believed that (b) (6) (b) (7)(C) and his volunteer Trout Unlimited survey crew were the last to see Glenda Bradley alive on the Goshen Prong Trail southwest of the metal bridge between 1355hrs and 1415hrs on May 21,200. Photographs developed from Glenda Bradley's camera which was found in her pack indicate that Bradley photographed

One set of bear tracks was smaller than the other set of tracks. No bear tracks were observed in the gravel bed along the streambank. Documentation of Observations Made at Scene of Bear Mauling

Upon arrival at the scene I observed Glenda Ann Bradley lying approximately 15 yards northwest of the trail atop a small rise. A black bear was standing across the body, with the head pointing towards the northwest, over the upper portion of BRADLEY with its muzzle against her neck or upper chest. A yearly was sitting near the right shoulder of the victim. I did not detect any movement from BRADLEY but was unable otherwise to determine the condition of the victim. These observations were made from approximately 15 feet away from the bear and the victim.

After Ranger GRUBB had driven the bears away from BRADLEY with gunfire I pursued them as they ran towards the wood As I passed by BRADLEY I quickly observed that the wounds to the body were quite severe. I then communed after the two bears, (See previous report for description of destruction of bears.)

After the bears were destroyed I stayed in the area of the attack. I returned to the Bradley's body and upon a more detailed observation of the body determined that the victim was dead. (See previous report for description of wounds to the body.) I then began to secure the scene. After making sure the scene was safe I observed the area immediately adjacent to the body.

Approximately eight feet southwest of the body I observed an area that showed disturbance in the leaf litter on the ground. It appeared that the disturbance was from a quick 180-degree turn. There was another area where the leaves were disturbed approximately eighteen inches northeast of the turn area. The disturbance was directly in line with the body and was the approximate width of the body. There was also disturbance northeast towards the body showing the dragging of the body to the crest of the small rise of the ground. BRADLEY's shirt and bra were pulled up towards the neck and shoulders.

At this time I began to back track from the body to secure any tracks that were evident. I easily followed human tracks southeasterly direction from Bradley's' body. The prints showed a lot of disturbance and it was evident that she had been moving at a full run as she traveled through the woods. I also observed a set of disturbance through the vegetation to the northeast of the human prints. These impressions were parallel along to the path of flight and were found in the slight depression to the southwest of the body. Although I was unable to observe a print I determined that the evidence pointed to a four legged animal travelling easily through the woods. The differences in the two sets of tracks seemed quite remarkable to me at the time. Chuck HESTER was able to track from near where Bradley's' pack was to my position.

I was confident at the time that we had ascertained Bradley's' attempted escape path and I moved back over to the body. Upon Ranger Jeff CARLISE's arrival we were able to tape off the area of the attack and where the tracks were located. No other physical evidence was found at the site.

Officer's Opinion; From what I observed at the scene I have no suspicion of foul play. The tracking evidence that I observed leads me to believe that BRADLEY was in full flight attempting to escape from the bears. The length of the strides and the amount of disturbance that was evident suggest that she was running at her top speed. The bear tracks that I believe were paralleling BRADLEY's tracks pointed to the ease with which BRADLEY was caught. My observations lead me to believe that she turned towards the bear before she was attacked at the area where the body was found and that there was not much of a struggle that occurred there. This was how at the time I was on scene that I interpreted the evidence I found

NARRATIVE: I responded to the above location in response to a call for personnel to carry out an injured person. When I arrived at the scene Ranger Jerry Grubb advised me of the bear/person incident and assigned me to reconstruct the attack scene and the last movements of the victim and bear

Ranger Chuck Hester arrived at the scene and we formed a team and started at the edge of the attack area and back tracked the victim to a sycamore stump on a small rock/boulder island in the Little River East Prong. The tracks were well-defined boot prints and paralleling the booth prints were bear tracks.

INVESTIGATION: Starting at the beginning of the first sign on the sycamore stump island we tracked across the river to the bank just north of the bridge over Little River EP. To the south of the bridge there is a sandy beach and gentle grade up to the trail and bridgehead. This is the closest point to the area pointed out to me by Ranger Grubb where the victims pack was found in the river. The tracks turned to the left (north) and went down the side of the river past a large log and other debris dam left from high water in the trees on the bank, effectively blocking any one egress through it. Once past this dam/block the tracks go up a three to four feet high bank. The tracks go across an area clear of under brush and a small depression. high water channel. The bear tracks come in from the right (South) at the beginning of the depression. The tracks are wide spaced and deep while crossing this area. At the east edge of the clear area a 10-inch log was lying on the ground, parallel to the clear area and past the log a rhododendron ticket starts. Directly pat this log there are two distinct boots prints, the right foot is side ways to the flight path and the left foot is pointing straight ahead. Inference here is the victim stopped to see where the bear was as she was coming to the Rhododendron thicket. After these tracks there was right boot and then a left boot continuing in the straight flight path from the river. The last two boot prints are turned around pointing back toward the river in the direction from which the victim had just come. Inference here is that the victim turned to face the pursuing bears to attempt to scare it away or defend herself

The body was several feet away from these last tracks lying on its back with the feet next to the last tracks.

Beginning at the sycamore stump in the middle of Little River, we were able to track a person with small feet running across an open area. We surmised the person was running due to the long length of stride. We followed the same track from the river to where the body was laying.

While tracking the first subject, we found where a bear moved onto the tracks from the right (from the south). The bear's tracks were then moving in the same direction of travel and along the same course as the human tracks. This course of travel ended at the body.



Gross Findings:

This is a 50 kg (111 lb) adult female Black Bear in marginal nutritional condition. Subcutaneous adipose tissue is depleted, but adequate fat is present around the heart and kidneys. There is little post-mortem decomposition; time from death to necropsy was approximately 5 hours. A metal tag inscribed with the number 1514 is present in the left ear, and the same number is tattooed in green on the buccal surface of the right upper lip. The maxillary canines are 2.4 cm long, and the width between the apices of the crowns is 4.5 cm. The mandibular canines are 2.7 cm long and the width between the apices of the crowns is 5 cm. A ragged, approximately 1 cm diameter penetrating wound is present in the skin and subcutaneous tissues of the upper right thorax.

The thoracic cavity is filled with blood (approximately 300 ml) including a large clot in the caudal thorax. A penetrating wound extending from the skin into the left ventral chest is present (consistent with a bullet wound). The lungs are collapsed. Ragged holes are present in the right cranial and left cranial lung lobes, and also in two foci in the right ventricle (entry and exit wound), and one foci in the vena cava. No blood is present in the heart. A bullet fragment is lodged in the vertebral canal in the mid-thorax.

A small amount of blood is present in the abdominal cavity. There are multiple liver fractures without associated hemorrhage, as well as a 4.5 cm rent in the caudal vena cava. There is a focal, approximately 3 cm in diameter, perforation of the wall of the stomach midway between the greater and lesser curvatures. The stomach measures 30 x 15 x 8 cm. Multiple fragments of mammalian muscle, non-haired skin, and glandular tissue are present within the stomach (total weight = approximately 550 grams), admixed with plant material. The muscle and skin fragments account for approximately 50% of the total stomach content. The duodenum and proximal jejunum contain scant mucus and the aboral GI tract contains scant fecal material.

No gross lesions are present in the brain.

Gross Diagnosis:

Trauma due to multiple gunshot wounds.

Laboratory Findings:

Brain - Rabies virus not found by FRA; Tennessee Department of Health, Laboratory Services, Lab #724, B-047377.

Histopathologic Findings:

- 1) Brain, Left Cerebrum (Slides 1 and 2) No significant lesions.
- Left Midbrain (Slide 3) Occasional, mild, focal, perivascular accumulations of lymphocytes and plasma cells are present in the meninges and the choroid plexus.

- 6) Right Midbrain (Slides 9, 10 and 11) Scattered capillaries contain nematode larvae similar to those described above.

Stomach Contents:

There are multiple sections of multiple fragments of non-haired skin and skeletal muscle mixed with small amounts of plant material. The skin fragments are most consistent with normal human skin. The skin samples have minimal crush artifacts, some evidence of tissue separation associated with trauma, but no hemorrhage. The muscle tissue also has evidence of postmortem trauma and ingestion. This includes tears and separations in the muscle tissue in the absence of hemorrhage or edema. The muscle and skin both have minimal evidence of postmortem degeneration.

Histopathologic Diagnoses:

Brain - No significant lesions.

Final Diagnosis:

Trauma due to multiple gunshot wounds.

Gross Findings:

This is an 18 kg, yearling female Black Bear which is in poor nutritional condition. The maxillary canines are 1.5 cm long, and the width between the apices of the crowns is 3.7 cm. The mandibular canines are 1.7 cm long, and the width between the apices of the crowns is 4 cm. There are multiple bullet wounds over the thorax and abdomen and in the hind legs.

The thoracic cavity is filled with blood, and penetrating wounds extend from the skin into the right mid-thorax and the left caudal thorax. Mr. was awakened to the sounds of pots being banged together. When he came out of his tent, he observed a bear about 2/3 the size of the bear that was in the site the previous night. Gross Findings:

This is an 18 kg, yearling female Black Bear which is in poor nutritional condition. All subcutaneous adipose tissue is severely depleted and there is a marked paucity of perirenal and pericardial fat. There is little post-morten decomposition; time from death to necropsy was approximately 5 hours. The number 350 is tattooed in green on the buccal surface of the right upper lip. The maxillary canines are 1.5 cm long, and the width between the apices of the crowns is 3.7 cm. The mandibular canines are 1.7 cm long, and the width between the apices of the crowns is 4 cm. There are multiple bullet wounds over the thorax and abdomen and in the hind legs.

The thoracic cavity is filled with blood, and penetrating wounds extend from the skin into the right mid-thorax and the left caudal thorax. Ragged holes are present in the right and left cranial lung lobes, and a full-thickness rent is present in the aorta approximately 1 cm above the base of the heart.

Multiple fragments of mammalian muscle, non-haired skin, and glandular tissue are present in the stomach (total weight = approximately 500 grams), admixed with plant material. The muscle and skin account for approximately 70% of the stomach content. The duodenum and proximal jejunum are devoid of ingesta and the aboral GI tract contains scant fecal material. No fat is present in the omentum.

Approximately 2/3 of the dorsal skull is fractured; multiple small fragments of bone are embedded into the underlying brain. There is focally extensive destruction of the brain tissue with hemorrhage.

Gross Diagnosis:

Trauma due to multiple gunshot wounds.

Laboratory Findings:

Brain - Rabies virus not found by FRA; Tennessee Department of Health, Laboratory Services, Lab #725, B-047378.

Histopathologic Findings:

- 1) Left Cerebrum (Slides 1-3) There are scattered, mild to moderate perivascular and sub-meningeal hemorrhages.
- 2) Left Midbrain (Slide 4) Changes are similar to those in the cerebrum.
- 3) Right Midbrain (Slide 5) Changes are similar to those in the left cerebrum and midbrain; in addition, there are scattered fragments of bone and skeletal muscle embedded in the brain parenchyma.
- 4) Right Brainstem (Slide 6) Changes are similar to those seen in the previous sections.

Stomach Contents:

The skin samples have minimal crush artifacts, some evidence of tissue separation associated with trauma, but no hemorrhage. The muscle tissue also has evidence of postmortem trauma and ingestion. This includes tears and separations in the muscle tissue in the absence of hemorrhage or edema. The muscle and skin both have minimal evidence of postmortem degeneration.

Brain - Acute, mild to moderate, multifocal hemorrhage.

Gross Findings:

This is a 50 kg (111 lb) adult female Black Bear in marginal nutritional condition. Subcutaneous adipose tissue is depleted, but adequate fat is present around the heart and kidneys. There is little post-mortem decomposition; time from death to necropsy was approximately 5 hours. A metal tag inscribed with the number 1514 is present in the left ear, and the same number is tattooed in green on the buccal surface of the right upper lip. The maxillary canines are 2.4 cm long, and the width between the apices of the crowns is 4.5 cm. The mandibular canines are 2.7 cm long and the width between the apices of the crowns is 5 cm. A ragged, approximately 1 cm diameter penetrating wound is present in the skin and subcutaneous tissues of the upper right thorax.

The thoracic cavity is filled with blood (approximately 300 ml) including a large clot in the caudal thorax. A penetrating wound extending from the skin into the left ventral chest is present (consistent with a bullet wound). The lungs are collapsed. Ragged holes are present in the right cranial and left cranial lung lobes, and also in two foci in the right ventricle (entry and exit wound), and one foci in the vena cava. No blood is present in the heart. A bullet fragment is lodged in the vertebral canal in the mid-thorax.

A small amount of blood is present in the abdominal cavity. There are multiple liver fractures without associated hemorrhage, as well as a 4.5 cm rent in the caudal vena cava. There is a focal, approximately 3 cm in diameter, perforation of the wall of the stomach midway between the greater and lesser curvatures. The stomach measures 30 x 15 x 8 cm. Multiple fragments of mammalian muscle, non-haired skin, and glandular tissue are present within the stomach (total weight = approximately 550 grams), admixed with plant material. The muscle and skin fragments account for approximately 50% of the total stomach content. The duodenum and proximal jejunum contain scant mucus and the aboral GI tract contains scant fecal material.

No gross lesions are present in the brain.

Gross Diagnosis:

Trauma due to multiple gunshot wounds.

Laboratory Findings:

Brain - Rabies virus not found by FRA; Tennessee Department of Health, Laboratory Services, Lab #724, B-047377.

Histopathologic Findings:

- 1) Brain, Left Cerebrum (Slides 1 and 2) No significant lesions.
- Left Midbrain (Slide 3) Occasional, mild, focal, perivascular accumulations of lymphocytes and plasma cells are present in the meninges and the choroid plexus.

- 3) Brainstem (Slide 4) No significant lesions.
- 4) Left Cerebellum (Slide 5) Scattered capillaries within the parenchyma contain coiled, approximately 300 micrometer, slender nematode larvae, consistent with microfilariae of Dirofilaria ursi.



Park Provides Details on Fatal Bear Attack

He noticed two bears, an adult female weighing 112 pounds and a yearling female weighing about 40 pounds, guarding the body. He tried to run off the bears, but the adult female showed aggressive behavior towards the went to seek additional assistance and a hiker ran to get help at the Elkmont campground arriving at 5 p.m..

A Park Ranger was immediately dispatched to the scene and arrived at 6:05 p.m. Fifteen minutes later two other Park Rangers arrived. The Park Rangers observed the bears still near the body and shot the bears with their service weapons. A total of 17 Park personnel responded to the incident.

The bears were sent to the University of Tennessee of Veterinary Medicine
Department for a necropsy. The woman's body has been transported to East
Tennessee State University for an autopsy. Park officials are almost 100 percent
certain that the two bears were involved the attack but the necropsy will confirm
this fact.

It appears that this was an unprovoked attack. According to the victim's family Bradley was an experienced day hiker who was familiar with the Park. Bradley's day pack which contained food was not disturbed.

The adult female bear had been tagged in 1998 by University of Tennessee wildlife biologists for research purposes but never had shown any aggressive tendencies towards people before. By all indications this bear was truly a wild bear. But most past human/bear conflicts in the Smokies have been as a result of bear's either being fed human food and becoming habituated to human food. In

the past decade, the Park has become increasingly proactive in both reducing available garbage in front country areas and providing effective food storage alternatives in the backcountry. Managers have also stepped up education programs to teach people about responsible food storage and to avoid conflicts with bears.

Acting Superintendent Philip A. Francis, Jr., said that "We want to stress that there is no indication whatsoever that Bradley did anything to provoke this attack. The fact remains that bears in the Smokies are wild and unpredictable animals. We will continue to reinforce the message that human food obtained by bears can lead to injuries."

Four adjacent backcountry campsites 21, 23, 24, and 30 are still closed pending confirmation that the bears were the cause of Bradley's death.

AUTOPSY RESULTS INCOMPLETE ON BLACK BEAR VICTIM

The autopsy being performed on Glenda Bradley who was fatally attacked by two black bears in Great Smoky Mountains National Park on Sunday, May 21, is not complete. The Forensic Pathologist at East Tennessee State University in Johnson City, TN, who is conducting the autopsy, will not issue any findings until all elements of the autopsy have been done. The pathologist will not make any determinations or statements until all the information on the autopsy is collected and evaluated. The Park expects to receive the report in the next 2 to 3 months. At that time the findings will be issued.

BEAR MAULING LEADS TO FATALITY

Great Smoky Mountains National Park officials reported the Park's first-ever fatality from a black bear attack on Sunday evening approximately 2 miles up the Little River Trail from its trailhead in Elkmont.

A couple from Cosby, TN, entered the Park around noon to fish in Little River. The man last saw his companion around 2 p.m. when he separated from her to go fishing. About an hour later he went back to look for his companion, located her day pack, and found her body off trail. There were two bears at the body, a large adult female and a yearling. Another fisherman hiked to Elkmont campground to report the incident around 5:00 p.m. and rangers were on scene at 6:05 p.m. Two bears were in the area and rangers shot and killed them. The bears are being taken to University of Tennessee for necropsies to ensure that they were the animals involved in the attack. As a precautionary measure, Park officials have closed backcountry campsites 21, 23, 24, and 30, all of which are in the Little River drainage.

The woman's name is being withheld pending notification of family members.

A news conference is scheduled for 11 a.m. Monday morning at Park Headquarters to provide further details.
