

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

Be ready for hurricane season. Today you can determine your personal hurricane risk, find out if you live in a hurricane evacuation zone, and review/update insurance policies. You can also make a list of items to replenish hurricane emergency supplies and start thinking about how you will prepare your home for the coming hurricane season. If you live in hurricane-prone areas, you are encouraged to complete these simple preparations before hurricane season begins. *Hurricane season is from June 1 - November 30.



Determine Your Risk Storm Surge; Strong Winds; Flooding & Rainfall; Rip currents



Strengthen Your Home Cover Windows; Secure loose outdoor Help your neighbors prepare; Check-in items; Move vehicles to a safe location; Trim trees; Secure all doors



Find out if you live in an evacuation zone; Have a go bag for supplies; Follow evacuation orders if given; Plan several routes; Plan for your pets



Help Your Neighbor after the storm passes; Help your neighbors evacuate

Get An Insurance Check[‡] Check with your homeowner's insurance agent; Know your policy; Keep documents with you



Complete A Written Plan

Have a contact list; Have at least one contact outside of the impact area; Keep critical documents together for quick access; Share your plan
