Subject: City of Durham proposed fee adoption

The State of Oregon Building Codes Division (division) has received the enclosed notice of intent to adopt building inspection program fees from the City of Durham. Pursuant to Oregon Administrative Rule 918-020-0220, municipalities seeking to adopt fees are required to provide all the following summary information 45 days prior to the proposed adoptive date.

- A. The affected specialty code or program areas.
- B. A description of the proposed building inspection program fees including the approximate percentage change when applicable.
- C. The proposed effective date.
- D. The date of the last fee increase in the specialty code or program area if applicable.
- E. The anticipated date, time and location of the local municipal hearing scheduled pursuant to Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 294.160.
- F. The name, phone number and title of a contact person.
- G. A narrative explaining the purpose of the proposed fee adoption.

The division is required to notify interested parties after receiving a notice of intent to adopt building inspection program fees from a municipality. Enclosed is the information provided to the division pursuant to the above administrative rule requirements.

RE: Proposed Adoption of Building Permit Fee Increase

To Whom It May Concern:

Please accept this as notification that in accordance with Oregon Administrative Rule 918-020-0220, the City of Durham is notifying the Building Codes Division of a proposed adoption of fees. The purpose of the fee increase is to comply with our Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Tualatin to provide building plan check and inspection services. Our IGA requires that Durham charge not less than those fees charged by the City of Tualatin for building services. The City of Tualatin has provided notice of its intent to increase fees, so Durham needs to adjust its fees within sixty days. Tualatin increased its fees to enable them to offset the inflationary increase in its building program costs and allow stable funding needed to maintain staffing required to enforce their program. Current revenue was not sufficiently supporting the building department. In addition, the proposed fee schedule change will modernize the currently adopted fee schedule to better align cost recovery and long-term financial goals to keep pace with rising costs.

- The last fee increase occurred in 2005.
- The fee schedule change will affect the following specialty code programs: Structural, Mechanical, and Plumbing.
- The average increases for specialty code programs with increases and newly implemented fees are: Structural program increase 32%, Mechanical program increase 38% and Plumbing program increase 98%.
- Included in the proposal are the following:
 - o An increase in structural plan review fee from 65% to 70% of the building permit fee.
 - A 5% yearly fee indexing beginning July 2024 and running until July 2028.
 - A 3% technology fee.
 - A 3% electronic transaction fee.
 - o A pre-submittal fee of \$100.00.
 - o A building re-evaluation fee of a minimum of 2 hours of plan review time.
 - A permit extension fee of \$100.00.
 - A change of contractor fee of \$100.00
 - The establishment of a revised fee schedule for solar and wind in alignment with State of Oregon OAR 918-050-0180 fee methodology amendments.
 - An increase in the temporary certificate of occupancy fee from \$100.00/30 days to \$300.00/30 days.

- An increase in inspections outside of normal business hours from \$60.00/hour to \$100.00/hour.
- o An increase in re-inspection fees from \$60.00/hour to \$100.00/hour.
- An increase in inspections for which no fee is specifically indicated from \$60.00/hour to \$100.00/hour.
- Additional plan review service increase from \$60.00/hour to \$100.00/hour with a minimum of 1 hour of time assessed.
- o An increase in the minimum phased plan review fee from \$300.00 to \$360.00.
- An increase in the minimum deferred submittal fee from \$300.00 to \$360.00.
- An increase in the stand-alone residential permitting fees doubling the current fees.
- o The addition of a manufactured dwelling placement permit to the fee schedule.
- The new fee increase will become effective on November 1, 2023.
- Attached is the proposed fee schedule change compared to the City's current, adopted fee schedules.

A public hearing will be held at 7:30 p.m. on October 24, 2023 at the regularly scheduled City Council meeting. This notice is provided pursuant to the notification requirements of OAR 918-020-0220 and ORS 455.210.

Solar Structural Installation Permits per OAR 918-050-180:

Prescriptive path (as described in the Oregon Solar Installation Specialty Code, Flat fee that includes plan review): All other installations are considered non-prescriptive and shall be based on the valuation of the structural elements for the solar elements for the solar panels, including racking, mounting elements, rails, and the cost of labor to install. The cost of the solar electrical equipment, including collector panels, and inverters shall be excluded from the permit valuation. The valuation shall be applied to the structural permit fee schedule. The standard plan review fee will be added to the permit.

Phased Projects:

There shall be a minimum plan review phasing fee of \$360.00 \$300.00 for each separate phased portion of the project. In addition, a plan review phasing fee shall be charged in an amount equal to ten percent of the total project building permit fee calculated in accordance with OAR 9198-050-100 through 110 not to exceed an additional \$1,500.00 for each phase.

Deferred Submittals: The plan review fee for processing deferred plan submittals shall be an amount equal to 65 percent of the building permit fee calculated in accordance with OAR 918-050-110 (2) and (3) using the value of the particular deferred portion of the project with a minimum fee of \$360.00 \$300.00. This fee is in addition to the project plan review fee based on total project value.

Permit Valuation Methodology: The Permit Valuation methodology is mandated by the State of Oregon in OAR 918-050- 0100. A structural permit fee for new construction and additions shall be calculated using the currently adopted ICC Building Valuation Data Table, using the occupancy and construction type as determined by the building official, multiplied by the square footage of the structure. The square footage of a building, addition, or garage shall be determined from outside exterior wall to outside exterior wall for each level. The valuation used will be the greater of either the above calculated value or the value as stated by the applicant. A structural permit fee for alterations or repair shall be based on the fair market value of the permitted work as determined by the building official and defined below.

Fair Market Value: The Fair market Value to be used in computing the permit fee for alterations and repair shall be the total value of all construction work for which the permit is issued, as well as all finish work, painting, roofing, electrical, plumbing, heating, air conditioning, elevators, fire extinguishing systems and other permanent work or equipment, and contractor's profit.

Manufactured Dwelling Placement - Includes the concrete slab, runners or foundations that are prescriptive, electrical feeder and plumbing connections and all cross-over connections and up to 30 lineal feet of site utilities. Decks, other accessory structures, and foundations that are not prescriptive, utility connections beyond 30 lineal feet, new electrical services or additional branch circuits, and new plumbing - may require separate permits. All

decks 30" above ground, carports, garages, porches, and patios are based on valuation and may also require separate permits.

ORS 446.176(1) and OAR 918-5000105 require all local governments providing construction permits or inspections for manufactured dwelling and cabana installations to collect and remit to the Department of Consumer and Business Services a \$30 fee for each installation permit issued. This fee is to be added to manufactured dwelling and cabana installation permits only and should not be added to accessory structures or building, electrical, plumbing, mechanical permits or plan reviews.

Structural, mechanical, and plumbing designated permit fees will be automatically adjusted annually by 5% each July 1st through 2028 based on the Engineering News – Record Construction Cost Index (20-city average) published April 1. Valuations will be calculated in accordance with OAR 918-050-010, with calculated amounts is rounded to the nearest whole dollar.

History

The Oregon Solar Installation Specialty Code (OSISC) was integrated into the Oregon Structural Specialty Code (OSSC) in 2015 and is no longer a published code. This rule and the OSSC address statewide methodology for solar structural installation permits and the rule language needs to be updated to align with current code language and references. The Building Codes Structures Board served as a Rulemaking Advisory Committee and met on Aug. 3, 2022 to discuss these proposed amendments. The board reviewed the draft amendments and approved them for rulemaking.

STATEMENT IDENTIFYING HOW ADOPTION OF RULE(S) WILL AFFECT RACIAL EQUITY IN THIS STATE

There is no anticipated impact on racial equity in Oregon, but the agency welcomes input about any potential impacts. There will be additional opportunity for public comment at the rulemaking hearing on September 20, 2022.

FISCAL AND ECONOMIC IMPACT:

Effective April 1, 2015, the Oregon Solar Installation Specialty Code (OSISC) was integrated into the Oregon Structural Specialty Code (OSSC) as an Oregon amendment and has been adopted as part of the OSSC in every edition thereafter.

The Statewide Methodology for Solar Structural Installation Permits rule will be updated to reflect the current OSSC. The Building Codes Structures Board (BCSB) reviewed and approved the rule amendments. These changes align rule language with existing code language and references, and do not change any existing permit fees. Permit fees are determined using the statewide methodology applied to a local fee schedule. The division is not aware of any jurisdictions that were relying on the outdated references in the rule, and any updates to the rule should not result in a change to current permit fees assessed by local jurisdictions. The BCSB considered the fiscal and economic implications as well. The division, with the support of the BCSB, anticipates nominal fiscal and economic impact due to the rule amendment.

COST OF COMPLIANCE:

(1) Identify any state agencies, units of local government, and members of the public likely to be economically affected by the rule(s). (2) Effect on Small Businesses: (a) Estimate the number and type of small businesses subject to the rule(s); (b) Describe the expected reporting, recordkeeping and administrative activities and cost required to comply with the rule(s); (c) Estimate the cost of professional services, equipment supplies, labor and increased administration required to comply with the rule(s).

Statement of cost of compliance:

- 1. Impact on state agencies, units of local government and the public (ORS 183.335(2)(b)(E)): If a local government was relying on the outdated language in the rule, some minimal cost may be required to update forms or other permit application materials. Contractors and other members of the public who purchase structural solar permits may be impacted if projects are located in a jurisdiction that was relying on the outdated references in the rule. The division does not directly set local permit fees and there should be no change to the calculated permit fees based on these rule updates.
- 2. Cost of compliance effect on small business (ORS 183.336):
- a. Estimate the number of small businesses and types of business and industries with small businesses subject to the rule:

Small businesses that purchase structural solar permits in jurisdictions that are using the old methodology could potentially be impacted. The division is not aware of any jurisdictions using the outdated references in the rule. The division also is not responsible for selling permits in local jurisdictions and does not track the number of businesses involved in the purchase of structural solar permits and is unable to provide an estimate of the number of businesses impacted.

b. Projected reporting, recordkeeping and other administrative activities required for compliance, including costs of professional services:

Small businesses are not projected to have any changes to reporting, recordkeeping or other administrative compliance costs for this rule. Permits are sold and administered by local jurisdictions.

c. Equipment, supplies, labor and increased administration required for compliance:

No changes to equipment, supplies, labor or administration are anticipated for compliance. Permits are sold and administered by local jurisdictions.

DESCRIBE HOW SMALL BUSINESSES WERE INVOLVED IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THESE RULE(S):

Small business owners are represented on the Oregon Building Codes Structures Board (BCSB), which was used as the RAC for this rulemaking. There was opportunity for public comment at the BCSB meeting on August 3, 2022. There will be additional opportunity for public comment at the rulemaking hearing on September 20, 2022.

RULE SUMMARY: The amendments to OAR 918-050-0180, Statewide Methodology for Solar Structural Installation Permits, will align the rule with the current and upcoming Oregon Structural Specialty Code (OSSC). This rule and the OSSC address statewide methodology for solar structural installation permits and the rule language needs to be updated to align with current code language and references.

CHANGES TO RULE:

918-050-0180

Statewide Methodology for Solar Structural Installation Permits ¶

- (1) Structural permits for solar photovoltaic (PV) system installation shall be calculated using the following methodology:¶
- (a) Fees for installations that comply with the prescriptive <u>installation</u> path described in <u>section 305.4 of the Oregon Solar Installation Specialty Cthe state building code</u> shall be a flat fee and includes one inspection and permit review by the municipality-as defined in section 105.1 of the Oregon Solar Installation Specialty Code.¶ (b)(A) All other installations.¶
- (b)(A) All other installations not meeting the prescriptive path shall be based on the valuation of the structural elements for the solar panels, including racking, mounting elements, rails, and the cost of labor to install. The cost of the solar electrical equipment, including collector panels, and inverters shall be excluded from the structural permit valuation. The valuation shall then be applied to the municipality's fee schedule to determine the permit fee. ¶
- (B) Plan review fees shall be based on a predetermined percentage of the permit fee set by the municipality.¶ (2) Electrical components of a PV system require an electrical permit. Electrical permits shall be calculated based on the methodology established in OAR 918-309-0020 through 918-309-0070.
