


Our Mission

Making a Difference

Thanks to the many donations of time and financial resources, your Oshkosh Area Community Foundation is able to lead the way on a myriad of projects and programs that support our four major pillars of community impact. Four such examples are abbreviated here for you.

Economic Development

Oshkosh is in the midst of another economic boom, the likes of which our city hasn't seen since the milling days. In order to capitalize on this momentum leaders throughout the community representing education, development, city management, and more have all banded together foster one common positive message for the city. Known simply as the Oshkosh Image Campaign, this 3-year project serves to elevate stories of the quality of life we live as residents of Oshkosh through a wide variety of media outlets.

Housing/Neighborhoods

Oshkosh4Education's "Project CURB" was one of the largest neighborhood projects of 2017. Led by Chairperson Beth Wyman, Project CURB raised nearly \$200,000 in donations and in-kind contributions. While much of the contractor work was done ahead of time, over 600 community volunteers came out the morning of Saturday, September 23rd to donate their time to enhance the curb


appeal of all of Oshkosh's public schools. Improvements included new landscaping, fresh paint, baseball diamonds, playground equipment, benches, flower pots, trees and more!

Education

The new Reader's Cafe Student Literacy Intervention programs at the Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh are increasing reading confidence, fluency, and proficiency for club members who are experiencing academic challenges with reading. Low literacy skills are being improved through tutoring, readers theaters, choral reading, and book clubs. This collaboration between the Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh and the Winnebago County Literacy Council showcases just how fun reading can be once students have the support they need to thrive.


Health & Wellness

ENDOWMENTS ARE FOREVER

An endowment speaks to the future of a community and the desire of people in the present to make sure that generations are ensured the same or better quality of life. People make donations to an endowment and the funds are invested with growth as a goal. From the income, grants are made. The principle of the gift always remains intact.

The Three-Legged Stool

How Endowments Support the Organizations that We Love

"Fundraising is a three-legged stool between annual campaigns, capital campaigns, and endowment building," remarked Tom Blaze, President & CEO of the Oshkosh YMCA, as he pondered the importance of endowments. "Of those three, the endowment building gets the least attention, almost as an afterthought, but just like the other two legs it's vital to keeping an organization upright."

"Endowments are a permanent fund. They are a source of income that will help us tend to projects that would otherwise be difficult to find funding for."

"For example, there was a year when we needed to replace the indoor soccer arena turf at the 20th Avenue YMCA for over one hundred thousand dollars. Thanks to the endowment we were able to fill this need without having to campaign for it," said Tom.

Endowment development is easy to put on the back burner because there can be more pressing things that come up, but endowments are crucial to the future of the YMCA.

While Tom is grateful to be leading the organization with its current endowment, noting that many organizations don't have any at all to speak of, he has his sights set on growing their endowment threefold over course of the next decade.

"I think most people understand the importance of endowments. In many cases the donors simply don't know that we need it. Bricks and mortar and other tangible things are relatively easy to raise funds for. People like to literally see what their dollars are going toward shortly after they are given. Endowment building takes much more foresight."

"The YMCA is a member organization. Just because many of our members give to our annual campaign doesn't necessarily mean they're planning ahead to give to a long-term endowment, or consider us in a bequest. Those decisions come about through years of relationship building, and I think that's something that we do well."

Where individual capacity and passion meet, endowments are born. This is what supports the long-term sustainability of an organization, and what allows us to impact our community. For good. For ever.

William Waters Plaza A Private/Public Masterpiece

Several decades ago State Street terminated at the stairs of the Oshkosh Public Library on Washington Avenue. As city engineers sought to alleviate an awkward series of short turns to get from State Street to Jefferson Street, the roads were re-worked to meet directly, and thus a small triangle of land was created in front of the library. Shortly after that, the Rotary clubs partnered with the city to enhance the space with pavement, seating, and a dedication.

It's no surprise that the Community Foundation gravitates to these kind of projects. The longevity of a private/public partnership ensures that whatever is being worked on will be a gem for the community for years to come. We've seen it with the Leach Amphitheater and the Grand Opera House Square (among many others), and now we see it again with William Waters Plaza.

"River East Neighborhood came to us and asked 'can we please partner and do something extraordinary here,'" said Alexa Naudziunas, Assistant Planner for Community Development for the City of Oshkosh. It was a perfect fit for our long-term strategic plan."

Time and time again these goals align with the nature of your Oshkosh Area Community Foundation. "The key word here is neighborhoods," remarked Naudziunas. "The plaza is truly geared to be a place to draw traffic. With the renovation of The Howard, the YMCA, the historic apartments and even Washington Avenue itself, the plaza could be a major hub for foot traffic and community use.

> With downtown Main Street on one end and The Waters at the other, Washington Avenue is a pathway through history featuring prominent architecture by William Waters, who designed over 150 buildings throughout our community."

"When the city partnered with the Foundation in 2016 to provide support for the project, we never could have imagined how well it would be received," noted Naudziunas.

The new and improved William Waters Plaza is expected to be finished concurrently with the improvements to Washington Avenue in the latter half of 2018. Neighborhood residents and our entire community can take pride in knowing that their private/public partnership made a mark that will last. For **good**. For **ever**.

"Philanthropy is just really fun!" said Jim Stapel, President of Kitz & Pfeil Hardware. "It's about so much more than money. If you're blessed with something to give away, you end up gaining back so much in return." The Stapel family's charitable giving includes scholarships for organists and nurses, various religious donations, support for Rotary International, and more.

Kitz & Pfeil was started in 1913 by Joseph H. Kitz and Charles E. Pfeil. They purchased a 2000 sq. ft. sporting goods store in what is now 451 N. Main Street. In 1949 the store was sold to Art & Marie Stapel, thus starting the family business that we know today.

"A friend of mine from Kansas who owns a chain of True Value stores came up to see our business once," said Jim Stapel. "He said 'you probably don't know what you have here in downtown Oshkosh. It's amazing that you've been able to keep your downtown with its historic buildings and vibrant community going.""

True to their mantra that philanthropy is about more than just being financially charitable, as buildings from the Time Theater down to Church Avenue became available, Jim's dad would purchase them. Afterwards, they were rented out at generous rates so that others could try their hand at business. As Jim puts it, "Downtown has been really good to our family, and we'd like to see others get that chance too."

"My family loves what we do. Dad would joke that he only worked half days (meaning 7AM to 7PM), and that would always make folks smile," Jim recalled.

"In the '50s and '60s my dad spent a lot of time working with business owners along Main Street to make sure their businesses could keep going. That gift of my dad's knowledge, skills, and time to make sure they were successful – that was real philanthropy."

The entire Stapel family wishes to express their gratitude to their customers and fellow business owners over the last nearly seven decades. "That's one of the exciting things about downtown Oshkosh – some of the businesses are intergenerational – you've worked with the same people, you've known the same people, you've had the same neighbors - that's really special. You help each other out like a neighbor should."

"Philanthropy is so much more than just giving money," proclaimed Jim one last time. "If we all give of our time, talent, and treasure in service above self, there's no limit to what our community can accomplish." For **good**. For **ever**.
