

Investing In Our Communities: Progress

Thanks to many gifts of time and financial resources, we are making progress to address unmet needs and improve the quality of life in our communities.

Oshkosh Community YMCA Bridge to the Future: After a decade of revitalization in Oshkosh's downtown, the Foundation is proud to have provided a \$1 million grant to the Oshkosh Community YMCA's capital campaign to renovate its downtown facility. The Foundation's support for this project addresses not only the need for a welcoming, accessible social hub in our downtown region now and for generations to come, but also helps this longstanding institution meet the needs of its customers.

Neighborhood Grants Program: Through a strong partnership with the City of Oshkosh, the co-investment with individual donors and gifts to the Taking Root Fund, the Foundation provided \$100,000 in support for healthy neighborhood initiatives. Leveraged with nearly \$150,000 in support from the city's capital improvement budget, grants were awarded in 2016 to support beautification projects spearheaded by numerous neighborhood associations.

Mental Health, Wellness: The prevalence of mental health and behavioral health issues facing our communities demands a multipronged approach across sectors. The Foundation was proud to provide financial resources to support the following initiatives:

Wellness Screening: Samaritan Counseling Center of the Fox Valley expanded emotional wellness screening to high school students in Oshkosh, Omro and Winneconne.

Catalpa Health: Increased access to mental health therapy for children and their families through expansion of the Oshkosh treatment center and a new partnership with the Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh.


Substance Abuse/Crime Prevention:

Oshkosh police gained mental health training programs and investigation equipment to help in the fight against the heroin epidemic. Alcohol and drug prevention programming from Party. O expanded its reach.


Taking Root, A Campaign to Beautify Oshkosh: Five new welcome signs at the major highway entrances to the city of Oshkosh greet visitors and residents alike with a healthy dose of community pride. The 12- to 14-foot lighted signs were funded by the Taking Root Fund, a beautification effort that began in 2010.

In addition to the signs, the public-private partnership with the City of Oshkosh has resulted in the planting of 3,000 trees in public spaces throughout the city, as well as landscaping in city parks and other properties.

Roots Run Deep

Donation of farm land gives opportunity to continue, grow family's charitable legacy

As a child, Marianne Ivey remembers wading in a small stream and admiring the webs of garden spiders under willow trees on her family's farm land along County Road E in Omro. Her father, Bert Formiller, taught her to love this land, where she and generations of her mother's family were raised. The stream and willows were such a special memory, Marianne had an Oshkosh artist create a painting of them. "I always will find a place for it, wherever we live," says Marianne.

Life is about change. With the passing of Marianne's mother, Virginia Formiller in 2008, a few decisions were left to be made. She and her brother John, each with careers and children in other states, were unlikely to return to the family homestead. With careful planning and expert advice, the land was gifted to the Foundation and later was sold to a local farming family. The proceeds from the sale created the Marianne and Tom Ivey Charitable Fund, a Donor Advised Fund.

This common form of charitable giving allows the donor to lessen their income tax while providing an opportunity to give back to their community. The expert advice from attorneys, advisors and the Foundation was helpful, Marianne says, though it was still difficult to let the property go.

Her parents' families have deep roots in the Oshkosh area. Bert, a World War II veteran and recipient of the Purple Heart, purchased the farm from Virginia's father, William Sipple. The land abstract shows that William and his brother John purchased the property from their mother, Marianne says. Bert's family lived in the Berlin and Winneconne area, where there is a road bearing the Formiller name.

"I believe in giving back and I think my mother certainly did. She took the first step," says Marianne. "We will continue to honor what has been important to our family for a long time."

Virginia Formiller paved the family's path in philanthropy years before the land was gifted when she created the Virginia Formiller Family Scholarship, which benefits Omro High School students entering education, health care or social service fields. Virginia was a beloved educator for 40 years in Oshkosh and Omro.

"My mother was a dedicated educator," says Marianne. "She really cared for her students and they for her. I think some of her students depended on her for advice and as a stable adult in their lives when things were hectic in their own homes."

Virginia emphasized the importance of education to her children. Marianne and John both achieved college degrees – Marianne becoming a pharmacist and John a social worker.

Marianne, now retired, and her husband, Tom, a retired physician, plan to use their charitable fund to honor their family's values.

Giving Just Comes Naturally

Youngwirths build legacy of community support

Back in the day when Wayne and Suzanne Youngwirth were youngsters in Oshkosh, a strong work ethic was something people celebrated. The upbringing they experienced has instilled in them a drive to do well for themselves and for their community. It's something that just comes naturally.

"That's what makes life go 'round," says Suzanne, a retired nurse. "We have gotten a lot from this community, and we give back."

Throughout their 38 years together, the Youngwirths have given generously of their time through community organizations and programs. The Wayne and Suzanne Youngwirth Endowment Fund, a Donor Advised Fund, allows the couple to provide financial resources to charitable causes they're passionate about – things like downtown revitalization and youth mentoring. The Youngwirths built the fund over time, starting from an Acorn Fund in 1996 (the Foundation's first).

Through their estate plan, the Youngwirths' have directed a large portion of their investment portfolio to be gifted to the Fund after they're gone, ensuring their legacy of support will continue.

"I just love Oshkosh and I love the history," says Wayne, a manufacturing representative with his firm Youngwirth & Associates. "I've traveled extensively for years, including Europe. We have had several opportunities to leave, but we're staying."

The Youngwirth (originally spelled Jungwirth) family immigrated from Bohemia (Czech Republic). Wayne's great-grandfather sanded caskets at the Buckstaff Co. while his great-grandmother tended to a brood of 17 children. Wayne's grandfather, Frank "Butch" Youngwirth, was the oldest. A tall, intimidating man, Butch amassed a fortune as a bootlegger during the Prohibition era, running at least six taverns in Oshkosh. He gambled his earnings away and died penniless, Wayne says.

Wayne's father chose the opposite path in life, working as a janitor in Oshkosh schools in addition to a myriad of side jobs. "I grew up on the South Side, where everyone went to work at 7 and came home at $3:30,^{\prime\prime}$ says Wayne. "My dad was home every night. We lived in a very nice house, very well kept up and he taught us principles, that work was part of the social fabric.

Each of the children had jobs from an early age. They were paid for their work, but Wayne's father insisted that 50 percent went into savings. "At age 16, you got that money," says Wayne. "I still have mine – it's buried somewhere in my investments."

Wayne believes strongly that his upbringing led to his success, and the success of each of his siblings, several of whom have owned their own businesses and are sought after experts in their fields.

He and Suzanne are proud to invest in the community that has given so much to them. "You always want your hometown to do well," Wayne says.

Credit Where Credit is Due

Heaney's philanthropy recognizes family, friends who shaped his upbringing

Bill Heaney could be described as a conversationalist and a thoughtful academic, whose mind is an encyclopedic treasure of historical nuggets. Heaney is an anthropologist who has traveled the world for his research and taught at universities in the United States and abroad. As a member of a three-generation Oshkosh newspaper family, he has never lost touch with his hometown.

He credits his upbringing with influencing his worldly curiosity and desire to help others. Heaney is an advisor to the Heaney Family Fund, the foundation's first Donor Advised Fund, created in 1995. Recently, he has created funds to honor individuals who influenced his youth.

"Where I benefited most was from the city itself – be it the teachers or police or neighbors or schoolmates... I remember it fondly. Wherever I've been, and I've been overseas and traveled a bit, I've always felt that way."

His roots in the community, and with the Foundation, are intertwined with their histories. Heaney's grandfather, Oscar J. Hardy, was a long-time publisher of the Oshkosh Daily Northwestern, the city's daily newspaper, founded in 1860. Hardy, a paperboy who caught the attention of owner Col. John Hicks, moved up through the ranks and took over the paper after Hicks' death in 1917. Hardy was one of 10 forward-minded community leaders who created the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation in 1928.

Heaney's father, Samuel, was in medical school when Hardy, his fatherin-law, asked him to join the newspaper business. Samuel moved to Oshkosh in 1948 with his wife, Susan, and Bill, then a toddler (a second child, Curtis, came shortly after), to run the Northwestern with A. Thomas Schwalm until it was sold in 1998.


Memories of life in Oshkosh have inspired Heaney's philanthropy. He has created funds to honor:

Oscar and Gertrude Hardy – Heaney's grandparents. "(Oscar) built the Oshkosh Northwestern building in the midst of the Depression to show his support for and his belief in the local economy. I am very proud of him for what he accomplished," says Heaney.

Ruth Kossel – a practical nurse who watched after Bill and Curtis, and became a lifelong family friend "who taught us both to respect every persons' individual character and to show respect for their personal dignity," he says.

Norbert and Hope Vette – the Heaneys' neighbors on Hazel Street and owners of Vette's Sportshop. "Having a sporting goods store virtually next door, was a dream-come-true for a young man aged 5 to 12," says Heaney.

Heaney says that through his philanthropy, he is "saying thank you for the lifelong skills, interests and awareness that family friends have given me, not only pride and a sense of belonging ... but also the foundation for the kind of persons we've all become."
