We strengthen our communities through collaboration and partnership with donors and others to ensure lasting impact and to improve the quality of life for perpetuity.

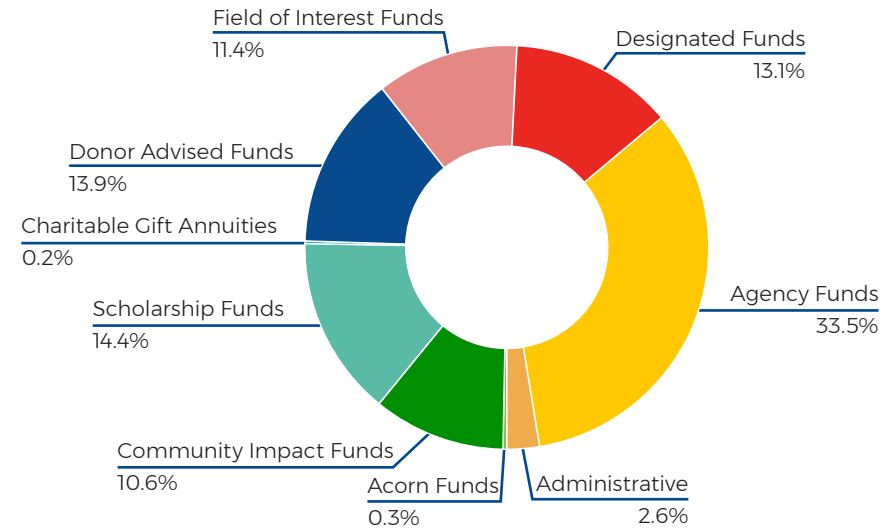
We steward the funds of our donors and connect them to important projects in our community in order to see their philanthropic dreams come to life.



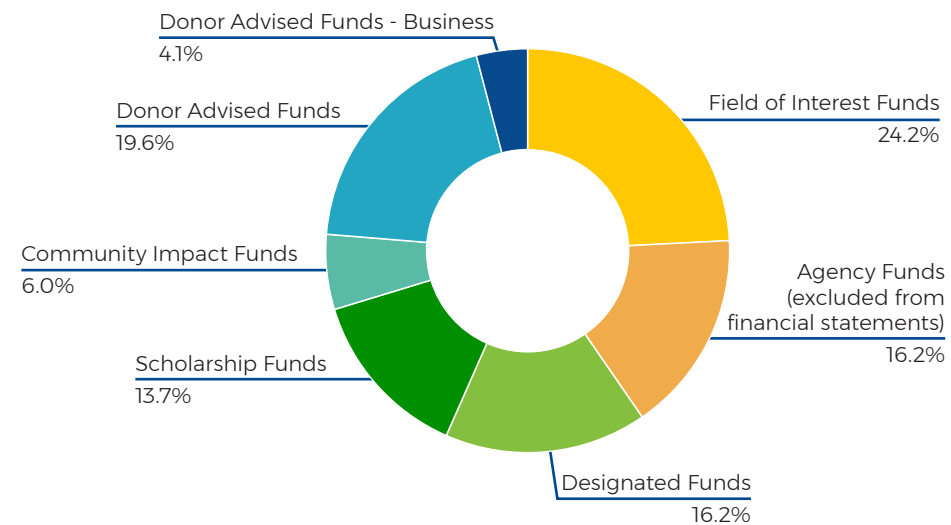

TOTAL ASSETS \$118,580,454



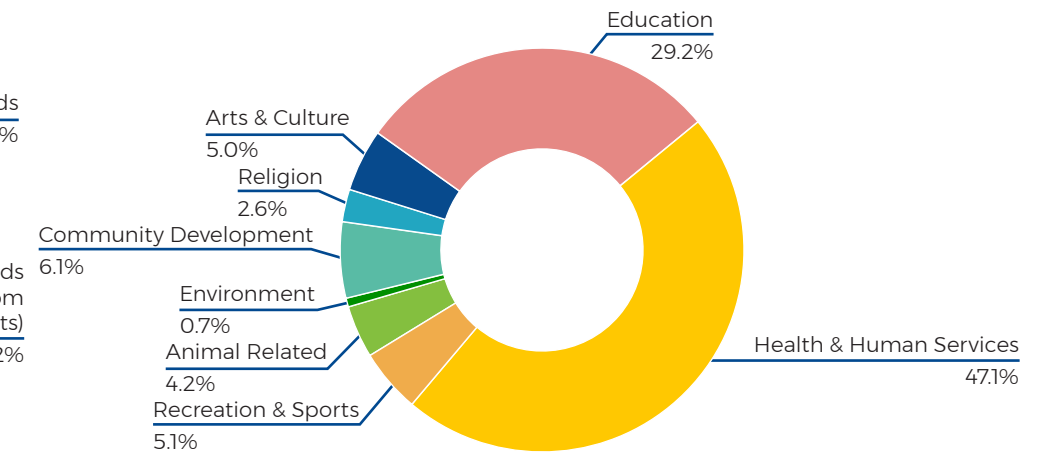
GRANTS BY FUND TYPE \$5,352,522

FIELD OF DREAMS

Young Philanthropist Builds New Ball Diamond for Community

Becoming a philanthropist has no age restrictions. All you need is determination, passion and the right partners to help you. For Sydney Supple of Oshkosh, she already had the determination and passion, and with the help of community partners, she turned her dream of building a softball diamond into a reality.

The vision for the softball diamond blossomed from the \$1,000 award Sydney received for being named the Gatorade Player of the Year during her sophomore year of high school, an award she would earn the following two years as well. That “seed money” inspired Sydney to give back to her community and provide a facility for all to use to help achieve their dreams. Sydney had played on nearly every softball diamond in Oshkosh but none would measure up to the vision she had.

Sydney started fundraising for her “field of dreams” when she was just a junior at Oshkosh North High School. She ran lemonade stands and sent out nearly 500 letters to local businesses asking for support. Little by little the funds started coming in. Through matching donations from the James J. and Rosanne C. Keller Family Foundation Inc., gifts from community donors and guidance from the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation, Sydney raised \$110,000 to build the field, with an additional \$10,000 set aside to cover the field’s maintenance for the first few years.

At the official ribbon cutting ceremony for the field in fall of 2019, Sydney was surrounded by those who helped her get to that moment. Sydney used this opportunity to host a pitching clinic for young girls in the community.

Karlene Grabner, Director of Donor Services for the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation, along with Oshkosh Parks Department Director Ray Maurer, coached Sydney in leading this project, which was a first for the Foundation. A young adult had never come into the Foundation with such big aspirations before, but with the positive encouragement and guidance from those around her, Sydney was able to accomplish her dream.

With skilled staff and passionate donors, the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation was able to assist this young philanthropist in achieving her goals. As witnessed from Sydney, it doesn’t matter your age, your income, or future endeavors, anyone can make a difference now, and for the future of their community.

“Those young girls have been looking up to Sydney for the last three years. She is not only a great role model for the sport of softball, but also for future philanthropists. She is instilling in these young girls that anything is achievable if you are willing to put the dedication and time into it,”

says Grabner.



BRINGING LOVED ONES HOME

Project Lifesaver Offers Caregivers a Peace of Mind

In a matter of minutes, your loved one could have wandered off and the immediate feeling of panic sets in. You instinctively call 911 who start their search at the last location your loved one was seen, but in that amount of time your loved one could be miles away.

For individuals enrolled in Project Lifesaver, a transmitter is placed on their wrist or ankle, which sends out a signal every second, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. If the participant goes missing, the caregiver immediately calls the Oshkosh Police Department, which responds to the last known location of the individual and uses radio frequency technology to locate the unique signal from the transmitter.

This program is specifically designed for those diagnosed with a cognitive impairment that hinders their decision making ability, putting them at risk to wander unintentionally and get lost. These diagnoses can include Alzheimer's, dementia or autism. Project Lifesaver can give caregivers peace of mind knowing

their loved one can be tracked should they wander.

In 2017, 73 year old Tom Werner wandered away from his home. "The first time he wandered he was gone four-and-a-half hours. We had no idea where he was. It was horrifying," says Tom's wife Lorel.

Tom was then enrolled in Project Lifesaver and given the special tracking bracelet. "The second time he wandered, he was only gone 16 minutes before they found him,"

says Werner.

Todd Wrage, Sergeant of Police for the City of Oshkosh, has been leading Project Lifesaver since its inception. Having a son with autism gives Sergeant Wrage a unique perspective and understanding when working with people with cognitive disabilities and their caregivers. Sergeant Wrage meets monthly with the participants and their caregivers to

replace batteries, inspect the transmitter and see how things are going. He works closely with the Aging & Disability Resource Center (ADRC) of Winnebago County to refer people to the great programs offered in the community for those with dementia or Alzheimer's.

The barrier of Project Lifesaver is it is only accessible to those living within the host entity's jurisdiction. Along with Oshkosh, Grand Chute Fire Department is the only entity in our area to use Project Lifesaver. This program is open to other organizations in the county that could partner with the Oshkosh Police Department for a one-time fee of \$1,000. Establishing this program in your community could mean the difference between life and death for your loved one.

Rebecca Groleau, Dementia Care Specialist for Winnebago County, provides support, resources and programs designed especially for dementia and Alzheimer's clients and their caregivers. It is estimated that over 3,300 people will have Alzheimer's or dementia by 2020 in Winnebago County alone. The Oshkosh police have seen an increase in calls relating to individuals with dementia in the past year as well.

The Oshkosh community hosts a variety of programs where people with dementia can remain active and safe, and their caregivers feel supported. Memory Cafes, offered at the Oshkosh Public Library and 20th YMCA once a month, offer socialization and participation in activities with others who have concerns about their memory. The Paine Art Center and Gardens plays host to SPARK!, a cultural program for people with early to mid-stage memory loss and their caregivers to experience art, culture and nature.

Rebecca is also eager to launch a new program, Active Minds, in Oshkosh. A successful program already established in Appleton, Active Minds is a personal learning experience designed to fit the needs of those with early to mild stage dementia. Not only does this program provide an educational component, it also provides respite for the caregiver to leave their loved one in good hands for a few hours so they can rest, relax and rejuvenate. The only barrier to starting this program is getting more participants. If you are interested in participating in any of the dementia programs, contact Rebecca Groleau at the ADRC.

As the number of people diagnosed with dementia and Alzheimer's increases in our area, the need for programs and support for those programs will increase as well. Many of the programs in Oshkosh are offered for free to the client and caregiver, so financial support from other sources is needed. Programs like the Memory Cafes and respite care have received funding from donor support. The Dementia Awareness Fund at the Foundation was established by a gentleman with a long family history of dementia. Due to his own experience with his father's wandering, he chose to support Project Lifesaver for the City of Oshkosh. He also supports the expansion of the program to other areas in Winnebago County.

The Dementia Awareness Fund is one of the many examples at the Foundation of donors who have established funds to support causes and programs they care about most. Whether it's dementia, animals, community development, or the arts, the Foundation is here to help bring your philanthropic goals to life.

INCREASING SOCIAL IMPACT

InterSector Connects Nonprofits with Business Talent

Tight budgets, limited resources and multi-tasking staff are the reality for many nonprofit organizations. To fully understand the extent of these issues, J. J. Keller Foundation Executive Director Heidi Dusek and U.S. Venture/Schmidt Family Foundation Executive Director Greg Vandenberg conducted empathy interviews with nonprofit executive directors. These leaders expressed the need for specialty or skilled resources in IT, human resources, legal matters, marketing, finance, and facilities. From this, InterSector was born to connect nonprofits with business talent and services to increase social impact together with assistance from founding investor, the J.J. Keller Foundation.



Eleven nonprofits participated in initial prototype testing. Nearly 40 volunteers from 12 employer partners put their professional skills to work completing HR, IT and marketing projects. Half of the projects focused on HR needs.

Many successes arose from the prototype testing, including support for the merger between Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Fox Valley Region and Best Friends of Neenah Menasha. To merge two well-established organizations is no easy task. Assistance from InterSector and Oshkosh Corp. smoothed the transition, aided by a community impact grant and a Basic Needs Giving Partnership grant from the Foundation.

Oshkosh Corp. volunteers worked side by side with both nonprofit organizations in evaluating their organizational charts and job descriptions. Oshkosh Corp. also completed a wage and compensation analysis and most recently put together a newly revised Employee Handbook. 8 employees from Oshkosh Corp. donated more than 100 hours of their time to assist in the project. It saved the nonprofits weeks of time and established a relationship that will extend past the project completion.

With the success of the prototype testing programs, and the demand for HR assistance in many nonprofits, InterSector will test a new model of

skilled volunteering: connecting a skilled volunteer “coach” with a nonprofit executive director. The pair will work together, with InterSector support, to develop a 12-month, project-based roadmap meant to move the nonprofit from one point to another. The hope is that this model will improve employee retention for nonprofits and for the employers of volunteers. It also can help create pipelines for future members of nonprofit boards.



In early November, the merged organizations came together in their new office to discuss the Employee Handbook created in partnership with Oshkosh Corp. Though the new space was void of furniture, chairs and decorations, the excitement and optimism from the group filled room.

This structure of capacity building will require philanthropy to be sustainable. Revenue may come in three forms: investment from the nonprofit receiving the services; investment from the business providing the skilled volunteer; and philanthropic investments. When our local nonprofits are supported and given opportunities to grow, the whole community is impacted for the better.

PARKS BUILD COMMUNITY

Oshkosh Parks Department Grows with Help From Philanthropy

Parks play a critical role in the physical, social and mental health of communities. In the City of Oshkosh, residents and visitors can explore over 40 parks and enjoy Pollock Community Waterpark, the Leach Amphitheater, and Menominee Park and Zoo. Many parks take advantage of the location on the western shore of Lake Winnebago with proximity to the Fox River and Lake Butte des Morts. Throughout the Oshkosh Parks, you'll find numerous boat launches, neighborhood parks, hiking and biking trails, playgrounds, and green space available for the community to enjoy.

Parks have become much more than a place to have a picnic or take a walk; the benefits of quality parks are numerous. Increases to property values and attracting top talent to live in the community are just a few of the economic values. Providing a space to stay active and connect with nature can lead to lower stress and a healthier lifestyle. Community parks offer gathering space and engagement opportunities that lead to social connectedness. Great parks are vitally important to establishing and maintaining the quality of life in a community.

The future of Oshkosh parks is bright thanks to the conscious efforts of the Parks Department and passionate donors. An endowment fund established by Mark Lohry, a frequent donor to the Foundation, is the cornerstone gift of the Oshkosh Parks Foundation Fund. The vision for the endowment is to support the Parks Department's efforts in operating, building, and maintaining our parks. The power of philanthropy will help promote the vision of exceptional parks that are a source of community pride and regional distinction. Donors passionate about building community through the parks will be directed to donate to this fund.

The effort to support and expand the park system in Oshkosh is already underway. The department is looking to form a forward-thinking leadership board that will help build the established endowment to fund the creation and maintenance of exceptional parks.

"The Oshkosh community deserves exceptional parks and this fund can make that happen," says Ray Maurer, City of Oshkosh Parks Director.

The fact of the matter is that extraordinary parks in Oshkosh are not feasible with just funding from city taxpayers. The need for public/private partnerships is growing not just for Oshkosh, but for communities around the country.

"For us in Oshkosh, utilizing public/private partnerships is the right way to build the future of Oshkosh parks," says Maurer.

Numerous projects in the parks department have been completed through public/private partnerships. The new community playground in Menominee Park was funded through city, service organization and donor contributions and offers community members a safe and modern playground for all ages and abilities to enjoy. The eagle exhibit at Menominee Park Zoo, expected to open in spring 2020, was entirely funded by donor support. The exhibit

"I started this fund because many cities have a Parks Foundation to support the city parks financially above and beyond tax dollars. I believe you have to start somewhere. I know people in Oshkosh support and are interested in city parks...it just takes someone to start the process,"

says Lohry.

will feature eagles that were injured, rescued and rehabilitated, and cannot be released back into the wild. Sydney Supple, a 2019 graduate of Oshkosh North High School and All-American softball player, raised over \$100,000 to renovate Rainbow Memorial Park ball field.

The parks department is committed to engaging community members in voicing their opinions on park projects. The newly installed Menominee Park community playground was chosen by local community members. Designs were created and presented to the community. Anyone could cast their vote for the design they liked best. By giving the community an opportunity to take ownership of this decision, they were able to feel and see the impact they made firsthand.

For residents who want to get more involved, joining your local neighborhood association is a great option. Currently, 18 neighborhood associations have been established in Oshkosh with the help of Greater

Oshkosh Healthy Neighborhoods. These voluntary organizations are made up of residents who work together to improve and maintain the quality of life in their neighborhoods. For associations looking to implement larger projects that require funding, grants are available through the city. Recently, the Menominee South Neighborhood Association applied for and received a grant to purchase outdoor fitness equipment. Pieces of the equipment will be placed in Menominee Park along Hazel Street to allow residents across the street at Bella Vista Assisted Living to use them. The remaining fitness equipment will be placed around the new community playground for parents and caregivers to use while still being able to view their children.
