

25th Annual National Night Out

The 25th Annual National Night Out (NNO), a unique crime / drug prevention event sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW), has been scheduled for Tuesday, August 5th. Last year's National Night Out campaign involved citizens, law enforcement agencies, civic groups, businesses, neighborhood organizations, and officials from over 10,000 communities from all 50 states. In all, **34 million** people participated in NNO in 2007, including Oshkosh.

National Night Out is designed to:

- Heighten crime and drug prevention awareness;
- Generate support for, and participation in, local anticrime programs
- Strengthen neighborhood spirit, and police-community partnerships;
- Send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

In 2007, National Night Out was held in Oshkosh for the first time, bringing together neighboods from across the city to South Park with an attendance of about 300. This year, Southwest Rotary is joining to help take this event to the next level.

Local organizers with the police department are planning a fishing contest and a 3 - On - 3 basketball tournament for all ages. They will also have a Jail and Bail, live music, and door prizes. Southwest Rotary has committed financial support of \$500 and is going to help grill and serve food (being provide at no cost to NNO participants – nothing like free food!!).
