
<u>WELCA Christmas Bake Sale and Sew in Love Sale</u> Saturday December 10th ORLC Great Room - 9am-Noon

Comfort Food Challenge Update

Thanks to everyone who helped prepare food, serve food, or attend the Comfort Food Challenge at our church in September. Family Promise raised just under \$15,000 that evening.

OUR ABUNDANT COMMUNITY GARDEN

Thanks to the efforts of our fearless leaders, Vicki Downhour and Karen Nelson, the community garden yielded abundant crops this season. Well over 1200 pounds of produce were donated to Helena Food Share. As we put the garden to rest for the winter, we are still amending the soil with leaves. Feel free to donate those leaves that you are raking up in your lawn. Bagged leaves may be left in the garden. Loose leaves may be left in the straw bale containment area. There is also a recycling container for leaf bag recycling. Feel free to take a bag or leave one.

Karen Nelson also recently presented a nutrition education event for AWARE families, using fresh produce from our garden. Four families attended, and one family expressed interest in securing a plot in our garden for the next season. All families went home with a bag of fresh vegetables to replicate the stir-fry recipe presented at this session. Thank you, Karen, for all your Master Gardener advice and assistance this year.

Outreach and Welcome Team

"To foster a culture of outreach and connection, we strive to invite and welcome all to join in experiencing God's healing, life-giving grace and in responding by worshiping and serving in Jesus' name." Outreach and Welcome Team mission statement

Viewed from one perspective, the world is overwhelmed with challenges, the vast majority of which we humans have created. But God offers a perspective of hope and promise. God invites us, as individuals and as the Church, to be partners in fulfilling that promise with the help of God's Spirit. To that end, Jesus gave the Church a unique and sacred task: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit..." Paul later asks, "But how are [people] to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim [Jesus and his gospel promise]?" Later still, the early reformers wrote: "For the Spirit enlightens and converts hearts through the Word that is proclaimed and heard, so that people believe the Word and say yes to it."

So our task is to **reach out to proclaim** and to **welcome and disciple**. Those complementary missions cover a lot of ground. Particular ways each of us can contribute at ORLC include: helping create and maintain a welcoming environment for visitors; learning how to reach people through modern communications technologies and then consistently using those tools; welcoming visitors before and after church services; sponsoring new members and helping them feel accepted and valued; leading classes. small groups, and events that provide opportunities for growth and connection; learning how to sincerely share your faith with others and inviting others to experience what brings you joy and peace; and making individuals who come to our church feel recognized and welcome.

Lynn called the meeting to order, and Pastor Trina opened with a brief devotion based on Romans 8:31-39. The Reverend Dr. David J. Lose will be using this passage on Installation Sunday, October 23, 2022.

Financial Report and Review

Beth reported that giving was down in September. Before paying the benevolence, we are at a positive cash balance of \$390.28. The building fund and council fund donations have not yet been sent to Mission Investments for September and we still owe Council Funds for June, July, and August donations. The total still owed for benevolence is \$6,253.87. Beth pointed out that the church Property Tax due at the end of November will be approximately \$15,000. Council decided to hold all funds.

Sarah provided estimated costs based on a range of Cost of Living Adjustments for staff. Council considered adjustments based on private sector, Social Security, and Synod suggestions. The proposed budget will be presented to the Congregation on November 20 for discussion and consideration.

There was also discussion about modifying the benevolence goals. Sarah calculated that we had given more than \$13,000 in gifts and materials to our local beneficiaries and \$2,500 to Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp beyond the 1% pledged in our spending plan. These figures do not take into account volunteer hours. Council recommends the 2023 spending plan eliminate the local beneficiaries and to designate \$500 to FLBC and 4% to the Synod.

Ministry reports

Pastor Trina reported that the new school year has brought an upswing in attendance in the last month and staff continues to evaluate worship each week looking for ways to improve the worshipping experience for all. The California Seminary is offering 5 congregations the opportunity to participate in a series of classes with a preaching professor - ORLC is one of those selected congregations. Two classes have been held so far.

Reports from the Preschool, Children's Ministry, Youth and Family Ministry, Worship and Music, the Hunger Team and the Outreach and Welcome Team all show a wide variety of active ministries.

Cody reported for the Property Development Team that the City and County are developing their grant requests. ORLC has submitted a letter of intent to apply and will respond to the Request for Proposals when they are issued, probably sometime this fall.

We are still waiting for a cost estimate for some better building signage, both interior and exterior.

The Audit Committee is working on the 2021 Year Report. Members have indicated that the office records are very well documented and organized. Thank you to Sarah and Lori.

New Business

Call Committee nominations have been submitted for the purpose of calling a new Associate Pastor. Lynn will contact those individuals to determine if they are willing and able to serve. Council will meet on Tuesday, November 1 at 6:00 p.m. to review names and establish the Call Committee. Council will also establish quidelines for the Call Committee to consider as they begin their work.

Council will have 5 vacancies next year: First Vice President, Second VP, Treasurer, and two At-large members. Cody, along with the out-going Council members, will begin to identify potential individuals. Kevin mentioned that we need to also look at the Committee memberships for vacancies.

Kevin asked that the Council sanction a Retreat Planning Working Group for the purpose of preparing for Congregational Council retreat to be held in February or March of 2023.

The LPA program continues evolving to provide needed training, yet stays focused on also ensuring accountability. Crist explained that some synods have very robust lay training programs but don't allow lay persons to preach or to preside over the sacraments. The Montana Synod, on the other hand, does allow LPAs to preside over the sacraments and preach but only with approval from the Bishop. This keeps lay leaders accountable to the church and provides oversight.

LPAs write an annual report to the Bishop each year, just like pastors. They also take part in continuing education. At the same time, LPAs are not pastors or deacons. They are unique, needed, and an important part of how we do ministry in the Montana Synod.

What is an LPA and what is their role in the congregation?

A Lay Pastoral Associate in the Montana Synod is a congregational lay person who has received religious, educational training, through the Montana Synod, in order to provide (in most cases) short term pulpit supply (ie, preaching) when the pastor is away, or if a congregation is without a pastor. Their role is to fill in for the basic pastoral duties such as providing Word and Sacrament, communion, and other roles as approved by the Bishop.

What kind of training is available?

The Montana Synod provides a 2-year training class that covers topics which include preaching, worship, prayer, and pastoral care. This educational training prepares the lay person to fill in for the short-term needs (and in some instances, longer term) of a congregation when a pastor is away, or for those congregations without a pastor.

LPA students are required to have a member of the rostered clergy serve as their mentor for the duration of the training. This provides one-to-one guidance and training throughout the program.



Celebrating 25 years of Lay Pastoral Associates!

Just what does the Montana Synod do for congregations and members of those congregations? The Montana Synod works to equip congregations for ministry of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. One of the many efforts in this mission is the Lay Pastoral Associate (LPA) program.

The LPA program is 25 years old and has trained over 300 people to serve the churches in Montana and northern Wyoming in a variety of ways. It's a Montana-grown program, created to meet Montana and Wyoming needs.

Former Bishop Jessica Crist said that Lutherans in this region have always had a strong lay preaching ministry. This has been particularly true in the Montana Synod where we've experienced shortages of pastors in our rural areas. Through the years, lay people have been asked to preach when congregations were without pastors or pastors were on vacation. "There was a pre-disposition to not be opposed to lay people taking on pastoral roles," Crist said.

In recounting the history of the LPA program, Crist explained that Mark Ramseth was Bishop at the time. He and Pr. Tom Lee, who was Associate to the Bishop, worked together on the idea of a more formal curriculum for lay leaders, "many of whom were already being called on to preach and preside," Crist said. The LPA program was created to give lay leaders some training, some authorization and some accountability.

Dave Scholten, an LPA from Ulm said, "The LPA program has made my life richer, fuller, and deeper, by providing an outlet for my gifts and passions. It has been for me a grounded, credible vehicle for an outward expression of an inner yearning."

When the LPA program began, it was held in eastern Montana because that was the area of greatest need. As it grew, the retreats were moved to Great Falls and now there are retreats both in the eastern part of the state and in Great Falls as well as some classes via Zoom.

The curriculum includes in-person courses that are taught by pastors from the Montana Synod. Between these retreats, students do individual study that includes intensive training in the Old Testament, the New Testament and church history. Having a pastor mentor is an additional important aspect of the training. LPAs learn about pastoral care, leading Bible studies, working with youth, and have experiences that empower them to take on a larger role in a congregation and the wider church.

Throughout the years, the program has remained local to meet the particular needs of Montana Synod churches. It has stayed local because it's the best way to create a community for the LPA students. Pr. Asselstine said he's seen how LPA students value that community and also value their role as LPAs. "I've seen how seriously the LPAs take their position and their training. They really want to learn," Asselstine said. "As we've changed and used them more regularly for preaching and more regularly for pastoral care where there aren't pastors available, their desire to learn has increased."

As congregations have become familiar with the program over the years, they have embraced the role as well. "There would be a lot of congregations that would struggle without access to lay people who are trained," Asselstine said. "It has changed the way that transitional ministry happens in our synod. When a pastor leaves, the first question is, 'Can we get a list of the LPAs in our area who can help in this transition?' For many congregations, LPAs have been a godsend."






