On 09/12/2019, I was contacted by Jessica Crampton with the Missouri Humane Society Animal Cruelty Task Force. Jessica reports that Tiffany Woodington was hoarding a large number of dogs in a number of locations in Benton County. Jessica advised the reports stated the dogs were not being properly taken care of and also had been transported from other states. Jessica advised Tiffany and her husband Steven Woodington had been operating a rescue in Texas and in the last few days Law Enforcement had been to their residence in Texas and Steven had been arrested and charged with Animal Cruelty. Jessica advised the Human Society in Texas removed approximately 278 dogs from that property. There was also information that Tiffany had possibly moved a number of dogs from Texas to Missouri and being housed in Benton County. Jessica advised she had information Tiffany had been moving dogs from 27780 Highway 52, Cole Camp a location in Benton County to her mother in law Diane Woodington's residence located at 15580 Highway C, Lincoln a location in Benton County.

Jessica and I responded to the Tiffany's residence on Highway 52 and were unable to make contact with Tiffany. While attempting to make contact I could smell a very strong odor coming from inside the residence consistent with something dead and decaying. I also observed an old school bus and back shed located on the property. All the windows on the residence and the bus and out building all appeared to have been covered with paper.

I then responded to Diane's residence on Highway C in an attempt to make contact with Tiffany. Upon arrival, I made contact with Tiffany sitting in her vehicle at the end of the driveway at a closed gate. Upon speaking with Tiffany she advised she did in fact have dogs housed in kennels at the Highway 52 location and that she had moved a number of the dog over night to the residence on Highway C and also a residence owned by her located at 1112 Maple Street, Cole Camp a location in Benton County.

Tiffany was advised of the information given to myself and Jessica and agreed to let us look at the dogs she had moved to the residence. I responded to a barn located on the property where I observed approximately 23 small dogs all in separate kennels. I observed the dog to appear to be malnourished. All the kennels had a large amount of feces covering the trays on the bottom and all the dogs were covered in feces also. While speaking with Tiffany she advised most of the dogs had been transported to her residence on Highway 52 from her property in Texas by a transport company. Tiffany advised she had moved the dogs over night to this location due to getting threats from people on Facebook and also because she had been staying at the residence the last few months due to Diane having issues and not being able to be left alone.

Tiffany then took us to the residence on Maple Street and showed us the dogs she had transported to that location also from the residence on Highway 52. At that residence I observed approximately 15 dogs all in separate kennels and one cat which was being held in the bathroom. I observed the dogs and cat to appear to be lacking

food and water and again the kennels were covered in feces along with feces covering the dogs.

Tiffany took us to the residence on Highway 52 where she had advised she was living and all the dogs had been housed the day prior. Tiffany advised she was the care taker of the dogs and two pigs located on the property. I observed two large pigs in a fenced area in the back yard the pigs appeared to be well taken care of and had water in a bucket by the gate entering the fenced area. Tiffany opened the front door to the residence where I earlier had the strong odor of something dead. Prior to entering the property Tiffany advised she had found a few dead dogs that she had not yet disposed of. As I entered the residence the smell so strong I had to cover my nose with my shirt to be able to walk through the residence. I observed a large number of kennels some stacked three high all covered in feces with no food or water bowls. Inside almost every kennel I observed the remains of deceased dogs and one cat all in a stage of decay that suggest they had been dead for an extended period of time. I observed a number of the dogs to have nothing left other than the bones and dog collars still in the kennel. Tiffany then showed us the back shed which again the smell was very strong to the point I was unable to stay inside for any time. I observed there to be a number of kennels stacked three to four high and all having deceased dogs again the kennels were covered in feces. I did observe one live cat among the rest of the dead animals which I advised Tiffany to immediately remove from the shed and she did.

Tiffany then showed us the bus. Inside the bus I observed two kennels with one containing a dead dog also in the same condition as the rest of the kennels on the property. I also observed a blanket and pillow that appeared someone had been sleeping on the floor of the bus.

In total I observed approximately 68 dead dogs and one cat on the property in which Tiffany took complete responsibility for. When asked Tiffany advised all the dogs died within a three day span due to a case of Distemper from a dog that had been transported to her residence from Texas, she was not aware of it until after the dogs arrived to the residence on Highway 52. Tiffany was asked why she had not reached out for help when she started seeing she was not able to take care of the issue on her own and she did not have an answer other than it just happened so fast.

Jessica and the Humane Society then responded the next day and removed all the live dogs from the properties with Tiffany's consent. Jessica advised all the dogs have been evaluated by their vet and results will be provided when complete but at this time the vet is advising the dogs appear to have no diseases and are only malnourished.

Photographs and the report from the Humane Society will be added to this report when completed.

On Monday September 9, 2019 I was dispatched to the intersection of Bingly Rd and FM 1847 in reference to assisting Cameron County Animal Control personal in conducting a follow upon investigation. Upon arrival I made contact with Animal Control Officer Josh Cruz # 804 and Ismael Cortez # 803 who stated that they needed to conduct a follow up investigation at 35848 Bingley Rd in reference to foul smells coming from location as well as dogs barking throughout the night and not allowing surrounding residence to sleep. Upon arrival to the location we made contact with a male subject who identified himself as Guadalupe Alvarez as he was driving out of the properly. Mr. Alvarez stated that he was the care giver of the mention properly which he advised that he was in charge of looking over the field's plants and trees. Mr. Alvarez was asked if on the property was a place where there was a large amount of dogs, which he stated yes and he guides us to the roadway. Mr Alvarez advised that there was a male subject at the facility which was the caregiver of the dogs. Mr Alvarez was asked if he knew the subject in charge of the facility which he stated no that was only in charge of the fields. Animal Control officers and I drove to the direction that Mr. Alvarez pointed us to. Upon our arrival I immediately noticed a strong foul smell coming from a white in color ware house I also noticed as I approached loud dog barking coming from the mention were house. I also noticed a male subject walking out of the facility which he identified himself as Mark Trevino DOB 11-15-89. Mr Trevino stated that they were a rescues facility where they would house dogs until they were placed for adoption. He also stated that the name of their organization was called "All Accounted For Recuse." Mr Trevino explained that the dogs were take care of during their stay until they would find a home in Missouri and immediately send them to a new home. Mr Trevino also informed me that the dogs were transported from different shelters like Palm Valley Animal Control Shelter, Weslaco Animal Control Shelter and Mission Animal Control Shelter to their facility by different transport personnel. It was then that I asked Mr Trevino for written consent to enter the ware house and see their dog which he agreed and signed a Cameron County Voluntary Consent To Search Form. As I entered the facility I immediately noticed that there were over 300 dogs held in different sized kennels some which contained several dogs crowded in the same kennel and all in unsanitary and unhealthy conditions, covered in feces and urine and some with open sore wounds possibly from their prolonged confinement in said tight spaces. It was then then I immediately contacted Lt. A Guerra and informed him of the incident, which he advised Cameron County investigators were going to be responding to my location of further investigate. While wait for Cameron County CID to arrive a male subject identified as Steve Woodington DOB 8-17-64 arrived to my location and stated that he was the owner and operator of the resoue program. Mr Steve advised me that he and his wife Tiffany Woodington DOB 6-27-70, operated a dog rescue program named All Accounted For Rescues out of Missouri, which he advised he was rescue dog here in the valley and later put them for adoption in Missouri and transported once a placement was found for them. I asked Mr Steve If there was any type of documentation for any of the dogs inside the facility which he stated he was not

sure. I also asked him if he was aware of the dogs conductions which he stated that he had not been at the facility for eight days. I also asked him if any of the dog were ever seen by a veterinarian which he advised that Vet John Montalvo out of Combes was the Vet over seeing his dogs. He was asked when was the last time any of the dogs had been seen by the vet, which he stated he was not sure.

Cameron County Investigator T Tobias arrived to my location and took over this incident. Cameron County Health Administrations and personnel arrived to my location to assist in the transporting of the dogs to the Cameron County Dog Shelter. Dr Clarissa Downey arrived to examine the canines and stated that she estimated that more than half of the canines were not going to survive either due to their poor health conditions or due to them having to be euthanized.

All Canines were removed from the property which Mr Steve gave consent in doing so by Cameron County Animal Control. Both Mark and Steve were transported to the Sherriff Department for further investigation
