BILL

To amend the law of evidence.

7 HEREAS it is expedient that the law of evidence should be further amended: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in this present 5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows: -

1. So much of the third section of the Act of Council passed in the Parts of sections by your of the seign of the Moiosty Ouese Victoria number fourteen 3 and 4 of 16 Vic. sixteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, number fourteen, 3 and 4 of 16 Vic as provides that the said Act shall not in any civil proceeding render any husband competent or compellable to give evidence for or against his wife, 10 or any wife competent or compellable to give evidence for or against her husband, and so much of the fourth section of the said Act of Council as provides that nothing therein contained shall apply to any action for breach of promise of marriage, are hereby repealed.

2. On the trial of any issue joined, or of any matter or question Husbands and 15 in any inquiry arising in any suit, action, or other proceeding in any court wives of parties of justice, or before any person having by law or consent of parties authority witnesses. to hear, receive, and examine evidence, the husbands and wives of parties thereto and of the persons in whose behalf any such suit, action, or other proceeding may be brought or instituted, or opposed or defended, shall, 20 except as hereinafter excepted, be competent and compellable to give evidence, either viva voce or by deposition, according to the practice of the court, on behalf of either or any of the parties to the said suit, action, or other proceeding.

3. Nothing herein shall render any husband competent or Except in criminal 25 compellable to give evidence for or against his wife, or any wife competent cases and cases of or compellable to give evidence for or against her husband, in any criminal adultery. proceeding, or in any proceeding instituted in consequence of adultery.

No husband shall be compellable to disclose any communication Husbands and made to him by his wife during the marriage, and no wife shall be compellable wives not 30 to disclose any communication made to her by her husband during the disclose marriage.
