



Using PetLink's Mass Import Feature

Instructions for Animal Professionals (Shelters, Rescues and Humane Societies)

Overview

PetLink offers Mass Import of multiple prepaid microchip registrations and transfers of ownership for Animal Professionals, so that you can upload pet data in bulk, saving valuable time entering individual records.

PetLink's Mass Import is based on a simple, easy to use Microsoft Excel spreadsheet template, where owner and pet data are input into one document, which then can be uploaded into PetLink directly at one time. Mass Import enables immediate registration, and eliminates the need for individual registration and transfer of ownership forms that have to be mailed or faxed to PetLink.

Mass Import also helps ensure that pet owner contact data remains in secure hands. We are committed to our customers' privacy; Mass Import creates an efficient and effective means to complete registration or transfer of ownership quickly and ensures that the privacy of both you and your clients is protected. Your facility will receive a confirmation report and each individual pet owner will receive a PetLink welcome email following a successful import.

In order to use Mass Import, your facility needs to have a valid, free, Animal Professional account with PetLink. Once your account is created, you can access the Mass Import template and instructions for completing a data upload by clicking on the Mass Import link in the left navigation menu in PetLink. Guardian: Linking You, Your Clients and Pets

By using PetLink's Mass Import feature, your facility will automatically be listed as "guardian" for every pet registered - something that a pet owner or adopter cannot edit. This adds your facility as a permanent contact in case the pet is ever found far from home but its family cannot be reached. It helps ensure that you can remain involved in the pet's care and in making decisions on how it is to be treated and possibly rehomed if that animal is ever unfortunately surrendered again.

Creating a petlink account for your facility

You can easily create a PetLink account for your facility. It takes only a minute or two, and it's free! Once complete, you'll be able to use not only the Mass Import feature highlighted here, but also the many other features and benefits of PetLink. We encourage you to check out the resources that will be available to you and to your clients through PetLink!



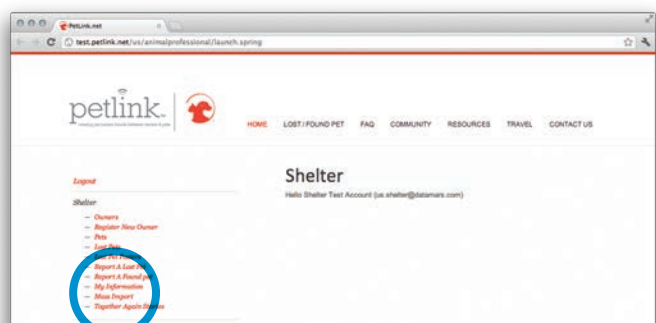
1. Visit www.petlink.net (that's **.net**, not **.com**!)
2. Click "[Register Shelter](#)"
3. Fill out the information requested
4. You will receive an email confirmation when your facility's PetLink account is live

It's that easy!

How to use mass import

Step 1: Create and Save Your Mass Import File

- Download the Mass Import template (.xls file) by logging in to www.petlink.net and clicking on [Mass Import](#) on the gray bar in the left-hand navigation menu and saving it to your computer's desktop.



- The Mass Import file must be either a Microsoft Excel (.xls) or Comma Separated Values (.csv) file.
- Open the template. You will notice that it contains several column headings. **It is very important not to alter these column headings in any way.**
- Make sure you do a "Save As" for each version of the Mass Import template. Please use the following naming scheme, and rename a new version for each new import:

[ShelterName_dd_mm_yyyy.xls](#)

- We recommend that you keep each version on file for at least 3 months; **be sure not to overwrite an existing file after you complete a Mass Import until you receive an email confirmation from PetLink that your import was successful.**

Step 2: Managing the Template

- Open the Mass Import template that you saved on your computer's desktop.
- The Mass Import file must be either a Microsoft Excel (.xls) or Comma Separated Values (.csv) file.
- **Remember not to alter these column headings in any way.**
- Column headers that appear in bold are mandatory fields, meaning they must be completed for each pet in order for the mass import to be successful.
- We encourage you to complete the non-mandatory fields as well; the more information we have in PetLink, the greater the likelihood that we will be able to reunify that pet to its family if it's ever lost.
- **Transaction Type:**
 - Select "N" for a new registration, or "T" if you are transferring ownership. NOTE: If you are transferring ownership, it is important that a new email address (used as the new owner's PetLink login) be assigned to each transfer. Email addresses previously assigned to PetLink accounts will result in errors. If the new owner has an existing PetLink account, please contact petlink@petlink.net.
- **Microchip ID:** The system will only access pre-paid Microfindr, Datamars or Bayer resQ 15-digit numeric microchip codes.
- **Breed:** See the following pages for lists of suitable breeds.

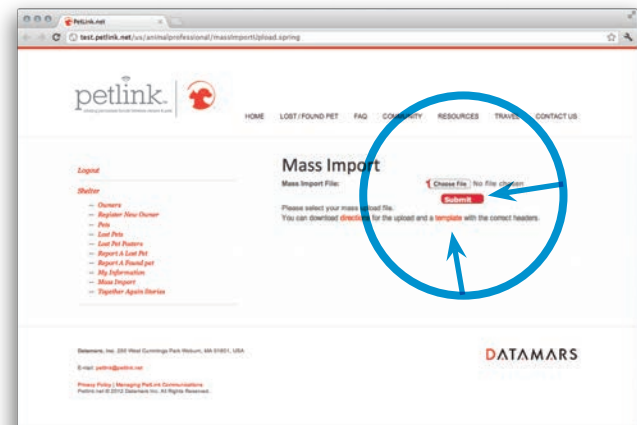
- **For pet owners who do not have an email address:**

- PetLink uses the owner’s email address not only as a means of contact, but the email address also becomes the owner’s login name. If the owner does not have an email address, or if the email address is unknown, please use the following temporary address:

10digitphone#@petlink.tmp
for example, 8001234567@petlink.tmp

See how we made a temporary email address out of the phone number 800-123-4567?

- **Password:** a password must be entered for each record; we recommend setting a standard password for your facility (i.e.: Clinic1) that is used for all records; this can then be given to all owners, who can then set personal passwords at a later time.
- **Don’t forget that each user must SAVE every time they enter a record to the template!**
- Decide how many records you will collect before completing a mass upload of your data. Perhaps your facility will complete an import once per day, maybe once per week – or every time you collect information on 20 pets – you can decide what will work best for you.
- Make sure everyone who has access to this file is aware of the necessary settings, where the file is to be saved, as appropriate. Make sure the team knows who is responsible for completing the Mass Upload and for verifying the confirmation.
- Here is an example of what your completed template should look like:



- Once you’re logged in, click on the **Mass Import** link
- **Browse** to the file location on your computer’s desktop
- Click the red **Submit** button – You’re almost finished!
- Check that you receive a confirmation report email from petlink@petlink.net to ensure that your Mass Import was successful; the email will have your template’s file name in the subject line. If there were any errors, you will need to correct those records and resubmit just those with a new Mass Import.

- Verify that your template is complete and correct with all the required information, and that it has been saved with the appropriate file name for upload.
- Go to www.petlink.net
- Log in using your practice’s account login name and password
