







Join us for this engaging opportunity to hear from Civil Rights Activist, Ambassador, and former Claremont College Chaplin, **James A. Joseph.** Ambassador Joseph is professor emeritus of the practice of public policy at the Sanford School of Public Policy at Duke University. He is also leader in residence for the Hart Leadership Program and founder of the

United States – Southern Africa Center for Leadership and Public Values at Duke and the University of Cape Town. He has served in senior executive or advisory positions for four U.S. Presidents, including appointments by President Jimmy Carter as Under Secretary of the Interior and President William Clinton as U.S. Ambassador to South Africa. I Ambassador Joseph has had a distinguished career in business, education, and civil society. An ordained minister, he has taught at Yale Divinity School and the Claremont Colleges where he was also Consortium Chaplain. After graduating from Southern University and Yale, Ambassador Joseph began his career at Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, Alabama in 1963, where he was also founding co-chair of the local civil rights movement.
