LOWER CITY MILLS PROJECT

The cluster of milling buildings including Lower City Mills, the Upper City Mill (now the Mercure Hotel) and their granary block, were central to feeding Perth over the last 250 years. Lower City Mills is a nationally important survivor of the burgh's agri-industrial past and still retains its internal machinery.

Perth and Kinross Heritage Trust secured a lease in the role of a 'benevolent developer' from Perth & Kinross Council in 2019, with a view to securing a sustainable future for this important building. Our planned multi-million pound project will deliver a range of social and economic benefits for Perth: improving the built environment at this key city location; providing training for a range of audiences while upskilling the local workforce and improving appreciation of this cultural asset by enabling safe public access. Scottish Archaeology Month (SAM), co-ordinated by Archaeology Scotland, has existed for more than 20 years. Alongside Doors Open Days it constitutes Scotland's contribution to European Heritage Days and helps deliver Aim 4 of Scotland's Archaeology Strategy.

SAM encourages people to interact with their archaeology, history and heritage by co-ordinating and promoting a varied programme of events all across Scotland. These include guided walks, exhibitions, excavations, lectures, performances, re-enactments, traditional skills workshops, storytelling, guided tours, conferences and many other activities.

SAM takes place every year in September but includes events running from the end of August until mid-October.



#1 Aberdalgie and Dupplin Church



A classic example of an ecclesiastical church cluster set within the historic Dupplin Estate, an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, with links back to the wars of Scottish Independence, the formation of the British State and the Lords Oliphant, Hay and Dewar dynasties. Come and enjoy a guided tour of the beautiful church sanctuary, ancient burial grounds and walled garden. Refreshments provided, visitors are welcome to bring a picnic.

#2 AK Bell Library



This grade A listed building was designed by William Macdonald Mackenzie and operated as an infirmary from 1836 until 1914 when it became a hospital for WW1 soldiers. Later on it became a tuberculosis centre and offices for Perth Education Authority, before reopening in 1994 as AK Bell Library, the flagship library and archive for Perth & Kinross. Join us for a behind-the-scenes tour of the library building and a chance to see some of the treasures of our archive and local history collections, led by our expert librarians and archivists.

#3 All Souls Church, Invergowrie



Red sandstone church, founded by Lady Kinnaird, with 140-ft spire, designed by Hippolyte Blanc 1890. Features include the high altar with beautiful Italian marble reredos and crucifix, Stations of the Cross sculpted in the walls of the church and brass lectern gifted by Bishop Forbes (d.1875) to Rossie Priory Chapel. Receive a warm welcome and tour this beautiful church. Refreshments, activities for children, and the opportunity to ring the bell!

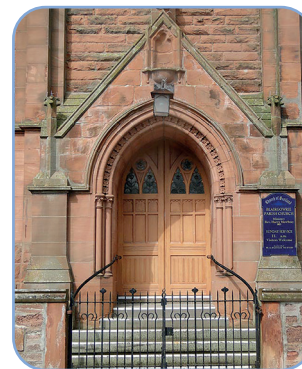

#4 Blairgowrie Parish Church



Blairgowrie Parish Church was built in 1904 when the former church was too small for the congregation. The high vaulted ceiling, the stained glass window and the organ were all gifted to the church by local benefactors. Come and discover the building and its connections to the community past and present. A programme of music will be provided throughout the weekend. Refreshments available. Saturday coffee and teas 10 - 1pm /Saturday and Sunday afternoon teas (pre-book) 1.30 to 4pm.

#5 Cultybraggan Camp



Cultybraggan Camp, run by Comrie Development Trust, was formerly an infamous Second World War PoW camp turned MoD training camp and is now a thriving multi-use site owned by the local community. It is composed of over 80 Nissen huts that are used by businesses and community groups, as events and heritage spaces and now as holiday homes and a cafe! Explore the museum with its tales of PoW escapes and Nazi brutality; experience the camp living conditions and military life; sample the quality produce of local artisans; dress as a soldier, try morse code and hunt the Cultybraggan mice!

#6 Drummond Castle Keep



An impressive tower house built on a rocky outcrop by the 1st Lord Drummond in the late-15th century and that now forms part of Drummond Castle. Enjoy access to rooms in the Keep, plus access to the parapet with wonderful views.

#7 Dunkeld Community Archive



Dunkeld Community Archive houses a growing collection of photographs, documents, research and memorabilia relating to the local area, as well as the regimental archive of the Scottish Horse. An exhibition on photography from mid 19th Century to the present day. The earliest ever photographs of Dunkeld by Dr John Wheeley Gough Gutch will be on display along with Dunkeld's Andrew Finley MacKenzie's work.

#8 Errol Parish Church



Known locally as 'The Cathedral of the Carse', Errol Church was designed by James Gillespie Graham and built in 1831-33. The church sits in the heart of the village of Errol and is home to the congregation of Errol Parish Church of Scotland. Come and see magnificent stained glass windows and the beautiful carved pulpit, an almost exact replica of the pulpit in Iona Cathedral. The Russian Stone, placed in memory of Russian airmen who fought as allies in WW2, can be found in the church grounds beside a small rose memorial garden. The refurbished Miller organ can be heard on Sunday morning, 11am at weekly worship. All welcome.

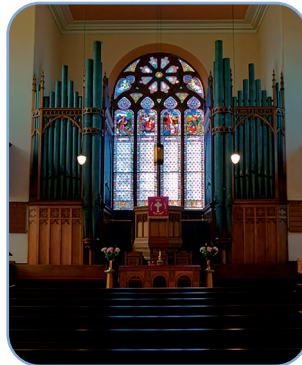

#9 Fair Maid's House



The Royal Scottish Geographical Society's visitor centre is a geographical delight, housed in the oldest secular building in Perth. Visitors can watch the planet from space, see the continents evolve, and learn about the hottest and coldest places on Earth. They can learn about the rich history of Perth and the Fair Maid's House, and discover the very best of geography and exploration through its amazing collection of maps, artefacts and books.

#11 Library of Innerpeffray



See the beautiful neo-classical Library of Innerpeffray, home to the first free public lending library in Scotland, plus the medieval Chapel and Victorian Schoolroom. #12 Lower City Mills



Home to Perth and Kinross Heritage Trust, this is the last chance to look behind the scenes into this water-driven mill before a major restoration project. The mill was in use from at least 1715 and houses rare working machinery - including the largest working waterwheel in Scotland! Try your hand at grinding with our quern stone, get creative colouring your own mill and complete our special kid's trail!

#13 Monzie Kirk



Early Victorian building with artefacts from earlier medieval building. Designed by William Stirling of Dunblane. Beautiful Morris and Burne Jones stained glass windows. Four ancient yew trees in Kirkyard pre-date the building by several hundred years. Magnificent Norman and Beard organ from 1913. Church members will be on hand to answer questions. Refreshments will be available.

#14 Carpow: Scotland's Forgotten Roman Fortress



"In this talk, Dr Andrew Tibbs (Durham University) will explore the archaeology and history of the fortress at Carpow, one of the most intriguing but understudied Roman sites in Scotland. We will look at why the Emperor himself led the expedition to crush the native tribes, why the fortress was strategically positioned overlooking the Tay and next to the River Earn, and we'll look at what archaeologists know about the site and what secrets remain to be discovered".

#16 Perth & Kinross Council



Originally the Head Office of General Accident Fire and Life Association Corporation Ltd, the foundation stone for the building was laid in 1899 and the building officially opened in July 1901. Whilst there has been some modernisation to the building over the years, many original fixtures and fittings remain. Come along for a closer look at the modern office environment within a historic building setting. Guided tours will encompass the Council Chambers, Civic Hall and historic areas including the Provost's Office, stained glass windows and marble staircase.

#17 Perth Academy



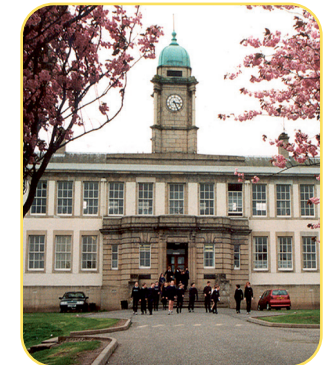
Founded in 1696 and tracing its origins back to a twelfth century grammar school established by Dunfermline Abbey, Perth Academy is potentially the oldest school in Scotland. It boasts notable former pupils including AK Bell and William Soutar. The present site was built in 1930 and designed by Reid & Forbes. Visitors will be treated to guided tours of the building by current pupils and will have the chance to see the work of the 'Flowers of the Forest' WW1 memorial group.

The first cathedral built in Britain since the Reformation, designed by William Butterfield and consecrated in 1850. Recently restored, its stunning architecture features beautiful stained glass. Live music 2-4pm on Saturday or join us for Evensong, featuring our choir, on Sunday at 3pm. Tours, a display of cathedral treasures, artwork from the children of St. Ninian's school, children's quiz, refreshments and the intriguing tales of Perth's suffragettes and a Jacobite bag await you!

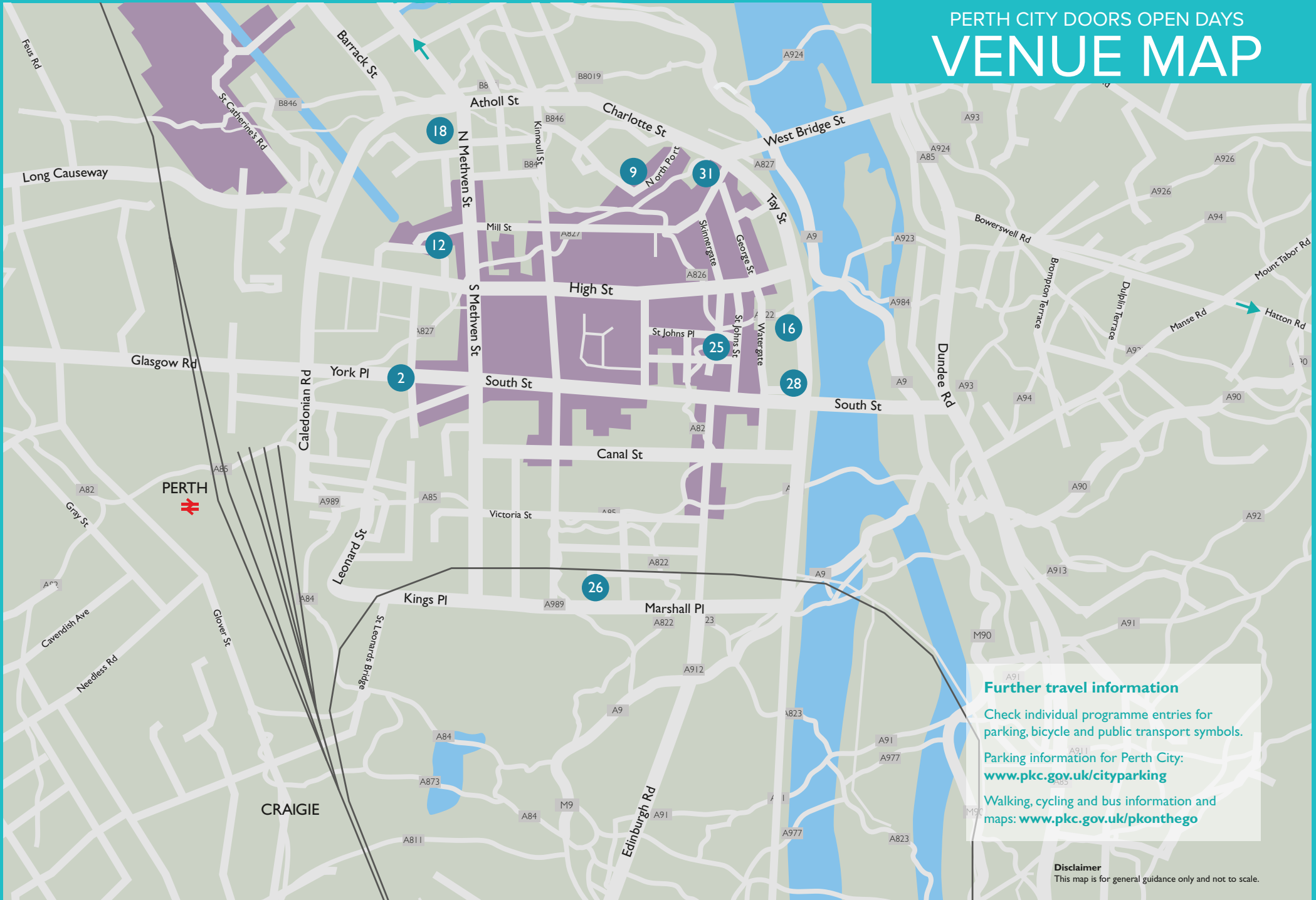
WIDER PERTH AND KINROSS DOD VENUE MAP

#22 Pitlochry Festival Theatre



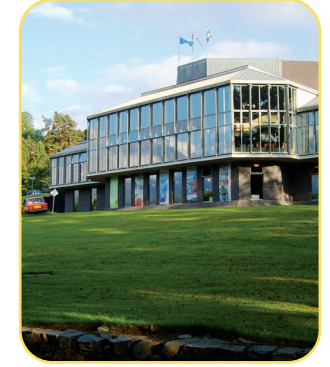

#23 Quarto Press



The press is a converted 19th century cottage and wagon shed adjacent to Grade B listed Beech Hill House (1750-1800). Come and try your hand at historical letterpress printing with metal and wood type, and at paper-making in a workshop packed with old trade gadgets and machines!

#24 St Andrew's Church of Scotland, Forteviot



The historic village of Forteviot is in the heart of the Strathearn Valley between Forgandenny and Dunning. No place has a better claim to be the Cradle of Scotland than Forteviot, where a Pictish royal palace once stood alongside a huge prehistoric ceremonial complex. The church contains a collection of Pictish stones and a historic handbell. Enjoy a guided tour of this beautiful, historic church and village, with village hall, green, carved cross replica, church with historic stones, handbell and grounds. Refreshments available.

#25 St John's Kirk



A church has stood on this site since the early 12th century, giving rise to Perth's alternative name "St. Johnstoun". In May 1959 John Knox preached his famous sermon here. Sir Robert Lorimer was responsible for restoration in 1926 and further restoration works have recently been completed with more waiting to be done. The Kirk has the largest collection of bells in the country and some stunning stained glass windows. Come and enjoy guided tours and organ music.

#28 St Matthews



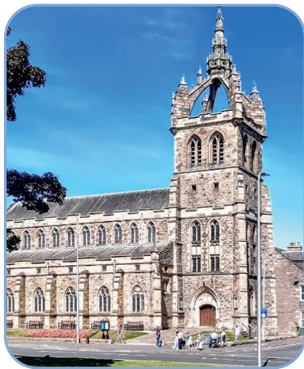

#26 St Leonard's in the Fields Church



A prominently-sited Scots Gothic-style Category A listed church building overlooking South Inch. Designed by J. J. Stevenson, building work began in May 1883, with the church opening in 1885. The church, with its iconic tower and crown spire, is a Perth landmark. Come learn about our history, and see a collection of historic church items. Tea, coffee and refreshments are available in the church hall. Organ recitals will take place. The church will open to visitors on Sunday after 11.15am morning worship, to which all visitors are invited.

#29 Sunnybrae Cottage



A fine survival of an 18th century Celtic Cuppil cottage that predates the settlement of Pitlochry surrounding it. Distinct within the streetscape because of its corrugated-iron roof (with thatch surviving beneath!), the cottage has evidence for a hanging lum, the former fireplace around which family life would have been played out. An 'A' listed monument, Sunnybrae Cottage is in the care of Historic Environment Scotland (HES). Sign up for this rare opportunity to see the remains of the archaeological investigation which took place inside the cottage, peeling back centuries of building and use. Your visit usually starts outside the building, looking at the architecture. Small parties of up to 6 at a time can then take it in turns to access the interior of the cottage, accompanied by a guide.

#27 St Luan's Catholic Church



St Luan's church is a simple building from the outside but with a history that links back hundreds of years to the Pictish Saint Moluag. It was built by public subscription in 1900 and houses some unique artefacts which contribute to its spiritual atmosphere, still enjoyed by an active worshipping community. Discover the church's links to the historic past of the town of Alyth. Enjoy a guided tour of the building and learn about the traditional elements of a Catholic Church. Watch a digital presentation on the unique artwork displayed in the church, by French artist Jean Raymond Hippolyte Lazerges (1817-1887). Share in parishioners' memories of the building and historical events.

#30 The Glover Incorporation of Perth Hall



The Glover's Hall has been the meeting place of the Glover Incorporation of Perth for over 150 years. Prior to that the Incorporation was based in the Fair Maid's House. The Glovers are one of the original incorporated trades of the burgh, whose existence can be traced back to the time of the Royal Charter in 1210. The Hall contains a variety of historical artefacts relating to the Incorporation. Visitors to the Hall, which is decorated in the style of the mid-19th Century, can learn about the Incorporations' historic links to the city. Visitors to the Hall will not only get rare access to a piece of Perth's history, but understand more of the role of the Incorporated Trades over 800 years, and learn a little of our participation in the new museum.

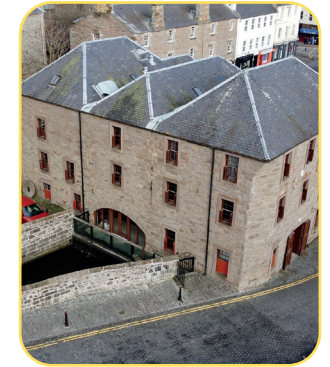
#33 How Water Powers the Mill

#34 Little Bellyclone Farm



A rare pre-improvement farm, Little Bellyclone boasts a unique and varied collection of vernacular buildings from the late 1700s to mid-20th century. Derelict and unoccupied since 2016, the site is now being repaired to showcase the best in traditional and modern natural building skills. Join the farm-buildings tour, archaeological mini-dig of a cobble street and traditional building skills taster sessions. Try your hand at drystone walling, lime pointing, earth building, clay plasters and natural paint making to discover how living heritage can help everybody take positive climate action.

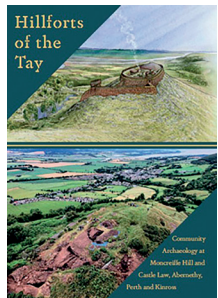

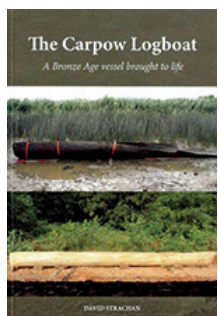
