# THE RISING TIDE OF PREVENTION

Harriet Beecher Stowe once said, “Never give up, for that is just the place and time that the tide will turn.” When I founded the Prevent Cancer Foundation nearly 30 years ago, prevention was not part of the cancer conversation. There were leaders and researchers focusing on finding cures, but there was a void in the dialogue when it came to prevention and early detection.

I saw an opportunity that could curb the growing cost of cancer, both in terms of the financial burden, and more important in the number of lives that could be saved. We knew that cancer would not wait as we watched the disease leave destruction in its wake. Prevention and early detection were not simply options—they were integral to the fight against cancer.

Today we are in the midst of a Rising Tide of Prevention. Even though cancer prevention has now become a focus for physicians, scientists, researchers, organizations, and government entities, the Foundation remains the only nonprofit focused solely on the critical concept of cancer prevention and early detection. One of the researchers who received early funding from the Foundation stated that we “lit a candle that ignited a bonfire.”

Dear Friends,

As we witness this tide rising, **I’m constantly reminded of the astonishing fact that up to 60 percent of cancer diagnoses and 50 percent of all cancer deaths could be avoided**—through simple preventive measures and healthy lifestyle changes, including screening.

With the knowledge we have today, we can dramatically alter our health and well-being. We speak about “Seven Steps to Prevent Cancer,” and while they seem so simple, too many people ignore them and continue to be diagnosed with cancer or die from the disease.

As you will read in the following pages, the Foundation has never deviated from our core mission; we continue to fund research that has had a profound impact on prevention and early detection. Here are a few examples of seminal studies supported by the Foundation:

- Early work that led to the development of the HPV vaccine, which protects against cervical and several other types of cancer
- Development of chemopreventive agents, such as tamoxifen, the first drug ever approved to prevent breast cancer, and COX-2 inhibitors, such as aspirin, which has been shown to be protective against colorectal and breast cancers
- Research leading to advanced technologies that detect lung, breast, skin and oral cancers



- ▣ Studies looking at links between naturally-occurring elements in the diet (e.g., resveratrol, curcumin) and cancer
- ▣ Research leading to the understanding about how certain heavy metals (e.g., cadmium, titanium) cause cancer
- ▣ Important behavioral studies leading to advances in understanding how to help smokers quit
- ▣ Studies on genetic links to cancer and how they are related to diet and other lifestyle choices

The Foundation was involved in early conversations that led to the funding of one of the largest (50,000 participants) and most expensive (\$250 million) clinical trials ever conducted, to determine whether screening individuals at high risk of developing lung cancer through the use of low-dose computed tomography (LDCT) would save lives.

The trial was positive and this past year the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force recommended screening to reduce death from lung cancer, the number one cause of cancer death in the U.S. Now the tide has risen on LDCT lung cancer screening, and it is time to ride the wave to finally reduce the number of lives lost to this lethal disease.

Unfortunately, what isn't rising is the amount of funding from the federal government for biomedical research. Funding levels have been stagnant since 2003 and after adjusting for inflation, the National Institutes of Health has actually lost ground—with funding dropping by 22 percent.

The Prevent Cancer Foundation continues its commitment to serving communities across the nation—educating the public on cancer prevention and early detection, healthy living—and the importance of regular screening.

The Foundation connects people with lifesaving information and direct service programs, while funding leading-edge cancer research, providing vital community outreach and education programs, and advocating for important issues on Capitol Hill and throughout the nation. We hope that the many ways we contribute to reducing cancer incidences and mortality through prevention will bring about a “rising tide that lifts all boats.”

**Each story you will read has in some way helped the tide of prevention rise.**

I am proud of everything we have accomplished over the past 29 years and look forward to increasing the rising tide of prevention into our 30th year and beyond.

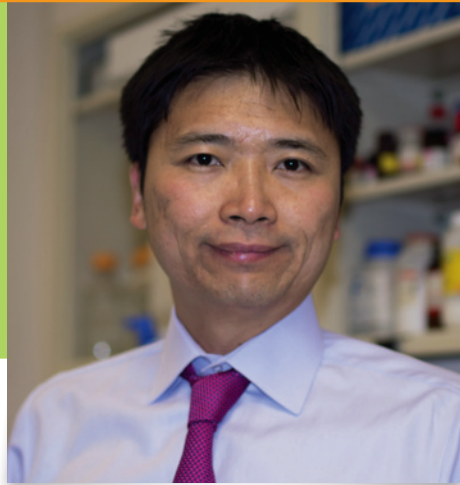

**NAMED AWARD:**

Marcia and Frank Carlucci Charitable Foundation Award in Cancer Prevention and Early Detection

**WHAT HE WILL STUDY:**

Omega-3 fatty acids for liver cancer prevention

Hepatocellular carcinoma (HCC) is the third leading cause of cancer-related deaths worldwide. Currently, there are no known biomarkers for early detection, and death often occurs soon after diagnosis. Dr. Fu, a postdoctoral fellow in Dr. Fung-Lung Chung's laboratory at Georgetown University, is examining a potential biomarker for the early detection of liver cancer and also is examining a mechanism-based method combining omega-3 fatty acids and the antioxidant from green tea as a novel cancer chemopreventive agent.

**NAMED AWARD:**

Awesome Games Done Quick Research Grant in Prostate Cancer

**WHAT HE WILL STUDY:**

Prevention of hormone-induced prostate cancer

After skin cancer, prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men, yet its causes are unknown. Male sex hormones (androgens) are considered critical factors in prostate cancer development. Because estrogens are formed from androgens in males, it is conceivable that estrogens play a role in prostate carcinogenesis. Dr. Maarten Bosland, Professor at University of Illinois at Chicago, and his team plan to collect preliminary data to examine how androgens and estrogens interact, and how interference with their interactions may strengthen our understanding of how to prevent prostate cancer.

**WHAT SHE IS STUDYING:**

The role of e-cigarettes in the pathogenesis of lung cancer

Public health concern has risen with the growing availability and visibility of electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes) across the country, yet very little research on the health effects of e-cigarettes currently exists. In fact, some manufacturers are promoting e-cigarettes as a safer alternative to cigarettes even though their potential toxicity, or cancer-causing ability, has not been evaluated. Enter Dr. Stacy Park, a postdoctoral fellow in Dr. Steven Dubinett’s laboratory at the University of California, Los Angeles. Dr. Park is looking at whether normal lung cells turn into cancerous cells after exposure to e-cigarettes. This research is among the first to determine if e-cigarettes have the potential to cause cancer. This contribution to the evidence base for e-cigarettes and their long-term health effects may advance tobacco-control policies and significantly impact lung cancer prevention.

**WHAT HE IS STUDYING:**

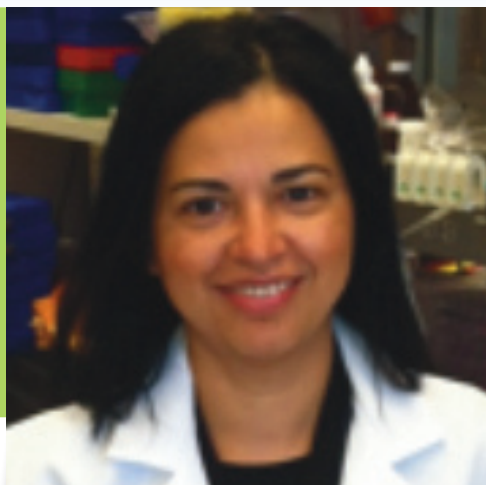
The impact of metformin on the  
risk of prostate cancer

After skin cancer, prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men. Screening the public for prostate cancer is not currently recommended until a more reliable screening test becomes available. Therefore, primary prevention of prostate cancer is more important than ever.

Dr. Ronac Mamtani of the University of Pennsylvania is studying metformin, a drug commonly used to treat Type 2 diabetes, as a possible drug to prevent the onset of prostate cancer. Metformin is safe, inexpensive and has been linked to a decreased risk of several cancers. Dr. Mamtani is comparing metformin with another type of drug for Type 2 diabetes to see if metformin is associated with lower risk of prostate cancer or less-aggressive forms of the disease. His results may lead to rapid clinical translation after further trials of metformin as a preventive agent for prostate cancer.

**NAMED AWARD:**

Holden Family Research Grant  
in Breast Cancer Prevention

**WHAT SHE IS STUDYING:**

Paternal obesity and reprogramming  
of breast cancer risk in their offspring

Obesity is one of the few modifiable risk factors for breast cancer. Some studies show that a mother’s obesity and nutrition during pregnancy can also affect her daughter’s breast cancer risk; however, no studies have used an animal model of the disease to investigate the impact of a father’s obesity or dietary habits on breast cancer risk in his children. Dr. Sonia de Assis of Georgetown University will investigate whether paternal obesity around the time of conception reprograms a father’s germ-line epigenome (chemical switches that turn genes on and off) and increases a daughter’s likelihood of developing breast cancer. Her study could uncover a new source of breast cancer risk, eventually leading to new approaches for breast cancer prevention and new biomarkers for early detection.

## 2014 DIALOGUE FOR ACTION™: RIGHT-SIZING CANCER SCREENING

For the past 16 years the Foundation's National Conference, Dialogue for Action™ on Cancer Screening, has brought together professionals committed to realizing the lifesaving potential of cancer screening for all communities. Dialogue convenes a diverse group of stakeholders: primary-care clinicians and advocates, medical specialists, survivors and advocates, researchers and health educators, third-party payers and staff from public health agencies on the national, state and county levels, all interested in cancer screening. Dialogue for Action™ is considered to be the "can't miss" conference that provides participants with concrete tools and effective strategies for use in both clinical and public health settings.

## LUNG CANCER WORKSHOP

In May, the Prevent Cancer Foundation hosted its annual workshop on the use of low-dose spiral CT (LDCT) screening to both detect lung cancer and other tobacco-induced diseases (particularly cardiovascular disease and COPD, also known as emphysema) and to more rapidly evaluate response to new treatments.

Imaging of the chest by LDCT has become even more significant as a tool for early detection of cancer now that the United States Preventive Services Task Force, "an independent, volunteer panel of national experts in prevention and evidence-based medicine," has recommended that adults ages 55-80 who are at high risk for lung cancer be screened—and now that private insurers will be required to pay for the testing beginning January 1.

The first of these workshops was organized by the Foundation in 2000 and within a year, the decision was made by Dr. Andrew C. von Eschenbach, then the director of the National Cancer Institute (NCI), to launch the National Lung Screening Trial (NLST), one of the largest (50,000 participants) and costliest (\$250 million) clinical trials in its history. Prevent Cancer Foundation President Carolyn Aldigé and Scientific Director Dr. James Mulshine participated in discussions held at the NCI about whether to conduct the trial. The NLST was halted in 2010 when it achieved its goal of proving that LDCT screening reduced death from lung cancer by at least 20 percent.

## CONGRESSIONAL FAMILIES CANCER PREVENTION PROGRAM

The Congressional Families Cancer Prevention Program brings together a bipartisan, bicameral group of Members of Congress and their spouses to help prevent cancer through education, awareness and outreach activities throughout the year. The highlight of the year was a series of women's health panels, which convened spouses, staff and Members of Congress.

Actress and activist Fran Drescher helped garner attention for *Women's Cancers: New Science, New Activism*, co-hosted with the Heinz Center for Science, Economics and Environment. Leading scientists Dr. Linda Birnbaum, Director, National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences at the National Institutes of Health and Dr. H. Kim Lysterly of Duke University School of Medicine led the discussion.

The Congressional Families Cancer Prevention Program also hosted the 21st annual *Action for Cancer Awareness Awards Luncheon*. Since 1993, this event has honored individuals who have made a significant contribution to cancer prevention and early detection. Fox News National Security Correspondent Jennifer Griffin, a survivor of triple negative breast cancer, served as master of ceremonies. Distinguished award recipients included congressional spouse Landra Reid (wife of Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid), NBC News anchor Andrea Mitchell and Olympic gymnast Shannon Miller. Each of these survivors was recognized for using her visibility and public influence to help fight cancer. A Special Recognition Award was presented to the Department of Defense's *Healthy Base Initiative* for its work to combat obesity and tobacco use on military installations.

# THE RISING TIDE OF OUTREACH

Since 1991, the Foundation's community outreach has been reflected in the millions of dollars invested in support of cancer awareness and screening programs in communities across the country. These include ongoing support of the Mammovan, run by the Medical Faculty Associates of George Washington University, ¡Celebremos la Vida! and Health Awareness and Screening Booths at State Fairs in rural America.

## HEALTHY FAMILIES / HEALTHY COMMUNITIES CANCER PREVENTION PROJECT

The Foundation for Healthy Communities in New Hampshire will develop a presentation on breast, cervical and colorectal cancer screening tailored to specific cultural and low-literacy needs. The Bhutanese and African communities in New Hampshire, along with other under-served communities, will have an opportunity to learn why cancer screening is important and how to access screenings through this project.

An important component of this project is that the information will reach a very diverse audience, being translated into six languages—**Spanish, Nepali, Portuguese, Arabic, Swahili and American Sign Language**—and will include the latest screening guidelines, how to communicate with one's primary care provider and how to access low-cost screening programs.

There are thousands of people in parts of country where prevention isn't part of the conversation. Cancer was only thought about in terms of treatment. Through the Prevent Cancer Foundation's Peer-Reviewed Community Grants program we raised the tide of prevention in communities across the United States.

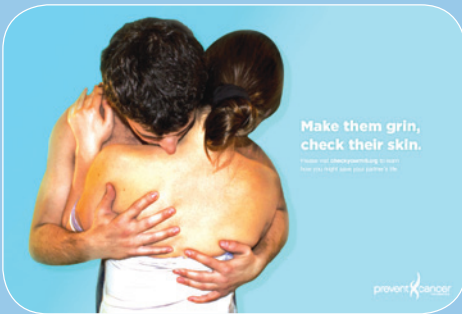

## CHECK YOUR MATE



The Prevent Cancer Foundation celebrated Valentine's Day in 2014 by launching the "Check Your Mate" campaign, which encouraged partners to perform breast, testicular, and skin cancer checks on one another. The Foundation created shareable online cards specifically targeted toward millennials and the campaign quickly gained traction. As unique and innovative education tools, the cards were utilized by colleague organizations, bloggers and social media influencers across the country.

## DEVELOPING LIFESTYLE MODIFICATION TIPS FOR THE "DOWN HOME HEALTHY LIVING" COOKBOOK

African-Americans have the highest colorectal cancer incidence and mortality rates among any racial/ethnic group. This project aims to address lifestyle behaviors such as diet, exercise and cancer screening to combat this cancer disparity. A unique cookbook, providing culturally appropriate recipes, will educate the African-American community on healthy lifestyles to prevent colorectal cancer. The Georgia Regents University will develop and evaluate the lifestyle tips (diet, physical activity and screening) component of the Down Home Healthy Living Cookbook—and will distribute it to 7,200 African Americans in 11 states as part of a CRC screening intervention. These lifestyle tips, which will provide practical action steps for good health and cancer prevention, will be developed with the input of African-American women in Miami, Chicago, Philadelphia and Los Angeles.

## DEVELOPMENT OF CULTURALLY SENSITIVE EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS ON HPV FOR AMERICAN INDIAN COMMUNITIES

The cervical cancer mortality rate for American Indian women is five times the national rate. This high death rate, coupled with low vaccination rates and a lack of culturally-appropriate cancer prevention education materials for American Indians, underscores the importance of this community grant.

The Minnesota Cancer Alliance is developing and testing culturally-specific mailings and educational materials on HPV vaccinations to be used in Minnesota's American Indian communities for the prevention of cervical cancer and other HPV-associated cancers. The cancer prevention materials will be distributed throughout the state to reach the parents of American Indian children ages 11-18 and the adolescents themselves.

"There is a lack of knowledge and awareness about HPV and the vaccine," said Heather Hirsch, Cancer Program Manager for the Minnesota Department of Health. This grant will help reach American Indian youth ages 11-18 years and their parents with educational materials for HPV vaccinations. Parents were used as a focus group to help determine which messages and photos are effective, depending on the specific culture.

## UNIDAS EN ROSA: BREAST HEALTH EDUCATION FOR LATINAS

The Los Angeles County Affiliate of Susan G. Komen® is implementing a culturally-competent outreach and education program, reaching community members at faith-based events, training lay health advocates (*Promotoras*) and motivating Latinas to seek breast health information and screening services in order to reduce late-stage diagnoses.

- "Through the support of Prevent Cancer Foundation, our *Unidas en Rosa* program has been able to educate 111 Latinas through six culturally-sensitive sessions at churches, train 23 *Unidas en Rosa Promotoras* on health communication and breast health basics and reach over 240 Latinas through three community-hosted events," said Gwen Barker, Director of Mission Programs for Susan G. Komen, Los Angeles County Affiliate.
- The group adapted the Foundation's *Campeonas* materials for their train-the-trainer events.
- Halfway through their grant year, this grantee has already reached 351 Latinas in the community and trained 23 *Promotoras*.

# THE RISING TIDE OF ADVOCACY

The past year has brought significant shifts in both cancer prevention policy and advocacy efforts by the Prevent Cancer Foundation, to ensure that all Americans have access to the tools they need to lead healthy lives. Along with a new strategic advocacy vision, the Foundation launched a website—[www.preventcancer.org/advocacy](http://www.preventcancer.org/advocacy)—to educate, engage and empower grassroots advocates across the nation.

## Health Care Reform

There has been a sea change in health care policy since 2010, when the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) was signed into law. The most important goals of this legislation were to expand access, improve quality and control costs. We are grateful that the law also covers significant preventive care services, offering 15 benefits including tobacco cessation programs, screening for many cancers, obesity counseling and cancer-protective vaccines.

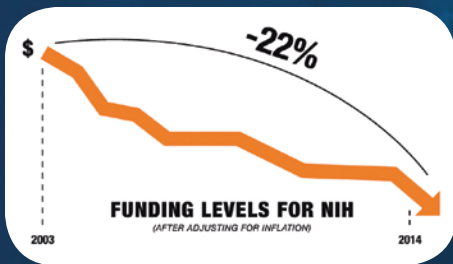
## Cancer Research Funding

Investments in medical research are critical to our ability to successfully prevent, diagnose and treat chronic illness, including cancer. Yet federal funding for the National Institutes of Health (NIH) has been steadily declining since 2003. The NIH is the largest source of funding for medical research in the world, supporting scientists, universities and research institutions in every state and internationally, yet funding has dropped by 22 percent (adjusted for inflation).

## Advocacy Priorities

This year, the Foundation advocated for the following issues:

- ▣ Increasing federal funding for cancer research
- ▣ Supporting funding for clinical trials
- ▣ Protecting the public health through the strict regulation of e-cigarettes as well all tobacco products, including cigars
- ▣ Advocating against a recommendation that the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) not be required to cover low-dose computed tomography (LDCT) scans to detect lung cancer in seniors.

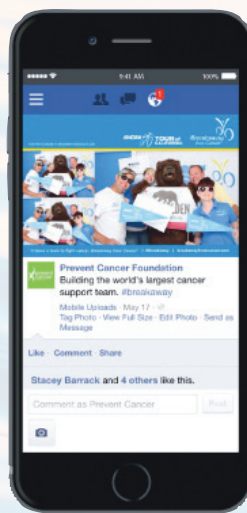
- Enhancing transparency and accountability for the United States Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF)
- Waiving Medicare coinsurance for colorectal cancer screening tests
- Opposing payer-generated clinical pathways
- Expediting FDA approvals for sunscreen ingredients
- Banning tanning bed use for minors
- Improving the nutritional quality of school lunches and imposing an excise tax on sugar sweetened beverages

The ebb and flow in cancer prevention and early detection policy means that the work of the Prevent Cancer Foundation, along with the efforts of our grassroots advocates, is more critical than ever before. As we prepare for the 114th Congress, prevention must be promoted and protected as a cost-effective strategy and—most important—as a way to save lives.

## BREAKAWAY FROM CANCER®

Breakaway from Cancer® is a partnership among four cancer-related national non-profits: the Prevent Cancer Foundation, Cancer Support Community, Patient Advocate Foundation and the National Coalition for Cancer Survivorship.

We are honored to have been part of Breakaway from Cancer® since it began in 2005, and participate in the Breakaway educational booth at the Amgen Tour of California, a professional eight-day cycling race through the state of California, from Sacramento to Thousand Oaks. Foundation staff were on hand to provide educational materials on cancer prevention and early detection and speak with visitors about their experiences with cancer. ## TWENTIETH ANNUAL SPRING GALA RAISES RECORD FUNDS IN SUPPORT OF THE MISSION

## A GAME OF FANTASY BRINGS IN THOUSANDS OF DOLLARS

As a young adult, Headley Butler never imagined that watching football and trading players would have a connection to kicking cancer. However, when cancer touched Headley and his family, it became clear to them the important role that prevention can play and the potential there is to save lives through early detection. In 1998 Headley’s aunt was diagnosed with stage 4 lung cancer, which claimed her life in a few short months. Then, 11 years later, Headley’s mother, Nancy, received a similar diagnosis and the fight against cancer became even more personal and important to Headley and his three siblings.

A long-time friend of Carolyn Aldigé, Headley learned through her that there are actions people can take to detect cancer earlier and potentially save lives. The support and information he and his family received from the Foundation during their aunt’s and mother’s cancer experiences motivated Headley to want to do more. His family had always supported the Foundation, but Headley was now looking to engage more people with the Foundation’s message of prevention and early detection—and to raise funds in the process.

In 2011, Headley teamed up with his siblings along with close friends Stuart Prince, Roger Edwards and Victor Maddux to organize a Fantasy Football benefit that has raised more than \$30,000 for the Foundation. His siblings, nephews, niece and fiancée all play in the charity fantasy league. Headley is excited to have found a unique way to take something that people love to do and use it to raise money, while at the same time providing education on cancer prevention. He doesn’t consider himself a fund-raiser, but has become passionate about trying to get others to create their own beneficiary events. Headley is eager to help anyone who would like to plan a Fantasy Football event to benefit the Prevent Cancer Foundation.

## AWESOME GAMES DONE QUICK

It is estimated that nearly 200 million people in the U.S. play video games, with about five million of those gamers playing 40 or more hours a week. Some people (mostly parents) ask: “Can’t you find something better to do with your time?”

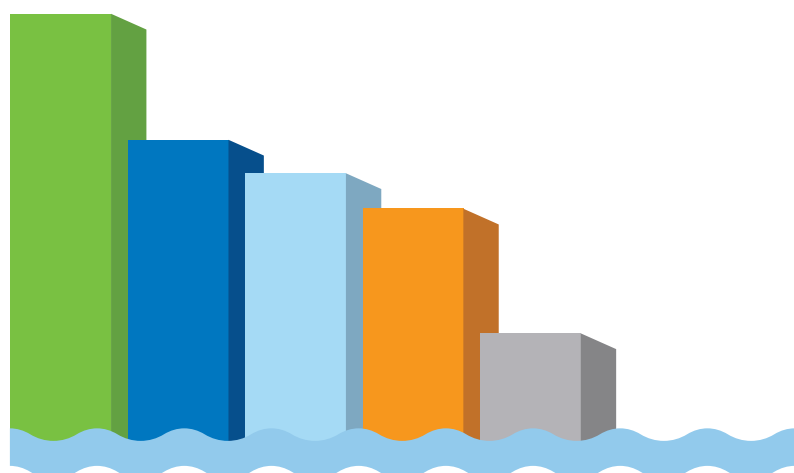
