Regional airlines are the keystone of North American air travel, connecting passengers and shippers from communities of all sizes with the rest of the world. In smaller communities, these connections represent an economic lifeline; in fact, most U.S. airports (63%) receive their only source of scheduled, commercial air service from regional airlines. With fewer passengers and shippers to board airplanes, smaller communities cannot support air service by larger airlines and larger aircraft. RAA members take pride in serving communities with aircraft that are appropriately sized to meet their needs.

The benefits are clear for smaller communities, but regional airlines support every aspect of the Air Transportation System. Major airlines partner with regional airlines to reach passengers they could not otherwise serve, bringing passengers and shipments through hub airports and beyond-offering a safe, seamless and reliable brand experience throughout. Without regional airlines, these connections would be broken and the guality of life at smaller communities would dim considerablywith residents unable to easily visit friends and family, travel for work or access specialized health care or receive timely shipments of goods, including perishable medical supplies. Without regional airlines to connect smaller markets to the global network, travelers would spend hours on the highway—a much less safe form of travel-to reach an airport with service. Even in larger markets, regional airlines bring value by supplementing major airline routes, adding frequency and enhancing competition. This allows major airlines to be more flexible and responsive to their customers. For communities, it means more destinations and departures and enhanced connectivity.

Given the role of regional airlines in smaller markets, a recent industry contraction—driven almost singularly by a shortage of airline pilots—led to diminished air service across the country. A growing shortage of maintenance technicians represents another concerning trend. Despite these challenges, and through relentless innovation and workforce investment, regional airlines have regained strength; enplanements ticked up this year, reaching levels not seen since 2013. This recovery reflects the success of regional airline initiatives aimed at recruiting and supporting the next generation of pilots and technicians, including outreach, tuition reimbursement and other financial support, career flow programs with universities and major airlines and markedly higher compensation starting with year one.

These market-based solutions have generated career interest, although progress has been partial. New data included in this year's report looks at the distribution of part 121 airline qualified pilots by age. Compared to last year, the age distribution of the airmen population shifted positively in the under 30 range, with more young pilots entering the workforce. Nonetheless, a larger shift occurred in the 60+ range during the same timeframe, suggesting that new airmen are not being created at an equal pace to those reaching mandatory retirement age. With passenger demand continuing to climb, half of today's qualified pilots face mandatory retirement within 15 years and 15% face that hard stop within five years. Despite more pilots entering the workforce, we are not keeping pace with retirements, let alone predicted growth.

Resolution demands a dramatic expansion of the population of students pursuing aviation careers. Women comprise 6% of the pilot workforce and 2% of the maintenance workforce, although we make up 50% of the overall workforce. Similarly, too few people of color are in our airline flight decks and MRO facilities. This needs to change. Airlines have centered workforce diversification; yet, students from all walks of life are deterred from the career because they cannot afford training. Student loan caps fall well below pilot flight education costs and aspiring aviators are left to fund the difference. This financing gap can exceed six figures. Those with means turn to the bank of mom and dad; those without means are left out. Industry-led efforts have renewed interest in aviation; now policymakers should address the student loan cap gap so more students have access.

Dear RAA Members and Friends,

Regional airlines are incredibly resilient businesses. Despite a myriad of challenges, we continue to be an indispensable part of the global airline network—safely connecting people to the larger world, no matter where they live. I'm proud to be a part of this industry.

As RAA's chair, my focus is fixed firmly on the future. How do we get young people interested in careers in commercial aviation? Nearly half of today's pilot workforce faces mandatory retirement within the next 15 years. Thirty percent of aviation technicians are near or at retirement. In the face of these retirements, demand for air travel is at an all-time high. The only way we can meet this demand is by adding more pilots and technicians to the career pipeline. We can achieve this by ensuring more young people can afford the training they need to achieve their career aspirations and by simultaneously implementing creative solutions to attract a new generation of talent.

This year's Congressional Fly-In provided the RAA with a valuable opportunity to get our message in front of influential members of Congress, as well as the Secretary of Transportation, the Honorable Elaine Chao. Secretary Chao played a key role in jumpstarting Congressional interest in the pilot shortage through the well-received Forces to Flyers program.

My big takeaway from those meetings—other than one should wear comfortable shoes to walk the halls of our nation's capital—is that RAA has been quite successful in changing the parameters of the debate in Washington regarding the future of the aviation workforce. The five-year FAA reauthorization bill passed last year contained numerous workforce provisions, and during this year's fly-in, lawmakers clearly understood the severity of the problem and were more willing than ever to collaborate on additional solutions.

We also urged lawmakers to include provisions in a higher education bill to ease the financial burden on prospective pilots. Today's federal financial aid system leaves aspiring pilots without sufficient funds to cover their education; pilot education costs can exceed \$200,000 for an undergraduate professional pilot bachelor's degree, and student loan ceilings leave most of this cost unsupported. The return on a pilots' investment is high—better than that of doctors and lawyers yet students without access to private wealth cannot afford or finance the training needed for their chosen profession. My colleagues and I continue to take steps to make the commercial airline career path more attractive—through compensation and other benefits like tuition reimbursement; institutional partnerships; leadership development programs to attract underrepresented groups; flow-through agreements with universities and our mainline partners; and in some cases, even foundational flight and maintenance technician training.

Additionally, we've recognized the importance of exposing students to aviation career opportunities early, and we've expanded our career outreach efforts to high school, and even elementary school students. And the RAA's new 501c(3) scholarship program will provide talented aviators with more needed financial assistance than ever.

Within the pages of this annual report, one can find the numbers and trends that tell a compelling story: regional aviation is as vital as ever, but it is going to take a collective effort—from Washington to the industry to universities and training institutions—to reach what should be a bright future.








Airports with Regional Service



Airports with ONLY Regional Service



Service at U.S. Airports




Passengers Enplaned (Millions)




Average Daily Departures




COMPARATIVE TRENDS IN U.S. PASSENGER AIRLINE SERVICE

Regional Airlines Non-Regional Airlines % Change Regional Airlines vs. 2009 % Change Non-Regional Airlines vs. 2009


Revenue Passenger Miles (RPMs) - billions



Increase in seating capacity from 2008 to 2017.







Federal regulations **require** Part 121 Commercial airline pilots to retire at age









Demand for Structured Training Pathways Steadily Increasing






The Airline Deregulation Act (ADA), passed in 1978, gave air carriers almost total freedom to determine which markets to serve domestically and what fares to charge for that service. The Essential Air Service (EAS) program was put into place to guarantee that small communities that were served by certificated air carriers before airline deregulation maintain a minimal level of scheduled air service. The United States Department of Transportation (the Department) is mandated to provide eligible EAS communities with access to the National Air Transportation System. This is generally accomplished by subsidizing two round trips a day with 30- to 50-seat aircraft, or additional frequencies with aircraft with 9-seat or fewer, usually to a largeor medium-hub airport. The Department currently subsidizes commuter and certificated air carriers to serve approximately 60 communities in Alaska and 115 communities in the lower 48 contiguous states that otherwise would not receive any scheduled air service.
