## NOTES ON CLASSIFICATION AND DESCRIPTION

## Note $\mathbf{1}$ - on classification

The combination of division and colour code assigned here (or as amended in any future Supplement) is the registered classification, to be observed, for example, when schedules require cultivars to be shown "as registered". The registered classification is not altered by any note of variable measurement or colour. (See pp.28-29 for any notes of variability in previous registrations.)

## Note 2 - on colour coding

Guidelines on colour coding, including those on distinguishing between Yellow and Orange and between Orange and Red appear in the Register and on registration forms. It is at the registrant's discretion to distinguish White from Yellow or Green, Yellow from Green, or Pink from the paler tones of Orange or Red.

In addition:

## - green at corona base

The green at the base of a corona, whether in the tube or in the corona itself, may be included in the colour code if it is prominent and plain to see. Registrants are advised to include it only if it is consistent from year to year.

## - non-concentric colours

When coding colours in perianth or corona that appear in radial rather than concentric bands, or in a flare from the base, or in flecks or splashes: start with a letter for the predominant colour; proceed with an oblique line; follow with the letter(s) (in any order) for the non-predominant colour(s).
For example, a yellow flower with a white streak along the midrib of the perianth segments would be Y/W-Y; a white flower with radial bands of orange and yellow on the corona segments would be W-W/OY.

## Note 3 - on colour terms

Colour Chart numbers in registered descriptions, e.g. 1D in 'Andy Blanchard', are from the RHS Colour Chart (1966 (reprinted 1986), 1995, 2001, 2007). Colour names followed by Chart numbers without brackets are equivalents adopted by the RHS for all its international registers. They are taken from the Universal Colour Language in the Inter-Society Color Council-National Bureau of Standards colourname system. Colour names followed by Chart numbers with brackets or by no numbers at all are those supplied by the registrant.

## Note 4 - on description

Registered descriptions are drawn up from application forms and, whenever possible, from photographs and actual specimens too. The Registrar would welcome readers' comments on the accuracy of all descriptions.

Illustrations of descriptive terms appear on p.32.

## Note 5 - on height

Stem heights in registered descriptions may be taken to be Standard ( $325-675 \mathrm{~mm}$ ) unless otherwise stated, when they will be described as Dwarf (less than 325 mm ) or Tall (more than 675 mm ).

## Note 6 - on Standards

The Standard noted at the end of some descriptions is the designated herbarium specimen or illustration forming a permanent record of the distinguishing characteristics of the cultivar and fixing the cultivar name.

Fl. forming a double triangle, 116 mm wide; perianth segments 55 mm long, broadly ovate, blunt, mucronate, spreading, plane, smooth and of heavy substance, overlapping half or more; the inner segments shouldered at base, less prominently mucronate; corona 42 mm long, funnel-shaped, smooth, mouth straight, lightly ribbed, even, irregularly and very shallowly lobed, with rim flanged and crenate. Mid-season to late. Very slightly scented. Nomenclatural Standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0117754)
Etymology: Named for the presenter of the BBC's One Show

Fl. rounded, 90 mm wide; perianth segments 37 mm long, ovate, blunt, spreading, slightly concave, smooth and of heavy substance, overlapping half; the inner segments narrower; corona 11 mm long, cupshaped, ribbed, mouth straight and even, with rim crenate. Mid-season.
Etymology: Named for the ancient peoples of Southwestern USA

Mid-season.

Mid-season. Sunproof. Strongly scented.

## ‘Angus MacMillan' 2 W-YWO

Fl. 100 mm wide; perianth segments 40 mm long, very broadly ovate in outline, roundish at apex, prominently mucronate, yellowish white 155D, spreading, concave, with margins incurved, with midrib showing, of heavy substance, overlapping onethird to a half; the inner segments narrower, blunt at apex, less prominently mucronate; corona 18 mm long, bowl-shaped, angled, yellowish white 155B, with brilliant greenish yellow 3B at base and a band of light orange-yellow 25D, touched with brilliant orange 25 C at rim, mouth straight, regularly ribbed and lightly frilled, with rim crenate. Late. Sweetly scented.

Fl. forming a double triangle, 97 mm wide; perianth and other petaloid segments in 3 or more whorls, mid-yellow; the outer whorls 42 mm long, ovate, blunt, slightly mucronate, spreading, plane, with margins wavy, smooth and of heavy substance, irregular, overlapping half or more; the inner whorls significantly shorter, strongly inflexed, concave; corona segments in several whorls, deep yellow; the outer whorl 35 mm long, completely enclosing the inner whorls of petaloid and corona segments, broad, inflexed, with margins wavy; the inner whorls short, clustered at centre, deeply inflexed. Tall. Very early to early

Etymology: Named for its flowering time

Fl. rounded, 26 mm wide, facing up; perianth segments 15 mm long, very broadly ovate, light greenish yellow 4 B , blunt, reflexed, plane or with margins incurved, smooth and of heavy substance, overlapping half or more; the inner segments narrower; corona 8 mm long, cylindrical, ribbed, brilliant yellow 11 A , mouth straight and wavy, with rim entire. Dwarf. Early.
Etymology: Named after its seed parent

Mid-season

## 'Bella Snow' 2 W-W

'Polar Snow' $\times$ 'Florence Joy'; sdlg no. 78/01
Fl. forming a double triangle, 118 mm wide; perianth segments 49 mm long, very broadly ovate, spreading, plane, smooth and of heavy substance, overlapping half; the inner segments slightly narrower; corona 37 mm long, funnel-shaped, smooth, mouth straight and even, with rim flanged and entire. Mid-season

## 'Bermuda Triangle’ 1 Y-Y

Sdlg PR 97:26 $\times$ Hamilton sdlg 15-94; sdlg no. 03:15 Fl. forming a double triangle, 120 mm wide; perianth segments 50 mm long, very broad, spreading, plane, smooth and of heavy substance, overlapping half; corona 54 mm long, cylindrical, smooth, mouth flared, with rim dentate. Tall. Early.
Etymology: Named for its triangular perianth segments

## 'Best Mate' 2 W-W

Fl. forming a double triangle, 102 mm wide; perianth segments 34 mm long, ovate in outline, acute at apex, spreading, plane or with margins incurved, smooth and of heavy substance, overlapping half; the inner segments narrower; corona 21 mm long, funnelshaped, ribbed, mouth straight and frilled, with rim flanged and dentate. Mid-season. Mildly scented

## 'Betcherrygah' 1 W-Y

(Ian H.Dyson) Ian H.Dyson, 2012
'Pops Legacy' $\times$ 'Quench'; sdlg no. 0322
Fl. forming a double triangle, 102 mm wide; perianth segments very broadly ovate, blunt, mucronate, spreading, plane, smooth, overlapping half; the inner segments narrower, shouldered at base, less
prominently mucronate; corona funnel-shaped,
smooth, mouth flared, regularly ribbed, frilled, with rim entire. Mid-season.
Nomenclatural Standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0117758)
Etymology: The Aboriginal name for budgerigars

Mid-season.
Nomenclatural Standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0117759)

## 'Birthday Boy' 2 W-YOO

Etymology: Named in honour of friend and fellow daffodil grower Kevin Kerr's 65 th birthday. This is one of his favourite daffodils

Fl. 96 mm wide; perianth and other petaloid segments in three or more whorls; the outer whorls 45 mm long, broadly ovate, blunt, mucronate, yellowish white 155D, spreading to a little inflexed, plane, smooth and of heavy substance, overlapping half; the inner whorls less prominently mucronate, more strongly inflexed, folded inwards from midrib; corona segments 16 mm long, interspersed among all the whorls of petaloid segments and clustered at centre, broad, strong orange 24 A , with yellowish orange (16A) at base, heavily frilled at centre. Mid-season. Sunproof. Nomenclatural Standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0117653)
'Catherine Penny Buchan' 2 W-GPO
(D.C.MacArthur) D.C.MacArthur, 2012
'Pismo Beach' open pollinated; sdlg no. ED40198

Fl. forming a double triangle, 79 mm wide; perianth segments 33 mm long, ovate, blunt, prominently mucronate, yellowish white 155B, spreading, concave, with margins incurling, creased, of heavy substance, overlapping one-third; the inner segments narrower; corona 14 mm long, cup-shaped, ribbed, pale yellowish pink 27D, with brilliant yellow-green 154 B at base and a band of pale orange (29C) at rim, mouth straight and frilled, with rim crenate. Late. Sunproof. Strongly scented

## ‘Causeway Gem’ 6 Y-Y

'Bryanston' $\times$ N. cyclamineus; sdlg no. 0201 Fl. 80 mm wide, facing slightly downwards; perianth segments 32 mm long, oblong in outline, rounded at apex, prominently mucronate, medium yellow, reflexed, plane or with margins slightly recurved, smooth and of heavy substance, overlapping a quarter; the inner segments narrower, acute at apex, less prominently mucronate; corona 30 mm long, cylindrical, smooth, slightly darker in tone than the perianth segments, mouth widely flared, lightly ribbed and a little wavy, with rim minutely crenate. Early. Nomenclatural Standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0117760)

## 'Causeway Torch' 2 W-YYP

Mid-season.

base, less prominently mucronate; corona 38 mm long, cylindrical, smooth, yellow, mouth straight and wavy, with rim entire. Tall. Mid-season to late. Nomenclatural Standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0117765)
Etymology: Awarded the best new plant award at the Cornwall Garden Society Centenary Show

## 'Charming Lady’ 6 W-GPP

Fl. 97 mm wide, facing up; perianth segments 40 mm long, very broadly ovate, truncate and mucronate, yellowish white NN155D, reflexed, concave, with margins incurling, with midrib showing, of membranaceous substance, overlapping half; the inner segments narrower, shouldered at base; corona 25 mm long, funnel-shaped, angled, strong yellowish pink 33C, with green at base, mouth a little expanded, broadly ribbed, irregularly frilled and lobed, with rim flanged and crenate. Mid-season. Sunproof. Strongly scented.
Nomenclatural Standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0117766)

## ‘Clandellow' 2 Y-Y

Fl. 95 mm wide; perianth segments very broadly ovate in outline, rounded at apex, truncate and mucronate, spreading, concave, with margins a little incurved, smooth and of heavy substance, overlapping half or more; the inner segments narrower, less prominently mucronate; corona bowl-shaped, smooth, mouth expanded, irregularly ribbed, heavily frilled and deeply six-lobed, with rim split and overlapping in places. Mid-season.

## HORTICULTURAL CLASSIFICATION

Whether of wild or cultivated origin, once a selection has been distinguished by a cultivar name it should be assigned to Divisions 1-12. Daffodils distinguished solely by botanical name should be assigned to Division 13.

## Notes

1. The characteristics for Divisions 5 to 10 are given for guidance only; they are not all necessarily expected to be present in every cultivar assigned to those divisions
2. Divisions 12 and 13 are not illustrated owing to the wide variation in shape and size between the flowers involved

## DIVISION 1 - TRUMPET DAFFODIL CULTIVARS



One flower to a stem; corona ("trumpet") as long as, or longer than the perianth segments ("petals")

## DIVISION 2 -LARGE-CUPPED DAFFODIL CULTIVARS



One flower to a stem; corona ("cup") more than one-third, but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments ("petals")

## DIVISION 3 - SMALL-CUPPED DAFFODIL CULTIVARS



One flower to a stem; corona ("cup") not more than one-third the length of the perianth segments ("petals")

DIVISION 4 - DOUBLE DAFFODIL CULTIVARS


One or more flowers to a stem, with doubling of the perianth segments or the corona or both

## DIVISION 5 - TRIANDRUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS



Characteristics of N. triandrus clearly evident: usually two or more pendent flowers to a stem; perianth segments reflexed

DIVISION 6 - CYCLAMINEUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS


Characteristics of
$N$. cyclamineus clearly evident: one flower to a stem; perianth segments significantly reflexed; flower at an acute angle to the stem, with a very short pedicel ("neck")

## DIVISION 7 - JONQUILLA AND APODANTHUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS



Characteristics of Sections Jonquilla or Apodanthi clearly evident: one to five (rarely eight) flowers to a stem; perianth segments spreading or reflexed; corona cup-shaped, funnel-shaped or flared, usually wider than long; flowers usually fragrant

## DIVISION 8 - TAZETTA DAFFODIL CULTIVARS



Characteristics of Section Tazettae clearly evident: usually three to twenty flowers to a stout stem; perianth segments spreading not reflexed; flowers usually fragrant

## DIVISION 9 - POETICUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS



Characteristics of $N$. poeticus and related species clearly evident; perianth segments pure white; corona very short or disc-shaped, not more than one-fifth the length of the perianth segments; corona usually with a green and/or yellow centre and red rim, but sometimes wholly or partly of other colours; anthers usually set at two distinct levels; flowers fragrant

## DIVISION 10 - BULBOCODIUM DAFFODIL CULTIVARS



Characteristics of Section Bulbocodium clearly evident: usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments insignificant compared with the dominant corona; anthers dorsifixed (ie attached more or less centrally to the filament); filament and style usually curved

DIVISION 11 - SPLIT-CORONA DAFFODIL CULTIVARS
Corona split - usually for more than half its length

a) Collar Daffodils Split-corona daffodils with the corona segments opposite the perianth segments; the corona segments usually in two whorls of three

b) Papillon Daffodils Split-corona daffodils with the corona segments alternate to the perianth segments; the corona segments usually in a single whorl of six

## DIVISION 12 - OTHER DAFFODIL

## CULTIVARS

Daffodil cultivars which do not fit the definition of any other division

## DIVISION 13 - DAFFODILS DISTINGUISHED SOLELY BY BOTANICAL NAME

## SECTION TAPEINANTHUS

Autumn flowering; one to four flowers to a rounded stem; leaves very narrow, glaucous, not always present on flowering bulbs; flower ascending, yellow; corona absent or rudimentary; anthers widely exserted from the tube, much shorter than the filaments, dorsifixed

## SECTION SEROTINI

Autumn flowering; usually one to two flowers to a rounded stem; leaves very narrow, glaucous, not always present on flowering bulbs; perianth segments pure white, usually twisted; corona very short, yellow, orange or green; anthers included in or slightly exserted from the tube, longer than the filaments, dorsifixed; flowers fragrant

## SECTION AURELIA

Autumn flowering; three to twelve flowers to a compressed stem; leaves flat not channelled, glaucous; flowers white; corona rudimentary or absent; filaments unequal in length; anthers exserted from the tube, dorsifixed; flowers fragrant

## SECTION TAZETTAE

Autumn to spring flowering; three (rarely two) to twenty flowers to a usually compressed stem; leaves flat or channelled, usually glaucous; flowers white, yellow or bicoloured; anthers included in or slightly exserted from the tube, much longer than the filaments, dorsifixed; flowers fragrant. The rounded stem and green leaves of $N$. aureus atypical, also the orange corona of $N$. elegans

## SECTION NARCISSUS

Spring flowering; usually one flower (exceptionally two to four) to a compressed stem; leaves flat not channelled, glaucous; perianth segments pure white; corona disc-shaped or very shallow, sometimes of a single colour, but usually with base green, mid-zone yellow and rim red or orange and often scarious; anthers partly exserted from the tube, much longer than the filaments, dorsifixed; flowers fragrant. Section covers $N$. poeticus

## SECTION JONQUILLA

Spring flowering; one to five (rarely eight) flowers to a rounded stem; leaves narrow or semi-cylindrical, green; flowers yellow, never white; perianth segments spreading or reflexed; corona usually cup-shaped, usually wider than long; anthers included in or partly exserted from the tube, much longer than the filaments, dorsifixed; flowers fragrant. The autumn flowering, green-flowered $N$. viridiflorus is atypical

## SECTION APODANTHI

Spring flowering; one flower or two to five to a somewhat compressed stem; leaves narrow, channelled, glaucous; flowers white or yellow, never bicoloured; perianth segments spreading or slightly
reflexed; corona cup-shaped, funnel-shaped or flared, usually wider than long; anthers included in the tube or three included and three exserted, much longer than the filaments, dorsifixed

## SECTION GANYMEDES

Spring flowering; one flower or two to six to an elliptical or cylindrical stem; flowers pendent, white or yellow or somewhat bicoloured; leaves flat or semi-cylindrical; perianth segments reflexed; corona cup-shaped (rarely campanulate); anthers three included in the tube, three exserted (often beyond the corona), equal to or much shorter than the filaments, dorsifixed. Section covers $N$. triandrus

## SECTION BULBOCODIUM

Autumn to spring flowering; one flower to a rounded stem; leaves narrow, semi-cylindrical; flowers white or yellow; perianth segments insignificant compared with the dominant corona; anthers widely exserted from the tube (often beyond the corona), much shorter than the filaments (which are usually curved), dorsifixed

## SECTION PSEUDONARCISSUS

Spring flowering; usually one flower to a more or less compressed or sometimes rounded stem; leaves flat or channelled, usually glaucous; flowers white, yellow or bicoloured; perianth segments usually spreading or inflexed; corona more or less cylindrical, often flared at mouth, yellow or white (never orange or red); anthers exserted from the tube, equal to or shorter than the filaments, sub-basifixed. The green leaves, rounded stem and strongly reflexed perianth segments of $N$. cyclamineus and the two to four flowers to a stem of some species including $N$. alcaracensis, $N$. longispathus and $N$. nevadensis are atypical

NOTE Hybrids distinguished solely by botanical name are also assigned to this Division.

In the Register, daffodils distinguished solely by botanical name are listed separately from those with cultivar or group names (see pages 1371-1386).
