

Summer Psychology in Croatia

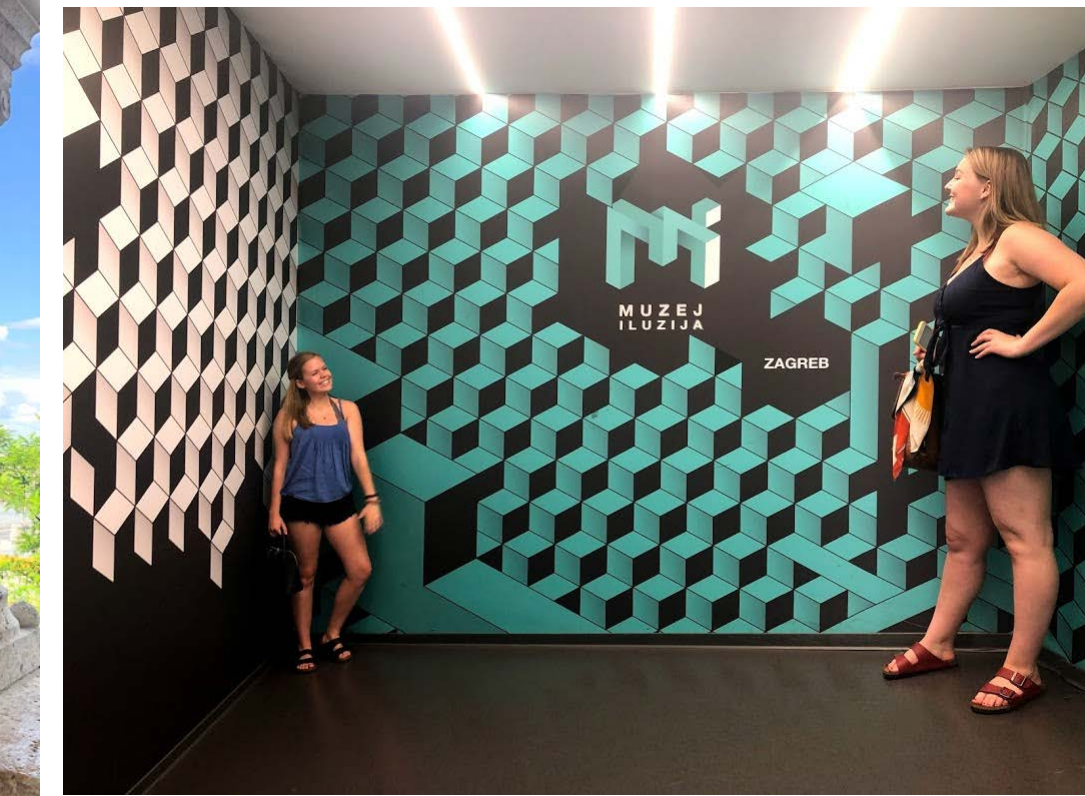

Introduction

- Students from multiple disciplines studied two different areas of psychology, abnormal and positive, abroad last summer.
- Students traveled to Zagreb, Croatia to take classes, but also took part in an additional week-long study trip to Vienna, Austria and Munich, Germany.
- Together, learned about the history of psychology and its founders, like Freud, and how psychology can be applied to major world events, such as the Holocaust.

Study Portion

- The final week of the trip was dedicated to traveling through Vienna, Austria and Munich Germany.
- In Vienna, students visited several museums dedicated to famous psychologists from the area. We were also given a tourist pass that allowed us to travel around the city during free time.
- In Munich, students visited the Dachau Concentration Camp as a conclusion to the abnormal psychology course.
