

CRAB TREES

ADAMS

(LATIN: MALUS) Adams is a broad-rounded crabapple that **matures to 15-20' tall and as wide**. Pink flowers bloom in abundance in spring. Flowers are followed by small, glossy, red crabapples that mature in fall and persist into winter. Leaves emerge with reddish tints in spring, mature to green in summer and turn orange-red in fall. Sun Zone 4



ADIRONDACK

(LATIN: MALUS) A small, disease-resistant, flowering tree with upright branches outlined by dark green foliage. In spring, red buds open to white blossoms tinged with pink followed by small, persistent red fruits. **Grows 15-18' tall with a 12-16' spread**. Full sun Zone 4-8



CAMELOT

(LATIN: MALUS CAMZAM) A dwarf, white-flowered crabapple tree that **matures to 10' tall by 8' wide**. This dwarf tree is noted for its rounded form, white flowers, red fruit and good disease resistance. Leaves emerge in spring with a burgundy tinge. Red buds open in spring to white flowers with pink tinges on the petals. Flowers are followed by red crabapples that age to burgundy red. Crabapples mature in fall and may persist into winter. Full sun Zone 4



CANDYMINT

(LATIN: MALUS SARGENTII) Perfect for small spaces, this tree has a growth habit that tends to be much wider than it is tall. Grows to the **height of 10' tall and 15' wide**. Flowers are dark red, fading to pink as they open in the spring. Foliage is maroon, fading to green as the season passes. The Candymint Crabapple tree offers great disease resistance to scab, mildew and cedar-apple rust. Full sun Zone 4



DONALD WYMAN

(LATIN: MALUS) Donald Wyman is a large, spreading crabapple that **matures to 15-20' tall and 18' wide**. Fragrant, white, single flowers bloom in abundance in spring. Flowers are followed by bright red crabapples that mature in fall. Crabapples persist on the tree well into winter. Leaves turn amber-gold in fall. The resistance of disease on this tree is good. Full sun Zone 4



EMERALD SPIRE

(LATIN: MALUS) A slow growing crabapple that has a columnar tree form. Pink flowers emerge in spring followed by red fruit. The most notable characteristics of Emerald Spire are its disease free foliage and dwarf, columnar growth habit. Great as accent tree or summer privacy screen. Grows 10-20' tall with a 5-10' spread. Full sun Zone 2



FIREBIRD

(LATIN: MALUS SARGENTII) In spring, red flower buds open to pure white flowers. The foliage is a nice dark green throughout the season, turning shades of yellow in the fall. Bright red fruits appear in mid-summer and last through winter. Very resistant to apple scab and other diseases. Growth at maturity is **8' tall and 10' wide**. Full sun Zone 4



GLADIATOR

(LATIN: MALUS X ADSTRINGENS) an excellent ornamental tree with a profusion of bright pink flowers followed by small reddish-purple fruit on a stately, upright crown. Glossy bronze-purple leaves look lush all growing season long and have high disease resistance. Grows 20' tall with a 9' spread. Full sun Zone 2-8



GOLDEN GALAXY

(LATIN: MALUS) Pale pink buds open to single white flowers in great abundance. Fruit is a rich gold, 5/8" in diameter, persistent to midwinter. Golden Galaxy is a small, rounded to slightly spreading tree to 12' high and 10' wide. Annual bloomer. Good clean foliage, excellent disease resistance. Beautiful gold fruited Crabapple that gives a showy autumn display. Full sun Zone 4-7



GUINEVERE

(LATIN: MALUS) Dwarf. Lustrous dark green foliage is blushed with burgundy. Mauve buds open to white flowers, bright red 3/8" fruit. **Grows 8-10' tall with a 10' spread.** Disease resistant. Full sun Zone 4



LANCELOT

(LATIN: MALUS) Lancelot crabapple a compact growing spring flowering tree with excellent disease resistance. It has a dense canopy with crisp green foliage and White Spring flowers. The fruit is Gold in color. **Grows 8-10' tall with a 10' spread.** Full sun Zone 4



LITTLE TROLL

(LATIN: MALUS) Abundant cascades of single pure white flowers develop from brilliant red buds. Small, persistent, bright orange-red fruit are relished by birds. 'Little Troll' is a refined and graceful weeping Crabapple, a wonderful addition to his small mini-fruited hybrid group. Dark green, highly disease resistant foliage. **8-12' tall and wide in 10 years.** Full sun Zone 4-7



PRAIRIEFIRE

(LATIN: MALUS) Prairiefire is a dense, rounded, deciduous tree which typically **grows 20' tall with a similar spread**. Pinkish-red buds open to slightly fragrant, deep pink-red flowers in spring. Flowers are followed by masses of small, purplish-red crabapples. Leaves emerge purplish in spring, mature to dark green with reddish-tinged leaf in summer, and turn orange in autumn. Disease resistant. Full sun Zone 4



PURPLE PRINCE

(LATIN: MALUS) Purple Prince Flowering Crab is a dense deciduous tree with an upright spreading habit of growth. **Grows to the height of 20' tall and wide**. An outstanding rosy blooming crab; the purple bronze foliage and bright rosy blossoms are stunning in spring; fast growing, does not suffer from stem splitting and has very good disease resistance. Full sun Zone 4



RED BARON

(LATIN: MALUS) Red Barron crabapple is a broad-crowned deciduous tree **growing to 25' tall and 20' wide**. Red buds open to profuse, deep pink flowers in early to mid-May. Its fruits are deep, shiny red, giving this cultivar its name. Disease resistance on this tree is mostly excellent but only fair on scab. The leaves turn an outstanding orange in the fall. Full sun Zone 4



RED JEWEL

(LATIN: MALUS) Red Jewel Crabapple has an abundance of persistent red fruit that hang around nearly all winter. They are replaced by a profusion of snow-white flowers. **Grows to 15 feet tall** with an upright, spreading form. Moderately resistant to fireblight, good resistance to cedar-apple rust, scab, and mildew. Full sun Zone 4



ROYAL RAINDROP

(LATIN: MALUS) Royal Raindrops Flowering Crab is covered in clusters of fragrant rose flowers along the branches in mid spring. It has attractive deep purple foliage throughout the season. The deeply cut leaves are ornamentally significant and turn an outstanding scarlet in the fall. It will **grow to be about 20 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 15 feet.** Disease resistance is very good. Full sun Zone 4



RUBY DAYZE

(LATIN: MALUS) Beautiful bright magenta-pink flowers are abundant in spring. Deep red fall fruits are tiny and persistent. This tree scores on all fronts, featuring the most scab resistant foliage among red-leaved crabs that we have yet seen. You will love its more upright, tightly oval shape, as will those who maintain landscapes and streetscapes. **Grows 22' tall with a 16' spread.** Full sun Zone 4



RUBY TEARS

(LATIN: MALUS BAILEARS) Ruby Tears Flowering Crabapple is covered in clusters of fragrant pink flowers along the branches in mid spring, which emerge from distinctive red flower buds. It has attractive burgundy foliage which emerges ruby-red in spring. The leaves turn an outstanding red in the fall. It will **grow to about 10' tall, with a spread of 15'**. Full sun Zone 4



SARAH

(LATIN: MALUS) The semi-double to double white flowers are borne in abundance, and are wonderfully fragrant. Orange-red fruit will persist in the winter. **Typically grows 10-15' tall with a 15' spread.** Sun to Partial Shade Zone 4-8



SARGENT

(LATIN: MALUS SARGENTII) Sargent crabapple is a dense, spreading, horizontally-branched, deciduous, multi-stemmed shrub that may technically be grown as a dwarf tree. It typically **grows 6-8' tall with no central leader and spreads to 12' wide.** Pink buds open to a profuse spring bloom of fragrant, white flowers. Flowers are followed by small, red crabapples which mature in the fall. Dark green leaves turn yellow in autumn. Disease resistance on this tree is excellent. Full sun Zone 5



SHOWTIME

(LATIN: MALUS SHOTIZAM) Heavy blooming, with large bright fuchsia-pink flowers that are striking in springtime. Dark green foliage has a red overlay. A vigorous grower with upright oval form, it features bright red fruits in autumn that persist into winter and become bird food. **Grows 10-15' tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 3



SPRING SNOW

(LATIN: MALUS) Spring Snow is a dense, upright, white-flowered crabapple that typically **matures over time to 20-25' tall by 15-20' wide.** This is a fruitless crabapple. Single, fragrant, white flowers bloom in spring. Ovate bright green leaves turn yellow in fall. Full sun Zone 4



SUGARTYME

(LATIN: MALUS SUTYZAM) Sugartyme is an upright, oval, deciduous tree which typically **grows 14-18' tall and to 12-15' wide.** Pale pink buds open to fragrant, single, white flowers in spring. Flowers are followed by masses of small, glossy, red crabapples which mature in the fall and persist well into the winter. Leaves turn yellow in autumn. Excellent disease resistance. Slight susceptibility to apple scab, leaf spot, powdery mildew and fire blight. Full sun Zone 4



TINA

(LATIN: MALUS SARGENTII) Tina is a densely-branched, spreading, deciduous, dwarf shrub which typically grows smaller than the species, namely to **4-5' tall**. Pink buds open to a spring bloom of fragrant, white flowers. Flowers are followed by small, red crabapples which mature in the fall. Dark green leaves turn yellow in autumn. Excellent disease resistance. Full sun Zone 4



ZUMI

(LATIN: MALUS × ZUMI VAR. CALOCARPA) This zumi crabapple is valued for its profuse, spring bloom of fragrant, white flowers and for its glossy, small, bright red crabapples which mature in the fall and often persist into December. A dense, rounded-to-spreading, deciduous tree which grows 12-20' tall and wide. The small fruits are edible, but not usually used in cooking. Fruits are long-lasting and attractive to birds. Full sun Zone 4
